Brave Combat Federation has announced to feature women's strawweight bout in the eleventh edition of the event hosted in Brazil.

Luana Pinheiro will face Elaine Leal in the strawweight division. This also marks Pinheiro and Leal as the first women fighters signed from Brazil.

Luana Pinheiro is an MMA fighter out of Belo Horizonte, Brazil and has a record of five victories out of six appearances.

While Elaine Leal is more experienced with nine professional bouts in her career and has won five fights.

Brazil has hosted three Brave events and is one of the destinations that closely follow the sport of Mixed Martial Arts.

The event marks the first time female fighters are included in a Brave card in Brazil

Earlier in 2018, the efforts of the Kingdom of Bahrain to promote and

bring forward female competitors in combat sports were appreciated by multiple international organisations.

In 2017, IMMAF World Championships, Bahrain's first female competitors Fatema Bureshaid and Hend Rezk competed against global competitors.

Bureshaid also became the first Bahraini female to be awarded an IMMAF medal and the first to wear a hijab in IMMAF competition.

Windies edge Zimbabwe

West Indies edged closer to a place in the 2019 World Cup when they defeated Zimbabwe by four wickets in the latest qualifying match yesterday.

Chasing 290 to win, the twotime champions reached their target with six balls to spare after surviving a worrying midinnings collapse.

The West Indies lead the Super Sixes qualifying table with six points but will still need to avoid defeat against Scotland on Wednesday in their last Super Sixes match to be sure of a place in next year's finals

Zimbabwe, on five points, can still make the 2019 finals by beating the UAE on Thursday

although the Scots, Ireland and Afghanistan all remain in contention for a spot in the showpiece in England and Wales.

Brendan Taylor top scored for Zimbabwe with 138 which included 20 boundaries and two sixes.

For the West Indies, Marlon Samuels smashed 86 off 80 balls with four sixes while Evin Lewis and Shai Hope also contributed half centuries. (*AFP*)
