Municipalities have not surveyed underground wells since 1980

Oversight report reveals lack of inspection and monitoring

recent oversight report from the Bureau of Financial and Administrative Control has revealed a noteworthy negligence in the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Agriculture's assessments of underground wells in Bahrain spanning the last forty years, said a report published by our sister paper, Al Ayyam.

In response to the report, the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Agriculture, in collaboration with the Capital Secretariat and the three municipalities, has explained that a public tender was initiated in November 2022 for a well survey project.

Moreover, the report reveals that the ministry has stopped taking readings from the 2,480 mechanical groundwater well meters since March 2022, making it impossible to determine the quantity of water being withdrawn from these wells.

To rectify this situation, the Ministry has pledged to resume regular meter readings and emphasised the importance of encouraging well owners to install smart meters for streamlined data collection.

The report also highlights the Ministry's failure to inspect licensed groundwater well sites since January 2020.
