# Winfred bags gold for Bahrain

Winfred bagged the gold medal in the women's 1,500 metres at the 19th Asian Games in Hangzhou, China, adding to her maiden world title and first-ever Diamond League champion's 3,000m steeplechase—won just several weeks prior.
