Pamela Anderson broke down watching her 'sad' Netflix documentary

Pamela Anderson broke down in tears while watching her Netflix documentary 'Pamela: A Love Story'.

The 'Baywatch' star looked back on her rise to fame and her time in the showbiz spotlight for the film - which was produced by her son Brandon Thomas Lee - and she insisted she didn't want to watch it but she eventually relented and made her too sad.

Speaking in a video for Vogue France, she explained: "I said:

"If we are going to do this documentary, I want nothing to do with it. I don't want to see anything. I don't want to see it. I don't want to have any control over this ... I watched a little bit of it and I just couldn't watch it. I broke down, you know, because ... I think some things are better left in the past. To rehash them was a little sad for me."

However, Pamela went on to insist she saw that some good has come over the documentary because her honestly won her a new legion of fans.

She added: "People do come up to me on the street now and say: 'I love you. I didn't like you before but I love you now' ... because of the

documentary."

In the interview, Pamela also touched the sexualisation of her image and how her public persona led to people "talking badly" to her in the past.

She said: "I kind of grew up a little bit at the Playboy mansion so I was surrounded by you know, [the] sexy lifestyle so sometimes I would feel like I brought it upon myself when people talked badly to me."

"Even though that's a horrible thing to say and obviously it's not true because you should always be respected but at the time I just learned how to navigate it and not take it too personally and laugh it off."

Jada Pinkett Smith claims Chris Rock asked her out on date amid Will Smith divorce rumours

Jada Pinkett Smith has claimed Chris Rock asked her out on a date.

The 52-year-old star - who has revealed she and husband Will Smith have been secretly separated for the last seven years - recalled a moment amid divorce rumours in the past when the comedian actually phoned her thinking she was available.

She told People magazine: "I think every summer all the reports would come out that me and Will were getting a divorce. And this particular summer, Chris, he thought that we were getting a divorce."

"So he called me and basically he was like, 'I'd love to take you out.' And I was like, 'What do you mean?' He was like, 'Well, aren't you and Will getting a divorce?'"

"I was like, 'No. Chris, those are just rumors.' He was appalled. And he profusely apologized and that was that."

Jada didn't reveal when the exchange happened, but she admitted she hasn't spoken to the 58-year-old comedian since the 2022 Oscars when Will, 55, slapped him in the face over a joke about her shaved head, which sparked controversy due to her alopecia.

She said: "No, I haven't talked to Chris... [Do I have] any desire to talk to Chris? Here's my desire: I just hope that all the misunderstanding around this can be cleared up and that there can be peace."

Asked if she was offended by the joke, she refused to

pass "judgement" on someone else's art.

But she added: "I'll say that several times I've had my feelings hurt, for sure. I've had my feelings hurt a lot by Chris."

"But at the end of the day, too, being in the spotlight, it comes with the territory."

Jada thinks there was a "misunderstanding" between the pair going back to the 2016 Oscars, which he hosted and she publicly protested after the Academy Awards failed to nominate anyone of colour in the four acting categories.

They both apologised at the time, and she has now confirmed he also said sorry in the immediate aftermath of his joke and Will's slap at the 2022 ceremony.

She recalled: "Chris came down to the end of the stage and tried to apologize to me. He said, 'I didn't mean you any harm.'"

"I said, 'I can't talk about this now, Chris. This is some old s***.' I thought this was [about] the Oscar 2016 and... their stuff that they had before I even came into the picture in the late '80s."

John Cena apologizes to Dwayne Johnson

John Cena has apologized for criticising Dwayne 'The Rock' Johnson.

The 46-year-old star previously slammed Dwayne, 51, for turning his back on his wrestling career in order to become an actor - but John has now confessed to making a mistake.

John - who has also made the transition into the movie business - said during a WWE press conference: "I went about it the wrong way."

"I violated his trust and I made allegations about his perspective that I knew nothing

about. And deep down, I was a fan. I wanted The Rock back [in WWE]. I wanted to do anything to get The Rock back, but I did

it the wrong way." The wrestler-turned-actor acknowledged that his comments weren't "respectful".

John said: "I had to eat a little bit of crow. I had to say 'I'm sorry and I was wrong,' because I am sorry and I was wrong, and that's a very humbling experience. Dwayne is a hell of a guy."

"I became who I despised. I see that perspective and I understand it. It was a great learning experience from my mistake with feuding with The Rock."

John has put his acting career on hold over recent months, amid the ongoing actors' strike.

However, he plans to return to the movie business at some stage in the future.

Meanwhile, Sharon previously suggested that her reputation for being "difficult" has damaged her career.

The actress has been outspoken on various issues over the years, and Sharon thinks her honesty has undermined her earning potential.

She told WSJ Magazine: "I'm just excited to see where I belong in the world, to see where my journey is going."

"I think that when I was saying all these things - that now Kamala Harris, our fabulous vice president, and Michelle Obama and Hillary Clinton are now avidly discussing - about women's rights, [it] made my film career quite difficult."

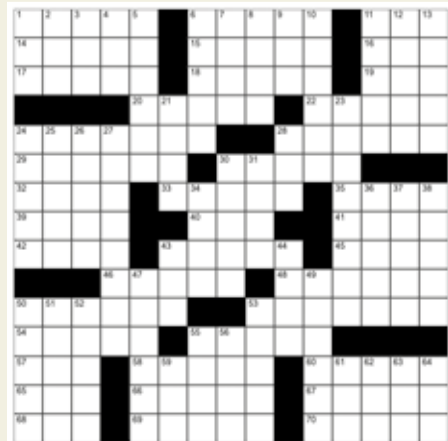
