Israel and Palestinians trade rockets over Gaza as violence intensifies

srael's army and Gaza fighters traded heavy cross-border fire yesterday, with 22 Palestinians killed over two days amid the worst escalation of violence to hit the coastal territory in months.

Sirens in the Tel Aviv area and Israel's south warned of incoming rockets in a fresh evening salvo, with an AFP reporter in Gaza observing dozens of launches as Israeli officials said Egypt was working on a possible truce with the Islamic Jihad.
