Three dead after plane crashes in Australia bushfire fight

♦ Three people were killed after a light aircraft crashed in remote northern



Australia yesterday while helping in the battle against bushfires, emergency services said. The plane went down near the outback town of McKinlay, more than 1,600 kilometres (1,000 miles) northwest of Queensland's state capital Brisbane. It was being used for fire mapping, authorities said, as more than a dozen fires continue to burn across the state. "Terribly sad that

three brave souls working to help their fellow Australians have lost their lives in Queensland," Prime Minister Anthony Albanese posted on X.

Hamas health ministry says 15 killed at Gaza UN school in Israeli strike

The health ministry in Ha-▲ mas-run Gaza said at least 15 people were killed yesterday when a UN school sheltering thousands of displaced Palestinians was hit by an Israeli strike.

"The massacre at the Al-Fakhura school committed by the occupation (Israel) this morning left 15 martyrs and 70 wounded," ministry spokesman Ashraf al-Qudra told a press conference.

The United Nations agency for Palestinian refugees said its school is being used as a "shelter

for displaced families".

"At least one strike hit the school yard where there were tents for displaced families. Another strike hit inside the school where women were baking bread," UNRWA said.

There was no immediate comment from the Israeli military about hitting the school in Jabalia refugee camp, and AFP was unable to independently confirm the toll.

On Thursday, UNRWA said four of its schools in the Gaza Strip housing people displaced by the war had been damaged by bombings.

Blinken to visit Turkey after Israel, Jordan: statement

s Secretary of State Antony Uslinken will visit Turkey for two days from Sunday as part of a Middle East tour amid the Hamas-Israel war, the State Department said.

Blinken was meeting with Arab counterparts in the Jordanian capital Amman yesterday after visiting Israel the day before.

But he left Israel empty-handed on Friday after urging its leaders to do more to protect civilians in the Gaza Strip during Israel's war to destroy Hamas.

In Turkey, Blinken would "underscore the importance of
