

The Bahrainis fell to continental powerhouses South Korea 62-89 in their Group C clash. It was yet another big loss for the nationals, who bowed to Jordan in their opening fixture 44-85 on Sunday.

Bahrain went behind by as many as 33 points against the Koreans. They had a strong start and trailed just 20-21 at the end of the first quarter, but were then outscored 7-23 in the second and faced a 27-44 deficit at
