### First round 73%

The voter turnout in the first round was 73%. In 2018, it was 67%, the highest since the parliamentary and municipal elections began in the Kingdom in 2002. A survey by the Bahrain Centre for Strategic and International Studies (Derasat) had predicted 63% to 69%% polling.
