American F1 driver not a necessity, says McLaren's Brown

 ${f F}$ ormula One does not need an American driver to boost the rapid growth of the sport in the United States, McLaren Racing Chief Executive Zak Brown said yesterday.

Brown's comments follow the decision by Formula One's governing International Automobile Federation (FIA) not to relax its super-licence rules so that American IndyCar driver Colton Herta could race for Red Bull's AlphaTauri team next

"I think the sport is going to continue to grow in America with or without an American driver," Brown, an American himself, said ahead of this weekend's Singapore Grand Prix.a

"I think an American driver in the sport will be additive, but I don't think it's a necessity."

The US is a growing market for Formula One both in terms of viewership and money brought in by big corporate sponsors. Its commercial rights are owned by US-based Liberty Media.
