Candidate Dr Khawla Al Shamsi to focus on solving Busaiteen employment woes and advancing women's rights

After getting the green light for her candidacy in Muharraq's first constituency, Dr Khawla Al Shamsi has hit the ground running with her campaign for the upcoming by-elections. The Daily Tribune sat down with her to discuss her journey and aspirations.

Q: Tell us about your academic and professional background?

A: I completed my Bachelor's at the University of Bahrain, followed by a Master's in Public Relations and Media from Al Ahliya University. I then moved on to pursue a PhD in Legislation and Online Publication, and professionally, I've spent two decades working an administrative job in a key government ministry. Alongside that, I'm a licensed attorney in cessation courts and also an academic lecturer within the same ministry.

Q: What would be your primary focus if you were to win?

A: Given the nature of this by-election, we need to adjust our priorities accordingly. My

chief aim is to put the interests of the citizens first. Unemployment is a pressing concern in Busaiteen, with nearly every household having at least one unemployed member.

I plan to advance the Gulf Cooperation Council Countries' employment platform initiative 2020-2023, which I believe could have a positive impact on local employment rates. Moreover, I intend to tackle unemployment by promoting awareness of the potential benefits of technology in collaboration with

the Ministry of Interior, which has made considerable strides in recent years.

Q: How do you view your chances in the election? And what do you think about those who suggest the constituency is already decided in favour of one candidate?

A: I believe my chances are strong, particularly given my academic and practical experience, alongside the leadership roles I've taken on. My strategy is to

reach out to voters through my comprehensive electoral plan. The notion that the constituency is already decided in favour of one candidate is something I strongly reject; it reflects a lack of confidence in the democratic reform process initiated by His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa, which is designed to allow everyone to voice their views in a civilised manner, free of preconceived assumptions.

Q: What are your goals concerning women's issues?

A: I believe women, with their unique emotional insight, can excel in any field. This belief is supported by Her Highness Shaikha Sabeeka bint Ibrahim Al Khalifa, who advocates for Bahraini women's roles and global presence. This year's theme, "Women worthy partners in nation-building," resonates with my vision for enhancing women's roles in parliament.

Q: How do you plan to improve the living and working conditions of expatriate employees?

A: We must extend and enforce the midday summer ban to protect workers from extreme heat, and I back the Ministry of Labour's efforts on this front. Also, improving oversight and managing truck congestion during peak hours is critical.

Q: Are there any additional concerns you plan to address if elected?

A: An oft-overlooked area is improving services for the elderly in government hospitals

and care homes, particularly by cutting waiting times in radiology departments.

Q: How will you handle the debate between the Shura and Representatives Councils over parliamentary oversight of the retirement fund?

A: My focus will be on addressing retirees' concerns pragmatically, beyond the debate over nomenclature. It's crucial to expedite these matters and reinstate the annual increase for retirees.

Q: Finally, what are your core principles?

A: Integrity and honesty drive my approach, both professionally and personally. I seek to collaborate with skilled individuals to advance the prosperity vision outlined by His Majesty the King. This approach isn't just about hitting the right notes during the campaign — it's about upholding decorum and respect in every action we take, ensuring that the ideals we stand for are not merely concepts in our minds but also reflected in our policies and actions.

Prison time for gas cylinder carjackers

The High Criminal Court has sentenced a 40-year-old man and his female accomplice to five years' imprisonment and ordered the confiscation of a gas cylinder.

The duo was found guilty of carjacking a woman and her daughter by threatening them that they would detonate the gas cylinder with a lighter.

The Public Prosecution charged the 46-year-old male defendant and his 32-year-old female accomplice with carjacking, specifically by imposing their will on the victims.

The prosecution alleged that the male defendant threatened the victims with a gas cylinder and a lighter, forcing them to exit their car before stealing the vehicle.

Resistance

They managed to overpower the woman's resistance, stole her belongings, and fled the scene.

The woman's husband, who testified in court, recounted the incident, stating that while his

wife was in the car with their daughter in a market in East Riffa, he stepped out to visit a shop.

Shortly after, he heard loud noises and witnessed the defendants stealing the car, which belonged to his mother.

"She informed me that the male defendant had held a large gas cylinder and a lighter, threatening to blow up the car if she didn't get out. She quickly

exited the car with our daughter. The defendants then fled, leaving the gas cylinder on the pavement," he said.

Witness

Another witness confirmed seeing the male defendant rolling a gas cylinder with the female defendant towards a parked car on the road.

They forced the victim out

of her car, stole it, and drove away, leaving the gas cylinder behind.

The officer who oversaw the case testified that investigations identified the defendants, who confessed to the crime after their arrest.

The incident was captured on security cameras, and it was revealed that the male defendant had a history of theft.

New AI system set up to enhance building oversight and compliance

A new detection system using artificial intelligence to monitor building changes and violations has been introduced by the Survey and Land Registration Bureau (SLRB).

Developed in partnership with Planet Labs for satellite imagery and Aetosky for AI analysis, the system has been introduced in collaboration with the Ministry of Municipalities and Agricultural Affairs.

The SLRB's Chairman, Eng. Bassim bin Yaqoub Al Hamar, outlined the push to integrate modern technologies into the real estate sector.

This effort aligns with the directives of His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa to devise a national strategy that meets the needs of the digital economy.

The new system leverages advanced technology to monitor changes in construction, the environment, and urban areas.

Strategy

This strategy involves implementing AI technologies across various sectors, upgrading technical infrastructure, and promoting investments to enhance the national economy.

He also highlighted the ongoing oversight by His Royal Highness Prince Salman bin Hamad Al Khalifa, the Crown Prince and Prime Minister, to ensure that government projects and services keep pace with digital transformation goals and

the government's performance and digital transformation programme (2023-2026).

The new system, he went on to say, leverages advanced technology to monitor changes in construction, the environment, and urban areas.

Alterations

AI analyses high-resolution satellite images to detect alterations caused by both natural and human activities.

This technology enhances real-time monitoring by processing and analysing large volumes of data quickly and accurately.

The Chairman stated that the system exemplifies how digital technology can improve government operations, boost the efficiency of detecting construction modifications, save time and costs, and assure regulatory compliance while protecting the urban landscape.

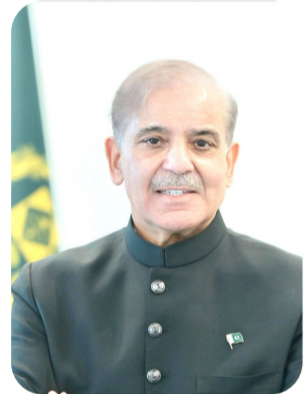

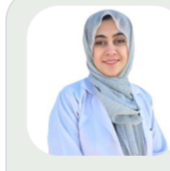

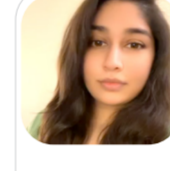

The baseline of Pakistan School goes back to the later part of 1960s when the leading visionary members of the community realized the need for a schooling system for their children, leading to the establishment of a small primary school in 1968 in a rented building in Fareej Fadhel area of Manama.

Trump holds live 'chat' with Musk, after delay

Donald Trump ran through his checklist of conspiracy theories Monday in a conversation with his uber-wealthy supporter Elon Musk that was initially derailed by what the tech titan said was a technical glitch.

In the conversation on X, Trump vented about a "zombie apocalypse" of immigration, repeatedly blasted President Joe Biden as "stupid", and mused on developing a new missile defense system based on the one that defends Israel.

The Republican standard-bearer also dismissed climate change, whose sea-level rises he said would simply create more real estate opportunities.

"The biggest threat is not global warming, where the ocean is going to rise one-eighth of an inch over the next 400 years," he told Musk.

"You'll have more ocean front property, right? The biggest threat is not that. The biggest threat is nuclear warming, be-

cause we have five countries now that have significant nuclear power, and we have to not allow anything to happen with stupid people like Biden."

What was billed as a "no limits" conversation between the two started more than half an hour late, with many of those logging on unable to listen in live.

Border 'apocalypse'

More than a million users listened in live to the conversation on X.

"We have people streaming

over," Musk told Trump, likening the border to the "zombie apocalypse" depicted in the film "World War Z."

"It's just not possible for the United States to absorb, you know, everyone from Earth," said Musk, identifying himself as a "legal immigrant."

Cost 'cutter'

In his "chat" with Musk, Trump returned often to a favorite theme -- boasting about his relationship with autocrats like Russia's Vladimir Putin and China's Xi Jinping, and insisted

America would be safer under his stewardship.

"One of the things we're going to do is we're going to build an Iron Dome," he said, referring to Israel's missile defense system.

"We're going to have the best Iron Dome in the world... because it just takes one maniac to, you know, start something."

Musk reiterated his strong support for Trump, saying the ex-president "was the path to prosperity and Kamala is the opposite."

At one point he also appeared to be touting for a job under a future Trump administration, suggesting he would like to serve on a cost-cutting committee. "I think it would be great to just have a government efficiency commission that takes a look at these things and just ensures that taxpayer money... is spent in a good way," he said. "I'd be happy to help out on such a commission." Trump appeared sold on the job application.

"You're the greatest cutter," he told the man who slashed swathes of staff months after taking over Twitter.

Heat killed nearly 50,000 in Europe in 2023: study

High temperatures which scientists say are being worsened by human-driven carbon emissions caused nearly 50,000 deaths in Europe last year, a study published Monday found.



The study by the Barcelona Institute for Global Health estimated that 47,690 died in connection with heat during the world's warmest year and Europe's second-warmest year on record.

In the past decade, only 2022 was deadlier, the annual report found, with more than 60,000 heat-related deaths.

Published in the journal Nature Medicine, the study took in temperature and mortality records from 35 countries across the continent.

The authors highlighted that older people were most at risk, with countries in southern Europe worst affected by the heat.

More than half the deaths occurred during two periods of high heat in mid-July and August, when Greece battled deadly wildfires. The mercury hit 44 degrees Celsius (111 degrees Fahrenheit) on July 18 in Sicily.

The report cautioned that the headline figure was an es-

timate, adding it was 95 percent confident the mortality burden was between 28,853 and 66,525.

But it also found that heat-related deaths would have been 80 percent higher were it not for action taken by European governments in the 21st century to adapt to hotter summers. "Our results highlight the importance of historical and ongoing adaptations in saving lives during recent summers," said the authors.

The report also showed the "urgency for more effective strategies to further reduce the mortality burden of forthcoming hotter summers", they added, urging more proactive measures to combat global warming. Europe, where the United Nations says temperatures are rising quicker than the rest of the globe, has experienced a growing number of often deadly heatwaves since the turn of the century.

The singer is due to perform five nights at Wembley Stadium in the UK capital between 15 and 20 August marking her return to the stage for the first time since police in Austria foiled a plan to attack her concerts at the Ernst Happel Stadium in Vienna - and a new

report suggests her security has been stepped up to levels usually reserved for U.S. presidents.

A source told The Sun newspaper the singer now has "presidential level" security around her. An insider added: "Taylor's security and of those around her has always been paramount, but even more so now."

"She and her dancers were told to 'go to ground for their own safety' in light of the Vienna threat. That's why nothing has been said about the cancelled shows beyond the promoter's

statement."

Taylor's concerts in Vienna were cancelled after the threat was detected and a statement from London's Metropolitan Police assured fans there's nothing to indicate the Wembley shows will be targeted.

The statement - obtained by PEOPLE - read: "There's nothing to indicate that the matters being investigated by the Austrian authorities will have an impact on upcoming events here in London."

Drake stepped in to help save Italian football club Venezia FC from bankruptcy.

The musician's pal Matteo Babel convinced the star to get involved ahead of the 2023-2024 season after it was revealed the Serie A side needed to raise \$40 million to avoid falling into financial ruin and possibly being demoted to a lower league - and the star helped rally investors so the money was raised within two weeks.

Babel told GQ Italia: "I got a call from Brad Katsuyama, co-owner of Venezia and a good friend of mine. He laid out the problem

to me in a simple way: Venezia has to raise €10 million in a couple of weeks, and then at least €30 million in a few months, or the club will go bankrupt ...

"Venice is an incredible city and Venezia has always been a special club. I spoke to Drake, then Brad and I discussed the details of how we could help. Within two weeks we had a deal, raised the money needed to pay the salaries and avoid bankruptcy."

Venezia FC co-owner Brad Katsuyama added: "Drake's value to any football club is undeniable, given his scale as a global superstar and the reach of his brand. This intersection of culture and sport is exactly where we want to be."

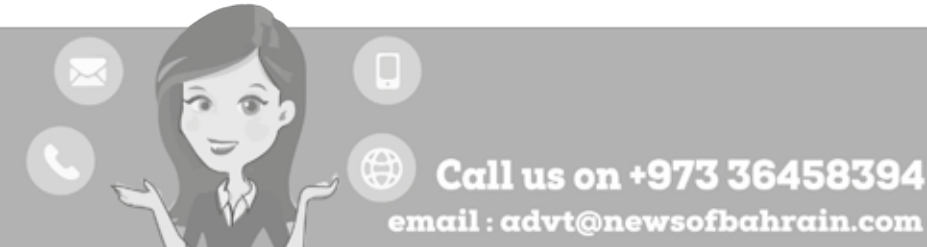

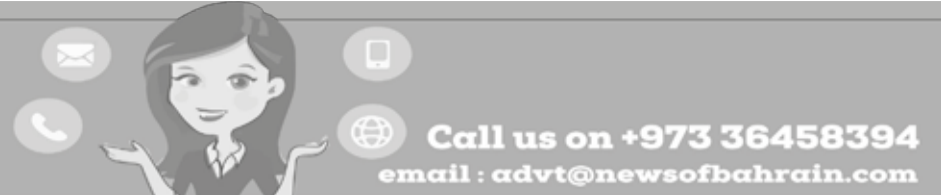

Olympic flag arrival kicks off 2028 'pressure' for Los Angeles

Los Angeles officials have four years to organize a successful Games amid traffic and infrastructure concerns

● Mayor pledges "no-car Games" in car-centric city

● Plans include 3,000 borrowed buses and dedicated lanes

● LA banking on entertainment industry and sports reputation

The Olympic flag arrived under bright skies Monday in Los Angeles, where officials now have four short years to organize a Games capable of rivalling the widely praised Paris edition in a notoriously traffic-clogged metropolis. Los Angeles Mayor Karen Bass landed in a plane emblazoned with palm trees and the logo "LA 2028," and crossed the tarmac holding the five-ringed banner, accompanied by several US athletes.

"We feel the pressure to make sure that our city and our region is prepared and ready," she told reporters.

"We have the flag now. It's on us. We got a lot of work to do Los Angeles," Bass added.

A timely reminder of potential unique challenges came moments before her plane landed,

as a 4.6-magnitude earthquake shook Los Angeles.

"Making sure that we are prepared for events like an earthquake" will be key to infrastructure plans, she said. "But also now we have climate events that we never thought about impacting our region, that we have to be prepared for as well."

Still, the biggest challenge will inevitably be transport.

In Paris for the closing ceremony last weekend, Bass outlined plans for Los Angeles to deliver a "no-car Games."

In a city addicted to private vehicles, where gigantic freeways criss-cross the urban sprawl and traffic jams are a daily inevitability, that pledge is ambitious.

"I'm skeptical we'll actually achieve that, but I know we're going to try," said James Moore, an industrial and systems engineering professor at University of Southern California.

'Out of town'

Los Angeles does have a subway network, but at just five-and-a-half lines and relatively infrequent service, it is tiny for the region's 10 million residents.

Authorities plan to bring in 3,000 buses, borrowed from all over the country, and to create dedicated road lanes for them.

Public transport will receive priority over private cars, which

will not be banned.

Not all Olympic sites are expected to have parking.

The last time Los Angeles hosted the Olympics, in 1984, many residents left the city, averting a traffic nightmare.

"If we see residents following the same strategy in 2028 and basically getting out of town for a few days, that may free up enough road space that we're able to move everybody with buses," said Moore.

The city's giant main airport, infamous for its accessibility issues, will -- at least -- finally be connected to the metro train network.

An automated shuttle, long in the works, is due to open by

2026, when Los Angeles will host the opening match of the soccer World Cup.

Hollywood, homelessness

Los Angeles is counting heavily on its reputation as the world's movies and entertainment capital.

In a "handover" segment of the Paris closing ceremony, Tom Cruise parachuted with the Olympic flag into Los Angeles near the famous Hollywood sign, which he then redecorated with the Olympic logo.

Los Angeles is also a US sporting powerhouse, with numerous major teams and state-of-the-art stadiums.

"What's not in our DNA? We're creative, we're storytellers. We've got sport, we've got diversity. It's LA," Reynold Hoover, CEO of the 2028 organizing committee, told AFP.

But beneath the Hollywood glitz, Los Angeles has an enormous homelessness crisis. Some 75,000 people lack housing, in a city where real estate is eye-wateringly expensive.

Since arriving at City Hall, Bass has made this long standing issue a priority. A vast shelter program has recently shown signs of progress.

The total number of homeless people fell slightly in 2024, for the first time in six years.

Man City's Haaland nominated for PFA Player of the Year award

England playmaker Foden scored 27 goals last season for Pep Guardiola's men.

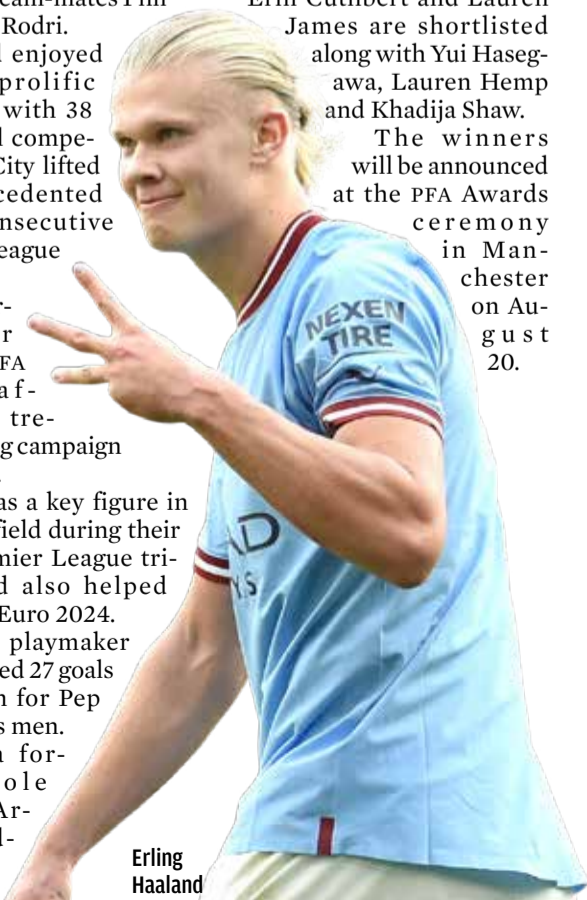
Chelsea forward Cole Palmer, Arsenal midfielder Martin

Popyrin breaks Aussie dry spell with ATP Montreal title

Alexei Popyrin profited from the mental fragility of Andrey Rublev on Monday as the Australian won the biggest title of his career at the ATP Montreal Masters.

World number 62 Popyrin beat sixth-ranked Rublev 6-2, 6-4 in 90 minutes in the US Open tuneup, denying the Russian a second Masters crown this season after winning at Madrid.

"One of the best matches I've played in my life," Popyrin said of the victory. "It's not the way I played in that final that makes me most proud. It's more the way I played all week."

Popyrin is the first Australian to win a Masters 1000 title since Lleyton Hewitt in 2003 at Indian Wells.

The only other Aussie to reach a Canadi-

an final was Patrick Rafter in 2001, who lost to Romanian Andrei Pavel.

Popyrin, who turned 25 last week, is the fourth from his nation to win at this level, following Rafter (1998 Toronto, 1998 Cincinnati), Mark Philippoussis (1999 Indian Wells) and Hewitt (2002-2003 Indian Wells).

"This means so much, it means the world," an emotional Popyrin said. "All the hard work we've put in over the last couple of years has paid off."

Popyrin, who beat five top-20 opponents during his run to Canadian glory, said he never felt much pressure.

"I felt pretty calm. I love to play matches like this. There is no point in being nervous or afraid of the opportunity," he said.

"I wanted to impose myself in the first game and I think I managed to do that. It

disturbed him a little bit, which was part of the game plan. I kept going in that way."

Pegula beats Anisimova for second WTA Canada title in a row

Jessica Pegula defeated Amanda Anisimova 6-3, 2-6, 6-1 in an all-American final on Monday to win the WTA Toronto Masters, becoming the event's first back-to-back champion since 2000.

Sixth-ranked Pegula captured her sixth career WTA title and second of the year after Berlin in June to become the first consecutive winner in Canada since Martina Hingis in 1999-2000.

"Crazy. I can't believe it. I wanted it so bad," a tearful

Pegula said. "Getting emotional thinking about it. I'm so happy to take the title here. It's awesome. I'm just flooded with emotions."

"It has been an up-and-down year but these are happy tears. I'm so happy."

Pegula said she was happy to have won the Canadian crown in both of the event's alternating home cities, Montreal and Toronto, which is near her own hometown of Buffalo, New York.

Her grandparents, one from Toronto and the other from Montreal, were in the audience.

"One in each city so that's one for each of you," Pegula said.

Pegula improved to 3-0 in her career rivalry with Anisimova, taking her second victory of the year after April at Charleston.

Pegula broke Anisimova to begin the match and again to claim the first set after 27 minutes when Anisimova double faulted.

In the second set, Anisimova smacked a forehand winner to break Pegula for a 2-1 lead and Pegula double faulted away a break to give Anisimova a 5-2 edge on the way to a third set.
