Ammar Mahdi Ghuloum and Asmaa Mahmoud Zayer, who are both Mechanical Engineering students, secured second place in the graduation projects category of the Mechanical Engineering program for their creation.

Human rights forum

A delegation from the National Institution for Human Rights (NIHR), headed by Ali Ahmed Al Darazi, participated in the Human Rights Institutions Forum held in Oman. The forum was organised by the Oman Human Rights Commission, in cooperation with the **General Secretariat of the Gulf Cooperation** Council (GCC).
