United Arab call to 'maintain pressure' for Gaza ceasefire

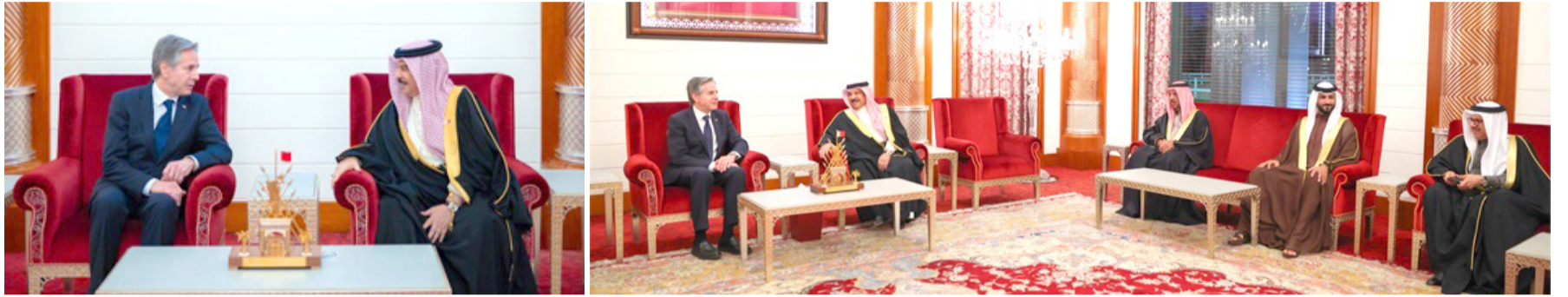
Jordan's King Abdullah II, Egyptian President Abdel Fattah al-Sisi and Palestinian leader Mahmud Abbas called yesterday for pressure to be maintained for a ceasefire in the Israel-Hamas war and to protect Palestinian civilians.

The three leaders had gathered for a summit in the city of Aqaba, on Jordan's Red Sea coast, to discuss the three-month-old war.

A royal palace statement issued after the meeting said they had "reiterated the need to maintain pressure to push for ending the Israeli aggression on Gaza, and protecting unarmed civilians".

They also "highlighted the need to ensure the sustainable delivery of sufficient relief and humanitarian aid to alleviate the catastrophic humanitarian situation in Gaza", the statement said.

All three nations are former Soviet republics that are now EU and NATO members.

MP Al Saleh: When will the 3% return to retirees?

MP Mamdouh Al-Saleh questioned the timing of the return of the annual 3% increase for retirees.

He emphasised that the implementation of the new law in 2024, which imposes new contributions on private sector companies for the end of service of foreign workers, will provide a financial surplus to the General Organisation for Social Insurance (GOSI).

During a parliamentary session on Tuesday, Al Saleh confirmed that the GOSI is expected to receive up to BD200 million by the end of 2024 from the new deductions from the private sector.

"This presents a suitable opportunity for the return of the

3% annual increase for retirees this year," he stated.

He stressed that the annual increase for retirees is necessary to help them cope with inflation and taxes amid challenging living conditions they face. He added that citizens are awaiting a clear and explicit answer regarding the return of the 3% increase to retirees' pensions.

This came during a general discussion on the government's policy regarding the situation of retirees after the suspension of the annual increase and the presentation of optional retirement for employees, along with the recurring investment losses in the funds of contributors to the retirement fund and the projects under the GOSI.

Residents make an 'urgent call' for better bus stop infrastructure in Um Al Hassam!

The lack of a designated bus stand in Um Al Hassam has been causing significant traffic congestion during peak hours, leaving commuters frustrated.

Local resident Mr. Shamil Mohammed has raised concerns about the situation, particularly during the evening rush from 5 to 8, when traffic is at its peak.

The bus stop in question, located on a busy road, lacks a dedicated space for buses to stop, forcing them to halt directly on the road.

This results in a bottleneck as cars behind the bus are compelled

to wait until it moves, leading to traffic snarls and delays.

To mitigate the issue, the authorities have marked the area

on the road with yellow and white paint, clearly indicating it as a bus stop.

Additionally, warning boards cautioning drivers to slow down have been installed ahead of the stop. However, these measures have proven insufficient, especially during the evening hours when the traffic volume is high.

Residents are now demanding improved infrastructure, including a designated bus stand, to alleviate the traffic congestion at this crucial spot. They argue that a proper bus stand would allow buses to pull over safely, ensuring a smoother flow of traffic while passengers board and disembark.

Man held for attempting to leave Bahrain using another person's passport

An Asian man was apprehended at Bahrain International Airport while attempting to exit the country using another person's passport.

His confusion raised suspicion, leading to his arrest and subsequent sentencing to three years in prison. The details of the incident reveal that the 38-year-old suspect presented a forged passport to the immigration officer at Bahrain International Airport. The officer became skeptical due to the suspect's suspicious behavior during the passport handover, prompting a thorough examination of the information and data. It was discovered that the passport belonged to someone else. The suspect admitted to attempting to leave Bahrain with the forged passport, claiming ignorance of the criminal nature of his actions. He clarified that he had intended to use it only in emergency situations.

During the investigation, a customs officer stated that when the suspect approached him to complete the travel procedures at Bahrain Inter-

national Airport, he appeared nervous and looked around in all directions while handing over the passport. It was evident that the presented passport contained data and photos of another individual, raising suspicions of its authenticity.

Discrepancies

The passport was then entered into the Nationality, Passports, and Residence Affairs system (NPRA), revealing discrepancies between the passport photo and the one recorded in the system. Additionally, the photo did not match the suspect's appearance.

The public prosecution accused the suspect of colluding with a public employee, with good intentions, to manipulate information in a government entity's IT system related to a department in the General Directorate of Nationality, Passports, and Residence Affairs.

This manipulation aimed to display false data as genuine, intending to use the passport information to another person, in order to enter the country.

Judge upholds six-month prison term for doctor in fatal traffic accident case

A judge in the execution court has refused to suspend the sentence or replace the punishment imposed on a doctor convicted of causing the death of an individual in a traffic accident in the Nuwaidrat area.

The doctor had previously been sentenced to six months' imprisonment, a ruling that was upheld by the court of appeals.

The incident took place when the accused, while driving his vehicle on a road in the Nuwaidrat area, failed to exercise the necessary care and attention. He posed a danger to pedestrians walking on the roadside as he was distracted by his mobile phone while approaching an intersection.

This resulted in a collision with the victim, who was crossing the road, causing him to fall to the ground. The victim was subsequently taken to the hospital but succumbed to his injuries three days later.

The public prosecution charged the doctor with causing the death of the victim due to his negligent driving, failing to exercise the utmost care, not adhering to safety precautions, using his mobile phone while driving, and causing damage to others' property.

The court of first instance sentenced him to six months' imprisonment and set bail at BD200 to suspend the execution. It also ordered the suspension of his driving license for three months after serving the prison term.

Asian fraudster's three-year jail term upheld

The Court of Appeals upheld a three-year prison sentence for an Asian fraudster who managed to seize BD2,000 from a citizen's account.

The fraudster contacted the victim, posing as an employee of a financial company, and requested him to update his personal information in order to enhance the security of his bank accounts.

Through deception, the perpetrator led the victim to the point of surrendering the amount. The first-degree court sentenced him to three years in prison, a fine of BD3,000, and deportation from the country upon completion of the sentence. The Court of Appeals affirmed the ruling.

Based on the complaint filed by the victim regarding the

fraud he suffered, security investigations were initiated, revealing that the money transfer and withdrawal operations were carried out using an ATM, and the accused was the one who made the cash withdrawals in installments using his own bank card.

The investigations further indicated that he operated as part of a criminal gang, responsible for creating bank accounts and receiving illicit funds from fraudulent activities.

He would then send the funds to an accomplice outside of the Asian country in exchange for a financial share.

During the prosecution's interrogations, the accused admitted to withdrawing several amounts from multiple cards belonging to different individuals.

'Set cap and regulate work'

MPs call for urgent measures to address soaring costs of recruiting domestic workers in Bahrain

Several members of parliament have called for serious measures to be taken to halt the rising costs of recruiting domestic workers from various countries, which in some cases have exceeded BD2,000.

They emphasised the need for a new decision to be made to set a cap and regulate work in this sector, which is facing numerous problems. They stated that there is an urgent need to set a reasonable and defined price for recruiting domestic workers.

They stressed the necessity for relevant authorities to take action by establishing organised frameworks and communicating with embassies and representatives of these countries to issue regulatory decisions that determine the cost of recruiting domestic workers, similar to what happened in the sister country of Kuwait.

In Kuwait, the costs of recruiting workers from various countries were set between a minimum of BD350 and a maximum of BD750, including travel expenses.

They pointed out that the prices of recruiting domestic workers in Bahrain are very high and burdensome for Bahraini families. The costs range from BD2,000 to BD2,200 to recruit



Indonesian workers, BD1,300 for Filipino workers, BD1,200 for Indian and Sri Lankan workers, and BD1,400 for Ethiopian workers.

Law proposal

On his part, MP Jalal Kadhem stated that he is currently working on preparing a law proposal to regulate the process of recruiting domestic workers and those in similar positions.

He affirmed that the law, which will be presented to the parliament in the near future, comes in response to demands from various segments of Bahraini society to intervene and stop the financial bleeding.

ity in the prices of recruiting workers, indicating a lack of control and an urgent need for parliamentary intervention to address this issue," he explained.

He pointed out the necessity of issuing a comprehensive law that addresses the rights and duties of all relevant parties, as well as setting reasonable salary ceilings, other expenses, recruitment fees, and office commissions in a transparent and acceptable manner for everyone.

Challenging matter

From her side, MP Jalila Al Sayyed confirmed that recruiting a domestic worker has become a challenging matter due to the exorbitant costs.

Furthermore, she stated some offices ask for significant

amounts of money and delay fulfilling their commitments, including the delay in bringing the worker and not meeting their obligations related to the guarantee period or training the worker.

She mentioned the existence of brokers who recruit workers and then smuggle them out after the three-month guarantee period, resulting in the loss of money without any benefit, and the only loser is the family who will have to spend a large amount again to recruit a new worker, hoping that they will stay and not escape.

Global unemployment set to worsen in 2024: UN

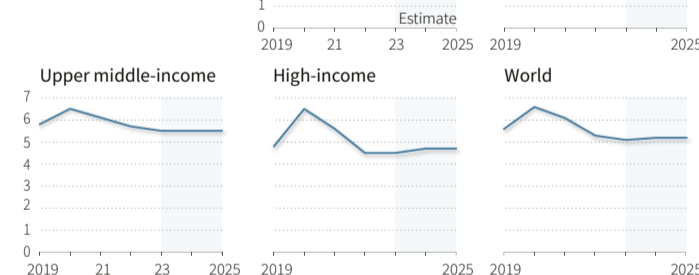
The global unemployment rate will increase slightly in 2024, the United Nations said yesterday as it raised concerns about stagnant productivity, worsening inequalities and inflation biting into disposable income.

The UN's labour agency said the economic recovery from the Covid-19 pandemic has slowed down, with ongoing geopolitical tensions and persistent inflation triggering aggressive moves by central banks.

That said, global growth in 2023 was modestly higher than

anticipated, and labour markets showed surprising resilience, the International Labour Organization said.

However, real wages declined in most of the G20 countries as wage increases failed to keep pace with inflation, said the ILO.

The 2022 global unemployment rate stood at 5.3% and made a modest improvement last year to 5.1%.

However, in 2024 an extra two million workers are expected to be looking for jobs, raising the global unemployment rate to 5.2%.

Disposable incomes have declined in the majority of G20 nations and, generally, the erosion of living standards resulting from inflation is "unlikely to be

compensated quickly", the ILO said. The report found that only China, Russia and Mexico "enjoyed positive real wage growth in 2023".

Real wages fell in other G20 countries, with Brazil (6.9%), Italy (five%) and Indonesia (3.5%) experiencing the sharpest declines. "Falling living standards and weak productivity combined with persistent inflation create the conditions for greater inequality and undermine efforts to achieve social justice," said Hougbo.

"And without greater social justice we will never have a sustainable recovery."

Saudi Arabia says value of mineral resources has nearly doubled

Saudi Arabia said yesterday that the estimated value of its mineral resources had nearly doubled to \$2.5 trillion, highlighting a sector it hopes will help diversify its oil-reliant economy.

"I am delighted to announce that our estimation for the kingdom's untapped mineral potential has increased from \$1.3 trillion to \$2.5 trillion, an increase of 90 percent," Industry and Mineral Resources Minister Bandar Alkhorayef told a conference in Riyadh.

"This is based on new discoveries in the form of rare earth elements, and a combination of the increase of volumes of phosphate, gold, zinc and copper, as well as the revaluation of these minerals."

The earlier valuation of \$1.3 trillion had been cited by officials including Saudi Arabia's de facto ruler, Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman, since

at least 2017. Risk intelligence firm Verisk Maplecroft wrote last year that the focus on mining was "among the more feasible parts"

of Prince Mohammed's Vision 2030 reform agenda, aided by existing mines, plants and infrastructure including railways.

Energy Minister Prince Abdulaziz bin Salman told the conference that rather than being called an oil-producing country, "what we are working on is that we would like to be an energy-producing country for all sources of energy".

Last year, the kingdom's deep-pocketed sovereign wealth fund, the Public Investment Fund, and state mining firm Ma'aden established Manara Minerals to snatch up global mining assets.

Manara announced its first high-profile acquisition, a 10-percent stake in Brazil's Vale, in July.

Germany resumes arms sales to Saudi Arabia with missile deal

Germany yesterday said it had approved the sale of missiles to Saudi Arabia, ending a blockade on direct arms exports to the Gulf kingdom in place since 2018.

Government spokesman Steffen Hebestreit confirmed a report by German weekly Spiegel, which said Berlin had given the green light for the delivery of 150 Iris-T air-to-air missiles to Riyadh.

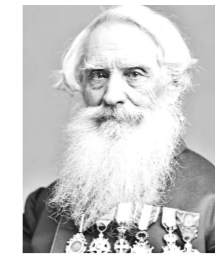
"The details of this report are accurate," said Hebestreit, speaking at a regular government news conference.

The Iris-T missiles could "be fired from aircraft at airborne targets, that is to say missiles, drones and so on", Hebestreit

added. Consent for the export of the missiles, manufactured by German group Diehl Defence, was granted towards the end of last year, Spiegel reported.

◆ **Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky** arrived yesterday morning in the Lithuanian capital for an unannounced visit to the Baltic states, staunch allies of the war-torn country. The three Baltic states -- all former Soviet republics which are now EU and NATO members -- are among Ukraine's staunchest allies. "Estonia, Latvia, and Lithuania are our reliable friends and principled partners. Today, I arrived in Vilnius before going to Tallinn and Riga," Zelensky said on social media platform X, formerly Twitter. "Security, EU and NATO integration, cooperation on electronic warfare and drones, and further coordination of European support are all on the agenda," he said. The Baltic tour marks Zelensky's first official trip abroad this year. In Lithuania, a key donor to Ukraine, Zelensky said he will hold talks with the president, prime minister and the speaker of parliament, and meet with the Ukrainian government.

◆ **Bhutanese voters** have elected Tshering Tobgay to become prime minister for a second time after his party won nearly two-thirds of seats, the election commission said in results released yesterday. The election was dominated by serious economic challenges that have called into question the Himalayan Kingdom's long-standing policy of prioritising "Gross National Happiness" over growth. Bhutan also lies sandwiched between the globe's two most populous countries, China and India, who watched the vote with keen interest as they eye strategic contested border zones. Tobgay, head of the liberal People's Democratic Party (PDP), who served as prime minister of the Himalayan kingdom from 2013 to 2018, won 30 of 47 seats in

◆ **The Islamic State group** has claimed responsibility for a blast targeting a vehicle in eastern Kabul that killed at least three people, the second deadly attack by the group in Afghanistan in a week. Kabul police spokesman Khalid Zadran said three people were killed and four wounded by a bomb hidden in a car near a minivan in eastern Kabul on Tuesday. He told AFP Wednesday that police had detained a suspect who had confessed his involvement. The Islamic State (IS) group claimed responsibility on its Telegram channel, saying it had "detonated an explosive device on a vehicle transporting employees of the Pul-e-Charki prison". The attack is the second in recent days, with IS claiming responsibility for an explosion on a bus on Saturday that killed at least five people in the Dasht-e-Barchi neighbourhood -- an enclave of the historically persecuted Shiite Hazara community.

Nepal police said yesterday they had arrested a spiritual leader whose followers believe him to be a reincarnation of Buddha over allegations of disappearances and rape at his ashrams.

Ram Bahadur Bomjam, known as "Buddha Boy" among devotees, became famous as a teenager after followers said he could meditate motionless for months without water, food or sleep. The 33-year-old guru has a devout following but has long been accused of physically and sexually assaulting his followers, and had been hiding from authorities for several years. "He was arrested after absconding for several years," police spokesman Kuber Kadayat told AFP. Police apprehended

Palestinian journalist freed from Israeli custody abused: report

London-based news outlet Al-Araby Al-Jadeed announced on Tuesday the release of one of its Palestinian journalists from Israeli custody, alleging he faced torture during more than a month in detention.

Diala al-Kahlout, who was among dozens of Palestinians shown detained by Israeli troops and stripped to their underwear in north Gaza last month, had been released back into the Palestinian territory, the Qatari-owned website said.

Kahlout told Al-Araby Al-Jadeed, sister operation of English-language news site The New Arab, that he had faced "indescribably tough and difficult" conditions following his arrest.

The 37-year-old said he had been beaten and tortured.

Israel army admits 'unintentionally' driving over dead man's body

Palestinian officials accused Israel of committing a 'brutal crime'

Israel's military said yesterday one of their vehicles "unintentionally" ran over the body of a Palestinian during a gun battle in the occupied West Bank earlier this week.

Palestinian officials accused Israel of committing a "brutal crime" after social media footage revealed a military vehicle running over a dead man in the city of Tulkarem late on Monday.

The military said they had been helping police in a counter-terrorism operation that resulted in an exchange of fire and the deaths of three.

"The operational vehicle that is seen in the video was dispatched in order to extricate the force that was caught under heavy fire, and unintentionally ran over the terrorist's body," the Israeli military said in response to an AFP request

Houthi claim major missile, drone attack in Red Sea

Yemen's Iran-backed Houthi rebels yesterday claimed responsibility for a large-scale drone and missile attack in the Red Sea described as the biggest yet in the international shipping corridor.

Military spokesman Yahya Saree said a "large number" of missiles and drones targeted a US ship that was "providing support" to Israel during its war against Hamas in Gaza.

"The naval forces, the missile force, and the unmanned air force of the Yemeni armed forces carried out a joint military operation with a large number of ballistic and naval missiles and drones," he said in a statement on X, formerly Twitter.

Earlier yesterday, the US military said American and British forces shot down 18 drones and three missiles launched by the Houthis towards shipping lanes in the Red Sea.

Saree did not give a timing or

a location for the attack but a Houthi leader, speaking on condition of anonymity, told AFP that it was the same incident.

Separately, Tawfiq Al-Humairi, adviser to the Houthis' Ministry of Information, told AFP that "this attack is considered the largest

for comment. The military said it would review what had happened and added that the video "does not show the incident in its entirety".

The footage of Monday's incident, shared on social media, appears to be taken from a security camera and shows an armoured vehicle slowly driving over what seems to be a lifeless body.

The vehicle then stops, restarts and drives off, crushing the body again with its back wheels.

China military tells US will 'never compromise' on Taiwan

Chinese military officials told US counterparts at talks this week that Beijing will "never compromise" on the issue of Taiwan and urged them to stop "provocative actions" in the South China Sea, the defence ministry said yesterday.

China "stressed that it will never compromise or back down on the Taiwan issue", the ministry said in a readout of the talks in Washington, held Monday and Tuesday, urging the United States to "stop arming Taiwan".



President Joe Biden and Xi Jinping "China urged the United States to reduce its military deployment and provocative actions in the South China Sea and stop supporting violations and provocations by individual

countries," the statement continued.

"The United States should fully understand the root causes of maritime and air security issues, strictly rein in its frontline troops, and stop with the exaggeration and hype," it added.

"The Chinese side also elaborated its solemn position and major concerns on issues involving China's core interests and international hotspots issues," it said. President Joe Biden and Xi Jinping agreed in November to restart military talks between the countries, put on hold for more than a year.

Swiss train grazes woman in wheelchair fallen on tracks

An elderly woman in a wheelchair was miraculously left largely unscathed despite a close call with an oncoming train after having fallen on the tracks, Swiss police said yesterday.

The incident happened on Tuesday afternoon at a train station in northeast Switzerland, police in the canton of Aargau said. The woman, 70, was "very lucky in her misfortune", because she fell exactly between two rails, po-



lice said. The result was that the passing train barely touched her as it passed over her.

She was taken to hospital, as was another person on the platform who was mildly injured by flying parts of the electric wheelchair.

The incident caused delays in traffic at the station in Kaiseraugst, near Basel for several hours. Police have so far ruled out any third-party involvement in the incident.

Former Nepal cricket captain Lamichhane gets eight years for rape

A court in Nepal yesterday sentenced former star cricket captain Sandeep Lamichhane to eight years in prison for rape.

Lamichhane, 23, was once the poster boy for cricket in Nepal and the leg spinner's on-field success had boosted the sport's profile in the Himalayan republic.

In 2022 he was accused of raping a young woman in a Kathmandu hotel but was freed on bail and returned to the squad to compete in international tournaments.

He was convicted of rape in December after a repeatedly delayed trial that had left him free to continue his sporting career, with his sentence handed down on Wednesday.

"The court has sentenced him to eight years," Kathmandu district court official Ramu Sharma told AFP.

Three rooms, three budgies and an Xbox: how Breivik serves his sentence

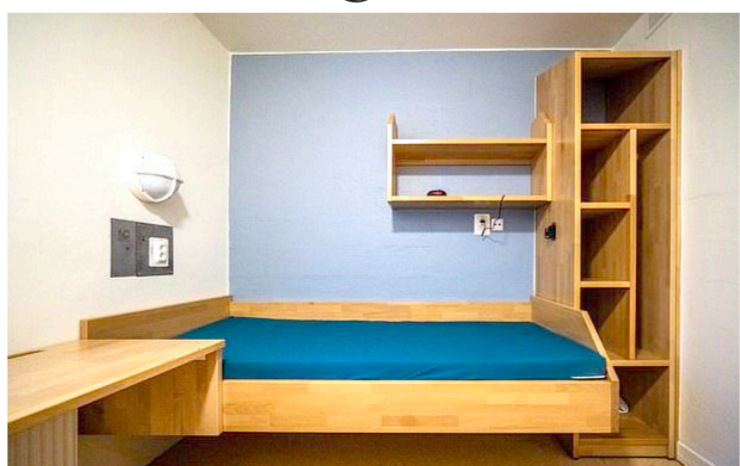
Three private rooms, as many budgies and an Xbox: the lawsuit brought by Anders Behring Breivik against the Norwegian state's prison regime details conditions that would make many prisoners envious.

Since 2022, Breivik has been serving his sentence in the high-security wing of Ringerike prison, on the shores of the lake that surrounds the island of Utøya where he killed 69 people, most of them teenagers, on July 22, 2011.

Mere hours earlier, he had detonated a bomb in Oslo, killing eight others.

The 44-year-old right-wing extremist now has three personal rooms to himself: a living room, a study room and a small gym.

On the floor below -- which he shares with another prisoner, though never at the same time -- he has access to a kitchen, a TV

lounge with a games console, a dining room and a room for visits.

"Breivik has much more space than any other inmate in Ringerike prison," the facility's director Eirik Bergstedt told Norwegian news agency NTB in December.

Although the decor is relatively plain, the gym includes several exercise machines and the lounge has a large flat screen TV and several armchairs so he can play Xbox with the guards.

21 years in prison -- which can be extended indefinitely -- has taken the Norwegian state to court this week to protest against his prison regime.

In a tearful address to the court on Tuesday he said authorities are trying to "push me to suicide".

It is not the first time Breivik has used strong words to protest his conditions: in a letter to AFP in 2014, he threatened to go on hunger strike in prison if he did not get, among other things, a Playstation 3 instead of the older Playstation 2.

Indonesia's Lewotobi Laki-Laki volcano erupts, on highest alert level

Indonesia's Mount Lewotobi Laki-Laki erupted anew yesterday, spewing ash clouds two kilometres (6,561 feet) above its peak as authorities raised the volcano's alert status to the highest level.

The eruption follows weeks of heightened volcanic activity on the mountain, located on eastern Indonesia's Flores Island, and prompted the local government to issue an evacuation order for nearby residents.

"The communities are urged to immediately evacuate to safe points to avoid hot ash (from the volcano)," local official Benediktus Bolibapa Herin told AFP yesterday.

Former US first lady Melania Trump announces death of her mother

Former US first lady Melania Trump has announced the death of her mother Amalija Knavs. She was 78.

"It is with deep sadness that I announce the passing of my beloved mother," Trump posted late Tuesday on X, the former Twitter.

Amalija Knavs was a strong woman who always carried herself with grace, warmth, and dignity," she said, adding: "We will miss her beyond measure and continue to honor and love her legacy."

Melania Trump's mother came to the United States from Slovenia with her husband Victor Knavs, and following a years-long immigration process the couple took the oath to become US citizens in 2018, while Donald Trump was president.

"I found a snakeskin jacket at a store called Aardvark's, on

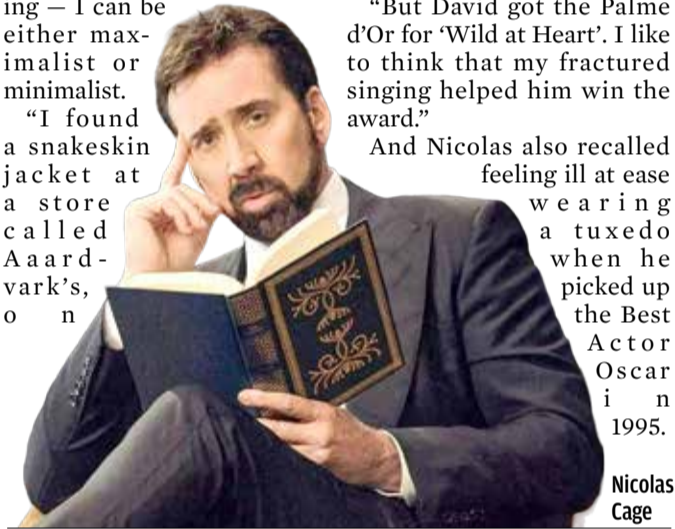

Kelly Clarkson is truly embracing the "New Year, New You" mantra.

She recalled telling NBC, the network that airs her talk show, "I'm not trying to sound ungrateful, I just can't stay here

[in L.A.] anymore for my mental health; for me and my kids.' They weren't doing well either."

"For the past few years, I'd just been showing up and smiling and doing what I'm supposed to do, but you can only compartmentalize so long until you break," she explained.

The "A Moment Like This" singer confessed she also prioritized her physical health with some key dieting tips, as Clarkson was determined to get

in the best possible shape of her life.

"I eat a healthy mix. I dropped weight because I've been listening to my doctor — a couple years I didn't," she said.

"And 90 percent of the time I'm really good at it, because a protein diet is good for me anyway. I'm a Texas girl, so I like meat — sorry, vegetarians in

the world!"

She added, "But I still splurge. The other night I had a frozen yogurt with my daughter, and it was magical."

In 2018, Clarkson told "Today" that she lost 37 pounds after changing her diet.

The single mother of two shares daughter River Rose, 9, and son Remington Alexander, 7, with ex-husband Brandon Blackstock, 47.

Clarkson and Blackstock married in 2013, and she filed for divorce in 2020 after seven years of marriage.

The "Because of You" crooner noted the split was part of the reason she decided to flee Los Angeles.

Arnold Schwarzenegger wants 'careless' cyclist's lawsuit thrown out

Arnold Schwarzenegger has blamed a "careless" cyclist for their crash.

The 'Terminator' actor is being sued by Joanne Flickinger, who claimed he hit her with his SUV while driving "negligently" on San Vicente Boulevard in Hollywood last February, but he has now filed a response and wants the civil suit thrown out of court because he insisted it wasn't his fault.

Responding to the complaint — which saw the 78-year-old star accused of driving "with excessive speed and [failing] to keep a proper lookout", the former Governor of California argued in documents ob-

tained by RadarOnline.

com: "[Flickinger] was so careless and negligent about the matters alleged in the Complaint so as to have contributed in some degree to the injuries, damages and/or losses alleged by [Flickinger] and therefore said carelessness and negligence completely bars or eliminates any recovery by [Flickinger]."

He insisted any alleged injuries she sustained where caused by third parties out of his control and asked the court "that in the event they are found liable to [Flickinger], said liability should be reduced

by the percentage of fault attributable to [Flickinger], and all other parties, persons, firms, corporations, and entities; and that said liability for non-economic damages of these Defendants is several only, and not joint, so that these Defendants shall be responsible only for the amount of non-economic damages."

Arnold wants the lawsuit thrown out and his costs paid.

In her complaint, the cyclist alleged the collision caused her "severe injuries" which are "permanent".

She is seeking damages exceeding \$25,000 for "past and future pain and suffering, emotional distress; past and future loss of earnings; past and future medical expenses; past and future healthcare expenses; past and future incidental expenses; and past and future household services".

At the time of the accident, law enforcement sources told TMZ: "The woman made a left turn in front of Arnold before he had a chance to hit his brakes and he was not going very fast at all".

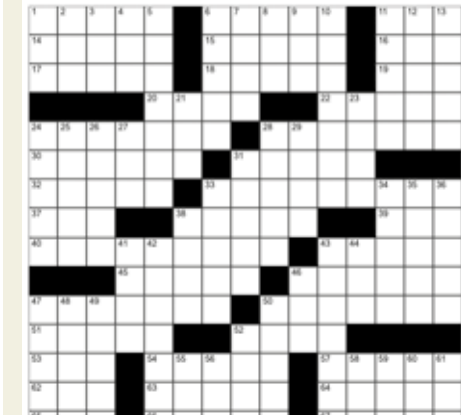

The win followed Sunday's nail-biting derby victory over the Los Angeles Clippers, and left the Lakers at 19-19 for the season -- 10th in the Western Conference.

"We'll take it, we can do better, but obviously for us that's a big-time win," a relieved Davis said after the game.

Davis received crucial scoring support throughout the line-up -- something that has been a problem for Los Angeles in recent outings.

bike tracks to follow, presenting a huge navigational test.

Five-time Dakar champion Nasser Al Attiyah was clearly unperturbed as took the honours yesterday, his first success in the Prodrive Hunter, to go second overall, within sight of Al Rajhi but just 2:28 ahead of Carlos Sainz in an Audi.

Loeb said at the finish: "We had a clean stage. We wanted to lose some time on this one to have a good road position for tomorrow. I'm not sure what will be our position with the time we

Matt Renshaw were long seen as the main contenders to fill the role, until Smith last week said he wanted to do the job.

"Steve Smith will be opening

the batting and Cameron Green will be coming into the number four position which is fantastic," chief selector George Bailey told reporters.

"Steve's motivated and energised and keen to do it.

"It's a challenge for him, it's something ... he thinks he can do. It's an itch he'd like to scratch and ultimately for us, as a team, it's something that fits."

The highly-rated Green has been sidelined recently by a resurgent Mitchell Marsh, who has assumed the all-rounder role.

Shifting Smith up the order, rather than opting for a specialist opener, allowed selectors to bring Green back primarily as a batsman.

"The way the rest of that batting order is functioning left us feeling like we have someone who we think is pretty talented, who potentially was going to find it hard to get any Test cricket in the next period," Bailey said of Green.

"I don't think that's going to be particularly beneficial for Green. We can get a lot of benefits out of him playing."

India's Kohli to miss T20 opener against Afghanistan

Star India batsman Virat Kohli will miss the first of three Twenty20 internationals against Afghanistan due to "personal reasons", coach Rahul Dravid said yesterday.

"Virat Kohli will miss the first game due to personal reasons," Dravid said at a press conference.

"He will be playing from the second and third T20."

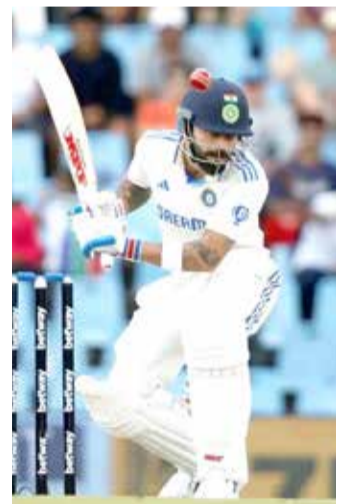
Kohli and Rohit last played a T20 international in November 2022, when India lost to England in the semi-finals of the T20 World Cup in Australia.

"But when you have a squad, you have to have that flexibility to do whatever is required if that is in the best interest of the team and gives us the best chance to succeed.

"So nothing is closed. But certainly, we're really happy with what Jaiswal has done as
