Zelensky issues stern warning: Kyiv only has quarter of air defences on front line

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky said he expects Russia to step up its offensive in the northeast and warned Kyiv only has a quarter of the air defences it needs to hold the front line.

Russian forces, which had made only moderate advances in recent months, launched a surprise assault in the Kharkiv region on May 10 that has resulted in their biggest territorial gains in a year-and-a-half.

Zelensky said Russian troops managed to advance between five to 10 kilometres (3-6 miles) along the northeastern border before being stopped by Ukrainian forces, but added that the region could be the "first wave" in a wider offensive.

"I won't say it's a great success (for Russia) but we have to be sober and understand that they are going deeper into our territory," he said, speaking from Kyiv on Friday in his first interview with foreign media since the offensive began.

Six shot dead in Afghanistan

The bodies of three Spanish tourists and three Afghans shot dead while visiting a market in Afghanistan were transported to the capital along with multiple wounded, the Taliban government said Saturday.

The group was fired on while walking through the bazaar in the mountainous city of Bamiyan in central Afghanistan, around 180 kilometres (110 miles) from the capital Kabul, on Friday.

"All dead bodies have been shifted to Kabul and are in the forensic department and the wounded are also in Kabul. Both dead and wounded include women," the government's interior ministry spokesman Abdul Mateen Qani told AFP.

'Refugees' missing

Twenty-three people trying to cross the Mediterranean to Europe from Tunisia have been missing for the past two weeks, the country's National Guard said in a statement yesterday.

'Forced to flee'

800,000 people have left Rafah amid intense Israeli assault on Hamas fighters

Heavy clashes and bombardment rocked the southern Gaza city of Rafah yesterday, as the United Nations said 800,000 people had been "forced to flee" an Israeli assault on Hamas fighters.

Israel's military said its air forces hit more than 70 targets across Gaza while ground troops conducted "targeted raids" in eastern Rafah, killing 50 Hamas fighters and locating dozens of tunnel shafts.

Philippe Lazzarini, head of the UN agency for Palestinian refugees UNRWA, said that since Israel's Rafah operation began, there had been a massive movement of people.

"Nearly half of the population of Rafah or 800,000 people are on the road having been forced to flee since the Israeli forces started the military operation in the area on 6 May," he said in a post on X.

He said people were fleeing to areas without water supplies or adequate sanitation.

Hamas's armed wing, the Ezzedine Al-Qassam Brigades, said it fired a barrage of rock-

ets towards Israel's port of Ashkelon and targeted an Israeli command centre at the Jabalia refugee camp in northern Gaza.

An AFP reporter said air strikes and artillery pounded eastern Rafah as warplanes overflew the city on Gaza's border with

Egypt.

More than 10 days into what the army called a "limited" operation in Rafah that sparked an exodus of Palestinians, fighting between Israeli forces and Palestinian fighters has also flared again in northern Gaza.

Israel said in early January it

had dismantled Hamas's command structure in the north, but the army said Hamas - whose October 7 attack sparked the war - had been "in complete control here in Jabalia until we arrived a few days ago".

Hamas slammed what it called Israel's "escalating crimes of the

occupation" and "intensified brutal raids" on Jabalia, saying they had killed dozens of civilians and wounded hundreds more.

Incursion

Aid groups say Israel's Rafah incursion, launched despite overwhelming international opposition and as mediators were hoping for a breakthrough in stalled truce talks, has worsened an already dire humanitarian crisis.

With key land crossings closed or operating at limited capacity because of the fighting, some aid began entering Gaza via a temporary US-built floating pier.

Israel war cabinet minister threatens to 'quit'

Israeli war cabinet minister Benny Gantz said yesterday he would resign from the body unless Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu approved a post-war

plan for the Gaza Strip.

"The war cabinet must formulate and approve by June 8 an action plan that will lead to the realisation of six strategic goals of national importance.. (or) we will be forced to resign from the

government," Gantz said, referring to his party, in a televised address directed at Netanyahu.

Gantz said the six goals included toppling Hamas, ensuring Israeli security control over the Palestinian territory and re-

turning Israeli hostages.

"Along with maintaining Israeli security control, establish an American, European, Arab and Palestinian administration that will manage civilian affairs in the Gaza Strip and

lay the foundation for a future alternative that is not Hamas or (Mahmud) Abbas," he said, referring to the president of the Palestinian Authority.

He also urged the normalisation of ties with Saudi Arabia.

Ministry of Education timeline

Key academic year events, scholarship plan

The Ministry of Education has announced the timeline for key academic events and scholarship opportunities for the 2024 academic year.

According to the announcement, all academic results are scheduled for release during the second week of June.

The remaining stages of the current academic year will see the resumption of school hours and the commencement of final examinations from today.

The academic year will conclude on June 3, mark-

ing the last day of school and the end of the examination period. Subsequently, administrative and educational bodies will start transition to summer vacation mode starting July 1.

Scholarship

Regarding scholarship opportunities, the Ministry disclosed plans to unveil the study scholarship program for the 2024 academic year in July.

The scholarship plan will feature a significant development, with six scholarships earmarked for the US and Britain. Prospective applicants must secure initial admission to an American

or British university to compete for these scholarships, with selection criteria based solely on GPA.

Nursing specialty

The Ministry announced plans to allocate additional seats and bolster the nursing specialty. The announcement of missions and scholarships is scheduled for August, providing further opportunities for aspiring scholars.

The Ministry's proactive approach underscores its commitment to facilitating educational advancement and providing students with diverse opportunities for academic and professional growth.



Extension rejection

Government dismisses proposal to extend work permit renewal grace period

The government has rejected a proposed law that would have granted employers a 30-day grace period to renew work permits after their expiration.

The government cited concerns about the proposal's potential to conflict with existing labour laws, create practical implementation challenges, and exacerbate the issue of irregular employment.

The proposed law, originating as a parliamentary suggestion by MP Mamdooh Al Saleh, aimed to reduce lawsuits against employers by the Labour Market Regulatory Authority (LMRA) and prevent business disruptions due to expired work permits. It also sought to address irregular employment and enhance over-

sight of the labour market.

However, the government argued that the existing decision issued by the LMRA chairman, which regulates work permits for foreign nationals, adequately

addresses these concerns. Additionally, the proposed law could create confusion and lead to practical difficulties in implementation.

The LMRA and the Ministry

of Labour both supported the government's decision to reject the proposal.

Balance

Meanwhile, the Bahrain Chamber of Commerce and Industry (BCCI) suggested incorporating a series of amendments to the proposed law to achieve a balance between protecting employers and safeguarding workers' rights.

The proposal argued that the amendment would provide employers with additional time to renew work permits without incurring penalties, as they might inadvertently overlook the renewal deadline.

It emphasised that this differs from employing individuals without a valid work permit, which carries a separate set of penalties.

Broken promises

Court orders refund in full amount for undelivered dream kitchen services

The court has ruled in favor of a customer who sued a kitchen company for failing to deliver her dream kitchen and refusing to refund her payment.

The customer was awarded the full amount she paid for the kitchen, plus additional compensation for damages caused by the delay.

The court ordered the company to pay the customer the full amount she had paid for the kitchen (BD2,879), plus compensation for damages (BD500) with legal interest of 1% until full payment. The company was also ordered to pay court fees and attorney's fees.

According to court files, the customer entered into a contract with the company to build a kitchen in her home within a timeframe of one and a half months for a total cost of BD3,700. The customer paid the full amount upfront, but the company failed to deliver the kitchen on time and the work was found to be faulty.

The customer refused to accept the kitchen and demanded a full refund. However, the company refused to return the money, instead offering to deduct the cost of the appli-



ances (BD821) and return the remaining amount. The customer filed a complaint with the Consumer Protection Department, which referred the case to the criminal court.

Evidence

During the court proceedings, the customer presented evidence that she had not received the refund. A witness testified that he had accompanied the customer to the company to discuss the kitchen design and that they had agreed on specific specifications. The witness also confirmed that the customer had paid a 50% deposit of BD1,850 and the remaining amount after 45 days.

However, after the 45-day deadline passed, the company delivered an aluminum frame for the kitchen that was of poor quality and had scratches. The customer complained, and the company employees acknowledged the poor workmanship and asked for a second chance to fix the issues. They also promised to refund the money if the work was not done to the agreed-upon specifications.

However, scratch the surface, and you'll find a quiet revolution underway — a rekindled reverence for the mighty pen and handcrafted paper, driven by a desire to connect with the tangible and timeless.

Qassim Haider, a renowned Bahraini calligraphy artist and brand designer with over 15 years of experience, believes there need not be a dichotomy between antiquity and modernity.

Parallel to his penmanship pursuits, Haider harboured a deep fascination with programming and computers from an early age. This dual passion led to a pivotal moment in 2003.

He recalled, "When the war in Iraq ignited and everyone was tuning in to Al Arabiya for the news, my attention was captivated not by the unfolding events but by the channel's logo. Its ingenuity, a departure from traditional Arabic calligraphy, left me in wonderment."

Haider draws inspiration from nature, translating its essence into abstract shapes that transcend language. His intricate and meticulously crafted artworks speak a universal language of beauty.

This online tool, equipped with all the necessary resources for artistic calligraphy, has become invaluable to thousands of users worldwide.

Haider's style has evolved significantly over the years. He reflects, "My style, both in traditional calligraphy and fonts, isn't defined by uniformity as much as it used to be, but rather by a harmonious, integrative relationship of variables."

Drawing inspiration from



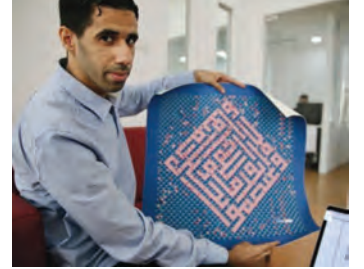

However, he warns that without a dedicated local institution, the art form risks "losing its distinct identity" when amalgamated with other visual arts.

Haider emphasises the responsibility of the artistic vanguard to "enrich the cultural

Bahrain – seat of living peace

Amidst the clamour of the analysis about the final Arab Summit resolutions passed and discussions reported, many of the observers, attendees, experts, and analysts did not notice that the day of the Bahrain summit, May 16, coincides with the International Day for Living Together in Peace, a day declared by the United Nations General Assembly in accordance with a resolution it took at its seventy-second session on December 8, 2017.

And to add weight to this observance, the honourable Secretary-General of the United Nations, Antonio Guterres himself attended the summit. This, I believe, sent out a strong message of belief and hope that “peace is here... peace in Bahrain.”

The fact is that the Middle East has witnessed a lot of turmoil since time immemorial – from the days of the Crusades, in fact, and even earlier when Romans asserted their power over the inhabitants of the lands here. In the beginning this was because of the region was at the crossroads of ideas and change was a constant. And change is always resisted. Later, it was because the region was discovered to be the world’s largest repository of fossil fuels and in many ways that gave us back our agency to shape our geopolitics.

But if new ideas often brought conflict, they also opened up new conversations and intellectual horizons. And in this matter, Bahrain has always stood as a shining example of assimilation, harmony and peaceful co-existence. If we review the text of the resolution issued regarding this day, we will find that it speaks of the determination to save future generations from the scourge of war, promote a culture based on peace and non-violence that benefits humanity, and encourage dialogue, understanding, and cooperation between religions and cultures for the sake of peace – now these very values, I believe, underpin our King’s vision for Bahrain and the world.

His Majesty has always emphasised that lasting peace would only be possible if we worked on it together: local communities, religious leaders and other actors should all set aside personal agenda and encourage forgiveness and compassion.

In my humble opinion, what the United Nations wrote about its resolution designating May 16 as a day to encourage global peace echoed the actions and vision of His Majesty the King. Indeed, when I read this statement, I felt that someone would recite it to the entire world. He is our king, the leader of peace and harmony.

Yes, my friends, this decision and its words were nothing but a quotation of the vision of His Majesty the King, and the presence of the Secretary-General of the United Nations on May 16 to sit on the benches of the Bahrain Summit, coinciding with the Day of Nations to Live Together in Peace, was evidence that Bahrain is the most appropriate place to celebrate this day.

Splash away fear

Dive into summer fun and help children overcome swimming anxiety

Renowned coach Norhan Tarek, from Nano swimming academy, shares valuable insights to The Daily Tribune on how to help children overcome their fear of water while making swimming lessons enjoyable.

“Children love summer because it’s the time where they swim and play games like diving for treasure, sharks and numbers, and shapes,” says Coach Tarek, highlighting the excitement children associate with swimming during the summer months.

Acknowledging children’s fears is the first step in helping them conquer their anxieties, according to Tarek.

“Try not to dismiss your child’s fear as irrational and thus unimportant,” she advises. “Some children are intimidated by starting right away with full submersion. Instead, ease them

into the water with fun, confidence-boosting games.”

To ease children into the water, Tarek suggests starting with confidence-boosting games. Overcoming a fear of water takes time. It’s better to slowly increase their exposure to water and make it enjoyable with games and fun lessons.

Fear to fun

“If the child encounters difficulties during a lesson, singing songs can be a great distraction. Kids love music and songs, and singing together can be very soothing and diverting for a child. Choose tunes that they love, anything from ‘Row Your Boat’ to ‘ABCs.’ It can help shift the focus from fear to fun.

“A great starting point is to

teach kids how to blow bubbles. Not only is it enjoyable, but it also teaches them that blowing bubbles prevents water from going up their nose,” she added.

Tarek emphasises the importance of patience when overcoming a fear of water. “It’s never a good idea to rush your child, or worse, force them to do something they are truly frightened of,” she cautions. “If your child has a meltdown or gets disinterested, allow them to take a break. Get out, have a snack, or play a game on dry land.”

While swimming is a fun-filled summer activity, safety should never be overlooked.

Safety measures

Tarek shares essential safety measures for children swim-

ming in pools or at the beach.

“Never go to the pool or swim in the ocean without telling an adult,” she advises. “Don’t run next to the pool, wear safety equipment or flotation devices, and alert an adult immediately if you see a friend fall into the pool or swim in a deeper side of the ocean.

“Don’t try to save them yourself. lastly, friends do pranks with each other, but never push a friend into the water.”

As summer approaches, let us embrace the joy of swimming while ensuring a safe and empowering experience for children.

Remember, a little splash of encouragement can go a long way in transforming fear into triumph!

Spotify sued over alleged unpaid royalties

Music streaming giant Spotify has been sued in a US federal court for allegedly underpaying songwriters, composers and publishers by tens of millions of dollars.

The lawsuit against Spotify USA was filed in New York on Thursday by the Mechanical Licensing Collective (MLC), a non-profit that collects and distributes royalties owed from music streaming services.

The suit alleges that Spotify on March 1, without advance notice, reclassified its paid subscription services, resulting in a nearly 50 percent reduction in royalty payments to MLC.

"The financial consequences of Spotify's failure to meet its statutory obligations are enormous for Songwriters and Music Publishers," MLC said.

OpenAI disbands team devoted to artificial intelligence risks

Integrated members into other projects and research

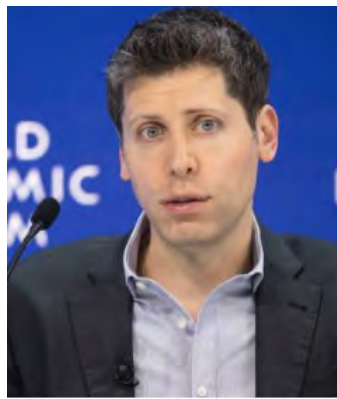

OpenAI on Friday confirmed that it has disbanded a team devoted to mitigating the long-term dangers of super-smart artificial intelligence.

OpenAI weeks ago began dissolving the so-called "superalignment" group, integrating members into other projects and research, according to the San Francisco-based firm.

Company co-founder Ilya Sutskever and team co-leader Jan Leike announced their departures from the ChatGPT-maker this week.

The dismantling of an OpenAI team focused on keeping sophisticated artificial intelligence under control comes

as such technology faces increased scrutiny from regulators and fears mount regarding its dangers. "OpenAI must become a safety-first AGI (artificial general intelligence) company," Leike wrote Friday in a post on X, formerly Twitter.

Leike called on all OpenAI employees to "act with the gravitas" warranted by what they are building.

OpenAI chief executive Sam Altman responded to Leike's

post with one of his own, thanking him for his work at the company and saying he was sad to see Leike leave.

"He's right we have a lot more to do," Altman said. "We are committed to doing it."

Altman promised more on the topic in the coming days.

Sutskever said on X that he was leaving after almost a decade at OpenAI, whose "trajectory has been nothing short of miraculous."

"I'm confident that OpenAI will build AGI that is both safe and beneficial," he added, referring to computer technology that seeks to perform as well as -- or better than -- human cognition. Sutskever, OpenAI's chief scientist, sat on the board that voted to remove fellow chief executive Altman in November last year. The ousting threw the San Francisco-based startup into a tumult, with the OpenAI board hiring Altman back a few days later after staff and investors rebelled.

Russia seizes Deutsche Bank, UniCredit assets

A Russian court has ruled that Deutsche Bank and UniCredit's assets in the country are to be seized, documents showed.

A court in Saint Petersburg ruled in favour of seizing 239 million euros (\$260 million) from Deutsche Bank, documents dated May 16 showed.

The same day, it ordered the seizure of around 463 million euros of assets belonging to Italy's UniCredit.

Both decisions were issued in answer to a request from RusKhimAlians, which was planning to build a major gas processing and liquefaction plant in cooperation with German company Linde, which pulled out of the project due to Russia's military campaign.

RusKhimAlians sued UniCredit and Deutsche Bank -- both guarantors of the project.

Deutsche Bank said it would "need to see how this claim is implemented by the Russian courts and assess the immediate operational impact in Russia".

UniCredit said it "has been made aware" of the decision and was "reviewing" the situ-



ation in detail.

UniCredit was one of the European banks most exposed to Russia when Moscow started its campaign in Ukraine, with a large local subsidiary operating in the country.

It began preliminary discussions on a sale last year, but the talks haven't advanced.

Chief executive Andrea Orceci said UniCredit wants to leave Russia, but added that gifting an operation worth three billion euros was not a good way to respect the spirit of Western sanctions on Moscow over the conflict.

Nevertheless, UniCredit has gradually reduced its exposure to Russia and managed to increase the ratio of its capital to risk-weighted assets to 16 percent from 15 percent last year.

News in brief

A team of mountaineers has retrieved the bodies of a US climber and her Nepali guide who were killed in an avalanche on Mount Shishapangma in Tibet last year, organisers said yesterday. Mount Shishapangma is one of the highest mountains in the world, at 8,027 metres (26,335 feet), and is located entirely within Chinese territory. In October last year, an avalanche on the mountain killed two US climbers and their Nepali guides. Nirmal Purja of Elite Exped, a firm that organises expeditions, said Saturday it had retrieved the bodies of American Anna Gutu and her Nepali guide Mingmar Sherpa. "Earlier this week, we were able to climb on Shishapangma and were able to bring them down the mountain and cross the border," he said on Instagram. "From there we brought them to Kathmandu and onward to be reunited with their families." China has closed Shishapangma expeditions this year, but the Elite Exped team was given a permit for this mission.



Bodies of US, Nepali climbers recovered from Tibet mountain

Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan has pardoned seven generals imprisoned for their role in the military coup that overthrew an Islamist government in 1997, according to decrees published in the official gazette. The decision cited the age and medical conditions of the generals, who were sentenced in 2018 after a trial full of twists and turns. The decrees were signed as a court in Ankara sentenced charismatic Kurdish leader Selahattin Demirtas to 42 years in prison for offences including undermining state unity.

A Chinese official responsible for agricultural affairs is under investigation for corruption, state media reported yesterday, as President Xi Jinping's extensive anti-graft campaign continues to bring down high-level figures. Tang Renjian, the head of China's Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Affairs, is "suspected of serious violations of discipline and law", state broadcaster CCTV said. The report did not include details on the specific violations Tang is suspected of committing.

North Korea has confirmed test-fired a tactical ballistic missile equipped with a "new autonomous navigation system", state media said yesterday, with leader Kim Jong Un vowing to boost the country's nuclear force. Kim oversaw the Friday test-launch into the East Sea, also known as the Sea of Japan, on a mission to evaluate the "accuracy and reliability of the autonomous navigation system", Pyongyang's official Korean Central News Agency (KCNA) said.

Film director Mohammad Rasoulof fled Iran on foot: Guardian

Film director Mohammad Rasoulof made an "exhausting and extremely dangerous" walk across a mountainous borderland in order to avoid being jailed in Iran on national security charges, he told the Guardian newspaper. Rasoulof said Monday he had fled Iran after a court sentenced him to eight years in jail, of which five were due to be served, over his new film "The Seed of the Sacred Fig". The leading Iranian film-maker, often a target of the country's authorities, told the Guardian in an interview published Friday that he had found shelter in Germany and was hopeful he could attend the film's Cannes premiere next week. "The film tells the story of a judge's struggles amid political unrest in Tehran. Rasoulof told the UK newspaper that he had "no choice" but to leave, although he expects to return home "quite soon". "My mission is to be able to convey the narratives of what is going on in Iran and the situation in which we are stuck as Iranians," said Rasoulof. "This is something that I cannot do in prison. "I have in mind the idea that I'll be back quite soon, but I think that's the case of all the Iranians who have left the country," he added. Rasoulof has already served two terms in Iranian jails over previous films and had his passport withdrawn in 2017. Having decided to leave, Rasoulof told the newspaper he cut all communications via mobile phones and computers and made his way by foot on a secret route to a border crossing. "It was a several-hour long, exhausting and extremely dangerous walk that I had to do with a guide," he said. After staying in a safe house, he contacted German authorities who provided him with papers that enabled him to travel to Europe.

Flash floods kill 50 in western Afghanistan

Flash flooding has killed at least 50 people in western Afghanistan, provincial police said yesterday, with some residents reaching safety on higher ground mere minutes before the water hit. The floods on Friday also destroyed about 2,000 houses, and damaged thousands more homes and businesses, Ghor police spokesman Abdul Rahman Badri said in a statement. The fresh flooding in the country -- which has experienced above-average rainfall this spring -- comes after flash floods on May 10 in northern Baghlan province washed away hundreds. Survivors there were still searching for missing relatives days after the disaster. "Fifty residents of Ghor province were killed by the floods on Friday and a number of others are missing," Badri said. "These terrible floods have also killed thousands of cattle... They have destroyed hundreds of hectares of agricultural land, hundreds of bridges and culverts, and destroyed thousands of trees." A resident of Firozkoh district in Ghor told AFP he and his family raced to higher ground when they were alerted by the sound of aerial firing and urgent warnings over mosque loudspeakers of oncoming flash floods. "Within five minutes of our escape, a huge and horrible flash flood came and washed away everything. I watched the flood destroy my house with my own eyes," Zahir Zahid told AFP over the phone.

Slovak PM shooting: 'positive' health outlook, suspect in detention

Slovakia's health minister said yesterday the prognosis for Prime Minister Robert Fico was "positive" after an assassination attempt as a court put the suspected gunman in pre-trial detention. Fico has been in hospital since Wednesday when a lone gunman shot him four times, including in the abdomen. He underwent a five-hour surgery on Wednesday and another surgery on Friday, both at a hospital in the central Slovak city of Banska Bystrica. The suspected gunman, identified by Slovak media as 71-year-old poet Juraj Cintula, was placed in pre-trial detention by a special penal court in Pezinok northeast of the capital Bratislava on Saturday.

Libyan armed groups clash near capital Tripoli

Clashes between Libyan armed groups broke out on Friday night in the city of Zawia, some 40 kilometres west of the capital Tripoli, a security official told AFP. An official at the city's security directorate told AFP the clashes were ongoing but "intermittent" on Saturday. "The southern areas of the city of Zawia have been witnessing clashes between armed groups since last night," the official said. Libya is still struggling to recover from years of war and chaos after the 2011 overthrow of longtime dictator Moamer

Israeli leaders split over post-war Gaza governance

New divisions have emerged among Israel's leaders over post-war Gaza's governance, with an unexpected Hamas fightback in parts of the Palestinian territory piling pressure on Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu. The Israeli army has been battling Hamas across Gaza for more than seven months while also exchanging near-daily fire with Iran-backed Hezbollah forces along the northern border with Lebanon. But after Hamas fighters re-emerged in the Israeli war cabinet in recent days. Netanyahu came under personal attack from Defence Minister Yoav Gallant for failing to rule out an Israeli government in Gaza after the war. Experts say the lack of clarity only serves to benefit Hamas, whose leader has insisted no new authority can be established in the territory without its involvement. "Without an alternative to fill the vacuum, Hamas will continue to grow," International Crisis Group analyst Mairav Zonszein told AFP. Emmanuel Navon, a lecturer at Tel Aviv University, echoed this sentiment. Myanmar ethnic armed group claims control of western town

Myanmar ethnic minority armed group yesterday claimed its fighters had seized control of a town in western Rakhine state, in what would be another blow to the junta. Clashes have rocked Rakhine since the Arakan Army (AA) attacked security forces in November, ending a ceasefire that had largely held since the 2021 military coup. AA fighters have seized territory, including along the border with India and Bangladesh, piling further pressure on the junta as it battles opponents elsewhere across the Southeast Asian country.

Sudan paramilitaries say will open 'safe passages' out of key Darfur city

Sudan's paramilitary Rapid Support Forces have announced their willingness to open "safe passages" out of the former haven city of El-Fasher in Darfur, which has been gripped by fighting for weeks. The RSF, battling the regular army for more than a year, affirmed in a post on X late Friday "the readiness of its forces to help citizens by opening safe passages to voluntarily leave to other areas of their choosing and to provide protection for them". El-Fasher, the state capital of North Darfur and once a key hub for humanitarian aid where many had gathered for shelter, has been in the grips of fighting as the RSF seeks to control it. The paramilitaries called on residents of El-Fasher to "avoid conflict areas and areas likely to be targeted by air forces and not to respond to malicious calls to mobilise residents and drag them into the fires of war". Medical charity Doctors Without Borders on Wednesday said its hospital in North Darfur had received more than 450 people killed in the fighting since May 10, but noted that the actual death toll was likely much higher. Tens of thousands of people have died and millions have been displaced since the war broke out in April 2023. The UN on Friday warned it only had 12% of the \$2.7 billion it sought in funding for Sudan.

YOU KNOW WHAT Sudan has been in the throes of conflict for over a year between the regular army led by de facto ruler Abdel Fattah al-Burhan and the RSF led by his former deputy Mohamed Hamdan Daglo. The conflict has killed as many as 15,000 people in the West Darfur state capital of El-Geneina alone, according to United Nations experts.

Germany cleans up after massive floods

German emergency workers were Saturday starting a major clean-up after heavy rains triggered massive flooding in the southwest of the country, while parts of Belgium and the Netherlands were also hit. A huge downpour Friday in the German state of Saarland deluged buildings, left streets deep under water and sparked evacuations, with rescuers carrying stranded residents to safety in boats. Officials said it was the worst flooding in the area in nearly 30 years, with the capital Saarbruecken badly affected and reports saying that a breach in a dyke led to a power station in the state being shut down. No deaths were reported but at least one person was injured.

Austria to resume aid to UN agency for Palestinians

Austria said yesterday it will restore its funding to the UN agency for Palestinian refugees after suspending it over allegations that staff were involved in the October 7 Hamas attacks. In the weeks that followed, numerous donor states, including Austria, suspended or paused some \$450 million in funding. Many, including Germany, Sweden, Canada and Japan, had since resumed funding, while others have continued to hold out. A total of 3.4 million euros (\$3.7 million) in funds have been budgeted for 2024.

Iranian Nobel laureate faces new trial: family

Jailed Iranian Nobel Peace Prize winner Narges Mohammadi faces a new trial over accusations she made against the security forces of sexually assaulting female prisoners, her family said yesterday. The trial, due to begin today, relates to an audio message she shared from prison in April shared by supporters and in which she decried a "full-scale war against women" in the Islamic republic. She is charged in this latest case with making "propaganda against the regime", it said. There has been no comment on the case by the Iranian judicial authorities. Mohammadi, who is held in Tehran's Evin prison, urged Iranian women in her April message via her Instagram page to share their stories of arrest and sexual assault at the

hands of the authorities. Mohammadi is already serving sentences based on several convictions issued in recent years, which her family says punish her rights campaigning. According to her family, her sentences now amount to 12 years and three months of imprisonment, 154 lashes, two years of exile and various social and political restrictions.

Oil tanker hit by missile off Yemen: security firm

A crude oil tanker was hit by a missile off the coast of Yemen's southwestern city of Mokha overlooking the strategic Bab al-Mandeb strait, maritime security firm Ambrey said yesterday. "A Panama-flagged crude oil tanker was reportedly 'attacked' about 10 nautical miles southwest of Mokha, Ambrey said, adding that information "indicated the vessel was hit by a missile and that there was a fire" in the ship's rear. The firm later said it had "received information that indicated that the tanker had received assistance. One of the steering units of the vessel was reportedly functional." It said the incident occurred 98 nautical miles (180 kilometres) south of Yemen's Hodeidah, without specifying the type of vessel involved. "The vessel and crew are safe and continuing to its next port of call," United Kingdom Maritime Trade Operations (UKMTO) added. 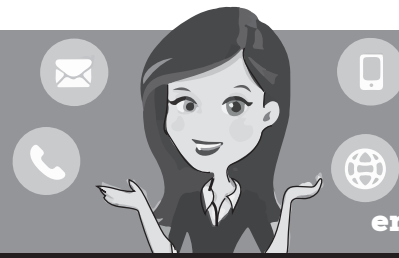

Leverkusen took the lead after

12 minutes when Amine Adli forced Augsburg goalkeeper Tomas Koubek into an error, winning possession before squaring for Boniface to tap in from close range.

Midfield star Andrich doubled Leverkusen's lead, backheeling in a rebound after 27 minutes.

Augsburg teenager Mert Kormor pulled one back on his first start for the visitors with a stunning strike on the 62nd-minute mark, but Leverkusen held on to win ahead of what could be an historic week.

Pogacar left the starting ramp dressed from head to toe in the overall leader's pink colours and with the 'Pink Panther' movie theme playing.

And while he didn't win the stage itself he arrived on the shores of Lake Garda 3min 41sec ahead of Geraint Thomas in the overall standings with third and Ben O'Connor in fourth at 4min 35sec.

Pogacar has extended his overnight lead in the rankings ahead of Sunday's stage, which he described as "a monster"

and whose finish line is at an altitude of almost 2,400m (7,874ft).

Pogacar has worked a lot on the time trial this winter, in particular his aerodynamic position, after losing 1min 38sec over 22km to Jonas Vingegaard in the last Tour de France.

"I raced hard over the opening section with all the turns and people," said Pogacar. "But the final flat 10km was harder."

The 25-year-old is now more than ever the man to beat as he towers above the field in his debut Giro after a boldly declared bid to win both the Italian race and the Tour de France this season.

For Ineos Grenadier Ganna it was a stressful day, the Italian rider having been pipped at the death by Pogacar in the Giro's first time trial last week.

An early starter, Ganna cut a grim figure whilst watching the rest of the field dash across narrow country lanes.

Max Verstappen secured his eighth consecutive pole position in qualifying for the Emilia Romagna Grand Prix at Imola yesterday to equal the record of Ayrton Senna.

The Red Bull three-time world champion's dominance in qualifying drew him level with Senna's run of eight poles, poignantly three decades after the late great Brazilian's tragic death at the Italian circuit in 1994.

"It's a great start to the year but also very special 30 years since he passed away at this track," said Verstappen.

"Of course, very pleased to get pole here and in a way it's a nice

memory to him (Senna), he was an incredible Formula 1 driver especially in qualifying laps as well, so a great day for me and a great day for the team, I'm very very happy."

Oscar Piastri's McLaren will start alongside the unstoppable Dutchman on Sunday after posting the second fastest time 0.074 seconds behind in a tight qualifying session.

Tha Australian's teammate Lando Norris, winner last time out in Miami, posted the third best time to fill the second row alongside the Ferrari of Charles Leclerc.

Carlos Sainz in the other Ferrari will set off on the third row with the Mercedes of George Russell for company.

Yuki Tsunoda's RB, Lewis Hamilton (Mercedes), Daniel Ricciardo (RB), and Nico Hulkenberg (Haas) rounded out the top 10.

The glaring absentee from the first five rows was the Red Bull of Sergio Perez, who went out in the second qualifying session, the Mexican muttering "what a mess" on the team radio.

'Tiny margins'

Piastri in contrast was thrilled

to get so close to taking pole.

Norris, who claimed his maiden victory two weeks ago, said: "P3 is not a bad job and both of us are within a tenth of P1, so it is all about tiny margins. We've had a good day and a good weekend so far."

After a chaotic third practice on a beautiful sunlit day at the Autodromo Enzo e Dino Ferrari Verstappen was swiftly on the pace and went top after eight minutes in 1:16.013 only to be outpaced within a minute by Piastri and then Norris, the McLa-

rens endorsing their practice speed.

Fernando Alonso's difficult day continued when his Aston Martin went off at the exit of Tamburello, taking a dive through the gravel, but avoiding any contact with the barriers. He pitted, accepting he could not improve on 20th and last on the grid.

Hulkenberg then went top for Haas before Verstappen outpaced him along with Leclerc as Q1 ended with Valtteri Bottas of Sauber, Logan Sargeant of Williams Zhou Guanyu of Sauber and Kevin Magnussen, in the second Haas, exiting with Alonso.

Hamilton was out early to top Q2 ahead of Russell before the

Red Bulls finally found their pace, Verstappen going top in 1:15.386, despite running wide at Rivazza, with Perez second. All were running on softs.

Leclerc then took the initiative with Tsunoda slotting into second place, all proof that Red Bull were not having it their own way – and the top seven all within half a second of the pace.

On their second runs, Verstappen improved to take top spot, but team-mate Perez missed out on the top-ten shootout and was eliminated in 11th along with Esteban Ocon of Alpine, Lance Stroll of Aston Martin, Alex Albon of Williams and Pierre Gasly, sporting a Senna-yellow helmet, in the second Alpine.

Hulkenberg was first out for Q3, as the temperature fell, with Verstappen revelling in the cooler conditions. He clocked 1:14.869 to go top with Norris second on his first timed run ahead of Leclerc, Piastri and Sainz.

The top four were separated by four-tenths of a second for the final runs which saw Verstappen, digging into his reserves of talent, grab pole with a dazzling lap in 1:14.746 – a clear example of an outstanding driver delivering beyond the potential of his car.

Ferrari under-estimated rivals pace at Imola - Leclerc

Charles Leclerc suggested that Ferrari may have under-estimated the hidden potential of rivals McLaren and Red Bull after slipping from pace-setters to fourth and fifth in yesterday's qualifying for Sunday's Emilia Romagna Grand Prix.

The Monegasque driver, who was fastest in both practice sessions on Friday, qualified fourth behind pole-sitter Max Verstappen of Red Bull and the two McLarens of Oscar Piastri and Lando Norris.

"I'm a bit disappointed," admitted Leclerc.

"Just today, there wasn't much

more in the car. FP1 and FP2 went really well. However, we never know the fuel levels of the others and I think they hid their game a bit more than what we thought.

"That ended up by just having not enough performance in the car to do better today.

"It's a shame because when you have upgrades on the car and when you are at home, you

obviously want to do really well, but today was the best we could do.

"Tomorrow, we will focus on maximising the result, but for us the target remains to win for sure. The car is definitely good in terms of race pace.

"But, this is one of the most difficult tracks to overtake on and, also, I don't quite understand why the DRS (Drag Reduction System) zone is shorter this year, which is going to make overtakes a bit more difficult.

"But strategy is still there, the pace is there, so my target is still the win and if we come short of this, well, that's life. We will have tried at least."

Team-mate Carlos Sainz, win-

ner of the Australian Grand Prix earlier this year, said he thought McLaren's pace was superior at the Autodromo Enzo e Dino Ferrari.

"I think looking in detail, the whole weekend McLaren have looked a bit stronger than us in single-lap pace on the softs," he said.

"They just were not putting a lap together, but we knew coming to qualifying they were going to be difficult to beat.

"And then, we had Max who always gets there. Even if they run the engine turned down always in practice and they look like they are struggling, we know they have a lot to come in qualifying.

Yesterday's match was less

dramatic than Madrid's three-set thriller as Sabalenka, who has won the two most recent Australian Opens, gave herself too much to do.

Swiatek took the opening set in just 36 minutes in a clinical display of tennis against Sabalenka, who has said repeatedly that Rome is her dream tournament to win.

Going into yesterday's final Swiatek had won 97 percent of her matches in which she went one set ahead since the start of 2022 and Sabalenka didn't help her cause by wasting seven break points over two games in the second set. And after Swiatek broke Sabalenka's serve in game seven it was only a matter of time before she closed out the match and championship.
