Kingdom shines with four medals, soaring to 33rd place at Paris 2024 Olympics

As the Paris 2024 Olympics drew to a close on Sunday night, the royal vision and support of the Kingdom of Bahrain to consolidate its position in global sports stands rewarded, securing a total of four medals, including two gold, one silver, and one bronze medals, boosting the Kingdom's standing at the Olympics from the 50s to 33 and positioning Bahrian as the leader of sports in the GCC region.

It is indeed a historic moment for Bahrian as the nation not only doubled the medal count from its highest achievement of one gold and one silver medals at the 2016 Rio de Janeiro Olympics, it became the Arab country that won the most gold medals at the Paris Olympics this year.

Bahrian's Winfred Yavi not only won the gold medal in women's 3000m steeplechase final on August 6th but also set a new Olympic Record with a remarkable time of 8:52.76. Her achievement put Bahrain in the spotlight at the Paris Olympics as a rising force in international athletics. Yavi's victory was the GCC's first gold medal at the Paris Olympics.

In her interview with the Bahrain News Agency later, Yavi expressed deep gratitude, and acknowledged that the encouragement from HM the King and the royal family played a pivotal role in her journey to



winning gold and breaking the Olympic record.

Talking exclusively to The Daily Tribune in her first interview after the Olympic victory, Yavi said her next goal is to set a new world record at the World Athletics Championships in 2025 at Tokyo.

The next win for Bahrain came from Salwa Eid Naser in women's 400 metres on August 9th in the form of a silver medal. Her strong performance in the final 100 metres was her fastest time since she won the world championship in Doha.



Only six other women have run faster than her timing of 48.53 seconds ever, making her silver medal shine like gold.

Bahrain's winning streak continued the next day, with Gor Minasyan winning a bronze medal, securing the first-ever medal in weightlifting for the Kingdom.

On the final day of the Olympics, Bahrain's standing took another leap when Ahmed Tajuddin etched his name into the annals of wrestling history with a spectacular gold medal win in the men's freestyle 97kg division.

Through its winnings, Bahrain has shown the sporting world its intent to take a lead role and

spread its wings. The Kingdom's efforts to this end are backed by none other than HM King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa, whose vision in consolidating the position of Bahrain's sports globally is being marvellously executed under the leadership of His Royal Highness Prince Salman bin Hamad Al Khalifa, the Crown Prince and Prime Minister.

The efforts are being spearheaded by His Highness Shaikh Nasser bin Hamad Al Khalifa, HM the King's Representative for Humanitarian Work and Youth Affairs and



Chairman of the Supreme Council for Youth and Sports (SCYS); and His Highness Shaikh Khalid bin Hamad Al Khalifa, First Deputy Chairman of the SCYS, President of the General Sports Authority (GSA), and President of the Bahrain Olympic Committee (BOC).

COVID cuts backfire

Hotel ordered to pay manager BD38,000 for wrongful termination

● Payment as back pay and damages; Court finds embezzlement charges baseless

The Labour Court has ruled in favour of a former hotel manager, awarding him over BD38,000 in back pay, compensation for wrongful termination, and deductions made during the COVID-19 pandemic.

The manager, who had been employed by the hotel since January 2019, was dismissed in October 2021 despite having a valid contract that was due to expire in January 2023.

The court found that the hotel's termination of the contract was unjustified and lacked legal grounds.

The court's decision was based on several key factors, including the hotel's decision

to deduct a significant portion of the manager's salary during the pandemic, despite his continued attendance and performance.

Deductions

The court deemed these deductions illegal as the hotel failed to provide sufficient legal justification.

Moreover, the hotel's termination letter lacked a valid reason for dismissal and failed to provide a written warning, as required by law.

This led the court to conclude that the termination was wrongful and warranted com-

pensation.

The hotel had accused the manager of embezzlement, but the criminal court acquitted him of these charges.

Evidence

Furthermore, the Labour Court considered this acquittal as evidence that the hotel's accusations were baseless.

The court ordered the hotel to pay the manager BD6,228 for the period between July and October 2021, BD7,060 for the illegal deductions made during the pandemic, and 6% interest on the back pay, increasing by 1% for each month after the sixth month of delay, up to a maximum of 12%.

The Court also ordered the hotel to pay BD19,500 for the remaining term of the contract, BD1,850 for notice period, BD1,838 for annual leave, BD1,829 for end-of-service gratuity, return ticket, end-of-service certificate, court fees, and lawyer's fees.

Travel agency employee vindicated

The High Appeals Court has acquitted a travel agency employee of embezzlement charges, overturning a previous conviction.

The court found the initial conviction to be based on insufficient evidence and questioned the motives of the complainant.

The employee was initially accused of stealing money from the agency.

The complaint was filed by the brother-in-law of the accused, who claimed the employee had misappropriated funds.

Betrayed

"I felt betrayed when my own family member accused me of such a serious crime," the victim said. "We've had our differences in the past, but I never expected him to make such a malicious allegation."

However, the court found no evidence of any formal complaints filed by other clients or customers.

"Throughout my time at the agency, I have always strived to provide excellent service to our customers," the employee stated. "The fact that no one else has come forward with similar complaints speaks volumes about the baseless nature of this accusation."

Conflict

During the appeal process, the defense attorney highlighted the existing personal conflict between the accused and the complainant.

The lawyer argued that the

accusation was likely motivated by personal animosity rather than genuine concern.

The court's investigation revealed that the complainant had not filed any formal complaint with the police regarding the alleged embezzlement.

Two witnesses, initially involved in the case, later admitted to having settled their differences with the accused and had not filed any formal complaints.

"I'm grateful that the court has seen through the false allegations and recognised that this was a personal vendetta, not a legitimate legal matter," the employee stated. "This experience has been a humbling one, but I'm relieved that the truth has prevailed."

The court ultimately ruled that the evidence presented against the accused was insufficient to support the charges.

The judge found the initial conviction to be based on weak evidence and questionable motives, ultimately acquitting the employee.

A blueprint for greener future

Bahrain embarking on mission to beautify parks, promenades and coastlines

The Istiqlal Park will feature new asphalt flooring, upgraded sports equipment, and smart lighting systems.

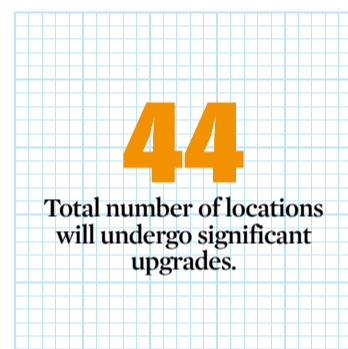

green technology by incorporating solar panels for energy generation and implementing water-efficient irrigation systems.

Defence Council takes over cyber security

Hundreds of housing plots and loan for Bahrainis

The Ministry of Housing is set to distribute hundreds of housing plots to eligible citizens in the coming weeks, as part of the new "Land and Loan" programme, according to parliamentary sources.

The project encompasses 313 housing plots which will be distributed through the "Land and Loan" programme.

Foreign Direct Investment in Saudi Arabia rises to \$215 Billion

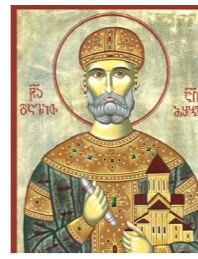

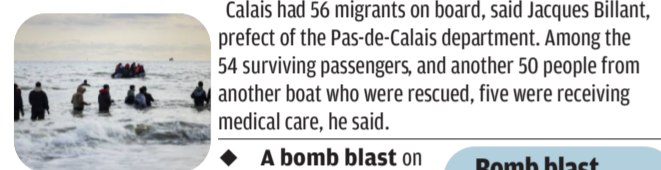
The death toll from a landslide at a vast garbage dump in the Ugandan capital Kampala has risen to 10, police said yesterday, amid claims the site was a disaster waiting to happen. Local media said homes, people and livestock were engulfed in mountains of waste at the landfill in the northern Kampala district of Kiteezi on Saturday after a collapse caused by heavy downpours. President Yoweri Museveni said he had directed the army's special forces to help in the search and rescue operation and demanded to know who allowed people to live near such a "potentially hazardous and dangerous heap". Kampala's metropolitan police spokesman Patrick Onyango told reporters at the scene that 14 bodies had been recovered on Saturday, and another four on Sunday.



Death toll from Uganda rubbish dump collapse reaches 19

Two migrants died yesterday in the Channel off the northern coast of France trying to reach Britain by boat. French maritime authorities said. The new drownings near the French city of Calais mean nine people have lost their life attempting the dangerous sea crossing this month alone, and 25 since the start of the year. A boat was signalled as being in distress on Sunday morning at sea between Calais and Dunkirk and "two people were declared dead", the maritime authorities said. The vessel in trouble 10 kilometres (6 miles) north of Calais had 56 migrants on board, said Jacques Billant, prefect of the Pas-de-Calais department. Among the 54 surviving passengers, and another 50 people from another boat who were rescued, five were receiving medical care, he said.

Rwanda's all-powerful President Paul Kagame was sworn in yesterday for a fourth term after sweeping to victory in elections last month with more than 99 percent of the vote.

Several dozen heads of state and other dignitaries joined the inauguration ceremony at a packed 45,000-seat stadium in Kigali, where crowds had started gathering from the early morning.

Kagame took the oath of office before Chief Justice Faustin Ntezilyayo, pledging to "preserve peace and national sovereignty, consolidate national unity".

The outcome of the July 15 poll was never in doubt for the iron-fisted Kagame, who has ruled the small African nation since the 1994 genocide, as de facto leader and then president.

Israeli civilian killed in West Bank shooting: emergency services, army

Jerusalem, Undefined

An Israeli civilian was killed and another wounded in a shooting in the occupied West Bank on Sunday, Israeli emergency services and the army said.

Medical teams "pronounced a man in his 20s dead" while a 33-year-old man was evacuated by helicopter "with gunshot wounds to his lower limbs", an emergency services statement said. The army said the dead man was an Israeli civilian.

The attack took place in the Jordan Valley in the northern West Bank.

Iran reduces sentences of journalists who covered Amini's death

Iranian courts have reduced jail terms for two female journalists charged with collaborating with the United States, their lawyers told reformist newspapers yesterday. Elaheh Mohammadi, 37, and Niloufar Hamedi, 31, are out on bail after more than a year in Tehran's Evin prison for their coverage of the September 2022 death in custody of Mahsa Amini which had sparked nationwide protests.

Gazans flee as Israeli forces push into Khan Yunis

Palestinians fled southern Gaza's main city yesterday as Israel warned of a new military operation, a day after one of the deadliest reported strikes in more than 10 months of war.

Intense diplomacy in recent days sought to avert a wider war in the Middle East following the killings of Iran-aligned militant leaders, while international mediators invited Israel and Hamas to resume stalled talks towards a long-sought Gaza truce and hostage-release deal.

AFP journalists said hundreds of Palestinians fled northern neighbourhoods of Khan Yunis, southern Gaza's main city already ravaged by months of bombardment and battles, after Israel issued fresh evacuation orders in the early morning.

The military dropped leaflets and sent mobile phone messages warning of "dangerous combat" in

Al-Jalaa district and telling Palestinian residents to leave the area, which until Sunday was designated Al-Jalaa neighbourhood to temporarily evacuate.

Families gathered their meagre belongings as crowds of people left Al-Jalaa, some loading mattresses, clothing and cooking utensils into pick-up trucks. Others took to the road on foot.

Umm Sami Shahada, a 55-year-old displaced Palestinian, said she had "fled Gaza City at the start of the war for Khan Yunis", hoping to find shelter.

"My daughter was killed in bombardment, so we went to Rafah, then we came back here, and now with this new evacuation order we don't know where to go", she said.

Israel has occupied the West Bank since 1967 when it also seized the Gaza Strip, from which it withdrew in 2005, but later imposed a crippling blockade followed by a siege shortly after October 7.

He added: "We have a very difficult situation, and Russia is a country that is close to us. We need to consult each other."

Funeral held for nine-year-old victim of UK stabbing that sparked riots

Hundreds of mourners gathered yesterday in Southport, northwest England, for the funeral of a nine-year-old girl killed in last month's knife attack, which sparked more than a week of nationwide disorder.

Family, friends, community leaders and emergency responders all joined Alice da Silva Aguiar's parents for an emotional ceremony at a Catholic church in the seaside town, nearly two weeks after the mass stabbing that shocked the country.

Attendees had been asked to wear white, a tradition for some in Portugal, where Alice's parents hail from.

Locals lining the main road clapped as the funeral cortege -- bearing a small white coffin, resting on a carriage pulled by

two white horses with colourful feathers -- passed by.

Southport spirit," said one man who turned out. "We're here to pay our respects."

Pink ribbons and balloons had been tied to lampposts and garden walls near the church.

Several hundred people packed inside the venue for the service -- featuring short addresses, readings, prayers and hymns -- which was relayed on loudspeakers to those who had gathered outside.

Jinnie Payne, the headteacher of the primary school the nine-year-old attended, was among those to speak movingly.

"Alice, you will forever be in our hearts," she told the congregation.

The July 29 mass stabbing at a Taylor Swift-themed dance class killed two other girls -- Bebe King, six, and Elsie Dot Stancombe, seven -- and injured 10 others including eight children.

Those wounded have all since been released from hospital.

Bangladesh swears in chief justice as old guard removed

Bangladesh's new chief justice has been sworn into office after his predecessor, viewed as a loyalist of toppled premier Sheikh Hasina, quit following protester demands, a presidential official said Sunday.

It is the latest in a string of fresh appointments to replace

an old guard viewed as linked to the previous regime, ousted by the student-led uprising. Syed Rezaat Ahmed, the senior-most high court judge, was sworn into office by President Mohammed Shahabuddin, the president's press secretary Shiplu Zaman told AFP. "He became the 25th chief justice of Bangladesh," Zaman said.

All 62 bodies recovered from Brazil plane crash wreckage

Brazilian authorities on Saturday finished recovering the bodies of the 62 people who died when their plane tumbled from the sky, as experts began examining the doomed aircraft's black boxes to determine the cause of the disaster.

Videos showed the ATR 72-500 plane in a sickening downward spin Friday before it crashed into a residential area in the town of Vinhedo, some 80 kilometers (50 miles)

northwest of Brazil's financial capital Sao Paulo.

The plane operated by airline Voepass fell almost vertically, landed on its belly and exploded in flames, striking with such force that it was nearly "flattened," said Sao Paulo fire lieutenant Olivia Perroni Cazo.

"A total of 62 bodies (34 male and 28 female) were recovered and taken to the morgue in Sao Paulo for identification and delivery to their families," the regional government said Saturday evening.

Russian army concedes Ukraine advances in Kursk offensive

Russia yesterday acknowledged Ukrainian forces had pierced deep into the Kursk border region in an offensive that a top official in Ukraine said was aimed to "destabilise" Russia and "stretch" its armed forces.

Kyiv has deployed thousands of troops to the surprise operation, a Ukrainian security official told AFP, seizing the battlefield initiative after months of slow Russian advances across the east.

"We are on the offensive. The aim is to stretch the positions of the enemy, to inflict maximum losses and to destabilise the situation in Russia as they are unable to protect

their own border," the security official said on condition of anonymity.

The shock assault, now in its sixth day, appeared to catch the Kremlin off guard, with Moscow's army rushing in reserve troops, tanks, aviation, artillery and drones in a bid to quash the incursion.

But it's army on Sunday appeared to concede that Ukraine had been able to penetrate its territory by up to 30 kilometres (20 miles) in places.

In a daily briefing on the situation in the western Kursk region, the defence ministry said it had "foiled attempts" by Ukraine's forces to "break through deep into Russian territory" using armoured vehicles.

Bahrain Needs Innovative Afforestation

The quest for "zero carbon neutrality" has gripped the nations of the world as they attempt to ward off climate change and its disastrous consequences. Bahrain has had the foresight to plan for zero neutrality in terms of carbon emissions by the year 2060. To this effect the island nation has mobilised several initiatives to cut down carbon emissions.

Notably Bahrain has put afforestation on top priority in the efforts to dial down carbon emissions and as a part of this the establishment of nurseries has been accelerated which can nurture and plant nearly 1,10,000 mangroves in various locations. Similarly, initiatives are also being taken to increase the urban green canopy by planting 1,40,000 trees in various streets, squares and avenues. These ambitious efforts are a part of Bahrain's afforestation plans according to which the green cover of the nation is expected to double by 2035. Interestingly, these aggressive efforts by Bahrain especially with regard to mangrove expansion are four times more than the goals stipulated by United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC). All these efforts are also being complimented by Bahrain's initiative to launch the Botanical Atlas Project (BAP). BAP launched via the National Geographic Database platform utilises satellite imagery to measure the vitality and greenness of the vegetation. This has further strengthened Bahrain's efforts to accelerate the afforestation efforts.

As we go forward the pace of climate change is set to rapidly increase thanks to spiralling carbon emissions. Bahrain is no exception to this dynamic scenario and in order to keep up and in fact overtake the problem the current measures as mentioned above may not be sufficient by themselves. Innovative afforestation is one initiative that can have a direct impact in neutralising carbon emissions and drive Bahrain towards zero carbon neutrality.

The Miyawaki afforestation method is one such innovative step. This method involves planting a variety of indigenous species close together, which helps the plants grow faster and stronger through mutual support and competition. Bahrain can identify the species and locations where this initiative can be applied.

Bahrain can also rope in peri-urban and rural communities into a Community Nursery project that empowers the communities to grow, plant and protect native trees in exchange for economic benefits. This innovative step can help Bahrain restore and safeguard existing forests and build new forest sectors. In order to speed up afforestation process Bahrain can also utilise technology and create an open mobile tree tracking app that can connect tree growers to tree funders. This unique innovation can speed up afforestation even in the remote parts of Bahrain by bringing tree enthusiasts together who empower the local people to grow trees by funding them.

Bahrain can also utilise advanced scientific methods that focus on tree genetics to ensure healthy seedlings. This combined with effective site selection can establish a firm foundation for the afforestation efforts as the tree's planted through this method will be more resilient and capable of surviving the harsh climate of Bahrain. Afforestation is the only method that can store carbon build up as forests have the amazing capability to store carbon by removing them from atmosphere. This combined by a shift to cleaner emission free fuels can make Bahrain's quest for Zero Carbon Neutrality much more easier.

Paris, France

Rain on opening ceremony parade

From a colourful, sometimes controversial opening ceremony to boxers caught up in a gender row to respectful bows on the gymnastics podium, the 2024 Olympics served up many memorable moments.

A look at 10 of the best:

Organisers promised a spectacular opening ceremony and the rain-soaked boat parade on the River Seine ended up making global headlines, but not for the expected reasons.

Church leaders, conservatives and even US presidential candidate Donald Trump were left outraged by a scene involving drag queens and lesbian DJ Barbara Butch that appeared to parody Jesus's Last Supper.

Artistic director Thomas Jolly denied any such intention. He and others involved ended up facing vicious online harassment that led to police complaints.

Djokovic's roar of approval

Novak Djokovic stunned Carlos Alcaraz in a memorable men's final to clinch tennis gold and become only the fifth player to complete the Golden Slam of all four majors plus Olympic gold.

The 37-year-old celebrated with a roar which echoed around Roland Garros before the tearful Serb clambered into the player's box to embrace his wife Jelena and two children.

"There is no greater inspiration than representing your country," said the 24-time Grand Slam title winner.

Alcaraz was also in tears, claiming he "had let Spain down".

Biles bows to 'queen' Andrade

Simone Biles may have been the star of the show but she was widely praised for bowing to her arch-rival Rebeca

Andrade on the podium.

Biles said it was "just the right thing to do" after she and teammate Jordan Chiles finished in silver and bronze medal position respectively behind the Brazilian in the floor final.

"Rebeca's so amazing, she's queen," said Biles.

Romanian Ana Barbosu was later awarded the bronze medal after the Court of Arbitration for Sport ruled that Chiles should not have been upgraded from her initial fifth-place finish.

Lyles just in time

World champion Noah Lyles roared to victory in 9.79sec to claim gold in a dramatic men's Olympic 100m final in the closest finish in modern history -- just five thousandths of a second separated him from Jamaica's Kishane Thompson.

"I'm the man amongst all of them. I'm the wolf amongst wolves," said Lyles whose victory was only confirmed after a photo-finish.

Not cricket as Pakistan top India at javelin

Pakistan's Arshad Nadeem won the

men's javelin title, his country's first individual gold at an Olympics, with a Games record of 92.97m.

In second place was India's defending champion Neeraj Chopra.

"Rivalry is there when it comes to cricket matches, other sports, the two countries have a rivalry, but it's a good thing for the young people in both countries to watch our sport and follow us. It's a positive thing for both countries," said Nadeem.

North-South Korea podium selfie goes viral

Images of Olympic table tennis players from North Korea and South Korea taking a selfie together on the medal podium went viral in South Korea, hailed as a rare show of cross-border unity.

After South Korea won bronze and North Korea silver in the mixed doubles behind China, South Korea's Lim Jong-hoon took a group photo after the medal ceremony.

North Korea's Ri Jong Sik and Kim Kum Yong, the South's Shin Yu-bin and the victorious Chinese team Wang Chuqin and Sun Yingbiao all

Lim's phone, a South Korean-made Samsung.

"A selfie with both Korea's national flags and a Samsung phone," said the widely read daily JongAng Ilbo.

Dreams come Trew

Australian skateboarding sensation Arisa Trew, just 14, won the women's park event to become her country's youngest ever gold medalist.

Trew nailed a high-risk and high-speed final round in her trademark pink helmet, bringing the crowd to their feet at a sun-drenched Place de la Concorde.

The event also featured 11-year-old Zheng Haohao, the youngest athlete ever to represent China at the Olympics.

"Skateboarding in the Olympic Games isn't much different from skateboarding in my neighbourhood. It's just more spectators," she told reporters.

Gender-row boxer beats 'bullying'

On a raucous night at Roland Garros, the storied home of the French Open, Algerian gender-row boxer Imane Khelif claimed gold and used her platform to hit

back at "attacks" and "bullying" before defiantly declaring "I am a woman like any other."

Together with Taiwan's Lin Yu-ting, who also fought in Paris, Khelif was disqualified from last year's world championships after they failed gender eligibility tests.

However they were cleared to compete in Paris, setting the stage for one of the biggest controversies of the Games.

"I am fully qualified to take part, I am a woman like any other. I was born a woman, lived a woman and competed as a woman," said the 25-year-old.

High five for Cuban wrestler

Cuban wrestler Mijain Lopez made Olympic history when he became the first athlete to win five consecutive individual golds in the same event, bettering the records of Games icons such as Carl Lewis and Michael Phelps.

The soon-to-be 42-year-old then placed his shoes in the centre of the mat to signify his intention to retire.

"Wrestling has been the love of my life, for all of my life," he said.

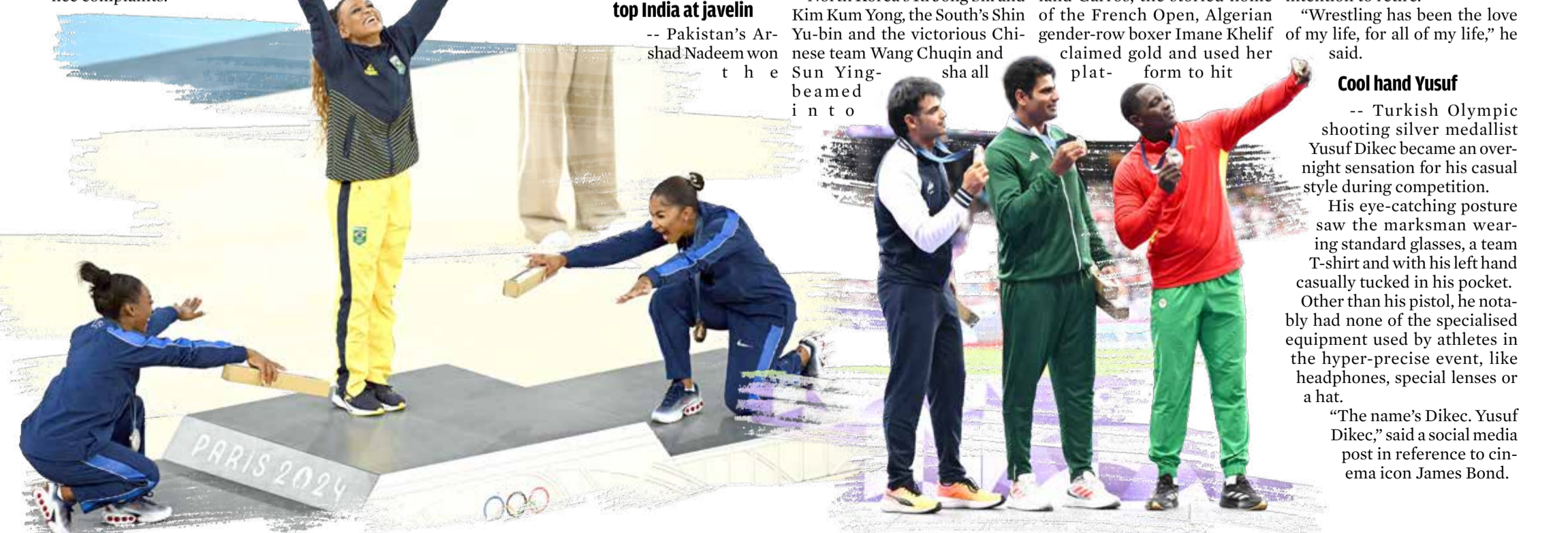
Cool hand Yusuf

Turkish Olympic shooting silver medallist Yusuf Dikec became an overnight sensation for his casual style during competition.

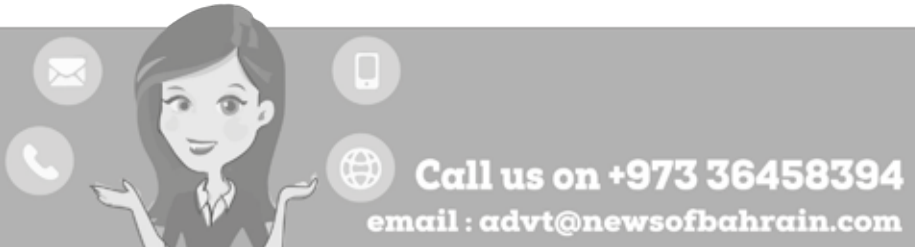
His eye-catching posture saw the marksman wearing standard glasses, a team T-shirt and with his left hand casually tucked in his pocket.

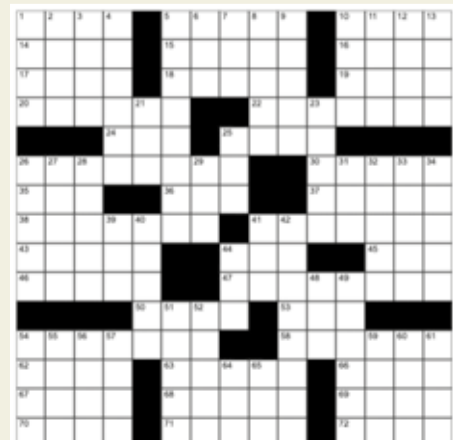

Paris bid a triumphant "au revoir" to the Olympics yesterday as the curtain came down on its widely praised staging of the global sporting spectacular.

A star-studded closing ceremony got under way in front of around 71,500 spectators at the Stade de France to crown an event that has been broadly acclaimed as one of the greatest

editions of the Olympics ever held.

Around 270 artists and performers were scheduled to perform in the packed arena for an estimated 9,000 athletes who marched into the venue as the festivities got into full swing.

The opening segment of the ceremony festivities began with France's swimming hero Leon Marchand -- winner of four gold

medals at these Games -- gathering the Olympic flame from the cauldron in the centre of Paris to begin its journey to the Stade de France.

French rugby hero Antoine Dupont -- who led the host nation to a rugby sevens gold medal in one of the early highlights of the Games -- carried a tricolore flag into the Stade de France as partying athletes swarmed the

field.

The glittering closing spectacle marks the beginning of the four-year countdown to the Los Angeles Olympics,

The ceremony follows 17 days of frequently breathtaking sporting action set against the backdrop of iconic Parisian landmarks from the Eiffel Tower to the Chateau de Versailles.

In contrast to the rain-soaked opening ceremony on the River Seine, the opening ceremony began as the sun set across the French capital.

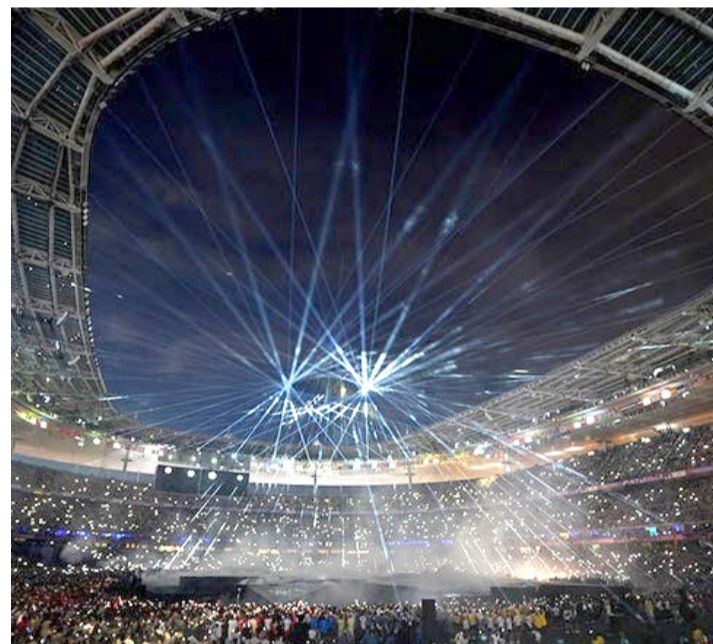
The last day of sporting action saw the United States pip China for top spot in the battle for medals after the US women's basketball team squeezed past France 67-66 to clinch the last gold of the Games.

Athletics has moved on from Bolt, Coe says

Track and field chief Sebastian Coe has hailed the emergence of an "extraordinary" group of athletes at the Paris Olympics who have gone some way to filling the void left by Jamaican legend Usain Bolt. Bolt was a transformational figure in athletics, winning eight Olympic and nine world gold medals as he dominated the sprints during his stellar career.

Talk since his retirement after the 2017 world championships in London has always been about who might step into his shoes as the leading pin-up for the sport.

But Coe insisted the narra-

tive wasn't just about one athlete alone to fill the void.

"We are no longer a sport about one person," he told reporters in Paris yesterday, all the while praising Bolt.

"That one person was Herculean, that one person transformed the popularity of our sport for a very clear period of time, and he consistently did that."

Coe likened Bolt's legacy to that of Muhammad Ali in boxing.

"You don't replace Muhammad Ali, you don't replace Usain Bolt. But I did say, 'Mark my words, other athletes will come through'.

USA fend off France for women's Olympic basketball gold

● **American women win nail-biter 67-66, securing their eighth consecutive Olympic basketball title**

● **A'ja Wilson scores 21 points**

The United States held off France 67-66 to win an unprecedented eighth successive women's Olympic basketball gold yesterday and extend their run of victories at the tournament to 61 games.

A'ja Wilson scored a game-high 21 points for the Americans who won the title for the 10th time overall, surviving a buzzer-beating shot from France's Gabby Williams.

The hosts needed a three to force overtime but Williams' foot was on three-point line as she let go off the ball, so her shot counted for just two points in a dramatic finale.

The US secured their 40th gold of the Paris Games in the final event of the competition, pipping China to the top the

medals table by virtue of winning more silvers.

The US women got support from LeBron James who sat courtside wearing his gold medal, joined by team-mates Bam Adebayo and Derrick White, a day after they won the men's gold by beating the French man 98-87 in Saturday's final.

A low-scoring first quarter saw a cold-shooting France muster just nine points, but the

US only fared marginally better and led by six after 10 minutes.

Williams trimmed the gap to a point with a three early in the second period before a basket from Valeriane Ayayi tied the game at 20-20.

Marine Fauthoux drained a three from near midcourt with the shot clock expiring to send the crowd wild, but Napheesa Collier's putback ensured the teams headed into the break level at 25-25.

France strung together a 10-point run to start the third period as Fauthoux and Ayayi both nailed threes.

The US to hit back to lead 45-43 going into the final quarter, with Kelsey Plum connecting on a pair of threes -- one after Johannes took a nasty blow from Wilson that went unpunished, to France's fury.

Wilson belatedly found some rhythm offensively after a difficult first half, but France had an answer each time and went back in front, 51-49, on Marieme Badiane's layup.

Hassan wins marathon as Olympic endurance gamble pays off

It mirrored Hassan's efforts in the Covid-hit Tokyo Games three years ago when she also won three medals: two golds (5,000m, 10,000m) and a bronze (1500m).

She also became the first athlete since Emil Zatopek in 1952 to take medals in the 5,000m, 10,000m and marathon in a single Games.

Assefa took silver in 2:22:58, with Kenya's Hellen Obiri claiming bronze (2:23:10).

Bangladesh retain ex-lawmaker Shakib for Pakistan Tests

Bangladesh retained all-rounder Shakib Al Hasan yesterday in the squad for this month's Test series against Pakistan, despite the former ruling party lawmaker facing backlash after the country's premier was toppled.

Shakib, 37, lost his status as a lawmaker after parliament was dissolved following the dramatic ouster of long-time ruler Sheikh Hasina after weeks of deadly mass protests.

“The emphasis was on picking our best players,” chief selector Gazi Ashraf Hossain said in a statement.

The all-rounder, who was elected as a lawmaker from

Anisimova upsets Sabalenka to reach WTA Toronto semis

American Amanda Anisimova upset two-time reigning Australian Open champion Aryna Sabalenka 6-4, 6-2 on Saturday to reach the semi-finals of the WTA Toronto Masters.

Anisimova, into her first Masters semi-final, advanced to a Sunday showdown against US eighth seed Emma Navarro, who eliminated fellow American lucky loser Taylor Townsend 6-3, 7-6 (7/5).

Anisimova, 22, will try to reach her fourth career WTA final and first since winning at Melbourne in January 2022.

She also won at Bogota in 2019 after losing her first ca-

reer WTA final at the 2018 Japan Open.

World number 15 Navarro, 23, won her only prior WTA final in January at Hobart.

“She's a player who is definitely on fire right now. She's playing some great tennis,” Anisimova said of Navarro. “I'm sure it will be a tough match.”

World number three Sabalenka was broken in the 10th game to drop the first set, netting a backhand to surrender to set then slamming her racket to the court in frustration.

After an early exchange of breaks in the second set, Sabalenka netted a backhand to give 132nd-ranked Anisimova a break and a 4-2 edge.

Rublev rolls over depleted Sinner in ATP Montreal upset

Andrey Rublev defeated a world number one for the second time in his career as he stopped Jannik Sinner 6-3, 1-6, 6-2 on Saturday to reach the semi-finals of the ATP Montreal Masters.

Bahraini wrestler Akhmed Tazhudinov secured a stunning victory in the men's 97kg wrestling final at the Paris 2024 Olympics, pinning Georgian opponent Givi Matcharashvili in a dramatic first-round finish yesterday.

ting world, claimed his first Olympic gold medal with the win, adding to his titles as an Asian and World champion.

American defending champion Jennifer Valente overpowered the field to defend her women's omnium title in the final velodrome race of the Paris Olympics yesterday.

Valente finished 13 points ahead of Poland's Daria Pikulik, with New Zealand's Ally Wollaston taking bronze, six points further back.

The omnium is one of track cycling's most unpredictable events, featuring four separate races -- the scratch, tempo, elimination and points --

with riders collecting points in each.

Valente timed the opening 30-lap scratch race to perfection, pulling clear on the final stretch to take the maximum 40 points ahead of Canada's Maggie Coles-Lyster.

Serbia make it three water polo crowns in a row

Serbia won their third straight Olympic gold in men's water polo with a 13-11 victory over Croatia at La Defense Arena yesterday.

The Serbs were beaten three times during the group stage of the competition but came alive in the knockout stage beating Greece and the USA before an impressive display in the gold medal game.

Uros Stevanovic's side were 8-5 up at half-time and never looked in danger of letting their lead slip against the 2012 gold medallists.

"We had our ups and downs. But we are famous for this, we are very hard to beat in the elimination phase. Everybody,

I think, underestimated us a little bit because of the results in the group. It happens," said defender Dusan Mandic, who played in all three gold medal winning teams.

"We were prepared for when it was the most important. I think only those of us that were here, the players and the coaches, believed in this. That the gold would happen," he said.

Hat-trick Harrie becomes most successful Dutch summer Olympian

Emotional sprint sensation Harrie Lavreysen became the Netherlands' most successful summer Olympian yesterday with a third Paris cycling gold in the men's keirin, boosting his career haul to five.

On a thrilling final day at the Saint-Quentin-en-Yvelines velodrome, newly-minted New Zealand star Ellesse Andrews powered to the women's sprint title to add to her keirin gold.

And American Jennifer Valente successfully defended her omnium crown to culminate a week that saw Britain's waning track dominance diminish even further.

Britain had bossed the medal table at every Games since Beijing in 2008, but there was a narrowing of the gap in Tokyo three years ago.

With the retirement of legends Laura and Jason Kenny it has closed even further.

While they topped the overall Paris medal table with eight, Britain managed just a single gold, as the Dutch won three and New Zealand and the

United States earned two each.

Lavreysen, who also defended his sprint and team sprint titles, is now his country's most successful summer Olympic athlete ever, surpassing former swimmer Inge de Bruijn and three others who have four gold.
