US gives \$100m more in aid to Turkey and Syria

Washington

The US will provide an additional \$100 million in aid for the earthquake response in Turkey and Syria, on top of the previously announced \$85 million, the State Department said yesterday, while the Secretary of State assured Ankara that the "US is here."

President Joe Biden intends to authorise \$50 million in Emergency Refugee and Migration Assistance Funds (ERMA) and \$50 million in humanitarian assistance through the State Department and USAID.

"This humanitarian assistance will target vulnerable earthquake-affected populations in Turkey and Syria and be available to support international and nongovernmental organisations providing assistance," the State Department said in a statement.

Israeli strike kills 15 in Damascus

Damascus

An Israeli air strike killed nearly yesterday 15 people including two Syrian civilians and badly damaged a building in a Damascus district housing state security agencies, a war monitor said.

The strike targeted a meeting that included Syrian regime officers and was "the deadliest Israeli attack in the Syrian capital" since the civil war began, said Rami Abdel Rahman of the Syrian Observatory for Human Rights.

Tunisia intercepts over 400 migrants

Tunis

The Tunisian coast guard said yesterday it had intercepted overnight more than 400 migrants trying to reach Europe by sea in 16 separate operations off the North African country's coast.

"During the night between February 18 and 19, coast guard units in the center, north and south managed to thwart 16 attempted crossings and rescue 423 people," the agency said in a statement posted on its official Facebook page.

Highest nuclear uranium levels

Iran inspectors detect 84% purity making it closer to potential bomb material

Vienna

International atomic monitors in Iran last week detected uranium enriched to levels just below that needed for a nuclear weapon, according to two senior diplomats, underscoring the risk that the country's unrestrained atomic activities could prompt a new crisis.

The International Atomic Energy Agency is trying to clarify how Iran accumulated uranium enriched to 84 percent purity — the highest level found by inspectors in the country to date, and a concentration just 6 percent below what's needed for a weapon. Iran had previously told the IAEA that its centrifuges were configured to enrich uranium to a 60 percent level

of purity.

Inspectors need to determine whether Iran intentionally produced the material, or whether the concentration was an unintended accumulation within the network of pipes connecting the hundreds of fast-spinning centrifuges used to separate the isotopes. It's the second time this month that monitors have detected suspicious enrichment-related activities.

The development comes as Iran is increasingly isolated from the West and nuclear talks with world powers remain suspended. The country has also faced widespread condemnation for its deadly crackdown on major protests and the US and European Union have tight-

ened sanctions on Iran over its military support for Russia's war on Ukraine.

The IAEA is preparing its quarterly Iran safeguards re-

port ahead of a March 6 Board of Governors meeting in Vienna, where the Gulf nation's nuclear work will figure prominently on the agenda.

Iran has not submitted required forms declaring its intention to raise uranium enrichment levels at two facilities near the towns of Natanz and Fordow, according to one diplomat.

Even if the detected material was mistakenly accumulated because of technical difficulties in operating the centrifuge cascades — something that has happened before — it underscores the danger of Iran's decision to produce highly enriched uranium, the other diplomat said.

The IAEA has repeatedly said levels even at just 60 percent are technically indistinguishable from the level needed for a nuclear weapon. Most nuclear power reactors use material enriched to 5 percent purity.

Court to hear case of man accused of killing brother

The First High Criminal Court will be hearing today the witnesses' testimonies in the case of a young man who killed his own brother by stabbing him 26 times with a sword.

The defendant attended the last session where he denied the charge of premeditated murder. He admitted to using drugs and owning the murder weapon, claiming that on the day of the incident, he had consumed alcohol.

The police station had received a report from the defendant confessing to stabbing his brother with a sword following a disagreement. Security forces headed to the location and found the victim was already dead.

One of the policemen interrogated the defendant about the incident and he disclosed that financial disagreements between them led to an altercation at home wherein the victim attempted to assault him with a knife. In response, he took out a sword and stabbed him multiple times.

The mother testified that there were disagreements between her sons that escalated when the victim threatened the defendant. While performing



fajr prayer on the day of the incident, she heard yells from the courtyard and asked her sons to come inside. She resumed her prayer but heard loud noises again.

From outside, the defendant assured her that there was nothing wrong. When she inquired after the victim, he told her that the victim had fallen down. She requested that he take him to a hospital, and he answered that an ambulance was already on the way.

One of the neighbours stated that upon hearing the altercation he went out and witnessed

the defendant standing next to his car outside their home talking to the police on the phone.

The neighbour asked about the situation so the defendant led him near the car where a man was lying face-down with grave bleeding injuries next to a knife and sword. He asked about the identity of the victim and the defendant informed him that it was his brother, whom he killed for being a drug lord and causing trouble for their mother.

The witness added that he heard the defendant ask the paramedics whether or not the victim had a pulse. When they told him he'd passed away, the defendant turned to the other side of the road and smiled. Afterwards, the police arrived and arrested him.

Self-made charity drive to help Bahrain community

Call out for people to donate 'anything and everything' to help those in need

● **Throwing away any item of clothing also leads to landfill waste**

Self-made charitable organisations across the Kingdom are urging the people to donate their unwanted goods to help the needy and capture the spirit of Ramadan.

A growing number of groups are appealing for anything and everything from clothes, toys, furniture, shoes, electrical goods and books.

According to The Daily Tribune compiled report, there are many families who are in need, not only during the financial crisis but also during the COVID epidemic. Many have lost their jobs, some have large families and low income, others are struggling to make ends meet, and some want their daughter to get married.

"I was in Dubai and saw a

group of 25 people doing charity work, where they were donating all kinds of used clothing, shoes, furniture, and food but they weren't taking any such funds, there was no money involved. I got inspired and I wanted to open this in Bahrain," said Lina Stahl, volunteer and owner of 'A Box Forward.'

"I wanted to do something for this nation and its citizens, whether they were Bahrainis, Africans, Pakistanis, Indians, or Bangladeshis.

"I got in touch with another charity organisation called 'Box of Goodness' a few months ago, and together we gave a lot of clothes and other little items like shoes, cutlery, diapers, and many more to Turkey and Syria.

"In order to maintain balance, a charitable organisation needs at least 5,000 volunteers to work alongside. Currently, we have 550 volunteers and I hope more people come to help. After all, for every needy person, there should be an equal number of givers."

She pointed out, apart from the fact that Ramadan is on its

way and our main emphasis is that, "because there are people who would need food after being the entire day without eating, 12 families reached out to me last week asking for food items. Most of them were Bahrainis, and they didn't have electricity either."

Throwing away any item of clothing increases landfill waste. If each household in the Kingdom donates only one extra bag of unwanted clothing, we could save a quarter million bags from ending up in landfill each year.

She added: "There are people here who will accept anything that satisfies their fundamental requirements, therefore I advise everyone to donate whatever they can, even stained clothing or used shoes would help.

"I just want everyone to deserve to have what a regular person should have, thus we don't accept any money or give out bank information to anyone. Reach out to us or anyone in need before dumping old items in the trash; it might just brighten their day."

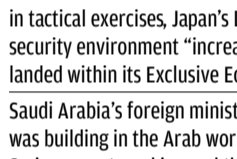

◆ **The Taliban** administration will move ahead with plans to turn former foreign military bases into special economic zones for businesses, the acting deputy prime minister for economic affairs said in a statement on Sunday. The acting commerce minister had told Reuters in December that his ministry was working on the plan for former American bases and would submit it to both the economic committee led by acting deputy PM Mullah Abdul Ghani Baradar and to the cabinet for approval. "Following a thorough discussion, it was decided that the Ministry of Industry and Commerce should progressively take control of the remaining military bases of the foreign forces with the intention of converting them into special economic zones," Mullah Baradar said in the statement. He added a pilot plan would begin to convert bases in the capital Kabul and in northern Balkh province.

◆ **The United States** held joint air exercises bilaterally with South Korea and Japan involving strategic bombers on Sunday, a day after North Korea fired a Hwasong-15 intercontinental ballistic missile (ICBM) in a "sudden launching drill". South Korea's Joint Chiefs of Staff said the exercise, in which South Korea's F-35A, F-15K and U.S. F-16 fighters escorted American B-1B bombers, demonstrated the allies' "overwhelming" defence capabilities and readiness posture. "(The exercise) strengthened the combined operation capability and affirmed the United States' ironclad commitment to the defence of the Korean Peninsula and the implementation of extended deterrence," the South's military said in a statement. Japan flew F-15s over the Sea of Japan with the U.S. Armed Forces' B-1 bombers and F-16s



in tactical exercises, Japan's Defense Ministry said in a statement, calling the security environment "increasingly severe" after the latest North Korea missile landed within its Exclusive Economic Zone (EEZ). Saudi Arabia's foreign minister said consensus was building in the Arab world that isolating Syria was not working and that dialogue with Damascus was needed "at some point" to at least address humanitarian issues, including a return of refugees. "You will see not just among the GCC (Gulf Cooperation Council) but in the Arab world there is a consensus growing that the status quo is not workable," Prince Faisal bin Farhan Al Saud said. The minister said without a path towards "maximalist goals" for a political solution, another approach was "being formulated" to address the issue of Syrian refugees in neighbouring states and suffering of civilians, especially after the devastating earthquake that hit Syria and Turkey.

Japan bids farewell to four pandas returning to China

Thousands of Japanese fans yesterday bade farewell to four beloved pandas which will be returned to China this week, with some visitors shedding tears. Visitors flocked to Tokyo's Ueno Zoo to catch a last glimpse of Xiang Xiang, who has been a massive draw for the park since her birth in 2017, and to a park in western Wakayama region for the other three pandas. In Tokyo, the final viewing of Xiang Xiang, the zoo's first baby panda since 1988, was limited to 2,600 visitors who won a lucky lottery ticket, but some fans who did not win still came. "I wanted to breathe the same air," as Xiang Xiang, Mari

Asai told the Asahi Shimbun daily. "Even if I cannot see her, my heart is filled with joy knowing she's there," the 48-year-old said. Another visitor told local media, crying, that she wanted to be closer to the five-year-old panda. "Everything about her is adorable, whether sleeping or awake," she said. Ueno Zoo receives calls and emails every day from panda fans asking it to keep Xiang Xiang, the Tokyo Shimbun daily reported, citing a zoo official. The panda was initially set to head to China in 2021 but its departure was postponed multiple times due to travel restrictions linked to the pandemic.

Syrian baby born in earthquake adopted by aunt and uncle

An infant child born in northern Syria during this month's devastating earthquake was reunited on Saturday with her aunt and uncle, after her parents and siblings died in the disaster. Footage circulating widely on social media after the quake showed a rescuer scrambling down a hill of rubble carrying a tiny dust-covered baby. The newborn was later identified as the child of Abdallah and Afraa Mleihan, who died in the earthquake along with their other children in the rebel-held town of Jandarisi in Syria's Aleppo province. The infant was treated in the Jihan Hospital further west in

the Afrin district, also opposition-held, until medics could verify the identities of her relatives. On Saturday, her paternal aunt Hala and uncle by marriage Khalil Al-Sawadi finally picked up their niece - whom they named Afraa, after her deceased mother.

"This girl means so much to us because there's no-one left of her family besides this baby. She'll be a memory for me, for her aunt and for all of our relatives in the village of her mother and father," Sawadi told Reuters. He was carrying Afraa, wrapped in a pink blanket, in one arm and

his own newborn daughter Ataa, wrapped in blue, in the other. Ataa was born three days after the earthquake and Sawadi said he would raise them together. "There were legal procedures to confirm the genetic relation, as well as a DNA test," he told Reuters. More than 5,800 people have died across Syria as a result of the Feb. 6 earthquake, the bulk in the opposition-held north which had already suffered years of bombardment since conflict broke out in Syria in 2011. The quake also left more than 39,000 dead in Turkey. Jandarisi, where Sawadi lives, is one of the hardest-hit towns in the rebel-held parts of the north. Other children have been left orphaned there by the quake, after surviving years of bombardment in the nearly 12-year war ravaging Syria. Government-controlled cities have also been severely damaged. A woman gave birth to a child in the city of Aleppo during the earthquake and said he "brought her back to life."

Israel blames Iran for attack on oil tanker

Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu on Sunday said that Iran was responsible for a reported attack on an oil tanker last week. An attack on the Liberian-flagged Campo Square was confirmed on Saturday by the ship's captain, who said it was lightly damaged by an airborne object on Feb. 10 while sailing through the Arabian Sea. Shipping databases linked the tanker to Zodiac Maritime, which is controlled by Israeli shipping magnate Eyal Ofer. "Last week Iran again attacked an oil tanker in the Persian Gulf and harmed

the international freedom of navigation," Netanyahu said at a weekly cabinet meeting. Regional defence and security sources have said they suspected the assault was carried out by Iran, which did not comment on the incident. Tehran has rejected accusations. British maritime security company Ambrey Intelligence said unmanned aerial systems had attacked two tankers and one bulk carrier in the Arabian Sea and assessed that Tehran had mounted the attack. Two of the merchant vessels were Israeli-owned and one was Emirati, it said.

Body of Ghana star Atsu killed in Turkey earthquake flown home

The remains of former Ghana international footballer Christian Atsu who died in a devastating earthquake in Turkey were being flown home yesterday, the country's foreign ministry said. Atsu, 31, was caught up in a 7.8-magnitude quake that rocked Turkey and Syria on February 6, killing more than 44,000 people in both countries. There were initial reports the former Chelsea and Newcastle player had been rescued a day after the quake, but these turned out to be false and his body was found on Saturday. "The remains will be accompanied by his family and Ghana's ambassador to Turkey on a Turkish airlines flight and will arrive in Accra (Ghana's capital) at 7:40 p.m. Sunday," the foreign ministry

said. On Saturday, the ministry said that Atsu's older brother and twin sister were present at the site of the rescue when his body was recovered. His widow Marie-Claire Ruptio and their three children were in the stands at St James' Park on Saturday to join in a tribute to the player before Newcastle's Premier League match against Liverpool.

food choices. "If nobody brought in cakes into the office, I would not eat cakes in the day," Jebb told The Times newspaper. "But because people do bring cakes in, I eat them. Now, OK, I have made a choice, but people were making a choice to go into a smoky pub." Jebb, who was not speaking on behalf of the Food Standards Agency, made the comment days after parliament published a report that said 25.9% of adults in England were obese and a further 37.9% were overweight, citing a 2021 survey. The United States ranked highest in the world for obesity levels with 43%, the report added cit-

Medical charity Medecins Sans Frontieres (MSF) said a convoy of 14 of its trucks had entered northwestern Syria on Sunday to assist in earthquake rescue operations, as concerns grow over lack of access to the war-ravaged area.

The World Food Programme (WFP) has been pressuring authorities in that region of Syria to stop blocking access as it seeks to help hundreds of thousands of people in the wake of the devastating Feb. 6 quake that hit the region.

Speaking to Reuters on the sidelines of the Munich Security Conference on Saturday, WFP Director David Beasley said the Syrian and Turkish governments had been cooperating very well, but that its operations were being hampered in northwestern Syria.

The agency last week said it was running out of stocks there and called for more border crossings to be opened from Turkey.

In Syria, already shattered by more than a decade of civil war, the bulk of fatalities have been in the northwest. The area is controlled by insurgents at war with forces loyal to President Bashar al-Assad which has complicated efforts to get aid to people.

Meanwhile, rescue efforts in Turkey were winding down on Sunday, with many praying only for bodies to mourn.

Role of external auditors in public companies

According to the provisions of The Commercial Companies Law in Bahrain, the external auditors of public-joint-stock companies have got the necessary jurisdiction to call the shareholders of the company for an ordinary general assembly. This important power has been given by The Commercial Companies Law to the external auditors of the company to enhance their role and, no doubt, this indicates that the Legislature recognizes the significance of the duty and burdens to be undertaken by the external auditors of any company.

However, we need to mention that, this power is given by the law to the external auditors only. In other words, internal auditors cannot call the shareholders of the company, simply because the law does not give them such legal authority, as they are employees of the company.

On the other hand, external auditors are not employees of the company and totally independent from the management as there is no managerial supervision. External auditors, according to the terms of the Commercial Companies Law, are appointed by the shareholders of the company from qualified auditing firms applying for the job. External auditors, being appointed by the shareholders, are supposed to report to them and the shareholders normally, on recommendations from the Board, decide the appointment, amount of remuneration to be given to the external auditors in consideration for their auditing work.

As a rule, the external auditors are supposed to follow and apply the international accounting / auditing standards (IAS) and the customary professional ethics and codes of conduct. Auditor's firms, as we have recently seen, violating or breaching such norms are to blame themselves because they will be prosecuted and discarded.

As per the international standards, the duty of the external auditors is not just checking or auditing of accounts, but they are empowered to check the policies, procedures and strategies of the company and give their recommendations as they deem necessary.

I think the Commercial Companies Law gives the external auditors such a great role so as to enable them to assist in strengthening the system and structure of the company, to the benefit of the shareholders, within the accepted norms of auditing standards.

To achieve this goal the external auditors, in general, are not supposed to be looked at as enemies of the management or mistake-seekers. Their aim is to make sure that everything is in order and going in the right direction. Both parties are supposed to join forces for the betterment of the company in general and the shareholders in particular.

I would like to say here, in some cases, external auditors are obliged to report what they deem as serious matters / findings to the concerned official government institutions. A good example for this is the Central Bank or the Securities Market Authority. The law, for instance, authorizes and requires that external auditors appointed to audit licensed banks, shall report immediately serious violations and or malpractices of licensed banks to the Central Bank. This is due to the special nature of the work of licensed banks and to protect depositors who are supposed to have save haven for their deposits in banks. The purpose of this duty is to ring an alarm bell to enable the competent authority, to take prompt and appropriate action.

Of course, the Central Bank has got its own ways and means to observe the proper performance of banks and to keep a vigilant eye on what they are doing. However, this should be considered as an additional eye and mind to give more protection to the banking industry.

A legal question may arise here, what about the "privity of contract" between banks and the external auditors? How come they report to an alien or a third party to the contract? In reply, I would like to say that the Central Bank is not an alien because it is the licensing and supervisory authority over banks. Moreover, the Central Bank directs all banks to insert a clause in each contract with external auditors providing that external auditor shall report certain matters to the Central Bank. This means the contractual relationship with the bank gives the external auditors the right to report whatever required and or they deem necessary to the Central Bank (other competent authorities).

Above shows that external auditors of public companies are given an important role to enable the corporate business to develop in a clean and healthy environment for all.

Sean Penn film 'Superpower' catches Zelenskiy at moment of Russian invasion

Late in the evening of Feb. 24, 2022, just some 15 hours after Russia triggered its invasion of his country, Ukraine President Volodymyr Zelenskiy found time to receive American actor Sean Penn.

Sitting in a bare, apparently windowless room, Zelenskiy speculates on Vladimir Putin's motives for the invasion in the central scene of "Superpower", Penn's feature-length profile of the president that premiered at the Berlin Film Festival on Friday.

"He wants us to be dead," Zelenskiy says in the film. "He hates Ukraine. He hates us."

In that moment, Penn said, he saw Zelenskiy's transformation into the man of the hour. "He was born for that moment," he told a news conference on Saturday.

Nearly one year into the invasion, Putin's troops are still in Ukraine, intensifying assaults in the east in what Moscow calls a "special military operation" that has killed thousands and led millions to flee.

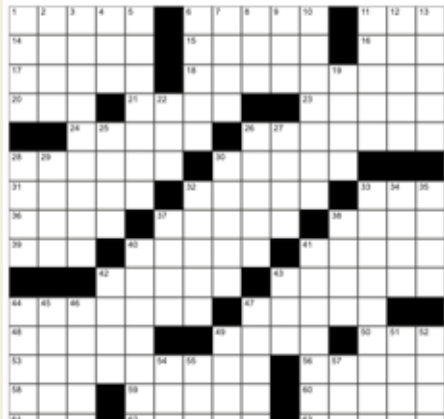

Wickets fell like nine-pins and Nathan Lyon narrowly averted a Jadeja hat-trick but the bowler kept up the charge to wrap up the Australian innings, which started on a promising note near the end of day two.

Axar Patel set up victory with his counter-attacking 74 on Saturday, lifting India from a precarious 139-7 to just one short of Australia's first-innings total.

The left-hander put on a key 114-run eighth-wicket stand with Ashwin to turn the tables on Australia, who kept coming back with Lyon leading the bowling charge.

Lyon returned figures of 5-67 with his off-spin and was supported by fellow spinners Todd Murphy and debutant Matthew Kuhnemann -- both of whom took two each. The Aussies suffered an early blow ahead of day two when star opener Warner was ruled out due to concussion after getting hit on the head in his knock of 15.



Red-hot Rashford nets double as ManU outclass Leicester

Manchester United striker Marcus Rashford's superb run of form continued as he netted a goal in each half of his side's 3-0 Premier League win over Leicester City yesterday to extend his scoring streak to five games.

It was exactly what his side needed as they weathered an early storm from the visitors,

with keeper David De Gea pulling off a superb save to deny Harvey Barnes in the eighth minute and topping that with an even better effort to keep out a Kelechi Iheanacho header.

United were a different side after the break, Lisandro Martinez hitting the crossbar in the 49th minute with a header and Rashford going close after another run and shot as Leicester lost their composure.

England international Rashford bagged his second in the 56th minute, cutting in from the left and tearing into the box before guiding the ball home to register his 14th league goal of the season and 25th in all competitions.

Substitute Jadon Sancho added a brilliant third five minutes later when Martinez won the ball in midfield to allow Rashford to feed Sancho, who played

a quick exchange of passes with Fernandes before drilling home.

Leicester rang the changes in an effort to get back into the game but United continued to have the better chances, with Sancho and Wout Weghorst spurning good opportunities to add a fourth.

United moved on to 49 points, three behind second-placed Manchester City after 24 games and five adrift of leaders Arsenal,

England thrash New Zealand with Bazball and Broad-side

England "Bazball" revolution continued apace yesterday when the tourists wrapped up a thumping 267-run victory over New Zealand in the first test yesterday with the best part of two days to spare at Bay Oval.

It was a first test victory for England in New Zealand since 2008 and a 10th win in 11 matches since former Black Caps skipper Brendon "Baz" McCullum and Christchurch-born Ben Stokes took over as coach and captain.

The Black caps were perhaps still shellshocked after Stuart Broad's brilliant spell with the pink ball on Saturday evening and only Daryl Mitchell offered any real resistance as they slumped to 126 all out in the opening session of the fourth day.

"Another great performance," said Stokes. "Very clinical with the bat and very clinical with the ball. We executed as well as



we wanted to."

"It was entertaining cricket and that's what we want to do. We're just trying to put on a show."

Broad (4-49) laboured in vain on Sunday to get his 20th five-wicket haul in tests, but his strike partner James Anderson (4-18) stepped up to lead the mopping up of the New Zealand tail.

The pair on Saturday supplanted Australia's Glenn McGrath and Shane Warne as the most prolific test bowling partnership and now have a combined 1,009 wickets from 113 matches together.

ENGLAND STRATEGY

England's strategy of batting aggressively during the day and doing their best to expose New Zealand's top order to the vagaries of the evening sessions

paid huge dividends.

Stokes declared on 325-9 after England were sent in to bat on day one and although New Zealand responded with a first-innings tally of 306, the tourists always appeared to be in control of the game.

After another "Bazball" onslaught at the start of day three, the England batsmen slowed the pace to extend the innings and ensure New Zealand started their second knock under the floodlights.

England's 374 gave them a healthy lead but they barely needed it as Broad bowled Devon Conway, Kane Williamson and Tom Latham through the gate in short order before returning to remove first innings centurion Tom Blundell in the same style.

Promising young England batsman Harry Brook was named Man of the Match for his half centuries in each innings.

Sublime Messi free kick earns PSG 4-3 win over Lille

Lionel Messi scored a stunning free kick in added time to earn Paris St Germain a 4-3 comeback win over Lille yesterday and lift them seven points clear at the top of the Ligue 1 standings.

PSG, who have struggled for consistency since their return from the World Cup break, extended their lead over the chasing pack, while AS Monaco moved into second with a 2-1 win over Brest.

Third-placed Olympique de Marseille travel to Toulouse later on Sunday.

Lille almost caught hosts PSG off guard in the opening 40 seconds when Timothy Weah's low shot took a wicked deflection, but Gianluigi Donnarumma was down fast to save with his legs.

PSG quickly grew into the game after the early scare at the Parc des Princes, with Messi hitting the target from a tight angle after being played through by Neymar.

Kylian Mbappe, making his first start since a two-week injury layoff, opened the scoring in the 11th minute with a bril-

liant piece of individual skill, ghosting past two opponents and squeezing a shot under keeper Lucas Chevalier.

"The match was not great, we made a lot of mistakes but we have shown that even when the context is not favourable, we can get through. We are a different team, we can get by all the time," Mbappe told Prime Video.

Christophe Galtier's side doubled their lead six minutes later when Neymar tapped in a Vitinha cross to finish off a flowing move.

However, Lille were far from passive as Jonathan David tested Donnarumma with a bullet header before Bafode Diakite nodded home an Andre Gomes cross to pull one back in the 24th minute.

Messi won a free kick five minutes into stoppage time and the Argentine curled it into the bottom corner to score his 11th league goal of the season and seal a dramatic victory for PSG.

Lille dropped to sixth following Stade Rennais's 2-0 win over Clermont.

Lens secured a 3-1 home win over Nantes to move up to 49 points, level with Marseille in third.
