fter years of war and turmoil in Syria that has left millions displaced, the country now faces another crisis leaving thousands of people dead and trapped under buildings, where international aid has been slow to arrive.

Survivors of the 7.8 magnitude earthquake face freezing temperatures and horrific conditions after thousands have lost their homes, leaving survivors to camp in makeshift shelters on the streets.

If aid does not move quickly enough to provide relief and necessary items to those affected, many could be faced with a secondary disaster, resulting in more harm.

During a visit to the Turkish-Syrian border, UN Emergency Relief Coordinator Martin people have a right to feel abandoned as they look for international help that hasn't arrived.
