The Court of Cassation has overturned a lower court's ruling that ordered a Manama restaurant to pay municipal fees totaling BD53,600.

The Capital Municipality had filed a lawsuit seeking unpaid fees accrued over a 20-month period when the restaurant was closed. The lawyer, representing the restaurant owner, appealed the lower court's decision upholding the fees owed.
