GoFundMe campaign raises \$6mn for Afghan evacuation

GoFundMe campaign Ato raise money for the evacuation of 300 vulnerable Afghans fleeing the Taliban has raised over \$6 million, according to figures published Thursday.

The creator of the fundraising page, New Yorkbased Tommy Marcus, asked for funds to organize flights out of the country for Afghans who risk being targeted by the Taliban.

They include men and women who worked as human rights lawyers, LG-BTQ activists, journalists, government liaisons and others, "all of whom are at imminent risk of being executed by the Taliban, along with their families,' the page said.

Marcus said he was working with aid groups, veterans and activists on the ground in Kabul to plan the rescue operation.

Since its launch earlier this week, the campaign has received donations from over 106,000 people, with contributions ranging from \$1 to \$20,000, collecting \$5 million in the space of just one day.
