

Bahrain F1 Grand Prix to boost tourism: Al Sairafi

Bahrain will reap the fruits of the upcoming Bahrain Formula One Grand Prix's 19th edition at all levels, especially the tourism sector, including hotels, restaurants, event organising companies and agents.
