F-15 fighters arrive in Middle East: US military

American F-15 fighter planes arrived in the Middle East on Thursday, the US military said, after Washington announced the deployment of additional assets to the region in a warning to Iran.

"Today, US Air Force F-15E Strike Eagles from the 492nd Fighter Squadron, RAF Lakenheath, England, arrive in the US Central Command area of responsibility," the military command responsible for the Middle East said on social media.

The United States announced on November 1 that it was sending bombers, fighter and tanker aircraft and ballistic missile defense destroyers to the Middle East.

"Should Iran, its partners, or its proxies use this moment to target American personnel or interests in the region, the United States will take every measure necessary to defend our people," Pentagon spokesman Major General Pat Ryder said in a statement on the deployment.

President-elect Trump at 301 electoral votes, Harris at 226

The final state calls are coming in for the US presidential election, with President-elect Donald Trump at 301 electoral votes, well past the 270 needed for victory, and Democratic Vice President Kamala Harris at 226, US networks said.

Nevada was the latest to be called Friday, with six electoral votes going to Trump -- yet another flip of a swing state that voted for Joe Biden in 2020.

US media have declared Trump the winner in more than half of the 50 states, including key battlegrounds Georgia, Pennsylvania, Michigan and Wisconsin, all of which voted Democratic in the last election.

Extra time for work permits

MPs push to give employers a lifeline for work permit renewals

Parliament Proposal: MPs propose a 30-day grace period for work permit renewals to prevent employer penalties.

Government Pushback: Authorities argue it contradicts the labour law's focus on prioritizing Bahraini workers.

Business Support: Bahrain Chamber backs the grace period, calling for a fair penalty system and improved notifications for employers.

Missed Work Permit Renewal Deadline? Missing the renewal deadline for a work permit can have serious consequences, potentially leaving workers in an illegal status.

However, Bahraini parliamentarians believe they have a solution to this unintentional oversight. A proposal scheduled for discussion in the upcoming parliamentary session suggests granting employers a 30-day grace period to renew work permits.

The government, however, opposes the idea, labelling it unnecessary, given that employers

already receive a six-month advance notice regarding renewals. This stance comes with a cautionary note from the Ministry of Labour, which warns that administrative fines will apply to any employer found in breach of the law, including those employing domestic workers.

On the other hand, the Bahrain Chamber of Commerce and Industry supports the bill, stating that it benefits employers.

Penalties and Legal Basis

Parliamentarians assert that Tuesday's discussion aims to help employers avoid penalties

outlined in Article 36 of the Labour Market Regulatory Law No. 19 of 2006. Citing Clause (d) of Article 13 of the Constitution of the Kingdom of Bahrain, they believe the proposal could reduce the number of legal actions against employers.

According to MPs, providing employers with additional time could prevent inadvertent violations that may disrupt business activities.

Contradictions and Concerns

The government contends that the MPs' proposal contradicts the core objectives of

the Labour Market Regulatory Law, which prioritizes Bahraini workers. Additionally, the government emphasizes that fees collected under this law fund training and employment programs for national workers.

They also warn that the proposal could lead to practical challenges, including an increase in informal employment. Furthermore, the government argues that the grace period could hinder hiring processes while permits are being renewed.

Additionally, foreign work permits are already regulated by Decision No. 76 of 2008 and its amendments, which govern permit renewals.

LMRA Statistics

The Labour Market Regulatory Authority (LMRA) notes the difficulty in tracking delayed renewals, as renewal status fluctuates daily and hourly. Each work permit expires after a set duration, after which the worker may leave the country, apply for a new permit with a different employer, or continue working legally in other permitted scenarios. As such, accurately quantifying expired permits awaiting renewal is practically unfeasible.

Support from the Chamber

The Bahrain Chamber of Commerce and Industry, in agreement with the MPs, also suggested additional legal amendments on the issue. They recommended a review of the employer notification system at the authority and advocated for a graduated approach to penalties for employers.



LMRA reported issuing 503,000 work permits in 2021, 568,000 in 2022, and 460,000 from January to October of 2023.

No more need for husband's consent

Shura Council Seeks to end need for husband's approval in women's business

Opening a Shop Without a Husband's Approval?

If married, a woman cannot even entertain such thoughts, as the current law does not grant her that freedom.

But not for long, say Shura Council members who are aiming to

change this situation.

Members of the Shura Council are advocating for married

women in the Kingdom to have the freedom to run their own businesses independently.

Shura Council members, including Dr. Fatima Al Koohaji, Dr. Mohammed Ali, Redha Faraj, Hala Ramzi, and Ejlal Bubaishat, have proposed a plan to repeal Article 14, a rule in Bahrain's trade laws since 1987 that requires a husband's approval

for a married woman to engage in business.

Experts believe this amendment would promote gender equality in business, empowering married women to make independent choices. They note that Bahrain's neighbours, like the UAE, have recently granted married women equal rights in business ownership.

Global food prices reach 18-month high: FAO

Global food prices rose in October to their highest level in 18 months, with a sharp increase in the cost of vegetable oil, the Food and Agriculture Organization said yesterday.

The FAO Food Price Index, which tracks monthly changes in international prices of a basket of food commodities, reached 127.4 points last month, a two-percent increase from September.

It was the highest since April 2023 but still 20.5 percent lower than the peak reached in March 2022 following Russia's invasion of agricultural powerhouse Ukraine.

Vegetable oil prices increased by 7.3 percent in October, reaching a two-year high due to lower production.

Sugar prices rose 2.6 percent, dairy was up 2.5 percent and cereals gained 0.8 percent.

Meat was the only commodity to fall, down 0.3 percent from the previous month.

Gaza dead over 6 months shows 'nearly 70%' women, children

The UN condemned yesterday the staggering number of civilians killed in Israel's war in Gaza, with women and children comprising nearly 70 percent of the thousands of fatalities it had managed to verify.

In a fresh report, the United Nations human rights office detailed the "horrific reality" that has unfolded for civilians in both Gaza and Israel since Hamas's attack in Israel on October 7, 2023.

The rights office said it had now managed to verify 8,119 of the more than 34,500 people reportedly killed during the first six months of the war in Gaza, finding "close to 70 percent to be children and women".

Of the verified fatalities, 3,588 of them were children and 2,036 were women, the report said.

Bahrain strengthens diplomatic ties with Kazakhstan by opening a school in Astana

The Kingdom of Bahrain has officially unveiled a new international school in Astana, Kazakhstan, marking a significant diplomatic and educational investment.

Funded by Bahrain's Royal Humanitarian Foundation (RHF), the school aims to set a new standard in the region, offering a curriculum that integrates academic rigor with a global perspective. Bahraini officials and Kazakh dignitaries attended the opening, lauding the project as a symbol of strong ties between the two nations.

tion (RHF) signed an agreement with Kazakh authorities to fund and construct the school. This agreement solidified Bahrain's support for educational development in Astana, with the school now set to serve as a model for

international academic excellence in Kazakhstan.

The school's curriculum emphasizes not only core academic subjects but also fosters cultural exchange, equipping students with skills essential for a globalized world. Its modern facilities include advanced technology labs, athletic spaces, and community-focused learning areas, designed to support both academic achievement and personal growth.

For Kazakhstan, this development aligns with Astana's vision of becoming a regional leader in education and innovation.

Bahraini leaders highlighted that the initiative underscores Bahrain's commitment to promoting social impact abroad, emphasizing education's role in long-term, cross-cultural partnerships.

Missed World Cup tea delivery

Court orders businesswoman to payback BD10,000 advance

A businesswoman has been ordered to repay BD10,000 after failing to deliver a shipment of Sri Lankan tea in time for the recent World Cup, a case that has now seen her appeal rejected by the Cassation Court.

The dispute began when the plaintiff agreed to purchase the tea for BD 23,000, paying an upfront deposit of BD 10,000. The shipment, however, failed to arrive as planned, with the tea intended for sale during the high-profile sporting event.

The defendant, the owner of a trading company, argued that the plaintiff had refused delivery and claimed the agreement did not specify a delivery date linked to the World Cup. But witnesses testified that the defendant, through her husband, had offered tea samples specifically for sale during the tournament.

They further insisted that the agreement clearly stipulated

the remaining BD 13,000 was due upon delivery, which was to happen before the World Cup's opening. The defendant's witnesses countered, arguing that no explicit delivery date was ever mentioned.

In a decisive ruling, the lower court sided with the plaintiff, stating that the agreement was clearly intended for the World Cup period. This finding was upheld by the Cassation Court,

confirming the businesswoman's obligation to return the advance payment.

The case highlights the importance of clear contractual terms, particularly when deadlines are tied to high-profile events.

The businesswoman's appeal may have failed, but the ruling ensures that the plaintiff will be compensated for the missed deal.

Man steals jewellery with fake payment app

Court awards 5 Years and BD2,000 Fine

A man has been sentenced to five years in jail and fined BD2,000 after being caught orchestrating a clever scam at several jewellery stores in the Capital Governorate. The defendant, whose name remains undisclosed, used a fake digital payment app to deceive sales staff into believing they had received payment for expensive jewellery.

According to the Fourth Minor Criminal Court, the man convinced the shop attendants that the transaction had been completed, only to walk away with the valuable items.

Unbeknownst to the staff, no money was ever transferred, and the suspect proceeded to sell the stolen jewellery at other shops for a quick profit.

The man's fraudulent actions were not limited to one store.

Between 14 September and 10 October of this year, he managed to fool staff at multiple jewellery outlets using the same scam.

Police have tied him to five separate cases filed with the Capital Governorate Police Directorate.

After the thefts were re-

ported, the Public Prosecution swiftly launched an investigation, which led to an arrest warrant and the eventual capture of the suspect.

The court has now delivered its verdict, sentencing the man to five years in prison and ordering a fine of BD2,000 for his role in the elaborate scam.

Low-flung cables haunt Muharraq residents

Outdated internet cables threaten safety in Muharraq's historic lanes

Decades-old internet cables, once used by neighbours to share connections, now hang dangerously lower across narrow lanes in Muharraq's historic districts. In Blocks 203, 205, 206, and 209, these low-hanging wires are becoming a safety hazard for children and a breeding ground for rats and insects.

"Locals have raised concerns about the growing pest problem and safety risks," said Councillor Dalal Al Moqahwi. "The cables are not only a danger but also tarnish the distinctive 'firjan'



character of Muharraq's old city."

Many of these cables were in-

stalled over 20 years ago by residents who shared their internet connections. With time, they've



become a visible eyesore, hanging at head height across the neighbourhood.

Recognising the seriousness of the issue, the municipal council has called for urgent action.

At a recent meeting, members urged a collaborative effort with the Ministry of Municipalities Affairs, Civil Defence, and the Health Ministry to locate and remove the most hazardous cables.

The team will also evaluate which cables are most at risk of causing harm and may require protective coverings.

Al Moqahwi stressed the importance of acting swiftly to prevent further danger to residents. "As Bahrain works to revitalise Muharraq as a cultural and tourist hub, clearing these outdated cables is crucial to the area's renewal."

No more **midnight** calls

Shura members target telemarketing with tough new rules



If you're fed up with constant telemarketing calls, relief could be on the way. Bahrain is poised to join other GCC countries in taking action against these intrusive sales calls.

Legislators have tabled a proposal to regulate telemarketing practices and enhance consumer privacy. Under the

proposed rules, companies that fail to comply will face strict penalties, including warnings and, in severe cases, even the

risk of closure.

Shura Council members are set to vote on the proposal next Sunday, drawing inspiration from the UAE's policy, which limits marketing calls to the hours of 9 am to 6 pm.

This move comes as a response to the increasing number of complaints about unwanted calls disrupting daily life.

The proposal, spearheaded by Council members Lina Habib Qasim, Dr. Jehad Al Fadhel, Dalal Al Zayed, Hala Fayeze, and Hesham Al Qassab, outlines clear guidelines for telemarketing companies. Once approved, the Ministry of Industry and Commerce will oversee the implementation of the rules.

The proposal calls for companies to avoid contacting consumers at inappropriate hours, respect do-not-call requests, and ensure transparency by clearly identifying themselves and the purpose of their calls.

Countries like the UAE, Saudi Arabia, and Qatar already have similar regulations in place. The UAE, for example, restricts marketing calls to between 9 am and 6 pm and mandates that companies properly introduce themselves and respect consumers' privacy.



According to a study by the Consumer Federation of America, over 80% of Americans report receiving at least one telemarketing call a day, with many citing unwanted calls as a major source of annoyance and stress.

The Shura Council members backing this initiative believe these changes will create a more respectful marketplace for consumers and businesses alike.

100 days of annual leave, up from 75

Proposal in Parliament seeks to enhance worker welfare and flexibility

Government employees in Bahrain are set to benefit from an increase in annual leave, with a proposal to raise the current 75-day cap to 100 days. This proposal is currently under review in Parliament.

Under the existing Civil Service Law, employees are entitled to 30 days of leave per year, equating to 2.5 days per month, with a maximum cap of 75 days. MPs argue that increasing this limit would help address issues such as unpaid overtime and difficulties in securing time off.

Supporters of the change believe it would protect workers' rights, reduce stress, and ease the pressure on staff. The Legislative and Legal Affairs Committee, which has reviewed the proposal, agrees with these points. By increasing the cap, the committee believes workers will have more flexibility and

will be less likely to lose unused leave days. The proposal was

referred to the committee by Speaker Ahmed bin Salman Al Musallam in June.

The committee also asserts that this adjustment will help preserve full leave entitlements, ultimately improving staff morale and work efficiency across the public sector. They consulted with Legal Adviser Dr. Muhammad Al Tarawneh and gathered feedback from the Civil Service Bureau before reaching this conclusion.

However, the Civil Service Bureau has raised some concerns. Bureau officials warn that raising the leave cap could

lead to higher staffing costs and create discrepancies with the private sector, where the leave cap is set at 60 days. They also emphasized the importance of regular breaks for employee health and productivity, noting that time off helps reduce stress and rejuvenates workers.

Under the current policy, managers are responsible for ensuring employees take their leave within the prescribed limits, and unused leave cannot be cashed in unless the employee leaves their position.

Despite these concerns, the committee has formally recommended that Parliament approve the proposal, arguing that the benefits for worker welfare outweigh the potential costs. Committee chairman MP Mohsen Ali Al Asbool and lead reporter MP Ali Saqr Al Dosari both voiced strong support, calling the proposal a fair and necessary step towards enhancing workers' rights.

Parliament considers pension boost for retirees

A proposal to increase retirees' annual pensions using surplus funds from the unemployment account is currently under review by parliament.

A recent review revealed a surplus in the unemployment fund, which MPs believe could be redirected to support retirees without burdening Bahrain's main pension schemes.

The MPs leading the propos-

ratah, Zainab Abdulameer, and Ali Al Nuaimi—see the increase

as a way to share Bahrain's economic growth with retirees. They argue that the underused surplus could help retirees manage living costs and provide greater financial stability. MPs contend that this measure is necessary to help pensioners cope with rising living expenses and ensure they can maintain a decent standard of living amid inflation. The move aligns with constitutional principles aimed at supporting those facing old age or hardship.

Over 500 illegal bins removed from public roads

The Southern Municipality has removed more than 500 unauthorized clothing bins obstructing public roads. The operation, coordinated by the Ministry of Social Development and the Municipal Council, aimed to clear bins that were disrupting traffic and compromising pedestrian safety.

The authorities reported that it took approximately two months to remove the

illegal containers.

Municipal officials emphasized that clothing bins must have proper approvals before being placed in public spaces. They also noted that bins should only be positioned within the premises of the charity or organization requesting them.

This action aligns with Bahrain's Roads Law No. (2) of 1996, Article (4), which prohibits placing items such as tables, boxes, and stalls in public areas without prior clearance.

BD100,000 paid to settle medical error claims

Medical errors have cost Bahrain's public hospitals and primary care centers 100,000 dinars, according to the National Health Regulatory Authority (NHRA). This figure was disclosed in response to a parliamentary inquiry by MP Mahmood Fardan.

The NHRA emphasized that Bahrain's healthcare system operates under a framework designed to provide safe and reliable services. It also highlighted the established procedures in place to address claims of medical errors.

In its response, the NHRA noted that rigorous inspections are conducted to ensure high health

standards across both public and private healthcare providers in the Kingdom.

To protect patient rights, the NHRA has implemented measures aimed at reducing medical mishaps. However, it stressed that filing a complaint does not

automatically indicate a medical error, as determining whether an error has occurred is the responsibility of specialized technical groups.

Regarding the time taken to resolve complaints, the NHRA stated that the duration depends

on the complexity of the case. Several factors can influence the timeline, which in some instances can extend over several months.

The review process involves gathering medical records and

reports from healthcare providers. In certain cases, additional checks are conducted at the request of technical groups or judicial authorities.

Expert opinions are typically sought from consultants within the same medical specialty, and in more complex cases, multiple opinions may be required.

Moreover, the NHRA sends medical records for further review by a consultant, who presents their findings to a selected committee for discussion.

The NHRA explained that the review process may require additional input from other medical professionals, and a final decision on whether a medical error has occurred is only made after careful examination.



According to a 2020 study by the World Health Organization (WHO), medical errors are estimated to cause over 2.6 million deaths annually worldwide, making them one of the leading causes of death globally. In many countries, medical malpractice claims contribute to the financial burden on healthcare systems, with significant costs associated with settlements and legal proceedings.

Dawoodi Bohras join global leaders to address climate crisis

Losing trust could mean losing your seat

Shura Council proposes new rule for Municipal Councillors

A new proposal aiming to hold municipal councillors accountable in the same way as members of Bahrain's Parliament has been put forward.

If approved, it would mandate the removal of any councillor who loses public trust, mirroring the accountability standards of national lawmakers.

The proposal, led by Shura Council members Dalal Al Zayed, Dr. Ali Al Rumaihi, Adel Al Maawada, Dr. Abdulaziz Al Ajman, and Dr. Hani Al Saati, seeks to amend Article 16 of the Municipalities Law.

Currently, there is a gap in the law, as municipal councillors are not held to the same

standards as parliamentarians, leaving room for ambiguity regarding accountability.

The new law would distinguish between automatic removal, for basic breaches such as failing to meet membership requirements, and discretionary removal, where councillors could be dismissed for misconduct or neglect, with the decision left to their peers.

Shura members argue that the change will help restore public trust in local governance and ensure that municipal councils operate with the same integrity and transparency as the country's Parliament.

The proposal is now under review, and if passed, it will bring much-needed clarity to the nation's governing framework.

Health Ministry weighs plan for X-Ray department at Ibn Sina Medical Centre

The Ministry of Health is set to examine a proposal by MPs to open an X-ray department at the Ibn Sina Medical Centre.

The move aims to bring faster, more accessible imaging services to residents of the Capital Governorate's second constitu-

ency.

The proposal, led by MPs Ahmed Qarata, Hisham Al Awadhi, Mohammed Al Aliwi, Jameel Mullah Hassan, and Mohammed Al Rifai, is intended to relieve the growing strain on X-ray facilities at Al Naim Health Centre and Salmaniya Medical Complex, where patients currently face long waits.

In their explanatory note, the

MPs highlighted how this addition would support residents' health needs and reduce pressure on Bahrain's main healthcare facilities.

They emphasized the urgent requirement for more equipment and resources to meet the rising demands on local healthcare.

The Ministry of Health has confirmed it will review the

proposal with careful consideration, taking into account factors like population growth and space limitations within the Ibn Sina Medical Centre.

A final decision on the proposal is expected after a comprehensive evaluation, with the potential to reshape healthcare access for thousands in the area.

Parliament considers boosting marriage grants for widows

Parliament is set to debate a proposal to increase the marriage grant for widows and pension beneficiaries this Tuesday.

The proposed changes aim to extend the grant duration from 18 to 24 months, align-

ing it with the pension amount for that period. Additionally, the bill suggests raising the minimum grant to 1,000 dinars, up from the current 400 dinars.

The proposal draws on constitutional entitlements under Article 5(c) of Bahrain's Constitution, aiming to support widows, daughters, sis-

ters, and nieces with the financial burdens of daily life, particularly in the event of marriage.

Supporters argue that the current grant does not reflect inflation or the rising cost of living, pointing out that the law has not been updated since 1992.

However, the government has expressed concerns, warn-

ing that the amendment could strain the pension system, increase expenditures, and undermine the financial sustainability of the pension fund. It also noted that the change conflicts with Decree-Law No. 21 of 2020, which aims to safeguard pension funds.

Actuarial studies have cautioned against adding further

pension benefits, suggesting a cap on marriage grants to avoid discrepancies in payments.

The government also emphasized that the proposed law could disrupt the national budget and financial stability due to a lack of funding sources.

The Military Retirement Fund and the Supreme Council

for Women echoed these concerns, highlighting the potential negative impact on pension funds.

On the other hand, the Bahrain Women's Union supports the proposal, arguing that the law's outdated provisions no longer meet current economic conditions and need updating to better serve beneficiaries.

Should allowances count?

MPs eye exempting allowances from income assessments for low-income Bahraini families

In a key debate scheduled for Tuesday, Bahrain's House of Representatives will address a proposal to exclude allowances and bonuses when calculating applicants' monthly income for housing assistance programmes.

This proposal, championed by five MPs — Dr. Hisham Al Asheeri, Mohsen Al Asbool, Ahmed Qarata, Bader Al Tamimi, and Mahmoud Fardan — seeks to revise the current system, which they argue disqualifies many low-income families in need by including allowances that don't reflect their true financial situation.

The Ministry of Housing, however, has voiced caution, warning that passing the proposal could reduce loan amounts and even disqualify applicants from essential programs like Mazaya, which requires a minimum income of BD600.

Citing Ministerial Resolution No. 909 of 2015, the Ministry defended the existing income calculation method, asserting that including fixed allowances actually benefits applicants by raising the loan amounts available.

New bill proposes social security rise every three years, limits family support duty

A proposal aiming to boost social security payments by 10% every three years and limit family support obligations to financially capable, unmarried relatives is set for a parliamentary vote on Tuesday.

If approved, the amendment would provide regular increases in social security to help offset

the rising cost of living. It would also narrow the family support responsibility to only those un-

married relatives who have the financial means to assist.

Initially introduced in the Ser-

vices Committee in August 2023, the proposal has since been carefully reviewed in multiple

meetings. It has received backing from both the Legislative and Financial Affairs Committees, with the Services Committee strongly recommending its approval to benefit low-income families.

The amendment is based on Article 5(c) of the Constitution, which requires social security support for individuals facing hardship due to age, illness, or unemployment.

While the Ministry of Social Development supports the proposal's goals, it stated that the government's final stance is still pending. Comprehensive legal and economic evaluations were conducted to ensure the proposal's feasibility and alignment with social welfare goals.

With solid support from the Services Committee, the proposal is set for further discussion in Parliament on Tuesday.



News in brief

Irish president dissolves parliament ahead of November 29 election

Irish president, Michael D. Higgins, formally dissolved the country's parliament yesterday, kickstarting a three-week general election campaign that will end with voters heading to the polls on November 29. Irish prime minister Simon Harris's centre-right Fine Gael party has been tipped to win a fourth consecutive term. It shared power with another centre-right party, Fianna Fail, during the outgoing parliament, with the role of prime minister rotating between the two party leaders.

Russian prosecutors yesterday demanded a six-year prison sentence for a paediatrician accused of criticising the Ukraine campaign during a private appointment, in a case that has revealed the extent of repression gripping Russia.

Nadezhda Buyanova was reported to the police by the ex-wife of a soldier missing after fighting in Ukraine -- Anastasia Akinshina -- who accused her of calling the man a "legal target of Ukraine." The 68-year-old was arrested in February and has been in pre-trial detention since April.

Greece, Turkey agree to keep working on improving ties

The foreign ministers of Greece and Turkey yesterday agreed to continue improving their relations to boost trade and seek common ground on how to resolve their longstanding territorial differences. "We confirmed our will to maintain the (positive) climate we have managed to build," Greek Foreign Minister George Gerapetritis said. "I believe that we can resolve our differences with our neighbour Greece with mutual respect and on the basis of international law," added his visiting counterpart Hakan Fidani.

First artwork by humanoid robot sells for \$1.3m

A portrait of English mathematician Alan Turing became the first artwork by a humanoid robot to be sold at auction, fetching \$1,320,000 on Thursday.

The 2.2 metre (7.5 feet) portrait "A.I. God" by "Ai-Da", the world's first ultra-realistic robot artist, smashed pre-sale expectations of \$180,000 when it went under the hammer at London auction house Sotheby's Digital Art Sale.

"Today's record-breaking sale price for the first artwork by a humanoid robot artist to go up for auction marks a moment in the history of modern and contemporary art and reflects the growing intersection between A.I. technology and the global art market," said the auction house.

Ai-Da Robot, which uses AI to speak, said: "The key value of my work is its capacity to serve as a catalyst for dialogue about emerging technologies."

Ai-Da added that a "portrait of pioneer Alan Turing invites viewers to reflect on the god-like nature of AI and computing while considering the ethi-

cal and societal implications of these advancements."

The ultra-realistic robot, one of the most advanced in the world, is designed to resemble a human woman with a face, large eyes and a brown wig.

Ai-Da is named after Ada Lovelace, the world's first computer programmer and was devised by Aidan Meller, a specialist in modern and contemporary art.

"The greatest artists in history grappled with their period of time, and both celebrated and questioned society's shifts," said Meller.

"Ai-Da Robot as technology, is the perfect artist today to discuss the current developments with technology and its unfolding legacy," he added.

Ai-Da generates ideas through conversations with members of the studio, and suggested creating an image of Turing during a discussion about "A.I. for good".

The robot was then asked what style, colour, content, tone and texture to use, before using cameras in its eyes to look at a picture of Turing and create the painting.

UN condemns civilian toll in Gaza war

UN report condemns Israel's violations, exposes disproportionate civilian casualties amid ongoing conflict

UN rights office verifies 70% of deaths were women and children

Israeli attacks on residential buildings responsible for 80% of verified fatalities

Report cites potential war crimes, crimes against humanity, and even "genocide"

The UN yesterday condemned the staggering number of civilians killed in Israel's war in Gaza, with women and children comprising nearly 70 percent of the thousands of fatalities it had managed to verify.

In a fresh report, slammed by Israel, the United Nations human rights office (OHCHR) detailed a raft of violations of international law since Hamas's deadly October 7 attack in Israel sparked the war in the Gaza Strip.

Many could amount to war crimes, crimes against humanity and possibly even "genocide", it warned, demanding interna-

tional efforts to prevent "atrocious crimes" and ensure accountability.

"Citizens in Gaza have borne the brunt of the attacks, including through the initial 'complete siege' of Gaza by Israeli forces," the UN said.

"Conduct by Israeli forces has caused unprecedented levels of killings, death, injury, starvation, illness and disease."

It pointed to "the Israeli government's continuing unlawful failures to allow, facilitate and ensure the entry of humanitarian aid, the destruction of civilian infrastructure, and repeated mass displacement".

Israel's mission to the UN in Geneva "categorically" rejected the report, decrying "the inherent obsession of OHCHR with the demonisation of Israel".

"Dystopia of destruction"

"Gaza is now a rubble-strewn landscape," Ajith Sunghay, head of the UN rights office's activities in the Palestinian territories, said via video-link from Amman.

"Within this dystopia of destruction and devastation, those alive are left injured, displaced and starving."

Yesterday's report also found

that Hamas and other armed groups had committed widespread violations that could amount to war crimes and crimes against humanity, including seizing hostages, killings, torture and sexual violence.

Those violations, it said, were especially committed in connection with the October 7, 2023 attack, which resulted in 1,206 deaths, mostly of civilians, according to an AFP tally of official Israeli figures.

'Systematic violation'

The report also tackled the contentious issue of the proportion of civilians among the nearly 43,500 people killed in Gaza so far, according to the health ministry in the Palestinian territory.

UN agencies have been relying on death tolls provided by the authorities in Hamas-run Gaza due to lack of access. This has sparked harsh criticism from Israel but the UN has repeatedly said the figures are reliable.

The rights office said it had now managed to verify around 10,000 of the more than 34,500 people reportedly killed during the first six months of the war.

"We have so far found close to 70 percent to be children and women," Sunghay said, highlighting the stringent verification methodology that requires at least

three separate sources.

He said the findings indicated "a systematic violation of the fundamental principles of international humanitarian law".

He said 4,700 of the verified fatalities were children and 2,461 were women.

The rights office found that about 80 percent of all the verified deaths in Gaza had occurred in Israeli attacks on residential buildings or similar housing.

Children between the ages of five and nine made up the largest group of victims, with the youngest victim a one-day-old boy and the oldest a 97-year-old woman, it said.

Israeli football supporters back home after Amsterdam violence

A plane carrying Israeli football supporters brought home from Amsterdam by the government landed yesterday at Israel's Ben Gurion airport as authorities condemned a night of "hateful anti-Semitic violence".

Dutch police said 62 arrests were made as a result of the clashes, which erupted after a Europa League football tie between Amsterdam club Ajax and Maccabi Tel Aviv.

Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu ordered two planes to be sent to the Netherlands to bring the Israeli fans home, with the first flight of

evacuees landing yesterday afternoon, the Israel Airports Authority said.

Netanyahu also ordered Israel's Mossad spy agency to draw up a plan to prevent unrest at sporting events in the future.

Amsterdam's mayor said the city had been "deeply damaged" by "hateful anti-Semitic rioters" who hunted down and attacked fans of Israeli club Maccabi Tel Aviv in a night of "unbearable" violence.

Femke Halsema described gangs on scooters targeting fans of the Israeli club, beating and kicking them in "hit-and-run" assaults, leaving five people hospitalised.

"I can easily understand that

this brings back memories of pogroms," Halsema said, adding that she was "ashamed" by the violence.

"Our city has been deeply damaged. Jewish culture has been deeply threatened. This is an outburst of anti-Semitism that I hope to never see again."

Despite a "sporting" atmosphere in the ground and a huge police presence, authorities were unable to stop the rapid attacks on fans in several parts of the city.

Officers made 62 arrests in total but police chief Peter Holla said the hit-and-run tactics of the rioters made it "exceptionally" difficult to prevent the attacks.

Prince William says royal family's double cancer diagnosis 'brutal'

Prince William has described the past year in which his wife Catherine and his father, Britain's head of state King Charles III, each battled cancer as "brutal" and probably the "hardest" of his life.

The heir to the British throne was speaking to reporters on Thursday at the end of a four-day visit to South Africa for his Earthshot prize initiative.

Buckingham Palace in February announced that Charles, 75, had been diagnosed with an undisclosed cancer and would withdraw from public life to undergo treatment.

The following month his daughter-in-law Catherine, Princess of Wales, 42, revealed that she too had been diagnosed with cancer and was undergoing chemotherapy.

"Honestly, it's been dreadful. It's probably been the hardest year in my life," William said.

"So, trying to get through everything else and keep everything on track has been really difficult."

Both Charles and Catherine have since made limited returns to public duties, although Charles is still undergoing treatment.

Catherine said in September that she had completed her chemotherapy and was looking forward to undertaking more engagements "when I can".

"I'm so proud of my wife, I'm proud of my father, for handling the things that they have done,"

William added. "But from a personal family point of view, it's been, yeah, it's been brutal," he said.

William is also committed to a five-year programme, Homewards, launched by his philanthropic foundation to tackle homelessness in the UK.

When told he appeared relaxed, William said he "couldn't be less relaxed this year".

"It's more a case of just crack on and you've got to keep going," he said.

"I enjoy my work and I enjoy pacing myself, and keeping sure that I have got time for my family too," he added.

In addition to health problems, the royal family has this year faced continuing tensions surrounding William's estranged brother Harry.

Huge Bangladesh rally warns ousted PM's allies plotting return

Allies of ousted Bangladeshi Premier Sheikh Hasina were working to undermine the interim government that replaced her regime, two of her leading opponents warned yesterday at a huge rally in the capital Dhaka.

Hasina, 77, fled by helicopter to neighbouring India in August as a student-led uprising saw protesters flood streets of the capital Dhaka, bringing a dramatic end to her iron-fisted tenure.

Since then a caretaker government led by Nobel Peace Prize laureate Muhammad Yunus has taken charge, tasked with implementing far-reaching democratic reforms and staging fresh elections.

Hundreds of thousands of people attended yesterday's demonstration, one of the biggest since Hasina's toppling, which was organised by her longtime opponents of the Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP).

"We have gathered here to protect the voting rights of the people and to prevent the

re-emergence of fascists," Tarique Rahman, the BNP's exiled vice-chairman, told attendees via a videolink from his home in London.

"We must be cautious. Though the autocrats are gone, ill forces are still active. We cannot afford for the interim government to fail."

The BNP was subjected to

repeated crackdowns under Hasina's government, which rights groups say was behind the extrajudicial killing of hundreds of political opponents and the unlawful abduction and disappearance of hundreds more.

"Sheikh Hasina has fled, but the conspiracy continues," BNP general secretary Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir told the rally.

"Her associates are plotting to undermine the movement. We must be very careful."

Rahman, the son of two-time Bangladeshi premier and Hasina's chief rival Khaleda Zia, has lived in London since 2008 and was convicted in absentia of graft charges during Hasina's government.

Thousands of BNP members were arrested in the months before January elections that returned Hasina to power, staged in the absence of credible opposition parties.

The party has reasserted itself in the wake of Hasina's ouster, and several members of Yunus' interim government have served under prior BNP governments.

Germany brushes off Musk calling Scholz a 'fool'

German officials yesterday brushed off tech billionaire Elon Musk labelling Olaf Scholz a "fool" on his social media platform X after the dramatic collapse of the chancellor's coalition government.

In a comment Thursday above a post about the implosion of Scholz's long-troubled coalition, the world's richest man tweeted in German: "Olaf ist ein Narr" -- "Olaf is a fool".

Asked about Musk's comment, government spokeswoman Christiane Hoffmann took a playful dig at the US tycoon, saying that "on X, you have Narrenfreiheit", which translates to the freedom to act like a fool.

The word refers to revellers during Germany's traditional carnival season, which starts next week, having the freedom to act without inhibitions.

Historically, the term ech-





The home side passed up several opportunities to put the game out of sight for their opponents, but Spurs' hopes of a comeback were hit when Lankshear was sent off for two yellow-card offences in quick succession in the second half.

Dominic Solanke pulled one back in the 69th minute, shortly after being brought on by Postecoglou, but Galatasaray held on with relative comfort.

Van Nistelrooy accepts Man Utd lack a clinical striker

Samson's ton power India to victory

Sanju Samson's explosive 107 leads India to commanding victory over South Africa in T20 series opener

In a spectacular display of aggressive batting, Sanju Samson dominated South Africa's bowling attack with a blistering century that powered India to a commanding victory in the T20 series opener at Kingsmead.

Samson's remarkable innings of 107 runs, his second T20I hundred in just four matches, featured an extraordinary display of power hitting with seven fours and ten sixes. The wicketkeeper-batsman particularly excelled in the region between

point and cover, amassing 69 runs from just 19 deliveries in that area.

The innings gained momentum through two crucial part-

nerships – a 66-run stand with captain Suryakumar Yadav and a 77-run alliance with Tilak Varma. Despite a late innings wobble where India lost four wickets

in the final overs, they posted their fourth-highest total against South Africa.

South Africa's chase never gained traction, with only

three batters crossing the 20-run mark. The hosts' struggles were epitomized by captain Aiden Markram's early dismissal, extending his streak without a T20I fifty to 25 innings over two years.

The Indian bowling attack, led by spinners Varun Chakravarthy and Ravi Bishnoi, who claimed three wickets each while conceding just 53 runs in their combined eight overs, proved too formidable. Their effort was well supported by early breakthroughs from pacers Arshdeep Singh and Avesh Khan.

Gerald Coetzee, returning to international cricket after 166 days, showed promise with key wickets in the death overs, but couldn't prevent India's dominance. The hosts' batting collapse saw them bowled out inside 18 overs, recording their fourth-lowest score against India.

The match witnessed a pivotal moment when Chakravarthy dismissed both Heinrich Klaasen and David Miller in quick succession, effectively ending South Africa's resistance. Their partnership of 42 runs had been

the hosts' only substantial stand before the collapse.

Tilak Varma's aggressive cameo, including impressive boundary-hitting against both pace and spin, provided crucial momentum to India's innings before his dismissal to a well-judged catch by Marco Jansen.

The comprehensive 61-run victory highlighted India's depth in both batting and bowling, while exposing South Africa's struggles in maintaining consistency across both departments.

Guardiola will 'solve' Man City's malaise

Ayub finally succumbed to the spin of Zampa going for another big hit, caught by Hazlewood, ending a 71-ball stay that included five fours and six sixes.

Babar Azam (15 not out) joined Shafique to see Pakistan home, ending the match with the 10th six of their innings.

The European champions were hammered 4-0 by rivals Barcelona at the end of October and are now nine points behind

their great rivals in La Liga.

On top of that, they slumped to a second consecutive home defeat Tuesday, with AC Milan

triumphing 3-1 at the Santiago Bernabeu.

Mbappe has been some way off his best but the Italian coach refused to lay the blame at his door.

"The problem he's having is everyone's problem. We haven't hit our stride yet. But I'm convinced Mbappe is going to get through this difficult moment," he said.

"You could point at Vinicius (Junior), Rodrygo or (Jude) Bellingham. It is a difficult moment for everyone.

"You can't let your head drop, you have to hold it high."

Ancelotti, however, declined to speculate on Mbappe's second consecutive omission from the World Cup finalists' squad.
