1. Opt for a broad-spectrum sunscreen with an SPF of 30 or higher.

2. Choose a waterproof or water-resistant sunscreen for extended outdoor activities.

3. Apply sunscreen generlips, back of the neck, and tops of the feet

4. Apply sunscreen at least sure to allow for proper absorption.

5. Reapply sunscreen every if swimming, exercising, or sweating profusely.
