Seoul

South Korea has detected signs that the North is preparing more missile launches, the defence ministry said yesterday, adding it could involve an intercontinental ballistic missile (ICBM).

The ministry said signs that North Korea was "preparing for another ballistic missile launch have consistently been

detected since Sunday's test", referring to Pyongyang's sixth nuclear test.

It did not give details, or indicate when a launch might take place. Sunday's blast had a strength of 50 kilotons, defence ministry officials told a parliamentary briefing.

Pyongyang on Sunday triggered global alarm with by far its most powerful test to date, after it claimed it had successfully tested a hydrogen bomb that could be mounted onto a long-range missile, which analysts say is a major advancement in its nuclear programme.

"The explosive power of the North's nuclear test is estimated to be 50 kilotons," a senior ministry official told lawmakers at an emergency parliamentary briefing.

That would make it five times the size of the North's previous test in September last year, and more than three times bigger than the US device that destroyed Hiroshima in 1945.

The official did not confirm whether the tested device was a hydrogen bomb but said "a variety of nuclear material"

appeared to have been used. The North -- which in July carried out two ICBM launches that apparently brought much of the US mainland into range -- has rapidly made progress with its weapons programme in defiance of seven sets of UN sanctions. The South has carried out live-fire exercises in response to the test.- AFP

Bahrain condemns N. Korea nuke test

Bahrain has condemned the nuclear test conducted by North Korea, stressing that these repeated tests pose a serious threat to peace in the Korean Peninsula and the world at large posing a clear challenge to the international community.

"The Ministry of Foreign Affairs stresses the need for North Korea to stop all practices that raise tensions, threaten international peace and security, and to abide fully by international resolutions and treaties on the non-proliferation of weapons of mass destruction," the ministry said in a statement.

Trump, Moon agree to end limits on payload

Seoul,

S President Donald Trump and South Korea's leader Moon Jae-In agreed yesterday to remove limits on the payload of the South's missiles, Seoul's presidential office said, as the UN Security Council met to discuss a response to Pyongyang's sixth and most powerful nuclear test.

The two leaders in a phone call "agreed to lift the cap on missile payload of South Korea as an effective countermeasure" against Pyongyang's test on Sunday of what it described as a hydrogen bomb designed for a long-range missile, the presidential office said in a statement. - AFP

US for 'strongest' possible sanctions

The United States yesterday launched a bid at the UN Security Council to quickly slap the "strongest possible measures" on North Korea in response to its sixth and most powerful nuclear test, but China and Russia argued that diplomatic talks were needed to address the crisis. US Ambassador Nikki Haley said Washington will present a new sanctions resolution to the council to be negotiated in the coming days, with a view of voting on it next Monday. "Only the strongest sanctions will enable us to resolve this problem through diplomacy," Haley told an emergency council meeting. - AFP



MP prepares legal action against Qatar

P Jamal Bu Hassan is reportedly planning to take legal action against Qatar for its role in 'supporting terror groups against Bahrain."

Gulf News, citing Arabic daily Akhbar Al Khaleej, said that Bu Hassan would file the petition following the Eid Al Adha holidays.

The report quoting the daily also claimed that the parliamentarian would present the request in the name of the people of Bahrain.

"The petition will include the extent of the damage caused to Bahrain and Bahraini citizens as a result of Qatari support for terrorism and extremist groups," the report quoted Bu Hassan as saying.

"The focus will be on the victims of terrorism who include martyrs and the wounded, but there will also details about how the Bahraini economy was greatly affected by Qatar's support for terrorism."

"The government of Qatar must be prosecuted, especially with regard to the damage it caused to Bahrain and Bahrainis and to the economy and businesses which is estimated at billions. We must call on the government of Qatar to compensate for these losses, since this is mainly the legal responsibility of the people's representatives. The actions of the Qatari regime violated all local, regional and international covenants," Bu Hassan told the daily.

In a similar move, First Deputy Speaker MP Ali Al-Aradi earlier urged legal action against the Qatari Government for its direct involvement in supporting radical groups in Bahrain.

Al-Aradi had urged the Government of Bahrain to file an international law suit against Qatar, seeking compensation for all those affected by the Qatari support for terrorism.

"The radical groups have been involved since 2011 in the acts of violence, terrorism and incitement" Al-Aradi said, calling on the Government of Bahrain to set up a central committee to receive affected people's complaints and to assess the losses inflicted upon the nation and citizens due to Qatar's support for terrorism and extremist groups.

Al-Aradi also urged the establishment of a specialised legal team to file cases and sue Qatar for its blatant interference in Bahrain's internal affairs, breach of good neighbourliness and violation of national, regional and international legal covenants.

300 athletes for IMMAF

A thletes from around the world have been invited to compete in the International Mixed Martial Arts Federation's 2017 IMMAF World Championships of Amateur MMA to be hosted by the Bahrain Mixed Martial Arts Federation (BMMAF) at Khalifa Sports City Arena from 12 to 19 November, as part of Brave International Combat Week.

The tournament is expected to be IMMAF's biggest yet, drawing around 300 competitors.

Endorsed by the Bahrain Olympic Committee, four preliminary days of IMMAF Amateur MMA action will culminate in professional MMA event, BRAVE, on Friday 17th, followed by the IMMAF World Championship finals and medals ceremony on Saturday 18th.

Registration is currently

open solely to the top 32 ranked national teams in the IMMAF Amateur MMA Rankings. Each is permitted to enter one athlete per weight category up until this Thursday.

On the following day, the remaining places in the tournament brackets will be opened up to application from all IMMAF member federations on a first come first served basis, with a maximum of two entries per weight category permitted per nation. The final deadline for all entries is September 28.

They all agreed that the peak of occupancy was reached on the second day of Eid and that Bahrain is currently the favourite destination for tourists from the GCC region.

They also said that occupancy rates hiked by at least 70 per cent this year as many hotels offered attracting packages to GCC tourists with competitive prices, Eid brunch and other

According to the hoteliers, who represent a number of the leading four and five stars hotels in the Kingdom, hotels and resorts with sea view have taken the lion's share of the guests this year, with many families preferring the sea view and water activities offered by these facilities.

They also said that most reservations were made on the front desks of the hotels, while the remaining were made online using the hotels' websites or international reservations' smartphones applications.

Bahraini man arrested for murder of Asian woman

he authorities have arrested the Bahraini man who stabbed L an Asian woman to death in Muharrag Governorate on

Muharraq Governorate Deputy Chief Prosecutor Abdullah Al Dossary confirmed in a statement yesterday that the 28-year-old suspect confessed to the crime during the interrogation.

The suspect admitted that he stabbed the 38-year-old woman in the neck at her residence in Busaiteen after an argument between them went out of control, according to Al Dossary's statement.

The prosecutor also said that wounds indicating the victim's resistance were detected on the killer's right hand.

'The Public Prosecution was notified by the General Directorate of Criminal Investigation and Forensic Science in the Interior Ministry, informing that the body of an Asian woman was found inside a residential flat in Busaiteen area and that initial investigations indicate criminal suspicion. The special teams of the prosecution inspected the crime scene, examined the body and reported wounds to the woman's neck and eye. The weapon used in the crime was confiscated from the crime scene," Al Dossary explained in his statement.

"Intensified investigations launched by the police led to the identification and arrest of the suspect within 24 hours after the crime was reported. Investigations showed that the suspect has been repeatedly visiting the location lately," Al Dossary elaborated.

Al Dossary added that a coroner was tasked to examine the suspect who will remain in custody until the case is referred to the criminal court



Team KHK MMA wins 1 gold, 3 silvers at IMMAF Africa Open

Bahrain's Khalid Hamad Khalifa Mixed Martial Arts (KHK MMA) team member Hamza Zrira (four wins-one loss) picked up a gold medal as he defeated South Africa's Katiso Matime (3-11) in the final of the 61kg bantamweight bout on the main card of the 2017 First IMMAF Africa Open Championships at the Brakpan Indoor Sports Centre in Johannesburg, South Africa, which concluded on Saturday following a triangle choke submission after two minutes 40 minutes of the first round.

The KHK MMA team also picked up three silvers through Ramazan Gitinov of Russia, fellow Bahraini Hussain Ayyad.

Gitinov (1-1) was beaten on a technical knockout in the third round (1:03) by Democratic Republic of Congo's Eliezer Kubanza (2-0) in the 77kg welterweight division, while South Africa's Nkosi Nedebel (6-1) in the 70kg lightweight division beat Bahrain's Nayef Fikri (2-3) in the second round (2:20) by a technical knockout.

Ayyad (9-6) followed up his bronze medal at the European Open Amateur Championship in the Bulgarian capital Sofia earlier this year, with a silver after being defeated by an unanimous decision over three rounds by South African Wade Kerspuy (5-2) in the 56kg

The bout for the 66kg featherweight title between KHK MMA Russian team members between Abdulmanap Magomedov (3-0) and Gamzat Magomedov (1-0) was cancelled as the latter failed a medical.

In one other bout for the light heavyweight 93kg title, South African Frikkie Benderman (2-0) defeated compatriot Dmitri Fogg (3-2) on a split decision over three rounds.

The Bahrain team were coached by Renat Abu Ahmad and this is the third participation by the KHK MMA team this year after previously taking part in the European Open Amateur Championship in Bulgaria and Singapore in June.

Apart from extreme weather and wind conditions, floating containers put the athletes in risk. Big ships frequently loose part of their cargo, which then floats just under the surface of the ocean. It is therefore extremely hard to spot in time and a collision could cause severe damage.

Stronger Brics Partnership for a Brighter Future

Remarks by H.E. Xi Jinping President of the People's **Republic of China** At the Plenary Session of the BRICS Xiamen Summit Xiamen, 4 September 2017

We owe the rapid development of BRICS cooperation to our adoption of a right approach. Guided by this approach, we have respected and supported each other in following the path of development suited to our respective national conditions; we have pushed forward economic, political and peopleto-people cooperation in an open, inclusive and win-win spirit; and we have worked in unison with other emerging market and developing countries to uphold international justice and equity and foster a sound external environment.

Past progress shows that BRICS cooperation has met our common need for development and is in keeping with the trend of history. Though we have different national conditions, we share the commitment to pursuing development and prosperity through partnership. This has enabled us to rise above differences and seek win-win

As the world undergoes profound and complex changes, BRICS cooperation has become more important. Our people expect us to jointly boost development and improve their well-being. The international community expects us to make contribution to world peace and common development. We must redouble our efforts to comprehensively deepen BRICS partnership and usher in the second "Golden Decade" of BRICS cooperation.

First, we need to seek practical results in our economic cooperation. Results-oriented cooperation is the foundation of BRICS cooperation, and significant progress has been

made in this regard. However, we have yet to fully tap the potential of BRICS cooperation. Statistics show that of the 197 billion US dollars outbound investment we made in 2016, only 5.7% took place among our five countries. This means BRICS cooperation still has broad

I wish to announce here that China will launch the Economic and Technical Cooperation Plan for BRICS Countries with 500 million yuan for the first term to facilitate policy exchange and practical cooperation in the economic and trade fields. China will contribute four million US dollars to the NDB Project Preparation Facility to support the business operation and long-term development of the bank. China will work with all parties to follow through on the outcomes and consensus achieved in the past, and make good use of existing mechanisms. Together, we must seize the historic opportunities of the new industrial revolution,

explore new areas and models of practical cooperation, and enhance our links to ensure sustained and steady progress of the BRICS cooperation mechanism.

Second. we need strengthen the complementarity of our development strategies.

Despite our differences in national conditions, our five countries are in a similar stage of development and share the same development goals. We all face an arduous task in growing the economy. Strengthening the complementarity of our development strategies will help bring out our comparative strengths in resources, market and labor force, and release the growth potential of the five countries and the creativity of our three billion people, opening up huge space for development.

We need to plan well at the macro level and take concrete actions in key areas. Acting in the spirit of extensive consultation. contribution ioint

shared benefits, we need to identify those areas where our development policies and priorities converge, and continue to work toward the goal of connectivity in trade and investment, currency and finance, and infrastructure. With a focus on structural reform and sustainable development, we need to expand our converging interests and share experience on innovation, entrepreneurship, industrial development and production capacity to boost our respective economic development. It is important to strike a balance between the speed of growth and the quality and efficiency of growth. By implementing the 2030 Sustainable Development Agenda, we have the opportunity to achieve balanced economic, social and environmental progress, and bring about interconnected and inclusive development.

Third, we need to make the international order more just and equitable. Our ever

closer ties with the rest of the world require that we play a more active part in global governance. Without our participation, many pressing global challenges cannot be effectively resolved. We should speak with one voice and jointly present our solutions to issues concerning international peace and development. This meets the expectation of the international community, and will help safeguard our common interests.

should We remain committed to multilateralism and the basic norms governing international relations, work for a new type of international relations, and foster a peaceful and stable environment for the development of all countries. We need to make economic globalization open, inclusive, balanced and beneficial to all, build an open world economy, support the multilateral trading regime and oppose protectionism. We need to advance the reform of global economic governance,


increase the representation and voice of emerging market and developing countries, and inject new impetus into the efforts to address the development gap between the North and South and boost global growth.

Fourth, we need to promote people-to-people exchanges. Amity between the people holds the key to sound stateto-state relations. Only with intensive care can the tree of friendship and cooperation grow luxuriant. Enhancing the exchanges among our peoples and seeing the spirit of partnership embraced by all is a worthy cause that deserves our enduring commitment. A job well done in this regard will keep BRICS cooperation vibrant.

We are pleased to note that the important consensus reached at the leadership level on closer people-topeople exchanges is being translated into reality. This year, people-to-people exchanges among our five countries have been in full swing, marked by the diverse

activities of the BRICS Games, the BRICS Film Festival, the BRICS Culture Festival and the High-level Meeting on Traditional Medicine. We hope that through our joint efforts, these activities will take place regularly and be institutionalized. We need to expand our outreach to get the public more involved and encourage more lively exchanges of diverse cultures.

The past decade has seen the unremitting efforts of BRICS countries in pursuing development and deepening partnership. It is but a beginning in the history of BRICS cooperation. As I said in my letters to you early this year, looking ahead, BRICS cooperation is set to achieve greater development and play an even bigger role in international affairs. Let us set sail from Xiamen and join hands to usher in the second "Golden Decade" of BRICS cooperation and deliver greater benefits to the people of our five countries and around the world.



World equities drop after North Korea's nuclear test

London

Global stock markets slid yesterday as investors sought safer bets after North Korea claimed to have tested a hydrogen bomb, one week after firing a ballistic missile over Japan.

Pyongyang on Sunday conducted its sixth nuclear test -- sparking further condemnation and a warning from US Defense Secretary Jim Mattis of a "massive military response" if the United States or its allies were attacked.

Asian stock markets slid along with the South Korean won currency, while the haven yen rallied as the news ramped up international tensions. European losses were less acute.

"Fresh North Korean tensions weigh on financial markets as the probability of a serious US military response escalates," VTB Capital analyst Neil MacKinnon said.

US President Donald Trump stands ready to use the country's "full range of diplomatic, conventional, and nuclear capabilities" if North Korea continues to threaten it or its allies, the White House said Sunday.

Trump denounced the test, tweeting that the time for

"appeasement" was over and threatening drastic economic sanctions, including "stopping all trade with any country doing business with North Korea".

"It seems (North Korean leader) Kim Jong-un shows no signs of conciliation," said Greg McKenna, chief market strategist at AxiTrader.

North Korea "seems hellbent on either goading the United States, and its president, into a response or what it thinks will be an embarrassing backdown", he added.

Provocation

On equity markets Seoul shed 1.2 per cent and Japan's Nikkei ended 0.9-percent down as the stronger yen hurt exporters. Hong Kong slipped 0.8pc and Sydney closed down 0.4pc, while Singapore gave up onepc.

"There has been a marked

increase in North Korean provocation in recent weeks with a series of missile tests being carried out in what is quite clearly a deliberate escalation of international tensions," added XTB analyst David Cheetham.

"The latest drill caused a 6.3 magnitude earthquake that shook North Korea following the detonation of the country's strongest nuclear weapon which was almost 10 times more powerful than the

Sunday's test was of a device that could be mounted on an intercontinental missile capable of reaching the United States, North Korea claimed.

"It's expected this latest North Korea aggression, could further intensify geopolitical tensions," said Stephen Innes, head of Asia-Pacific trading at OANDA.

"The key now is how the international community will respond given how ineffective the tightened UN sanctions have been at discouraging North Korea's ambitions." (AFP)

Battling to thwart diesel bans, Merkel throws in the cash

Chancellor Angela Merkel yesterday pledged a billion euros to help German cities fight air pollution caused by dirty diesel cars. The public health threat posed by nitrogen oxides (NOx) emissions came to the fore after Germany's biggest carmaker Volkswagen admitted in September 2015 to fitting millions of cars worldwide with illegal devices to cheat pollution tests.



Following a meeting with 30 mayors whose cities or towns are threatening diesel bans, Merkel said she would double the financial aid from a previously announced 500 million euros (\$600 million) to stave off the threat of an all-out ban against diesel vehicles.

Election looming

With elections looming on September 24, Merkel and other politicians have a tight-rope to walk between balancing public health safety and securing millions of jobs in the vital automobile sector.

"Half of the sum will be at the charge of automobile manufacturers and the other half the federal state."



The immediate priority is to "prevent driving bans", stressed Merkel, mindful she has to protect the crucial industrial sector whose global titans like VW, Audi, Mercedes and BMW earn billions of euros in exports and employ between 800,000 and 900,000 people.

'PRETEND-SOLUTIONS

VW in 2015 admitted having fitted 11 million diesel engines with "defeat devices" to cheat on emissions tests and has agreed to pay \$4.3 billion in penalties and \$17.5bn in civil settlements in the United States.

Car chancellor'

Merkel was dubbed the "car chancellor" in 2013 after she went to bat for the sector and argued against an EU cap on emissions. She has also spoken out against costly hardware fixes for diesel engines, and refused to commit to a date by which Germany should phase out fossil fuel-powered cars, as Britain and France have vowed to do by 2040.



rench oil giant Total said yesterday it has agreed to sell its remaining stake in a Norwegian oil field to Kuwait so that it can focus on its recent acquisition of Denmark's Maersk Oil.

"Total has signed an agreement to divest its remaining 15-percent interest in the Gina Krog field in Norway to Kuwait Foreign Petroleum Exploration Company (KUFPEC)," Total said in a statement.

"In the framework of our

portfolio management and optimization of the allocation of capital, we have decided to fully divest our interest in the Gina Krog project and focus on other opportunities in Norway," said Total's head of exploration and production, Arnaud Breuillac.

"With the recent acquisition of Maersk Oil & Gas, the group's position in the North Sea will be significantly strengthened, in particular in Norway." Total announced on August 21 that it would buy Maersk Oil for \$7.45 billion

(6.35 billion euros), making it the second-largest operator in the North Sea, with substantial operations in Britain, Norway and Denmark

For its part, KUFPEC said said the deal was valued at \$317 million. Total already sold a 15-percent stake Gina Krog to Kuwait in 2016. It put the combined value of both that deal and the latest one at more than \$600 million.

The Gina Krog field is situated in the North Sea and is controlled by Norwegian giant Statoil. (*AFP*)

Washington state's Boeing subsidies are legal: WTO

ubsidies given by the US state Oof Washington to Boeing are legal, the World Trade Organisation appeals body said yesterday, partially overturning a victory by rival Airbus and the European Union last year.

The two aviation giants have been locked for years in a sprawling set of disputes at the Geneva-based WTO.

Monday's ruling concerns the so-called "baby Boeing" case, which relates only to tax breaks and other incentives provided by Washington State to the American aircraft maker.

Last November WTO judges found that one of the subsidies Washington State offered to support production of Boeing's 777X jet was "prohibited" as they encouraged the use of domestic materials, and thus caused trade distortions

The United States, acting on behalf of Boeing, appealed the decision and secured an outright victory that is not subject to further appeal, the WTO ruling

"The WTO has rejected yet another of the baseless claims the EU has made," Boeing said in a statement.

Workers are demanding an hourly wage of £10 (\$13, 11 euros), union recognition and an end to zero-hours contracts, under which employees are required to be

When the new concept car arrives at Frankfurt it'll be our second glimpse at a car filed away under Merc's new 'EQ' electric mobility sub-brand, following on from the Generation EQ concept revealed at the Paris Motor Show last year.

This teaser image hints strongly at the design of the new all-electric concept, which cuts a different character to the Generation EQ concept from last year. 



Voice assistants promise a lightfingered future

Berlin

Tomorrow's digital
interface may be even
more revolutionary than
the pinching, tapping and
scrolling heralded by the
smartphone: voice commands
promise to unify and tame
our digital lives.

Tiny speakers visible at every stand at Berlin's IFA electronics fair, most of them endowed with a feminine voice, are the ears and mouths of the new artificial intelligences.

Things haven't quite reached the fever pitch of 2013's "Her", Spike Jonze's film in which Joaquin Phoenix falls in love with an operating system voiced by Scarlett Johansson.

But industry experts and salespeople paint a glowing picture of a future home in which an artificial intelligence (AI)-powered butler will cater to consumers' every need via networked appliances.

"This technology is about to play a huge role in our lives. The main question

for manufacturers is what technical solution will make it as intuitive as possible," said Martin Boerner, vicepresident of Germany's information technology industry federation Bitkom.

Industry giants like Google, Amazon, Samsung and Microsoft are battling it out to produce the most responsive voice-controlled AIs, aiming to reduce the amount of time we spend tapping buttons or swiping through lists on our smartphones.

Many users check their phones 200 or even 300 times a day, Sony Mobile France chief executive Jean Raoul de Gelis pointed out, meaning that "above all, voice controls free up our hands" for other tasks.

As well as giving our thumbs a break, the new interfaces will, their makers hope, take the load off our brains as well, learning our habits and routines and working out what we want and need from them.

"The ultimate goal is

that you are unaware of the technology. Nobody wants to programme the floor cleaner robot's duty schedule for the week. Automation needs to become as tactful and perceptive as a butler," said Paul Gray of consultancy IHS.

Al has landed

Google and Amazon overshadow IFA despite their absence, with exhibitors of TVs, home appliances or sound systems proudly declaring partnerships with one or the other.

Research firm Gartner expects the connected speaker market to grow to 3.5 billion dollars worldwide by 2021, from 360 million in 2015.

As the objects' design remains perhaps too self-consciously high-tech for many people's kitchens or bedside tables, the smartphone is likely to remain the mouthpiece of the AIs for some time yet.

Google, Amazon's Alexa, Samsung's Bixby, Microsoft's Cortana and Apple's Siri are all jostling for space in consumers' imaginations.

Google has a big advantage with its Android phones in billions of pockets around the world, but a competitor like Amazon could end up on top of the wide-open market for home automation -- from kitchen to car, via the thermostat and the front door lock.

Bound together

But building this densely-networked future environment will bring new challenges for technology companies.

They will have to work together more closely to maintain the illusion of effortlessness for users, most of whom won't be prepared to outfit their entire life with one brand's devices.

At present, buyers have a hard time figuring out which devices are compatible with which others -- prompting manufacturers to push for a

standard protocol, a universal language that would allow appliances to communicate.

Girl 'got into my car', says kidnap suspect

The man charged with kidnapping a nine-year-old French girl during a wedding in the Alps has admitted during police questioning that she got into his car but denies abducting her, his lawyer said yesterday.

A week after Maelys de Araujo went missing in the eastern village of Pontde-Beauvoisin, a 34-yearold man was remanded in custody Sunday on charges of "kidnapping, illegal confinement or arbitrary detention".

The man was a guest at the wedding that Maelys was attending with her parents when she went missing in the early hours of Sunday, August 27

Her DNA was found in his car, which was parked next to the community hall where the celebrations were held and was cleaned the day after.

The suspect's lawyer Bernard Meraud said his client told police that Maelys "got into his car with a little boy, onto the back seat, to see if his (the suspect's) dog was in the boot."

Meraud confirmed that a trace of her DNA had been found on the dashboard but

Philippines probes second police killing of teenager

Philippine authorities said yesterday they would investigate allegations police tortured and murdered a second teenager following an earlier killing that sparked the largest street protests so far against President Rodrigo Duterte's war on drugs.

Police said they shot and killed Carl Angelo Arnaiz, 19, as he robbed a taxi driver with a handgun in northern Manila on August 17.

The young man's parents dispute the police account. On Monday the justice ministry ordered an official investigation, said Justice Secretary Vitaliano Aguirre.

autopsy appears contrary to the police allegation that he (Arnaiz) had allegedly fought back," Aguirre told reporters.

A forensic examination by a government agency which provides legal services to the poor found that Arnaiz was tortured and shot dead while handcuffed.

"He was beaten up, his body was full of welts, he had a black eye, gashes as well as handcuff marks," Public Attorney's Office chief pathologist Erwin Erfe told reporters, adding that bullet trajectories suggested Arnaiz was shot while

Hong Kong Airlines flight makes emergency landing

Aflight Made an emergency landing in northern Japan Monday after the cabin started to de-pressurise, a government official said, adding that no one was hurt in the incident.

The Airbus A330 jet, which was carrying 223 passengers and 12 crew members, took off from New Chitose Airport, the main gateway to the northern Japanese island of Hokkaido, at 5:07 pm (0807 GMT).

At 5:36 pm, the pilot reported that the flight

needed to return to the airport because of sudden decompression, a Japanese transport ministry official

The pilot, who declared it an emergency, landed in New Chitose at 6:36 pm, the official said, adding that the cause behind the loss in pressure was not immediately clear.

"We have been told that oxygen masks did not come down," the official said, adding that this might mean the severity of decompression was not critical enough to automatically deploy the

Brazil breaks up int'l cocaine ring, say police

Sao Paulo

Brazilian police fanned out across five states and the capital early Monday to smash an international drugs trafficking ring that allegedly shipped six tons of cocaine to Europe in the last year alone.

More than 800 officers deployed to serve 127 arrest warrants and 190 search warrants in the operation centered on Latin America's biggest city, Sao Paulo, police said in a statement.



Humanitarian crisis looms as Rohingya flee

Nearly 90,000 Rohingya have fled to Bangladesh since violence erupted in Myanmar in August, pressuring aid agencies helping hundreds of thousands of refugees suffering from previous spasms of violence

Bangladesh authorities have forced more than 2,000 Rohingya to leave a remote island where they were hiding out after fleeing violence in Myanmar, officials said yesterday.

The United Nations says 87,000 mostly Rohingya refugees have poured over the border into Bangladesh since the latest round of fighting broke out 10 days ago in Myanmar's neighbouring Rakhine state.

The vast majority have entered overland or by crossing the Naf border river. But as desperation grows, some are braving the open seas to reach the small island of St Martin's nine kilometres (around six miles) off Bangladesh's coast.

Officials said the island's 9,000 residents, who share close cultural ties with the Rohingya and speak a similar language, had been hiding around 2,000 recent arrivals but were ordered to give them

The Rohingya are a mainly

Muslim stateless ethnic minority who according to rights groups have faced decades of persecution in mainly Buddhist Myanmar.

The head of the local council Noor Ahmad said mosque loudspeakers were used to ask residents to hand Rohingya arrivals over to the coast guard.

"They told us to help find the Rohingya by any means and bring them to the coast guard camp," said Ahmad.

Another elected official, Farid Ahmed, said 2,011 Rohingya including children were rounded up at the coast guard headquarters on Sunday evening and taken away.

children "Rohingya were crying. But it is the government order. What can we do?" Ahmed said.

"They (Rohingya) said, where should we go? They (Myanmar forces) were killing us there. Our houses were burnt. They were firing at us.'

Both men said the Rohingya had been taken back to Myanmar on boats.

One senior security official who spoke to AFP on condition of anonymity said the Rohingya were taken back at night under escort from border security forces.

Bangladesh coast guards have intercepted and turned away hundreds more refugees as they tried to approach the island, the official said.

Bangladesh was already home to around 400,000 Rohingya before the current crisis and has made clear it does not want to take in more.

But it has been unable to stem the flow of refugees desperate to escape renewed violence in Rakhine state, where they say their community has suffered massacres at the hands of Buddhist mobs and the military.

Officials said the 2,011 Rohingya on the island had all arrived in the last few days.

"They were in different places in Saint Martin's island and they were herded together," said district administrator Ali Hossain.

Yangon

peace laureate Nobel peace laureate Malala Yousafzai and mainly Muslim countries in Asia led a growing chorus of criticism yesterday aimed at Myanmar and its civilian leader Aung San Suu Kyi over the plight of the Rohingya Muslim minority.

Suu Kyi, a former political prisoner of Myanmar's junta, has come under increasing fire over her perceived unwillingness to speak out

against the treatment of the Rohingya or chastise the military.

She has made no public comment since the latest fighting broke out on August

"Every time I see the news, my heart breaks at the suffering of the Rohingya Muslims in Myanmar,' Pakistani activist Yousafzai, who famously survived being shot in the head by the Taliban, said in a statement on Twitter.

"Over the last several years I have repeatedly condemned this tragic and shameful treatment. I am still waiting for my fellow Nobel laureate Aung San Suu Kyi to do the same," she added.

Malaysian Foreign Minister Anifah Aman also questioned Suu Kvi's silence.

"Very frankly, I am dissatisfied with Aung San Suu Kyi," Anifah said.

"(Previously) she stood up for the principles of human rights. Now it seems she is doing nothing.'

The Maldives announced on Monday that it was severing all trade ties with the country "until the government of Myanmar takes measures to prevent the atrocities being committed against Rohingya Muslims", the foreign ministry said in a statement.

Indonesia's

Minister Retno Marsudi met Suu Kyi as well as Myanmar's army chief General Min Aung Hlaing in Naypyidaw on Monday in a bid to pressure the government to do more to alleviate the crisis.

"Once again, violence, this humanitarian crisis has to stop immediately," Indonesian President Joko Widodo told reporters on Sunday as he announced Retno's mission.

Pakistan's foreign ministry said it was "deeply concerned over reports of growing number of deaths and forced displacement of Rohingya Muslims" and urged Myanmar to investigate reports of atrocities against the community.

Iranian Foreign Minister Javad Zarif added in a recent tweet: "Global silence on continuing violence against #Rohingya Muslims. Int'l action crucial to prevent further ethnic cleansing - UN must rally." (AFP)

World Cup: Syria, China eye to pull off a miracle

war-torn Syria as well as China, the ultimate sleeping giants, are both aiming to pull off a near-miracle as Asian qualifying for the 2018 World Cup heads into a final showdown today.

Among Asia's heavyweights, Australia's progress is far from assured and South Korea are in danger of missing out on their first World Cup since 1982 in what will be a nail-biting last round of group games.

Perhaps indicating rising standards in the region, competition for Asia's 4.5 places at next year's Russia World Cup has been unusually intense, with only Japan and Iran qualified so far.

Group A is particularly unpredictable as South Korea, Syria, Uzbekistan and Marcello Lippi's China remain in the running for either the second automatic berth, or a place in the play-offs by finishing

Syria, despite playing their home games in Malaysia to avoid their country's bitter civil war, occupy the play-off spot after a win and a draw against China, wins over Uzbekistan and Qatar, and draws with South Korea and Iran.

fixture -- away to Iran, who are yet to concede a goal -- as they look to stay ahead of Uzbekistan and China, and perhaps even leap-frog South Korea into second place.

Chinese success would be just as eyecatching if they manage to rise from fifth in the group to snatch a play-off spot and stay in the hunt for just their second World Cup appearance.

China were largely written off after defeats to South Korea, Syria and Uzbekistan, but they are reborn since Lippi's

arrival last October, winning twice to keep their hopes just about alive. If they beat Qatar handily,

and South Korea and Iran win against Uzbekistan and Syria respectively, 77th-ranked China can celebrate a major boost in their grand plan to become one of the world's top football nations.

"I always my

chance, we have no reason to give up," Lippi said, after last week's 1-0 win against Uzbekistan.

South Korea, looking to hang onto second place in Group A, should be favourites against Uzbekistan but they are playing in Tashkent and against a team still smarting from their defeat to China.

Uzbekistan have a torrid history against the Koreans, who beat them to an automatic qualifying spot for both the 2006 and 2014 World Cups. The Uzbeks lost in

World number one Rafael Nadal notched up his 50th win at the US Open yesterday to reach the quarter-

finals for the seventh time. The two-time champion. who could meet old rival Roger Federer in New York

for the first time at the semifinal stage, crushed Ukraine's Alexander Dolgopolov 6-2, 6-4, 6-1.

The 31-year-old Spaniard goes on to face either 19-yearold Andrey Rublev of Russia or Belgian ninth seed David Goffin for a place in the last-four.

'I played a solid match with not many mistakes," said Nadal, the reigning French Open champion.

"He's a player who can play amazing shots but sometimes he can be very unpredictable with errors so I just waited for my opportunity.'

Nadal, the 2010 and 2013 champion in New York, showed no signs of the struggles that bedeviled him in the two previous rounds, when he dropped the opening set before prevailing in four.

His 23 winners on Monday were just shaded by world number 64 Dolgopolov's 25 but the Ukrainian's 39 unforced errors were more than three times those committed by Nadal.
