The 2023 FIA Formula 1 World Championship enters a new campaign this weekend, and teams who exceeded expectations last season have been buoyed by their performances and are ready to go one step further.

Bahrain International Circuit (BIC) hosts the season-opening F1 Gulf Air Bahrain Grand Prix from Friday to Sunday and all eyes will be set on Sakhir for a hugely exciting weekend.

The Alpine pair of Pierre Gasly and Esteban Ocon will hope that their all-French connection can spearhead the team to a top-three finish in the constructors' championship, following an impressive fourth place in 2022. And it all starts with a positive showing at BIC.
