'Trouble' for helping woman in labour pain

Arab woman on trial for unauthorised use of ID card in ambulance incident

An Arab woman who helped another Arab woman in labour to avail emergency ambulance service by providing her Central Population Registry (CPR) card, as the woman in pain didn't have one, is now facing a trial for alleged misuse of the card.

The woman who provided the CPR card is 33 years old and is married to a Bahraini man while the woman who allegedly misused it is aged 31 years. Prosecution has alleged that the woman who helped had handed over her identity card without her husband's knowledge so as to help the woman in labour pain to complete the procedure for an ambulance transfer to Salmaniya Medical Complex. Both the women are now facing charges as prosecution is considering the case as misuse of the ID card.

It was on February 20, 2020

that the alleged incident took place in the security district of the Capital governorate. The prosecution has alleged that the woman who was in labour pain, who is named as the first defendant, maliciously used a valid identification card in the name of the other Arab woman, who is named as the second defendant, and benefited from it without justification by presenting it to personnel employed by the Sal-

maniya Medical Complex.

The woman who helped the woman in labour pain is now charged with complicity and assistance in misusing the valid identification card that belonged to her by handing it over to the first defendant for unauthorized use and benefit.

On the day of the alleged incident, the husband of the woman who helped received a phone call from the police at the Sal-

maniya Medical Complex asking him to come and register a newborn under his name. The husband allegedly told the police that what they are saying is not true and that he has no relation to the newborn. His wife was with him and it could not be her that delivered the child, the husband allegedly told the police.

As per the prosecution's case, it was revealed during investigation that the second defendant handed over the identity card due to humanitarian reasons to be used for availing the ambulance service.

The second defendant's lawyer has contended before the court that humanitarian considerations drove his client's actions. The first defendant was in a critical condition and his client wanted to save the woman and the unborn child as she saw that the woman was in labour pain and there was loss of blood, the lawyer has contended.

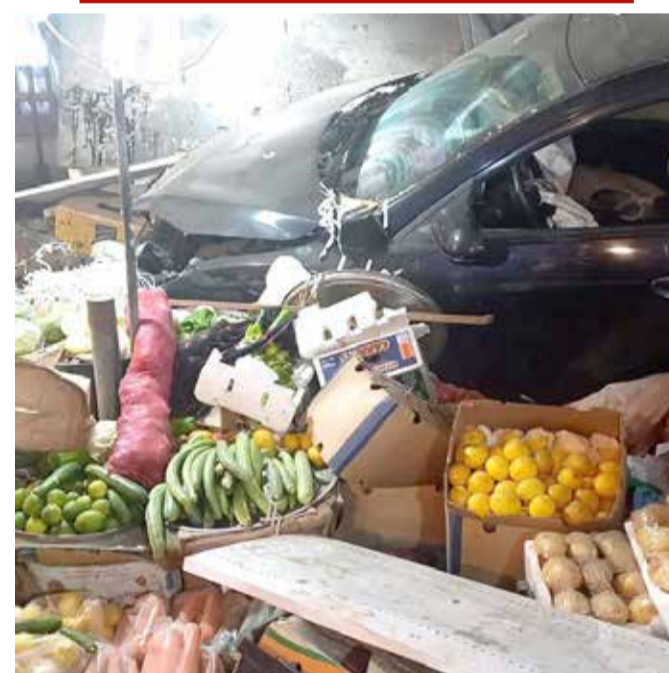

April hearing set for closing arguments in troublemaker's case

The High Appeals Court has scheduled a court hearing on April 24, 2023 to hear the closing arguments in the case of a troublemaker who was arrested from one of the commercial malls in the Kingdom last May.

According to court files, the GCC citizen was previously sentenced to one year of imprisonment for verbally and physically assaulting two policemen while he was resisting arrest.

"The Court convicted the accused of assaulting the two policemen while they were performing their duties, causing them the injuries described in the forensic report. The assault did not lead to their illness or their inability to work for a period of more than 20 days, and the accused also insulted both policemen," the Court stated.

The case occurred at one of the commercial malls in the Kingdom, where the appellant, along with others, fellow GCC

citizens, were stopped by the mall's security guards for their chaotic behaviour.

The guards notified the police and the two policemen, the victims in this case, reported to the scene. Two of the troublemakers were arrested by the cops and kept in the police vehicle to be taken to the police station for further investigation.

According to the policemen's testimony, the appellant opened the doors of the police vehicle, where the two arrestees were, without permission. When one of the policemen prevented him, he verbally abused him and shoved him in his chest.

The other policeman then interfered and sprayed the appellant in the face using pepper spray. However, the assailant resisted arrest and kicked the policeman in the chest. He was eventually controlled and taken into custody, and later trialed and sentenced to one year behind bars.

Verdict set for young Bahraini man accused of killing brother

● **October 30: Date of ruling**

The High Appeals Court, following several hearings, is set to deliver its ruling on the appeal made by a young Bahraini man accused of killing his own brother.

The defendant, who was previously convicted and sentenced to life in prison, has been seeking to overturn the verdict. The court has now scheduled October 30 as the date when the ruling will be announced.

Initially, the defendant de-
