# Williamson leads New Zealand to victory, suffers new injury worry

Captain Kane Williamson returns with a stellar 78, but exits due to an injury as New Zealand secures a dominant win

### New Zealand comfortably chases down 246 for victory

ane Williamson marked his return to the World Cup with an undefeated 78 as New Zealand cruised past Bangladesh by eight wickets yesterday but the captain was forced to retire hurt with a hand injury.

Williamson had been sidelined with a serious knee injury picked up during the IPL and sat out New Zealand's first two wins at the World Cup.

Chasing 246 to win, the 33-year-old, playing his first ODI since January, had reached his 43rd fifty in the format off 81 balls and was looking well set for a century.
