Gwyneth Paltrow still processing 'weird' ski trial

Gwyneth Paltrow has still not fully processed her "weird" ski trial.

The 50-year-old 'Sliding Doors' star was sued by Terry Sanderson for \$300,000 over a 2016 collision on the slopes at a resort in Utah while she countersued for costs plus a "symbolic" amount of \$1, and in March a jury in Park City, Utah, found the retired optometrist "100 per cent" at fault for the accident - awarding Paltrow her

\$1 plus legal fees.

Paltrow has now spoken out about the trial, insisting she has still not fully processed what happened and found the whole thing very strange. She told the New York Times: "That whole thing was pretty weird. I don't know that I've even processed it. It was something I felt like I survived. Sometimes in my life, it takes me a long time to look back and process something and understand something."

The actress went on to insist she was baffled when the outfits she wore to court became an online sensation. She added: "I was just getting dressed and

compromised my integrity. "I am pleased with the outcome and I appreciate all of the hard work of Judge Holmberg and the jury, and thank them for their thoughtfulness in handling this case." 'Our call time was 1 in the morning': Bradley Cooper spent five hours in makeup for Maestro

Bradley Cooper endured a five-hour makeup process to transform into Leonard Bernstein in 'Maestro'.

The 48-year-old actor both stars in and directs the new biopic about the celebrated composer and the Oscar-winning makeup artist Kazu Hiro revealed how he and his team would spend all night applying the cosmetics so he could be behind the camera in character.

Hiro told an audience at the picture's New York Film Festival screening on Monday (02.10.23): "The last stage, he had covered pretty much everywhere, the bodysuit and arms. That took over 5 hours."

"The last stage, the whole time, our call time

was 1 in the morning.

"The other thing was he wanted makeup to be finished before the crew call, so he would appear as Lenny to set up the shoot and everything. That also kind of made our call time two hours earlier than normal, so that was quite tough."

Hiro explained that the length of time Bradley spent in the makeup chair varied as they filmed scenes from across Bernstein's life.

He said: "(We had to) keep adding because as he gets older, we had to add more elements. The younger stage was the nose and lips and chin and a wig. After the third stage, he started having cheek and neck (additions)."

Hugh Jackman 'to the lift lid on his life in tell-all memoir'

Hugh Jackman is reportedly putting pen to paper to lift lid on his life in a tell-all memoir.

The 54-year-old Hollywood actor -

who announced his split from wife Deborra-Lee Furness, 67, last month - is now said to be in the early stages of telling his life story in a new book as he moves forward following the end of his 27-year marriage.

An insider told Us Weekly:

"Hugh is currently working on a memoir. He is in the early stages of writing it ... Hugh's choosing to [write the book] now because he's finally [being] honest with himself [and] the divorce and this book is the first step."

The source suggested there

will be "big bombshells", adding: "The content will be Hugh speaking about his life. He'll be opening up about his life like never before. It's been very healing for him."

Hugh and Deborra - who are parents to Oscar, 23, and 18-year-old Ava - confirmed

their split in a joint statement which was released last month.

They told People magazine: "We have been blessed to share almost three decades together as husband and wife in a wonderful, loving marriage."

"Our journey now is shifting and we have decided to separate to pursue our individual growth."

"Our family has been and always will be our highest priority. We undertake this next chapter with gratitude, love, and kindness."

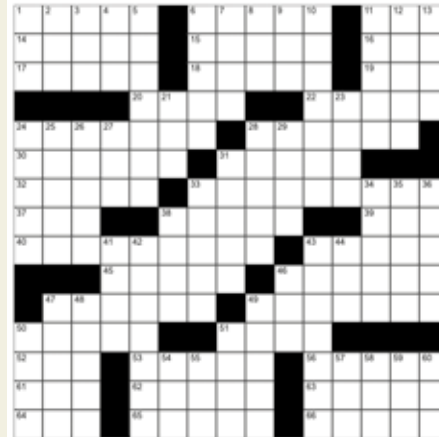
