### Biden to host India's Modi for state visit in June

m s\ President\ Joe\ Biden\ will}$ Narendra Modi for a state visit on June 22 that will affirm the two countries' "deep and close partnership," the White House announced yesterday.

The visit, the highest level of diplomatic reception at the White House, will boost Washington and New Delhi's "shared commitment to a free, open, prosperous, and secure Indo-Pacific," the statement said.

Tunisia's small Jewish commu-▲ nity was in shock and mourning yesterday after a bloody shooting rampage in which a police officer killed five people outside Africa's oldest synagogue.

The shooting Tuesday sparked mass panic during an annual Jewish pilgrimage at the historic Ghriba synagogue on the resort island of Djerba, which was quickly locked down by security forces.
