



**Proud moment for Bahrain as Mumtalakat-owned McLaren topples Red Bull at dramatic Azerbaijan Grand Prix**

**O**scar Piastri claimed an impressive second victory of his burgeoning career on Sunday when he drove his McLaren to a well-judged triumph ahead of Ferrari's Charles Leclerc in a tense Azerbaijan Grand Prix.

The 23-year-old Australian's victory enabled McLaren to replace Red Bull as leaders of the constructors' championship, ending the champions' two-year dominance, in a race of attrition that ended under a Virtual Safety Car following a spectacular late collision between Carlos Sainz of Ferrari and Red Bull's Sergio Perez as they battled for third.

George Russell finished third for Mercedes ahead of title-chasing Lando Norris in the second McLaren, who fought from 15th on the grid to beat three-time champion and series leader Max Verstappen of Red Bull, who was fifth.

"Well, that was the most stressful afternoon of my life," said Piastri on team radio.

"A big move! Thanks for the car! What a day that was! Thanks everyone."

Norris, who picked up an extra

point for the fastest lap, reduced championship leader Verstappen's lead to 59 points with seven races and three sprints to go.

The race began in warm sunshine under a cloudless sky with temperatures of 27 (air) and 46 (track) bathing the 6km street track.

Hamilton in the other Mercedes and Esteban Ocon (Alpine) both started from the pit-lane following overnight power-unit overhauls and Pierre Gasly (Alpine) from the back of the grid after being excluded

from qualifying for a fuel flow infringement.

**Flurry of pit stops**

Hamilton also made early progress. By lap five, he was 15th as Leclerc led Piastri by 0.936 seconds ahead of Perez, Sainz, Verstappen and Russell. Alonso was seventh, four seconds adrift and Norris 11th.

Leclerc increased his pace and established a gap of 3.6 seconds to Piastri. Norris, on hards, was up to ninth

and Hamilton 14th, the Britons managing the hot conditions with care. The pit stops began on lap 12, most switching from mediums for hards. Hamilton dropped to 18th and Norris, without stopping, rose to fifth.

After the flurry of stops, during which Leclerc briefly gifted the lead to Sainz, Piastri stormed into the lead on lap 20, squeezing by on the inside at Turn One.

"They are pushing like crazy - or they have more grip than us," reported Leclerc.

Behind him, a battle royal developed for fifth as Norris resisted Verstappen and Russell behind Albon until he pitted on lap 32. "I have rear grip," grumbled the frustrated Dutchman before Russell swept by on lap 34.

Norris pitted on lap 38 to set up a late charge, passing the champion on lap 48 for sixth.

By then, the leading trio were separated by less than two seconds with Piastri resisting Leclerc's pressure and Perez chasing and it stayed that way, the Australian's superior traction exiting Turn One, keeping him on top as Leclerc's tyres deteriorated before Sainz and Perez crashed on lap 50.

Fernando Alonso was sixth for Aston Martin ahead of Williams' Alex Albon and Argentine new boy Franco Colapinto with seven-time champion Hamilton finishing ninth. Ollie Bearman, standing in for the suspended Kevin Magnussen, was 10th for Haas ahead of his team-mate Nico Hulkenberg. He became the first driver to score points on debut with two different teams.

## Social support services benefit thousands of Bahraini citizens

Thousands of Bahrainis benefited from a range of social services between January and April 2024, including family consultations, disability support, and community development programmes.

More than 3,900 people attended awareness lectures, 358 families reached amicable agreements, and 59 children saw custody issues resolved, while hundreds more received rehabilitation and physiotherapy.

Driving these efforts, the Ministry of Social Development also strengthened partnerships with civil society and the private sector, aligning its initiatives with the National Economic Strategy 2030 and focusing on community well-being and family stability.

In this period, the Ministry facilitated 1,494 family con-

sultations.

The family care programme led to 31 agreements, aiding 358 families and 625 children.

# Global thumbs up for Bahrain

55 countries back Kingdom's push for modernised education and youth job initiatives

Bahrain's ambitious bid to overhaul education and curb youth unemployment received overwhelming backing at the International Conference of Young Parliamentarians, where 55 nations rallied to the cause.

Spearheaded by MP Abdullah Al Rumaihi, the Kingdom's proposal aims to modernise education systems and align curricula with today's job market realities, and tackling a pressing global challenge of rising youth joblessness.

The proposal stood out during the conference's fifth session, gaining considerable attention from representatives of 55 nations.

As session chair, MP Al Rumaihi emphasised the urgent need to integrate digital tools into education, especially in regions grappling with high youth unemployment.

He linked the global shortage of skilled workers to outdated education systems and pointed to Bahrain's own reform efforts, including initiatives led by His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa, such as the King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa Prize for the Use of ICT in Education, established with UNESCO in 2005.

### Global drop

(ILO) data, which showed a global drop in youth unemployment to 13% in 2023, driven by post-pandemic recovery.

However, he cautioned that the decline was uneven, with East Asia seeing a 4.3% increase and youth unemployment rising in the Arab world, Southeast Asia, and the Pacific by 1%.

He warned that rapid technological advancements are outpacing education systems, leaving many young people unprepared for the skills employers require.

The lawmaker urged for sweeping reforms to address the skilled labour shortage and boost economic growth.

Shura Council member Ali Al Shehabi proposed annual parliamentary reviews of education and employment progress.

He called for nations to share successful legislation and collaborate on strategies for training and job creation, closing the gap between school curricula

and workforce needs.

Al Shehabi also suggested regular reviews of national education systems, ongoing professional development for teachers, and expanded exchange programmes for students and educators to better equip them for the global job market.

## Kingdom 'model' of democracy and digital innovation

His Excellency Dr Abdullatif bin Rashid Al Zayani, Minister of Foreign Affairs, commended the approach led by His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa, which established the principles of democracy and respect for public rights and freedoms, further solidifying Bahrain's leadership as a model of the rule of law and constitutional institutions.

He pointed to Bahrain's expanding political participation, media freedoms, and the role of institutions such as the National Institution for Human Rights

The Minister also recognised Bahrain's global standing in ICT development and cybersecurity, aligned with the 2030 Economic Vision.

Al Zayani reaffirmed Bahrain's commitment to democracy, the rule of law, and peaceful coexistence under the leadership of His Majesty King Hamad.

## Pakistan lifts visas for GCC visitors: Embassy

Gulf nationals will no longer require visas to enter Pakistan for work or tourism, according to an announcement from the Pakistani Embassy.

In a statement issued from its office in Bahrain, the embassy revealed that under a new visa policy from Islamabad, citizens of the Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) countries — Saudi Arabia, Kuwait, the UAE, Oman, Qatar, and Bahrain — are now exempt



from the requirement to apply for electronic travel authorisation or visas through the e-visa portal.

The embassy's release clarified that travellers from these nations need only to purchase a flight ticket to Pakistan, where they can stay for up to 90 days for work or leisure.

The changes, according to the statement, are intended to ease the process of travel for business and tourism between the Gulf and Pakistan.

## Company owner acquitted in food delivery worker permit case

● Lower Criminal Court overturns BDI,000 fine

The Lower Criminal Court has acquitted a company owner accused of employing a food delivery worker without a permit, dismissing the initial criminal order that fined him BDI,000.

The case stemmed from spotting the foreign worker, identified as the second defendant, operating a motorcycle bearing the logo of a food delivery company.

Investigations revealed that the worker lacked a valid work permit despite wearing company attire and using a company motorcycle.

The defense lawyer, Mariam Al Sakran, argued that the rela-



tionship between the first and second defendants was not a genuine employer-employee relationship.

She highlighted inconsistencies in the investigation, including the lack of a translator for the second defendant, who is of Asian origin and does not speak Arabic. The defense also emphasised the defendant's denial of the charges.

The court's decision hinged on the fact that the worker's mobile phone screen was cap-

tured by labour inspectors, revealing that he was using an account registered under another person's name, who had a work relationship with the company.

This was corroborated by the first defendant's statements during questioning.

The court concluded that there was reasonable doubt about the existence of an employer-employee relationship between the two defendants, leading to the acquittal of the first defendant.

## Municipalities and government collaborate to enhance services

He highlighted the commitment to continuing efforts in a comprehensive framework to achieve desired goals and aspirations.

The meeting included a presentation by the Ministry

of Health on their plans for hospitals and health centres in the Northern Governorate, aiming to enhance services for all members of the community.

Discussions also centered on the issuance of regulatory requirements for residential project areas and a comprehensive guide for these projects.

This initiative comes in response to rapid urban changes and the growing desire of beneficiaries to expand and optimize their building space.

## Bahrain marks World Ozone Day

Bahrain is marking World Ozone Day, which this year celebrates the 37th anniversary of the Montreal Protocol under the theme "Montreal Protocol: Fixing the Ozone Layer and Reducing Climate Change."

His Highness Shaikh Abdullah bin Hamad Al Khalifa, Chairman of the Supreme Council for Environment (SCE), affirmed Bahrain's dedication to contributing to global efforts to safeguard the ozone layer through innovative initiatives and projects aligned with international environmental standards.

This commitment stems from the directives of His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa and the support of His Royal Highness Prince Salman bin Hamad Al Khalifa, the Crown

Prince and Prime Minister.

He highlighted Bahrain's progress, including the recent ratification of the Montreal Protocol and the Kigali Amendment through Decree (33) of 2024.

These steps underline Bahrain's commitment to international efforts to protect the ozone layer and combat climate change.

### Best practices

The Chairman also stressed that SCE will continue to support the refrigeration and air conditioning sectors by promoting best practices in managing and reducing the use of ozone-depleting substances.

Bahrain is set to reduce these substances by 73.5% by 2025, meeting the requirements of the Montreal Protocol and boosting international cooperation on emissions reduction.

## 'Abuse of rights'

High Civil Court orders school to re-enroll students after refusal over dispute with father

The High Civil Court has ordered a private school to re-enroll two sisters after the school refused to admit the younger sibling and expelled the older one following a dispute with their father.

It ruled that the school's actions were unreasonable and amounted to an abuse of its rights.

The dispute arose after a student, the older sister, was allegedly assaulted by a male classmate at the school.

Her father, seeking justice for his daughter, filed a lawsuit against the school.

### Legal dispute

In retaliation, the school refused to re-enroll the older sister for the next academic year and also denied admission to her younger sister, citing the ongoing legal dispute.

The father, represented by lawyer Dr Mohammed Kooheji, argued that the school's actions were retaliatory and unfair.



The court stressed that the school's decision to deny admission to the younger sister was unreasonable, as the school had no evidence of any wrongdoing by the family.

He highlighted that the school is the only one in Bahrain offering instruction in the specific language and that the family had no other options.

He also emphasised that the father's legal action stemmed from genuine concern for his daughter's well-being and not from malice.

### Parental concern

The court, in its ruling, acknowledged the father's right to seek legal redress and found

that his actions were driven by parental concern.

The court also stressed that the school's decision to deny admission to the younger sister was unreasonable, as the school had no evidence of any wrongdoing by the family.

The court ultimately ruled in favour of the father, ordering the school to re-enroll both sisters.

## Businessman avoids deportation after appeal victory

Pakistani businessman narrowly avoided deportation after a court overturned an earlier decision.

The 24-year-old, who faced

both imprisonment and a financial penalty, managed to remain in Bahrain after presenting evidence that he had rectified his visa issues.

Initially detained for overstaying his Labour visa, the young expat's appeal centred on

his lack of awareness about visa requirements and inadequate legal assistance.

The Court of Appeal took into account his attempts to address the issue, lifting the fine and halting deportation order.

# US Fed expected to make first rate cut since 2020

The Federal Reserve is gearing up to announce its first interest rate cut for more than four years on Wednesday, with policymakers expected to debate how big a move to make less than two months before the US presidential election.

Senior officials at the US central bank including Fed chair Jerome Powell have in recent weeks indicated that a rate cut is coming this month, as inflation eases toward the bank's long-term target of 2%, and the labor market continues to cool.

The Fed, which has a dual mandate from Congress to act independently to ensure both stable prices and maximum sustainable employment, has repeatedly stressed it will make its decision on rate cuts based solely on the economic data.

But a cut on Wednesday could still cause headaches for Powell, as it would land shortly before the election, in which former Republican president Donald Trump is running against the current Democratic vice president, Kamala Harris.

"As much as I think the Fed tries to say that they're not a political animal, we are in a really wild cycle right now," Alicia Modestino, an associate professor of economics at Northeastern University, told AFP.

## How big a cut?

The debate among policymakers on Tuesday and Wednesday this week will likely center on whether to move by 25 or 50 basis points.

However, a rate cut of any size would be the Fed's first since March 2020, when it slashed rates to near-zero in order to support the US economy through the Covid-19 pandemic.

The Fed started hiking rates

in 2022 in response to a surge in inflation, fueled largely by a post-pandemic supply crunch and the war in Ukraine.

It has held its key lending rate at a two-decade high of between 5.25 and 5.50% for the past 14 months, waiting for economic conditions to improve.

Now, with inflation falling, the labor market cooling, and the US economy still growing,

policymakers have decided that conditions are ripe for a cut.

Policymakers are left with a choice: making a small 25 basis point cut to ease into things, or a more aggressive cut of 50 basis points, which would be helpful for the labor market but could also risk reigniting inflation.

"I think that in advance of the November meeting, there's not quite enough data to say we're

in jeopardy on the employment side," said Modestino, who was previously a senior economist at the Federal Reserve Bank of Boston.

Analysts see the smaller cut as a safe bet. "We expect the Fed to cut by 25bp (basis points)," economists at Bank of America wrote in a recent note to clients.

"The Fed likes predictability," Modestino from Northeastern said. "It's good for markets, good for consumers, good for workers." "So a 25 basis point cut now, followed up by another 25 basis point cut in November after the next round of economic data, offers a somewhat smoother glide path for the economy," she added.

## How many cuts?

While analysts overwhelmingly expect the Fed to start cutting in September, there is less clarity about what comes next.

Economists at some banks, including Goldman Sachs, expect cuts totaling 75 basis points over the last three meetings of the year, while others see more aggressive cuts, like economists at Citi, who have 125 basis points of easing as their base case.

"The continued softening of the labor market is likely to provoke larger-sized cuts if not at this FOMC meeting then in November and December," the Citi economists wrote in a recent note to clients, referring to the rate-setting Federal Open Market Committee (FOMC).

The Fed will shed some light on the issue on Wednesday, when it publishes the updated economic forecasts of its 19-member FOMC -- including their rate cut expectations.

In June, FOMC members sharply reduced the number of cuts they had penciled in for this year from a median of three down to just one amid a small uptick in inflation.

But as inflation has fallen and the labor market has weakened, expectations of more cuts have grown. Traders also see a greater-than 99% chance of at least four more cuts in 2025, which would bring the Fed's key lending rate down to between 3.5 and 3.75% -- 175 basis points below current levels.



An interesting fact about a Fed rate cut is that it often leads to a "wealth effect." Lower interest rates can boost stock market prices because borrowing becomes cheaper for businesses, encouraging investment. This, in turn, makes stocks more attractive to investors, and when stock prices rise, individuals holding stocks feel wealthier, which can encourage more consumer spending.

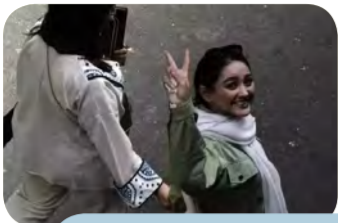

◆ **Thirty-four women** prisoners went on hunger strike in an Iranian prison Sunday to mark two years since protests erupted against clerical authorities, the foundation of Nobel Peace Prize winner Narges Mohammadi said. "Today, on the 15th September 2024, 34 female political prisoners in Evin Prison have gone on a hunger strike in commemoration of the second anniversary of the 'Woman, Life, Freedom' movement and the killing of Mahsa (Jina) Amini," it said. Amini was a 22-year-old Iranian Kurd whose death in custody after her arrest for allegedly violating the strict dress code for women sparked the demonstrations. The prisoners had abstained from food "in solidarity with the protesting people of Iran, against the government's oppressive policies," the foundation added. Mohammadi, who has campaigned against the compulsory wearing of the hijab and the death penalty in Iran, has been in Tehran's Evin prison since November 2021. She has spent much of the past decade in and out of jail and has staged repeated hunger strikes.

◆ **More than 40 people** are presumed to have died after a boat overloaded with passengers sank on a river in northwestern Nigeria, authorities said yesterday. The vessel was ferrying 53 farmers to their farms across the Gummi River in Zamfara State on Saturday when it capsized, a local official said. "Only 12 were rescued yesterday shortly after the accident," said Na'Allah Musa, a political administrator of the flood-hit Gummi district where the accident happened, adding that authorities were searching for the bodies of the rest of the passengers, who are presumed to have died. **Jordan's king appoints new PM after general election**

Jordan's King Abdullah II yesterday nominated his chief of staff to be the new prime minister, the royal palace said, charging him with forming a government after parliamentary elections. The outgoing premier, Bisher Khasawneh, submitted his resignation to the king earlier on Sunday.

Under the kingdom's constitution, the government usually resigns after legislative elections. It is the king who appoints the prime minister, not parliament. "King Abdullah on Sunday tasked Jaafar Hassan with forming a new government," a palace statement said. As well as being chief of staff, the 56-year-old Hassan was previously planning minister. In Tuesday's election Jordan's leading Islamist party, the Islamic Action Front, became the largest in parliament, winning 31 out of the 138 seats. The IAF is a political offshoot of the Muslim Brotherhood in Jordan, and the result gives the Islamists their largest representation since 1989.

Jordan in 1994 signed a peace treaty with Israel, becoming only the second Arab state to do so after Egypt. Nearly half of the country's population is of Palestinian origin. Khasawneh, 55, had headed the government since October 2020. Jordan's parliament is bicameral. In addition to the elected parliament, there is also a senate with 69 members appointed by the monarch. The Gaza war has hit tourism in Jordan, which relies on the sector for about 14 percent of its gross domestic product.

**Death toll rises as storm lashes central, eastern Europe**

One person has drowned in Poland and an Austrian fireman has died responding to floods, authorities said yesterday, as Storm Boris lashed central and eastern Europe with torrential rains.

Since Thursday, swathes of Austria, the Czech Republic, Hungary, Romania and Slovakia have been hit by high winds and unusually heavy rainfall.

The rains have flooded streets and submerged entire neighbourhoods in some places, while shutting down public transport and electricity in others.

Romanians waded through armpit-high water to safety, Poles sought shelter in schools and Czechs hurriedly put up sand dykes in an effort to keep the water at bay.

Sunday's deaths bring the overall toll from the storm to seven, with thousands evacuated across the continent.

In Romania, a body was found on Sunday, after four people were reported killed earlier. Four more

people were reported missing in the Czech Republic.

"The water came into the house, it destroyed the walls, everything," Sofia Basalic, 60, a resident of Romania's village of Pechea, in the hard-hit region of Galati, told AFP.

"It took the chickens, the rabbits, everything. It took the oven, the washing machine, the refrigerator. I have nothing left," she said.

On Saturday, four people died in floods in southeastern Romania, with the bodies found in the worst-affected region, Galati in the southeast.

Another body was found in the same region on Sunday.

"We are again facing the effects of climate change, which are increasingly present on the European continent, with dramatic consequences," Romania's President Klaus Iohannis said.

Hundreds of people have been rescued across 19 parts of the country, emergency services said, releasing a video of flooded homes in a village by the Danube river.

"This is a catastrophe of epic proportions," said Emil Dragomir, mayor of Slobozia Conachi, a village in Galati, where he said 700 homes had been flooded.

Romania's interior minister said more than 5,000 households and 15,000 people were affected in the region.

**Snow in September**

In Austria, some areas of the Tyrol region were blanketed by up to a metre (three feet) of snow - an exceptional situation for mid-September, which saw temperatures of up to 30 degrees Celsius (86 Fahrenheit) last week.

Rail services were suspended in the country's east early Sunday.

Firefighters have intervened around 150 times in Vienna since Friday to clear roads blocked by storm debris and pump water from cellars, local media reported.

Neighbouring Slovakia has declared a state of emergency in the capital Bratislava.

Heavy rains are expected to continue until at least Monday in the Czech Republic and Poland.

**Army says 'high probability' Israel air strike caused deaths of 3 hostages in November**

The Israeli military yesterday said there was a "high probability" an Israeli air strike was responsible for the deaths of three hostages who were killed in Gaza in November.

The bodies of the three hostages, Corporal Nik Beizer, Sergeant Ron Sherman and French-Israeli Elia Toledano, were brought back to Israel in December.

"The findings of the investigation suggest a high probability that the three were killed as a result of a byproduct of an IDF air strike, during the elimination of the Hamas Northern Brigade commander, Ahmed Ghandour, on November 10th, 2023," the military said in a statement, referring to the three captives.

"This assessment is based on the location of where their bodies were found in relation to the strike's impact, performance analysis of the strike, intelligence findings, the results of the pathological reports, and

the conclusions of the Forensic Medicine Institute."

"This is a high-probability assessment based on all of the available information, but it is not possible to definitively determine the circumstances of their deaths," the military said.

The bodies of the three hostages were recovered on December 14. The military said its investigation revealed that the three captives had been held in a tunnel complex from which Ghandour operated.

"At the time of the strike, the IDF did not have information about the presence of hostages in the targeted compound," the military said.

**Yemeni rebel missile hits central Israel in rare attack**

A Yemeni rebel missile triggered a rush to shelters in central Israel yesterday, a rare incident that caused no casualties but again added to regional tensions nearly a year into the Gaza war.

Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu said the rebels will pay a "heavy price".

AFP photographers saw firefighters putting out a brush fire near Lod and broken glass at a train station in Modin, about 20 kilometres (12 miles) southeast of Tel Aviv, Israel's commercial hub, after the attack.

Yemen's Huthi rebels claimed the strike.

**Hamas says has 'high ability' to continue Gaza war**

Meanwhile, a senior Hamas official told AFP yesterday that the Palestinian Islamist movement had ample resources to continue fighting Israel despite losses sustained over more than 11 months of war in Gaza.

"The resistance has a high ability to continue," Osama Hamdan

told AFP during an interview in Istanbul.

"There were martyrs and there were sacrifices... but in return there was an accumulation of ex-

ter Yoav Gallant told journalists that Hamas, whose October 7 attack triggered the war, "no longer exists" as a military formation in Gaza.

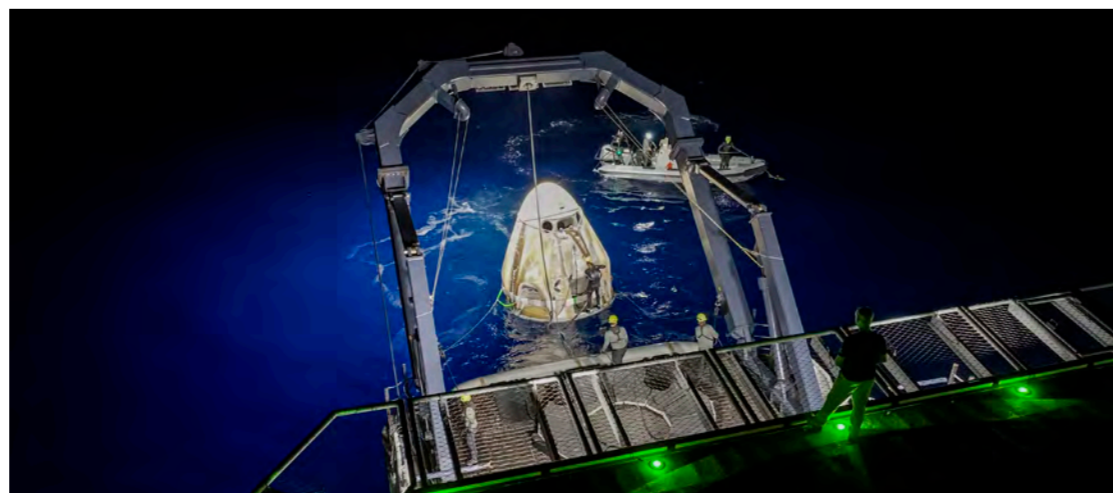
**Historic private astronaut mission ends with splashdown off Florida**

The SpaceX Polaris Dawn mission, which made history when its crew conducted the first spacewalk by non-government astronauts, concluded early yesterday with a splashdown off the coast of Florida.

The Dragon spacecraft plunged into the ocean at 3:37 am (0737 GMT), a webcast of the arrival showed, with a recovery team deploying in the pre-dawn darkness to retrieve the capsule and crew.

The capsule was lifted from the water and onto the recovery vessel half an hour later. After brief medical checks,

a smiling and waving SpaceX engineer Anna Menon was the first of the crew to exit, followed by engineer Sarah Gillis, pilot Scott Poteet and commander Jared Isaacman. A helicopter was due to transport them to land.

"Happy, healthy, home," the Polaris Program wrote on X. "A new era of commercial spaceflight dawned, with much more to come."

The four-member team led by fintech billionaire Isaacman launched Tuesday from the Kennedy Space Center, quickly journeying deeper into the cosmos than any humans in the past half

century as they ventured into the dangerous Van Allen radiation belt.

They hit a peak altitude of 870 miles (1,400 kilometers) -- more than three times higher than the International Space Station and the furthest humans had ever traveled from Earth since the Apollo missions to the

Moon.

Then on Thursday, with their Dragon spacecraft's orbit brought down to 434 miles, Isaacman swung open the hatch and climbed out into the void, gripping a structure called "Skywalker" as a breathtaking view of Earth unfolded before him.



Founded in 2002, SpaceX has quickly outpaced its legacy competitors, now thriving as one of NASA's prime contractors -- thanks in large part to owner and CEO Elon Musk's fervent drive to colonize Mars.

**Composition of the arbitral tribunal**

Arbitration is the will of the contracting parties, based on this and as per the UNICITRAL Rules of Arbitration, the parties can appoint the arbitration tribunal and indicate their number.

The Rules, to help in this respect provide for some details stating that, if the parties have not previously agreed (for example, in the arbitration clause) on the number of the arbitrators, and if within 30 days after the receipt by the respondent of the notice of arbitration the parties have not agreed that there shall be only one arbitrator, three arbitrators shall be appointed. As we can see here, the first option is for one arbitrator and in case of no agreement, three arbitrators to be appointed.

There may be some complications regarding the agreement of the parties to appoint the arbitrators, herein they must abide by the Rules which provide, if no other parties have responded to a party's proposal to appoint a sole arbitrator within the time limit of the 30 days and the party or parties concerned have failed to appoint a second arbitrator, the appointing authority may, at the request of a party, appoint a sole arbitrator pursuant to the procedure provided in the Rules, if it determines that, in view of the circumstances of the case, this is more appropriate.

Important to mention here, the appointing authority mentioned in UNICITRAL Rules of Arbitration, is the Secretary General of the Permanent Court of Arbitration (PCA). This, no doubt, shows the importance of the appointment of the arbitrators.

If the parties have agreed that a sole arbitrator is to be appointed and if within 30 days after receipt by all other parties of a proposal for the appointment of a sole arbitrator the parties have not reached agreement thereon, a sole arbitrator shall, at the request of a party, be appointed by the appointing authority, which shall appoint the sole arbitrator as promptly as possible.

In making the appointment, the appointing authority shall use, the list-procedure, unless the parties agree that the list-procedure should not be used or unless the appointing authority determines in its discretion that the use of the list-procedure is not appropriate for the case.

Herein, the appointing authority shall communicate to each of the parties an identical list containing at least three names. Within 15 days after the receipt of this list, each party may return the list to the appointing authority after having deleted the name or names to which it objects and numbered the remaining names on the list in the order of its preference.

If within 30 days after the receipt of a party's notification of the appointment of an arbitrator the other party has not notified the first party of the arbitrator it has appointed, the first party may request the appointing authority to appoint the second arbitrator.

If within 30 days after the appointment of the second arbitrator the two arbitrators have not agreed on the choice of the presiding arbitrator, the presiding arbitrator shall be appointed by the appointing authority in the same way as a sole arbitrator would be appointed.

Where three arbitrators are to be appointed and there are multiple parties as claimant or as respondent, unless the parties have agreed to another method of appointment of arbitrators, the multiple parties jointly, whether as claimant or as respondent, shall appoint an arbitrator. If the parties have agreed that the arbitral tribunal is to be composed of a number of arbitrators other than one or three, the arbitrators shall be appointed according to the method agreed upon by the parties.

In the event of any failure to constitute the arbitral tribunal under these Rules, the appointing authority shall, at the request of any party, constitute the arbitral tribunal and, in doing so, may revoke any appointment already made and appoint or reappoint each of the arbitrators and designate one of them as the presiding arbitrator.

As we can see, the appointment and number of the arbitrators, is primarily the duty of the concerned parties. However, since the arbitration is under the auspices of the UNICITRAL Rules of Arbitration the appointing authority, The Secretary General of the PCA shall intervene to complete the process based on his position and related experience in the arbitration process. Appointing proper and qualified arbitrators is a cornerstone in laying fast justice through arbitration. This is what is required from you and all, if appointed as arbitrators.

"My mind was

not right and chemically imbalanced, and it was really difficult. People were calling me a victim. That frustrates me, because being vulnerable is actually one of the strongest things you can do. That narrative is not going to take over my life."

Selena still experiences difficult days from time to time. But the chart-topping star acknowledges that she's "no victim".

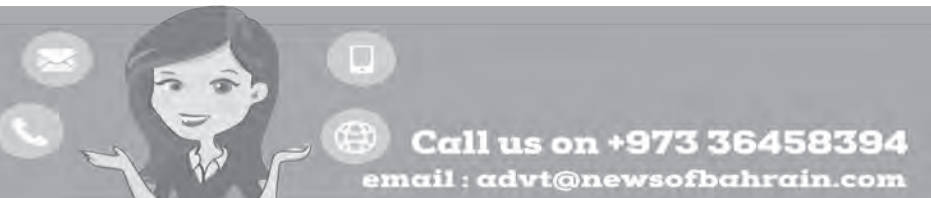

# Lookman fires Atalanta past Fiorentina ahead of Arsenal clash

Ademola Lookman made sure that Atalanta warmed up for their return to the Champions League with the winner in yesterday's 3-2 victory over Fiorentina in Serie A.

Nigeria forward Lookman did not feature in Atalanta's first three league matches after agitating for a transfer to Paris Saint-Germain.

But the 26-year-old netted the decisive strike in stoppage time at the end of the first half, jinking through the Fiorentina defence before shooting past David de Gea, seconds after Charles De Ketelaere headed Atalanta level.

Lookman, the hat-trick hero from last season's Europa League final triumph, also floated in a pinpoint cross for Mateo

Retegui to head in Atalanta's first equaliser in the 21st minute. "Yeah, I'm happy to be back, in front of our crowd, in front of our fans to be playing football," said Lookman to DAZN.

His immediate impact is great news for coach Gian Piero Gasperini, whose side host Arsenal on Thursday night and entertained their home fans in the newly-completed Gewiss Stadium.

"We're very pleased to be playing in the Champions league this season," added Lookman.

"We deserve it so we have to demonstrate that again on Thursday with the same drive, the same mentality that we showed today."

Atalanta, whose most recent appearance in the Champions League was in 2021, played their first three Serie A fixtures away from Bergamo to allow the club to put the finishing touches to their redeveloped home.

They are eighth on six points, three ahead of 14th-placed Fiorentina who twice went ahead in the first half through Lucas

Martinez Quarta and Moise Kean but are yet to win under new coach Raffaele Palladino.

Earlier Genoa snatched a 1-1 home draw with Roma in the final seconds to continue their positive start to the season.

Koni De Winter headed home Genoa's leveller in the sixth minute of added time at a packed Stadio Luigi Ferraris to deny Roma a first win of the campaign.

Artem Dovbyk looked to have shot Roma to victory when he prodded home in the 37th min-

ute after Niccolo Pisilli's effort was spilled by Pierluigi Gollini.

Later Inter have the chance to reclaim the league lead ahead of Juventus and Torino, who drew 0-0 with Lecce, when they make the short trip to Monza ahead of their Champions League opener at Manchester City on Wednesday.

## Red Bull boss blames Sainz for crash with Perez

Red Bull team boss Christian Horner blamed Carlos Sainz of Ferrari for causing the penultimate lap crash with Sergio Perez that wrecked his team's hopes of a podium finish in yesterday's Azerbaijan Grand Prix.

Horner said the Spaniard had drifted across the track towards Perez to cause the collision that wrecked the Mexican's race and robbed Red Bull of valuable constructors' championship points.

"It looked to me, just looking at the replay, like Carlos drifts across the circuit to the left-hand side," said Horner.

"It's done a huge amount of damage -- a massive accident.

"So, it cost us points, crucial points, for Checo and for the constructors. So very disappointing."

The pair tangled while battling for third place behind winner Oscar Piastri of McLaren and Ferrari's Charles Leclerc.

"He deserved a lot more," said Horner of Perez who seemed to have recovered his form after a long run in the doldrums during which he scored only 36 points in 10 races as Red Bull lost their

dominant position.

Piastri's victory along with team-mate Lando Norris finishing fourth lifted McLaren 20 points clear of Red Bull at the top of the teams' championship, ending the champions run of 55 races as leaders.

"He should at the very least have been on the podium today," added Horner, who suggested a penalty should be in store for Sainz at next weekend's Singapore Grand Prix.

Earlier Sainz and Perez had both declared their own innocence over the shunt.

"I honestly don't understand what happened," said Sainz.

"I am 100 per cent convinced I did nothing wrong and did nothing over-aggressive."

Perez said: "Honestly, it is such a shame. It's a disaster for the championship and not the way to end a weekend."

## Shapovalov enjoys Davis Cup redemption, sends Canada into finals

Denis Shapovalov let out a roar of delight as he sealed 2022 champions Canada's place in this year's Davis Cup finals yesterday beating Britain's Dan Evans 6-0, 7-5 -- redemption for the last time he faced the same opponents.

Back in 2017 Shapovalov's wild hitting of a ball in frustration hit the umpire leading to him being defaulted and Britain awarded the tie as a result 3-2.

The 25-year-old made no

such slip-up yesterday as he won the opening rubber and ensured the Canadians and not Britain would be joining Argentina as the two countries to progress from the group in Manchester, England.

Those two countries join Australia, Spain, United States, Germany and defending champions Italy in the finals which take place in Malaga, Spain, from November 19-24.

Brazil, the latter must hope the Italians beat the Dutch 3-0 in their tie in Bologna yesterday.

Britain had already faced a mighty task as they had to beat a strong Canada team -- it also includes Felix Auger-Aliassime -- 3-0.

The Israel-born Shapovalov, who has slipped to 100 in the world having once been as high as 10th, admitted having cruised through the first set it was tough to keep the momentum going.

## Messi scores twice in triumphant injury return for Miami

Since then he had missed eight MLS games for his club and this month's World Cup qualifiers for his country.

Messi hadn't played for Inter since June 1, but he didn't miss a beat as he was inserted into the starting lineup.

"The truth is that I'm a little tired," he said after the match. "The heat and humidity in Miami don't help much either, but I really wanted to come

back, I had been off of the field for a long time.

"Little by little I was training with the group, feeling good and that's why we decided that I would start, and I'm very happy -- very happy."

Miami coach Gerardo Martino was delighted to see his star come out "feeling good" after 90 minutes.

Philadelphia seized the advantage in the second minute on Mikael Uhre's left-footed shot from outside the area.

Messi grabbed the equalizer in the 26th minute, collecting a pass from Luis Suarez and beating defender Kai Wagner before unleashing a right-footed shot to cap a sequence launched by Jordi Alba on the left.

Ecstatic fans were still celebrating when he fired Inter ahead in the 30th, connecting again with Alba and firing a left-footed shot from the center of the area into the bottom right corner.

## Rain washes out England-Australia T20 series finale

Persistent rain meant the third Twenty20 international between England and Australia at Old Trafford yesterday was abandoned without a ball being bowled as the series ended all square at 1-1.

The match was due to get underway at 2:30 pm local time (1330 GMT).

However, with rain falling for several hours in Manchester yesterday morning both the toss and match itself were put on hold, with deep puddles forming on the covers protecting the pitch and square.

The official cut-off time for a five-overs per side match, the minimum length required to force a decisive result, was 5:46 pm (1646 GMT).

But a fresh downpour shortly before a planned pitch inspection led the umpires to abandon the match at 4:18 pm (1518 GMT).

The three-match series finished level at 1-1 after Liam Livingstone's 87 helped England win the second T20 in Cardiff on Friday following Australia's commanding 28-run success in Wednesday's opener in Southampton.

# Gabriel strikes as Arsenal hit wasteful Spurs with sucker punch

Arsenal beat Tottenham 1-0 despite key absentees, extending their dominance in the North London derby

● Arsenal overcome Rice and Odegaard's absence

● Tottenham's wasteful finishing costs them again

● Gabriel scores winner from set-piece in second half

Gabriel Magalhaes headed Arsenal to a 1-0 win at Tottenham yesterday as the Gunners overcame the absence of key midfielders Declan Rice and Martin Odegaard to extend their north London derby dominance.

Mikel Arteta's side were without skipper Odegaard due to an ankle injury suffered on Norway duty, while Rice served a suspension for his red card against Brighton.

Losing two such influential players appeared to make Arsenal vulnerable on their trip up the Seven Sisters Road to face their bitter rivals.

But the Premier League title contenders dug deep with a combative display, benefitting from Tottenham's latest display of wasteful finishing before Gabriel bagged the winner in the second half.

The Brazilian defender's first goal since February made it three wins from four league games for unbeaten Arsenal as they chase a first title since 2004 after two successive runners-up finishes.

Arsenal have now won on their last three visits to Tottenham, losing just once, in May

2022, in their last eight meetings with their hated neighbours.

The second placed Gunners are two points behind Manchester City as they turn their attention to their Champions League opener at Atalanta on Thursday before travelling to face Pep Guardiola's champions next weekend.

The 196th north London derby showed Arsenal have steel and spirit aplenty, but they also needed a dose of good fortune as Tottenham let them off the hook in the first half.

Failing to turn dominant spells into goals has been a familiar

story for Tottenham this season and once again Ange Postecoglou's men were let down by their lack of cutting edge.

Tottenham's second successive defeat leaves them with only one win from four games in a worrying start to the season for Postecoglou after their late swoon last term cost them a top four place.

Turning to Jorginho and Gabriel Martinelli to replace Rice and Odegaard, Arteta had urged his team to show the “resilience, depth and hunger” needed to overcome their selection issues.

### Set-piece specialists

Arsenal had to call on all those qualities during a vibrant start from Tottenham, with David Raya making a fine save at his near post after Son Heung-min's pass picked out Dejan Kulusevski for an instinctive strike.

Raya had to make an even more agile stop when Kulusevski's cross flashed through a crowd of players toward the far corner until the Spaniard clawed it away at full stretch.

William Saliba had to make a crucial, last-ditch tackle to deny the unmarked Dominic Solanke, who took too long to

shoot inside the area after Son pressured Arsenal into conceding possession.

Tottenham's profligacy gave Arsenal encouragement and Kai Havertz rose highest for a close-range header that forced a superb save from Guglielmo Vicario, who was also equal to Martinelli's curler moments later. Picked out by James Maddison's cross, Solanke did well to hold off Gabriel but his looping header dropped narrowly wide.

Amid a flurry of aggressive challenges, the simmering derby tension boiled over after Jurrien Timber's tackle on Pedro Porro

left the Tottenham right-back writhing on the turf.

Vicario confronted the Arsenal defender, with both players booked after a melee featuring a plastic bottle thrown from the stands.

By the time Kulusevski crudely up-ended Jorginho on the stroke of half-time, seven players had been booked in a fractious clash, including five from Tottenham.

Micky van de Ven's glancing tested Raya soon after the interval, but toothless Tottenham were hit with a brutal sucker punch in the 64th minute.

With 23 goals from set-pieces since the start of last season, Arsenal have become dead-ball specialists this was another expertly worked routine.

Saka's in-swinging corner arched towards Gabriel, who got away with a push on Cristian Romero before powering his header past Vicario from five yards.

Tottenham penned Arsenal back in the closing stages, but couldn't find a way through as Kulusevski blasted just over.
