Bahrain climbs to 61st position on 2023 passport index ranking

Five places better than first guarter of 2022, according to Henley Passport Index rating

ahrain has moved up five places on the global passport rankings for the first quarter of 2023, according to the latest Henley Passport Index rating.

The Kingdom now ranks 61st on the list of the strongest passports in the world, improving the 66th position it held last year.

In 2021, Bahrain ranked 69th, which means that the country has now climbed eight positions since then. Currently, the Bahrainis have visa-free access or visa-on-arrival to 87 destinations around the world.

The Henley Passport Index is the original and most authoritative passport index, with historical data spanning 18 years. The index and its contests are based on data provided by the International Air Transport Authority (IATA), supplemented, enhanced, and updated using extensive in-house research and open-source online data.

It ranks the world's passports according to the number of destinations their holders can access without a prior destinations. visa. The index consists of 199 different
