Senior officials from Russia, foreign and Arab countries, heads of international energy companies and organisations, and experts representing many Russian and international companies, participated in the forum.

The forum discussed the main challenges facing the energy sector such as development problems, and global energy development prospects programs.

GCC justice meeting
