For our Bahraini small enterprises – and large ones too! – there are many lessons to be learnt from the unfolding Big Tech Drama. Firstly, no matter how strongly you believe in hardware and software engineering, a tech company needs social vision to forge ahead. Our Be Aware app is a fine example of that. Secondly, you may swear by robotics and AI as the future of the workplace and yes, they are. But the power of the community and of people can never be fully replaced. Technology works for us – not the other way round.
