International community on high alert as Haniyeh killing threatens Mideast peace

ith the sudden escalation of tensions in the Mideast, following Israel's killing of Hamas' political leader Ismail Haniyeh while in Iran, world leaders yesterday called for cooler heads to prevail and avoid actions that would escalate the conflict.

The Israeli attack occurred at 2am local time while the Hamas leader was in Iran to attend the swearing-in of Iran's new President.

According to AFP reports citing Iranian media, the Israeli strike targeted special residences for war veterans in north Tehran where Haniyeh was staying.

An "official and public" funeral ceremony for Haniyeh will be held in Tehran today before his body is flown to Qatar, his base in recent years, for burial tomorrow, Hamas said.

UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres said the strike on Tehran, and another one on Tuesday in Beirut that killed a top Hezbollah commander, represented a "dangerous escalation".
