Eastern Ukraine village 'captured' by Russian forces

Russia yesterday said it had captured another village in south-eastern Ukraine as it continues to make battlefield gains in the conflict that is now into its third year.

"Units from the Vostok troops captured the village of Urozhaine" in the Donetsk region, the Russian defence ministry announced in its daily report.

The village was one of the few that Ukraine won back during its 2023 offensive.

Russia has been slowly taking territory in eastern Ukraine since that failed Ukrainian counter-offensive, as Kyiv's troops struggle with shortages of munitions and manpower.

Birthday party shooting tragedy

A former military sniper opened fire at a neighbour's birthday party in a village in central France on Saturday night, killing three people before killing himself, local authorities said.

Police are still investigating the circumstances of the shootings in Vozelle at a family gathering to celebrate a man's 20th birthday.

Around 9:45 pm (1945 GMT) on Saturday, the former soldier, 57, appeared on a path leading to the home and began shooting, local prosecutor Jerome Picques told AFP.

Landslide victims' bodies retrieved

Nepali search teams retrieved more bodies yesterday of the roughly 50 people missing after a landslide triggered by torrential rains swept two buses into a fast-flowing river.

Over 300 officers, including divers, were scouring the river for passengers and the two buses themselves, said Kumar Neupane, spokesperson for Nepal's armed police unit.

Other teams on boats were using sensor equipment to search the murky water. Grieving relatives waited on the banks in shock.

Bahrain denounces assassination attempt on Trump

His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa and His Royal Highness Prince Salman bin Hamad Al Khalifa, the Crown Prince and Prime Minister, sent cables to former US President Donald Trump, a Republican presidential candidate, strongly denouncing the assassination attempt on him during his campaign rally in Pennsylvania.

HM the King and HRH Prince

Salman condemned all forms of political violence that contravene democratic norms and values. They expressed his relief that former President Trump is safe. In a statement issued by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, it affirmed that the assassination attempt is a crime that contravenes democratic principles.

The ministry wished the former president health and safety, and that the US election cam-

paigns would continue in peace, without any form of violence and terrorism.

The ministry expressed the Kingdom's solidarity with the US and highlighted the long-standing relations between the two nations. It also extended wishes for a speedy recovery to those injured and expressed hopes for continued security, stability, and prosperity for the American people.

Divided Unity

Trump, Biden call for unity after assassination bid stuns US

Rivals Joe Biden and Donald Trump urged Americans to show unity yesterday after an assassination attempt on the Republican put the nation on edge in the run-up to the presidential election.

President Biden said he would address the nation from the Oval Office later in the day, a step only taken at times of grave crisis, after his 78-year-old predecessor was hit in the ear at a campaign rally in Butler, Pennsylvania.

"Unity is the most elusive goal of all, but nothing is more important than that right now," Biden said in brief remarks from the White House, flanked by Vice President Kamala Harris and his homeland security chief.

The 81-year-old Democrat said he had a "short but good conversation" on Saturday with Trump, his political nemesis whom he regularly brands as a threat to democracy.

important than ever that we stand United," Trump said in a statement on his Truth Social network, adding that Americans should not allow "Evil to win."

The tycoon added that it was "God alone who prevented the unthinkable from happening" and that he would "FEAR NOT."

Trump's wife Melania called the shooter a "monster."

Shock

World leaders and governments reacted with shock to the wounding of Trump.

Leaders globally spoke out against political violence and expressed their support for those affected by Saturday's shooting, which killed one bystander and left two other spectators critically wounded.

China's Xi Jinping expressed his "compassion and sympathy" for Trump, with a foreign ministry spokesman saying Beijing was "closely following" the incident.

Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi said he was "deeply concerned by the attack on my

friend."

Violence

"Violence has no place in politics and democracies," said Modi.

Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida also spoke out against political attacks, saying "we must stand firm against any form of violence that challenges democracy."

European Commission President Ursula von der Leyen said she was "deeply shocked" by the attack.

German Chancellor Olaf Scholz called the shooting "despicable" and said "such acts of violence threaten democracy."

Tragedy

In neighboring France, President Emmanuel Macron called the assassination attempt a "tragedy for our democracies."

Russia strongly condemned any violence in the context of politics, Kremlin spokesman Dmitry Peskov said yesterday.

Ukraine's President Volodymyr Zelensky said he was "appalled to learn about the shooting" and wished Trump a "speedy recovery."

"Such violence has no justification and no place anywhere

in the world. Never should violence prevail," he said.

Confidence

Turkey's President Recep Tayyip Erdogan expressed confidence "that the investigation into the attack will be carried out in the most effective way and that the perpetrators and their instigators will be brought to justice as soon as possible in order not to cast a shadow on the US elections and global stability."

The Vatican, meanwhile, voiced "its concern following yesterday's violent episode which injures people and democracy, provoking suffering and death."

Argentina's President Javier Milei blamed the "international left" after the assassination attempt.

Terrorism

"In panic of losing at the polls, they resort to terrorism to impose their backward and authoritarian agenda," said the populist president.

Brazil's President Luiz Inacio Lula da Silva said the shooting "must be strongly condemned by all defenders of democracy and political dialogue."

Hamas 'pulling out' of Gaza truce talks

A Hamas official said yesterday the Palestinian group was withdrawing from Gaza truce talks, following a deadly Israeli strike that targeted the group's commander Mohammed Deif more than nine months into the war.

Deif was "well and directly overseeing" operations, another

Hamas official told AFP, despite the bombing raid on a southern Gaza displacement camp on Saturday, which Israel said was an attempt to kill him.

The first senior official from the Iran-backed group, whose October 7 attack on southern Israel sparked the war, said Hamas was pulling out of negotiations towards a ceasefire partly because

of Israeli "massacres".

The health ministry in the Gaza Strip said at least 92 people had been killed and 300 wounded in a strike on Al-Mawasi, an Israeli-designated "safe zone" on the Mediterranean coast. Ismail Haniyeh, Hamas's Qatar-based political chief, told international mediators of the "decision to halt negotiations due to the (Israeli)

occupation's lack of seriousness, continued policy of procrastination and obstruction, and the ongoing massacres against unarmed civilians", the official said.

But Hamas was "ready to resume negotiations" when Israel's government "demonstrates seriousness in reaching a ceasefire agreement and a prisoner exchange deal", the official quoted

Haniyeh as saying.

Talks mediated by Qatar and Egypt, with United States support, have for months tried but failed to bring a halt to the war.

Israeli demonstrators, sometimes in the tens of thousands, have stepped up their actions demanding the government reach a deal to free the captives taken by Hamas fighters on October 7.

A billion-dollar industrial boom

Bahrain thrives with 38 new factories and major investments

● **Industrial Zones are 90% occupied in year of record growth**

Bahrain's industrial sector is on an impressive trajectory.

Over the past year, the number of factories has surged by 38, bringing the total to 857, according to the Ministry of Industry and Commerce.

This wave of industrial activity has driven investment levels in Bahrain's industrial zones past BD3.7 billion.

These zones, spanning 14.5 million square metres, are now 90% occupied.

The ministry has rolled out a new leasing model to support this growth. Lease contracts are now structured based on an approved template, with rental rates varying by activity.

Leases

For industrial operations, leases are set for 25 years at a rate of BD1 per square metre annually.

For logistical activities, the lease period is 15 years at BD4 per square metre per year.

The ministry's push to enhance Bahrain's industrial capacity is visible in several development projects.

In a memorandum to the legislative authority, the ministry detailed infrastructure projects under the industrial sector strategy (2022-2026).

Initial investment

These include the Bahrain International Investment Park and the US Trade Zone, with an initial investment of BD4.5 million, slated for completion

trial areas are being upgraded with an initial budget of BD2.5 million, expected to be completed by December 2024.

Sewage network

Additionally, a sewage network in the Al-Mazara'a and Al Lahsi industrial areas is in the planning stages, with an initial cost of BD230,000 and a target completion date of December

2024. A main power station is also being constructed in the east of Salman Industrial City at an initial cost of BD9.75 million, though the completion date is still under review.

These developments indicate that Bahrain is not just participating in the global industrial landscape; it's aiming to be a significant player.

In Salman Industrial City, the ministry is managing the development of advanced sanitation facilities with an initial cost of BD10.2 million, set to finish by December 2025.

Rare celestial event to illuminate Mecca today

Al-Asfoor: Sun overhead Kaaba, guiding Qibla direction worldwide

Get ready for a celestial show over Mecca today.

At precisely 12:27pm local time, the sun will be directly overhead the Holy Kaaba, casting no shadows and offering an extraordinary spectacle.

This rare event, calculated by astronomy researcher Mohammed Al-Asfoor, is significant for Muslims worldwide.

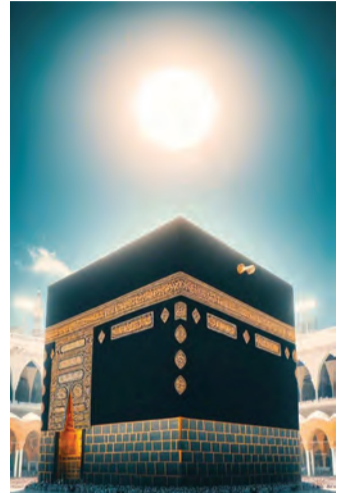
At this moment, the sun will reach its zenith, resulting in the complete disappearance of shadows from the Kaaba and all surrounding objects in Mecca.

This alignment provides a perfect chance for Muslims to accurately determine the Qibla, the direction they face during prayer.

Al-Asfoor explains that placing a vertical stick on flat ground at the time of the alignment will help.

The direction opposite the stick's shadow will precisely point to the Qibla.

This method has been used for centuries to ensure accurate Qibla determination any location where the sun is

visible. This event happens twice a year as the sun moves between the Tropic of Cancer and the equator.

First occurrence

The first occurrence was in late

May, and this upcoming event on 15th July is the final one for the year.

Al-Asfoor attributes this phenomenon to the Earth's axial tilt of 23.5 degrees.

Places between latitudes of less than 23.5 degrees north and south experience this alignment of the sun and Kaaba twice a year, with the timing varying based on the specific latitude.

SIO Scam Busted

BD109,000 fraud suspect arrested from Saudi Arabia

In a major victory against fraud, Bahraini authorities have apprehended a suspect wanted for allegedly swindling the Social Insurance Organisation (SIO) out of a staggering BD109,000.

The arrest, a collaborative effort between Bahraini and Saudi security forces, follows an international arrest warrant issued by the Public Prosecution.

The case unfolded after SIO filed a hefty complaint, accusing the suspect of manipulating the system for personal gain.

Investigations revealed the suspect had gained illegal access to SIO's electronic filing and submitted fabricated employment contracts for fictitious female workers supposedly employed by his father's company.

False claims

These false claims allowed him to register the workers for the social insurance program and subsequently request their "resignation" at manipulated dates.

This enabled him to exploit the system and receive hefty one-time compensation payouts meant for the insured individuals.

Financial trails exposed the suspect as the recipient of these misappropriated funds.

Escape

Faced with the suspect's escape from Bahrain, the Public Prosecution wasted no time in issuing an international arrest warrant.



The suspect had gained illegal access to SIO's electronic filing and submitted fabricated employment contracts for fictitious female workers supposedly employed by his father's company.

Saudi authorities, working closely with Bahrain's international security departments, successfully apprehended the suspect and extradited him back to Bahrain.

Upon his return, the suspect underwent thorough questioning by the Public Prosecution and has been remanded in custody. A comprehensive investigation into this significant fraud case is currently underway.

European man faces verdict in passport forgery scandal

A European man, 75, is scheduled to be sentenced on July 29, 2024 by the High Criminal Court for attempting to enter the Kingdom of Bahrain using a forged passport.

The court heard the case and the defendant denied the charges, but remains in custody.

The Public Prosecution charged the defendant with using a forged electronic document, specifically a passport, in an attempt to enter the country.

The incident occurred on March 22 this year when the defendant, aided by a well-intentioned employee,

entered incorrect data into a government system belonging to the Nationality, Passports and Residence Affairs (NPRA).

This was done with the intention of using the false data for entry into the Kingdom.

The defendant used a forged passport, purportedly issued by a European country, to enter Bahrain International Airport.

False pretenses

Investigations revealed that the defendant had entered the country under false pretenses.

He presented the forged passport, purportedly issued by a European country, to the passport officer at Bahrain International Airport.

The officer accepted the document, unaware of its fraudulent nature.

The investigation involved a witness who confirmed that, as part of their job, they are responsible for receiving travelers' passports and verifying their details against the passport photo.

Agency anxiety as cargo is held for months

Tonnes of marine cargo shipped from Bahrain and other GCC countries have been detained at the Kochi port for months due to the customs authority's non-clearance, the cargo agency owners disclosed at a press conference in Bahrain.

This has been a pressing problem since February 2024, affecting over 300 clients from six significant Bahraini freight companies that shipped two shipments during this period.

Due to the delay, a large number of products have already expired and cannot be used by the recipients.

Bahraini cargo company owners are blaming the Kochi Seaport Customs Commissioner for this distress situation, as he has not yet provided any clarifi-

fication.

Since the shipment has been held since February, cargo companies are also required to pay daily storage fees, which are substantially more than the money they were paid by their clients.

The majority of the victims are domestic workers from lower-class backgrounds who send used household goods, clothing, and food items home.

Since sea freight is less expensive than air cargo, lower-class customers typically choose it. Typically, it takes 18 to 20 days to clear marine cargo from Bahrain to Kerala.

During the press conference, Ms. Jaymol, CEO of Eastern Movers and Cargo, based in Hidd, said that the problem was exclusive to the Kochi port and did not exist in any other Indian port.

The representatives of the Bahrain-based cargo businesses are attempting to get in touch with Kerala's higher authorities, such as the Chief Minister's office and Members of Parliament, as well as the Indian Embassy in Bahrain.

Ms. Jaymol, Mr. Vinod, Mr. Younus, Mr. Afsal, Mr. Yashir, and Mr. Abhilash, representing the cargo companies, attended the press conference.

1,189 fire incidents in Bahrain reported in first half of 2024

Directorate of Civil Defence calls for caution, vigilance

About 1,189 fire incidents in homes, facilities, warehouses, and vehicles were reported in Bahrain during the first half of 2024, according to Brigadier General Pilot Ali Al-Kubaisi, Director General of the General Directorate of Civil Defence.

He emphasised the importance of applying precautionary and preventive measures to avoid accidents, especially given the high summer temperatures, and to ensure the protection and safety of citizens and residents.

General Al-Kubaisi explained that the main causes of fires in homes and buildings are negligence and children playing with electrical appliances and flammable materials like lighters and matches.

Inspection and maintenance

He urged regular inspection and maintenance of electrical equipment and connections, avoiding the overloading of electrical circuits, and proper maintenance of gas cylinders, including keeping them out of direct

He also recommended having fire extinguishers on hand.

The Director General further stated that the number of vehicle fire incidents reached 402 during the first half of 2024.

General Al-Kubaisi urged vehicle users to conduct periodic inspections and avoid

leaving flammable materials like lighters, gas canisters, and batteries inside the car. He also advised slightly opening the car windows to prevent fires.

Safety

To ensure the safety of homes and property, General Al-Kubaisi recommended that travellers disconnect electrical appliances, turn off air conditioning, close gas cylinders, and install security and early warning devices such as cameras and alarms for rapid detection and response to incidents.

Recognising the importance of public awareness, the General Directorate of Civil Defence has prepared various awareness programmes and campaigns for the summer season.

These include training courses, practical workshops, and targeted campaigns on the safety of places of worship, swimming pools, commercial and industrial establishments, shared housing, vehicles, and fuel stations.

Sparking revival

Committee completes counting Manama Souq fire losses and calls for action

57 shops damaged with estimated total losses exceeding BD1.5 million

The Manama Souq Development Committee has completed its assessment of damages to shops affected by the fire that broke out in the market on June 12, 2024.

The committee has documented damages to 57 shops, with estimated total losses exceeding BD1.5 million, according to Riyadh Al Mahrous, Chairman of the Manama Souq Development Committee.

While the committee has initiated contact with property owners and those affected by the fire, the process is complicated due to the involvement of numerous heirs for some properties, with approximately 30 shops being rented out.

To address this, the committee has recommended providing facilities for shop owners and landlords affected by the fire, including offering soft loans for reconstruction or long-term investments in properties by official entities.

Revitalisation

These measures are aimed at stimulating economic activity in the Manama Souq and ensuring its revitalisation.

Oil demand growth slowing, China consumption dips: IEA

The International Energy Agency trimmed its forecasts Thursday as it said world oil demand growth continues to slow and consumption in China dipped.

The Paris-based body that advises industrial nations on energy policy said oil demand increased by just 710,000 barrels per day in the second quarter, the slowest rate in over a year.

"Oil consumption in China, long the engine of global oil demand growth, contracted in both April and May" the IEA said in its monthly report on the

oil market.

Chinese demand in the second quarter was also marginally below the same period in 2023.

While demand in that quarter benefitted from the reopening of the Chinese economy after Covid lockdowns, the IEA said that the recent drop also "points to an intrinsic slowdown" and that "the downswing in the industrial fuels indicates a broader weakness in manufacturing".

The world's second-largest economy is grappling with a real estate debt crisis, weakening consumption, an ageing population and geopolitical tensions

overseas.

The IEA trimmed its forecast for Chinese oil demand this year by 0.2 million barrels per day (mbd) to 17 mbd. While that would be a gain of 0.5 mbd from 2023, it is far short of the 1.5 mbd gain last year.

The IEA sees Chinese demand growth slowing to 0.3 mbd in 2025, also a drop of 0.2 mbd from its previous forecast.

The return to pre-Covid normalcy and weak growth will also see China's weight in global oil demand growth decline, from about 70 percent of gains last year to 40 percent this year and

next, according to the IEA.

Emerging economies such as India and Brazil will account for a greater share in global oil demand growth, while advanced economies in the OECD will see consumption decline.

"Global gains are forecast to average just below 1 mbd in 2024 and 2025, as subpar economic growth, greater efficiencies and vehicle electrification act as headwinds," the agency said.

It trimmed its 2024 global oil demand forecast by 0.1 mbd to 103.1 mbd and its 2025 forecast by 0.2 mbd to 104.0 mbd.

Pakistan pledges \$7 bn IMF aid deal will be its last Islamabad, Pakistan

The International Monetary Fund has agreed to loan Pakistan \$7 billion to bolster its faltering economy, with Islamabad pledging Saturday it would be the last time it relied on relief from the Washington-based lender.

The South Asian nation agreed to the deal -- its 24th IMF payout since 1958 -- in exchange for unpopular reforms, including widening its chronically low tax base.

Pakistan last year came to the brink of default as the economy shrivelled amid po-

litical chaos following catastrophic 2022 monsoon floods and decades of mismanagement, as well as a global economic downturn.

It was saved by last-minute loans from friendly countries, as well as an IMF rescue package, but its finances remain in dire straits, with high inflation and staggering public debts.

"This programme should be considered the last programme," Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif told ministers and revenue officials in Islamabad. "We should tax those who are not being taxed."

Turkey puts its best foot forward to charm Chinese investors

Turkey plans to draw on its geographical position and an EU customs deal to entice Chinese investors keen to access European markets tariff-free, as it recently just did with carmaker BYD.

The Chinese electric vehicle giant signed a billion-dollar deal with Ankara on Monday to open a plant in western Turkey, promising to create 5,000 jobs, a move that will help it dodge new EU tariffs.

The country, at the crossroads between Europe, the Middle East and Central Asia, is in talks with other Chinese companies, Turkey's Industry and Technology Minister Mehmet Fatih Kacir said this week.

"We want to transform Turkey into a production centre for the next generation of vehicles," Kacir told private broadcaster Haberturk.

The minister emphasised his country's selling points, including being part of the EU's customs union and having trade agreements with 28 countries.

"Chinese producers want rapid access to international markets," he said. "Investing in Turkey offers them that."



The EU recently slapped additional provisional tariffs of up to 38 percent on Chinese EVs following an investigation that concluded state subsidies meant they were unfairly undermining European rivals.

But Ankara struck a customs deal with the EU in 1995 that enables the free flow between them of a number of goods, no-

tably cars.

Turkey became one of the leading centres of the world's automobile industry starting in the 1970s, when major carmakers including Fiat and Renault opened plants there -- with others like Ford, Toyota and Hyundai following.

BYD's Turkish base will allow the Chinese EV specialist to by-

pass EU tariffs upped by Brussels in July, and enter European markets.

Under new regulations on investment incentives, BYD will be able to circumvent a new 40 percent tariff that Turkey originally imposed on electric vehicle imports. Manufacturers investing in the country will be exempt.

A new partnership

At least five other Chinese carmakers are now considering opening plants in Turkey, state-owned news agency Anadolu reported.

Turkish manufacturer TOGG and Chinese firm Farasis have also partnered up to produce EV batteries in Turkey.

Turkish officials have held numerous meetings with Chinese industrialists in the last year, the industry ministry said.

Turkey's foreign affairs minister Hakan Fidan visited China in June to seal a new bilateral deal, calling the countries "drivers of Asian wealth."

His visit to Xinjiang was the first by a high-ranking Turkish official since 2012. The west China province is where Beijing is accused of human rights violations against more than one mil-

lion Uyghurs and other Muslim minorities.

Turkey's President Recep Tayyip Erdogan has previously deplored China's policy in Xinjiang, calling it "genocide" in 2009.

But Ankara has since toned down its rhetoric -- and Fidan in June reiterated the state's "total support for China's territorial integrity."

Former diplomat Gulru Gezer says that while it is important, China's treatment of the Uyghurs, who speak a Turkic language, is not the only issue on Beijing and Ankara's mutual agenda -- and it shouldn't hamper their relations.

"Fidan's visit supported this," she said. "The fact that Beijing let Fidan go into Xinjiang, talk to the population, were positive steps." But not all experts see it that way.

"Welcoming more Chinese investment could change Turkey's position on the Uyghur issue and push it to implement an extradition agreement," said Ceren Ergenc, an expert of China-Turkey relations at the Centre for European Policy Studies.

"This would have a very negative impact on the security of the Uyghur diaspora in Turkey,"

which hosts dozens of thousands of Uyghur refugees.

'Common ground'

Many countries, including EU members, want to attract Chinese firms looking to invest in Europe, and Turkey has only just started following suit, Ergenc said.

But obstacles remain, she said, citing an EU legal framework on foreign subsidies that could make it harder for China to "use Turkey as a springboard for Europe."

"In the past, Chinese companies considered that the economic situation in Turkey was not reliable enough, and preferred Hungary or Poland," the researcher said.

However, China and Turkey's warming relations are based on mutual interests, Gezer said.

"Ankara and Beijing share common ground, including a multipolar worldview. Their relations will continue to develop in the foreseeable future," she said.

Erdogan has confirmed his desire to join the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation, whose members include China, Russia and Iran, but where Turkey is only a partner.

Iraqi authorities have removed the remains of 139 people from a large pit believed to contain victims of the Islamic State group (IS), an official said yesterday. The Alo Antar hole -- a natural desert feature turned into a mass grave by IS jihadists-- is located in Tal Afar, some 70 kilometres (40 miles) west of Mosul in northern Iraq. It is not known how many bodies were dumped in the pit, but search efforts for other victims are ongoing. "We have removed the remains of 139 persons and also human body parts," said Dia Karim, director of the mass graves department at the Foundation of Martyrs -- a government institution tasked with finding mass graves and identifying remains. "They include women and men," Karim said, adding that "according to testimonies, the victims date back to IS rule" or before when Al-Qaeda was present in the area.



Iraq recovers remains of 139 likely IS victims from mass grave

Nepal's president appointed Khadga Prasad Sharma Oli as prime minister for a fourth time yesterday, after his communist party forged a coalition government with the centre-left Nepali Congress. First elected as prime minister in 2015, he was reelected in 2018 and then reappointed briefly in 2021 in Nepal's often turbulent parliament. In the Himalayan republic of about 30 million people, overshadowed by giant neighbours India and China, Oli previously trod a fine balance between the rivals, cordial to both but reaching out to Beijing to decrease Nepal's dependency on New Delhi. "President Poudel has appointed KP Sharma Oli as the new prime minister of Nepal," Kiran Pokharel, press adviser to President Ram Chandra Poudel, told AFP.



China, Russia conduct joint naval patrol in the northern and western Pacific. Beijing's defence ministry said yesterday, adding that the exercise was not "targeted" at any other nation. "According to the annual plan and the consensus between China and Russia, naval vessels of China and Russia recently carried out their fourth joint maritime patrol in the western and northern Pacific Ocean," the Chinese defence ministry said in a statement on Sunday. "This operation is not targeted at any third party and has nothing to do with the current international and regional situation," it added. No details were provided on the Pacific manoeuvres, including the ships' routes, their exact locations or the nature of the forces involved. On Friday, China said it was also conducting drills with Russia -- known as Joint Sea-2024 -- along its southern coast.

Alleged Trump shooter filmed on roof with rifle: TMZ video

Gunman lays on his stomach on a rooftop with a rifle in hand, then screams ring out, a video published by US outlet TMZ on Saturday shows.

US presidential candidate Donald Trump was shot in the ear in an assassination attempt by a gunman at a campaign rally Saturday in Butler, Pennsylvania.

The FBI identified the gunman, who was shot dead by the US Secret Service, as Thomas Matthew Crooks, a 20-year-old from the US state's Bethel Park, according to US media.

The video published by TMZ shows the alleged shooter laying on his belly on a rooftop and aiming a rifle.

"The guy has longer brown hair, and he seems to be wearing a grey shirt/khaki pants -- and as you can see, he's carefully trying pinpoint a target from afar before pulling the trigger," TMZ reported.

The man is not shown firing in the published footage. But a quick succession of gunshots is heard followed by screams from people off-camera.

Trump rally witness recounts victim shot dead

A witness to Saturday's shooting at a Donald Trump rally told how a man next to him was shot dead during the apparent assassination attempt on the Republican presidential candidate.

"I heard several gunshots. The man beside me suffered a gunshot to the head, was instantly killed (and) fell to the bottom of the bleachers. Another woman looked like she got hit in the forearm or hand," the man, whose name was only given as Joseph, told NBC News.

He said it seemed the victim was "in the way of the shots between whoever was shooting the gun and the president."

A second witness, an unnamed department physician, let me help you," said the man, who was wearing a white USA T-shirt stained with blood and a red MAGA hat. "The guy had spun around, was jammed between

the benches. He had a headshot here," he said, indicating a spot on his head. "There's lots of blood and he had brain matter," the man continued in comments that spread widely through US media.

How it unfolded

Dressed in a white shirt, dark blazer and bright red MAGA cap, Trump was railing against illegal immigration when shots rang out at 6:08 pm (22:08 GMT). "Take a look at what happened..." he said, his words cut off by four shots in quick succession.

Trump grabbed his right ear as repeated shouts of "get down!" were heard, before a fifth and sixth shot.

The former president crouched down behind the lectern as Secret Service agents moved in around him. Screams were heard in the crowd.

Within four seconds, further shots were fired, prompting more supporters

to get down while additional agents rush to the stage.

Seventeen seconds after the first shots, a final pop was heard and a woman screamed.

Three heavily-armed members of the security forces moved onto the stage 22 seconds after the shooting started. Secret Service agents swiftly shared instructions -- such as "we're clear" and "let's move" -- before they lifted up a dishevelled Trump.

Visible once more around one minute after the gunfire started, Trump said "let me get my shoes" as the agents formed a ring around him.

It's another 13 seconds until Trump raised his fist to the crowd, who responded with cheers.

As the former leader was ushered off the stage, his MAGA cap in hand, onlookers chanted "USA!"

Trump paused briefly to pump his fist in the air, before stepping off the stage.

Immediately before disappearing into an SUV and just two minutes after the assassination attempt started, Trump raised his fist once more and turned briefly towards the crowd.

As the car pulled away, heavily-armed security forces dressed in khaki fatigues moved onto the scene.

Trump says 'felt the bullet

Trump gave his first account of the shooting at 8:42 pm, posting on his Truth Social site. "I was shot with a bullet that pierced the upper part of my right ear," Trump wrote.

"I knew immediately that something was wrong in that I heard a whizzing sound, shots, and immediately felt the bullet ripping through the skin."

The White House said President Joe Biden was given an initial briefing on the incident by 6:50 pm.

"There's no place in America for this kind of violence. It's sick. It's sick," Biden told reporters in Rehoboth Beach, Delaware. Shortly before 10:30 pm, Biden's office said he had spoken to Trump and would cut short his beach weekend to return to Washington

Shooter named

The FBI identified the shooter as Thomas Matthew Crooks, a 20-year-old from Pennsylvania's Bethel Park, according to US media.

Crooks was named by the FBI "as the subject involved in the assassination attempt of former President Donald Trump".

The New York Times, citing official records, reported that Crooks was registered to vote as a Republican, but had previously donated \$15 to a liberal voter turnout group.

The Secret Service said the shooter "fired multiple shots toward the stage from an elevated position outside the rally" before being "neutralized" by agents. Multiple witnesses said they saw the gunman before the shooting and alerted authorities.

Trump supporter Ryan Knight said he saw the attacker

Two witnesses told US media they saw a man fatally shot in the head.

"The man beside me suffered a gunshot to the head, was instantly killed (and)... Another woman looked like she got hit in the forearm or hand," a man, whose name was only given as Joseph, told NBC News.

A second witness, who said he was an emergency doctor, said he went to help after someone shouted that a person had been shot. "The guy had spun around, was jammed between the benches. He had a headshot here," he said, indicating a spot on his head, in comments shared widely in US media.

"There's lots of blood and he had brain matter," said the man, who was wearing a white USA T-shirt stained with blood.

He was later escorted off stage by agents.



Panic, prayers as shooter starts firing at Trump rally

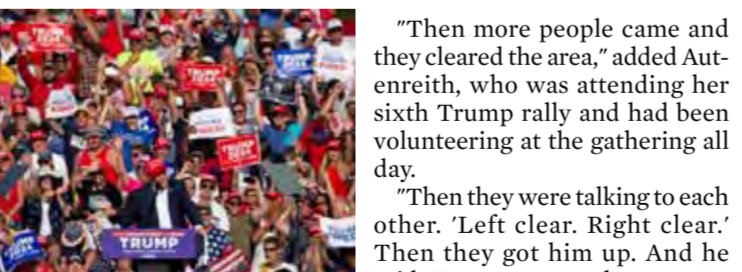
A string of pops sent a crowd of thousands of Donald Trump supporters diving for cover as the Secret Service rushed to protect the man they had waited hours in the sun to see.

A lectern emblazoned with the former president's name was knocked sideways, and the crowd gasped as agents lifted the 78-year-old Republican back to his feet after storming the stage.

Applause and cheering spread through the rural Pennsylvania fairground as Trump, clearly dazed, pumped his fist and waved through the linked arms of his security detail at the stunned

crowd. Officers gestured to his waiting motorcade, while an agent wearing a ballistic helmet and clutching a rifle scoured the crowd at Trump's feet.

The crowd chanted "USA, USA," as an unsteady Trump was led down the handful of steps from the stage to his waiting armored SUV.

"They won't take you down," shouted a man in the crowd as Trump's guardsmen formed a human chain to deliver him to safety, his fist still raised even as he was eased into the vehicle.

Erin Autenreith said she was "sitting in the first row in the middle. I was right in front of Trump."

"Then more people came and they cleared the area," added Autenreith, who was attending her sixth Trump rally and had been volunteering at the gathering all day.

"Then they were talking to each other. 'Left clear. Right clear.' Then they got him up. And he said, 'I gotta get my shoes on.'"

She said those words -- which were caught by Trump's microphone and audible in footage of the incident -- were the first he spoke.

"And I saw on his cheek, on the right side, because he came up straight, I saw a little bit of blood," Autenreith said.

"He turned and I could see it

from the ear. And then he put his arm up with a fist pump," she added.

Trump said in a Truth Social post later that he was "shot with a bullet that pierced the upper part of my right ear."

"Let's go people. Let's go," screamed one Secret Service officer as officials sought to evacuate the thousands of rally-goers.

"This is an active crime scene," said another, as a police helicopter flew overhead and a large police truck marked "Explosives" maneuvered through the mass of people.

Others berated organizers for the apparent lapse in security.

"Nice way to organize a perimeter," shouted one woman as she left.

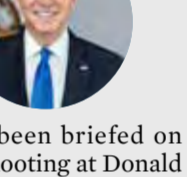

In Bahrain, CBB, released regulations for conventional and Islamic banks to undertake crowdfunding. It is possible for SMEs in Bahrain and the region to raise financing through crowdfunding. Firms operating e-finance platforms must have a license for Crowdfunding Platform Operator.

CBB Regulations provide for the minimum capital requirement for operators, only Person to Business (P2B) financing is permitted, SMEs with certain capital can raise funds through crowdfunding, experts and accredited investors are allowed to provide finance through these platforms and lend up to 10% of their net assets to a single borrower and sign a self-declaration form. Retail investors are not permitted to participate as the risks is of high nature. Platform Operators must disclose fees, charges and commissions and may provide financing to platform users subject to CBB license. If a borrower is unable to raise 80% of the crowdfunding, this will be considered unsuccessful and money should be refunded. A borrower can raise a maximum of BD 100,000 through crowdfunding in a year and the financing tenor should not exceed 5 years.

Globally, there are many big e-crowdfunding platforms, used by interested parties all over. Crowdfunding offers easy accessibility of vast networks through social media and websites to bring investors and entrepreneurs together, with the potential to increase entrepreneurship by expanding the pool of investors beyond the traditional circle of owners, relatives, and venture capitalists. Crowdfunding process created opportunities for entrepreneurs to raise hundreds of thousands or millions of dollars from anyone having money to invest. Investors can select from hundreds of projects and invest as little as 10 dollars.

JD Power has released its 2024 Initial Quality Survey, revealing that EV owners reported significantly more issues with their vehicles compared to ICE car owners. The study's findings are based on responses from nearly 100,000 customers who had purchased their vehicles within the last 90 days. The survey included 207 questions across

10 categories, covering aspects such as infotainment, driving assistance, interiors, and driving experience. For the first time, the survey also incorporated repair visit data, providing a comprehensive view of car ownership in 2024. According to the survey, EVs and plug-in hybrids required more repairs than their ICE-powered counterparts in all 10 categories. Frank Hanley,

Senior Director of Auto Benchmarking at JD Power, noted that these vehicles had a much higher service rate than traditional cars. The average problems per 100 vehicles (PP100) for diesel and petrol cars were 180 PP100, while for EVs, it increased to 226 PP100. Key issues included warning messages, with drivers struggling to understand new technologies or becoming frustrated

with false or unnecessary alerts from the car's driver assistance system. The infotainment system was another major area of concern, with numerous reports of connectivity issues with Apple CarPlay and Android Auto. Additionally, the Features, Controls & Display category was notably problematic, scoring 30% higher in issues than standard ICE cars.

Audi mulls closing Brussels plant as EV demand falters

German luxury carmaker Audi said Tuesday it is considering closing its Brussels plant making electric vehicles due to a global decline in demand for high-end electric cars. The manufacturer, whose parent company is Volkswagen, said it is weighing up the "early end of production" of its Q8 e-tron models at the factory. Management are discussing "solutions for the (Brussels) site," and this "may also include a cessation of operations if no alternative is found", it said in a statement.

The site employs about 3,000 people. Audi cited a "global decline in customer orders in the electric luxury class segment" as a reason. After investing heavily in the shift to electromobility in recent years, automakers have been hit hard in recent times by slowing demand for electric vehicles. Volkswagen -- whose 10 brands also include Porsche, Seat and Skoda -- said closing the Brussels plant, or finding alternative uses for it, as well as other unplanned expenses would have an impact of as much as 2.6 billion euros (\$2.8 billion) in the 2024 financial year.

BYD opens EV plant in Thailand despite slowdown, tariff row

China's electric vehicle giant BYD opened a factory in Thailand on Thursday, continuing its international expansion despite a market slowdown and hours before the European Union was due to impose swingeing tariffs on Chinese EV firms. The plant in Rayong, an industrial area southeast of Bangkok, will be able to build up to 150,000 vehicles a year, according to the company, which dominates its domestic

market. Wang Chuanfu, Shenzhen-based BYD's chief executive, said production would initially focus on full electric vehicles and later expand to include plug-in hybrids, which combine a conventional engine with an electric motor. "BYD Thailand plant has an annual capacity of 150,000 vehicles, including the four major processes of vehicle and parts production, and will create about 10,000 jobs," Wang said at an opening ceremony.

Highway to hell? Plan for Germany's biggest motorway sparks anger

A proposal to create Germany's biggest motorway has sparked a backlash, with critics fearful the "monstrosity" will increase climate-damaging emissions, worsen noise pollution and harm biodiverse habitats. The recommendation suggests widening a section of the A5 outside the western city of Frankfurt to 10 lanes at an estimated cost of 1.1 billion euros



(\$1.2 billion). While supporters say it is necessary to cope with expected increases in traffic on what is already one of Germany's busiest stretches of motorway, it has touched a nerve amid mounting concerns about the climate crisis. Hans Christoph Stoodt, from a campaign group fighting the plans, described the idea as "completely crazy", adding it would create a "monstrosity".

New electric air taxi venture on way

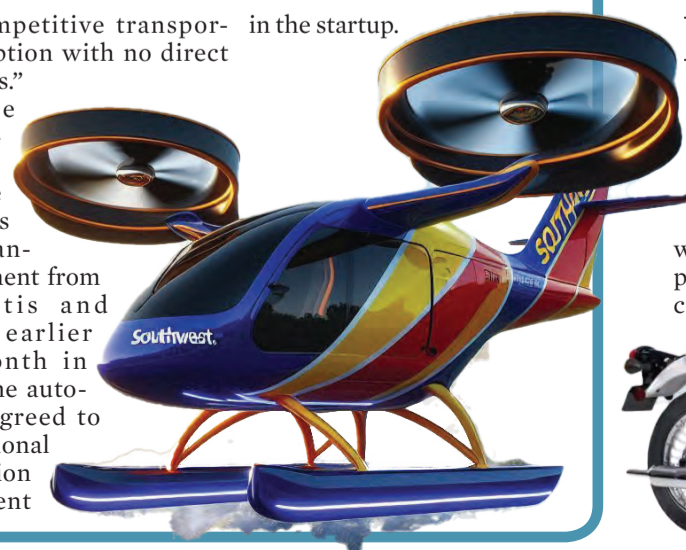

US carrier Southwest Airlines plans to jointly develop a fleet of electric air taxis to serve the California market with transportation startup Archer Aviation, the companies announced Friday. The two companies signed a memorandum of understanding envisioning Southwest making use of Archer's "Midnight" aircraft throughout the nation's largest state, offering short trips from California's 14 airports. Begun as an aviation venture in 2018, Santa Clara, Cal-

ifornia-based Archer has been working to gain Federal Aviation Administration certification of its electric vertical takeoff and landing (eVTOL) aircraft. The company's Midnight eVTOL can carry four passengers in addition to a pilot. The aircraft is "designed to transform urban travel, replacing 60-to-90-minute commutes by car with estimated 10-to-20-minute electric air taxi flights," said a joint press release. "The goal of Archer's aircraft is to offer a safe, low-noise,

cost-competitive transportation option with no direct emissions." The Southwest venture follows a joint announcement from Stellantis and Archer earlier this month in which the automaker agreed to an additional \$55 million investment

in the startup.



Kawasaki rolls out retro-inspired W230

Kawasaki has unveiled a new model called the W230, drawing design inspiration from the W series bikes of the 1960s and 70s. The retro-styled Kawasaki W230 features a round headlamp with a twin-pod instrument console, a tear-

drop-shaped fuel tank, and a single-piece seat. It rides on wire-spoke wheels and sports a chrome peashooter exhaust. Powering the W230 is a 233cc, single-cylinder, air-cooled engine, the details of which are yet to be disclosed. However, this engine also powers the KLX230, producing 19.7 BHP and 20.6 Nm of torque. The W230 boasts a standard suspension setup with a telescopic fork at the front and dual shock absorbers at the rear. It is equipped with disc brakes and dual-channel ABS for added safety.

Alcaraz overpowers Djokovic to retain Wimbledon title

Carlos Alcaraz overpowered seven-time champion Novak Djokovic in straight sets to retain his Wimbledon title on Sunday in a brutal statement that the new era of men's tennis has arrived.

The Spanish third seed produced a performance combining awesome power with delicate touch to win 6-2, 6-2, 7-6 (7/4), collecting the fourth Grand Slam of his young career.

Alcaraz equals the Open Era record for most Grand Slams won at the age 21 or under, joining Boris Becker, Bjorn Borg and Mats Wilander.

And he is just the sixth man to win the French Open and Wimbledon back to back.

Djokovic, 37, who had knee surgery just weeks ago, was aiming to win a 25th Grand Slam -- which would have been a record in the men's and women's game.

But he had no answers in the Centre Court sunshine as the electric Alcaraz pounded him from the back of the court and treated the crowd to an array of

his trademark drop shots.

Alcaraz seized the initiative in a first game of breathtaking quality lasting 14 minutes, taking advantage of his fifth break point. The Spaniard settled quickly into his routine on serve and went up a double break when Djokovic double-faulted in the fifth game.

The shellshocked Serbian, playing in his 10th Wimbledon final, held serve to love to close the gap to 5-2 but dumped the ball into the net to hand the Spaniard the first set.

Alcaraz was immediately on the front foot in the second set, forcing a break in the first game and fending off pressure on his own serve to take a 2-0 lead.

A Djokovic backhand into the net in the seventh game handed Alcaraz another break point and a double fault put the defending champion 5-2 up and on the cusp of a two-set lead.

The Centre Court crowd, including Catherine, Princess of Wales, looked on in disbelief as their hopes for a titanic tussle evaporated.

Djokovic fended off another of clutch of break points early in the third set to stay alive and showed signs that he was finding his range.

But the Spaniard carved out three break points in the ninth game, arrowing a passing shot past his stranded opponent to move 5-4 ahead.

Alcaraz stepped up to serve for the championship but squandered three match points, missing a straightforward drive volley as Djokovic broke for the first time in the match.

But he recovered his composure quickly as the set went to a tie-break. Djokovic went wide with a forehand to give Alcaraz a 5-3 lead and the Spaniard won the title with his fourth championship point.

The result means Djokovic has still not beaten a top-ten player this year and has yet to win a title.

The Serbian will now turn his attention to the Paris Olympics as he seeks to win gold for the first time.

Spanish delight English heartbreak

Spain struck late to win Euro 2024 with a 2-1 victory over England

Substitute Mikel Oyarzabal scored a dramatic late winner as Spain triumphed in Sunday's Euro 2024 final, beating England 2-1 to confirm their re-emergence as a force on the international stage and end their opponents' dreams of winning a first title in almost six decades.

Spain lost influential midfielder Rodri to injury at half-time, but shrugged that off to take the lead within two minutes of the restart through Nico Williams, who was set up by his fellow star winger, Lamine Yamal.

Pogacar pulverises opposition at Tour de France

Tadej Pogacar extended his overall lead at the Tour de France to more than three minutes on Sunday with a convincing second-straight stage win in the Pyrenees.

The Slovenian dropped the last of his rivals with five kilometres to go after five more Pyrenean peaks. A valiant Jonas Vingegaard could only finish 1 minute and 8 seconds adrift in second, with Remco Evenepoel in third at 2min 51sec on the day.

As Pogacar crossed the line at the magnificent Plateau de Beille deep in the Pyrenees, resplendent in his yellow outfit, he had racked up a second straight

iconic mountaintop triumph and a 14th Tour de France stage win aged just 25.

The overall leader expressed surprise at Vingegaard and his team.

"Jonas did most of the work," Pogacar said after Visma hogged the front of the peloton most of the day.

"With today being the 14th of July you might have expected a French win, but Visma went at it very strong."

"I wasn't sure myself I'd be able to keep up the pace, but this year I've adopted a different approach and it seems to be working," said Pogacar, munching on a candy bar.

The Team UAE leader's audacious bid for a Tour de France and Giro d'Italia double in the same season seemed closer after a third stage win on this year's Tour lifted him comfortably clear.

The last man to win such a double was Marco Pantani in 1998. On his way to his French triumph, the Italian also won a stage ended on the Plateau de Beille. Pogacar on Sunday ascended the mountain over four minutes faster than Pantani.

"That's a very good sign," Pogacar's team director Mauro Gianetti said.

There are two murderous mountain slogs to go in the Alps, where the weather will likely be much hotter, which Pogacar

dislikes. The final-day lottery is a fearsome 34km individual time trial on the cornice between Monaco and Nice.

For now, the sun shines on the Slovenian as he leads the two-time defending champion Vingegaard by 3 minutes 9 seconds with the young Belgian Remco Evenepoel on his first Tour de France third at 5min 19sec.

Evenepoel also looked happy with his day's work after he arrived for his debut Tour de France stating he was targeting the best young rider's jersey, which he looks good for now. "I felt it was a mistake to try and follow them when they

went. It was a race between them two," he said.

I kept going at my steady rhythm. It was a good weekend for us."



One-day delay for India, Sri Lanka white-ball series
