Biden drops out of election race, endorses Harris

Joe Biden yesterday dropped out of the US presidential election and endorsed Vice President Kamala Harris as the Democratic Party's new nominee, in a stunning move that upends the 2024 race for the White House.

The 81-year-old Biden stepped aside after weeks of pressure from Democrats following a disastrous debate performance, throwing the election battle against Republican Donald Trump into unprecedented turmoil.

"While it has been my intention to seek reelection, I believe it is in the best interest of my party and the country for me to stand down and focus solely on fulfilling my duties as President for the remainder of my term," Biden said in a letter on X while recovering from Covid at his beach house in Delaware.

Biden said he would "speak to the nation later this week in more detail about my decision."

Saudi Arabia, a major foreign player in Yemen's nearly decade-long civil war, urged restraint yesterday in the wake of an Israeli strike that the Houthi rebels said killed six people.

The Israeli attack which hit the Houthi-controlled city of Hodeida, "aggravates the current tension in the region and halts the ongoing efforts to end the war in Gaza," the Saudi foreign ministry said in a statement.

It "called on all parties to exercise maximum restraint and to distance the region and its people from the dangers of war."

Saudi Arabia mobilised an international military coalition against the Huthis in 2015, although a truce has largely held for the past two years.

Divine discovery

Ancient Christian building found in Bahrain offers glimpse into early church history



Bahrain's archaeological treasure

Excavations began at a mound in Samaheej cemetery

Archaeologists from Bahrain and the United Kingdom have unearthed what is believed to be one of the oldest Christian buildings in the Arabian Gulf, providing tangible evidence of a Christian community that thrived for centuries in the region, according to a report published by the Bahrain News Agency (BNA).

While Christianity is not primarily associated with Gulf countries today, the Church of the East, also known as the Nestorian Church, flourished in the area for centuries until the 7th century AD.

The report highlighted that this period coincided with the gradual conversion of the region's communities to Islam, beginning in 610 AD.

Radiocarbon dating conducted by archaeologists at the Samaheej archaeological site in Muharraq confirmed that the building was inhabited from the mid-4th to the mid-8th centuries AD.

It appears to have been abandoned after Islam spread among the local population.

The excavation project, a joint effort between the Bahrain Au-

thority for Culture and Antiquities (BACA) and a British team led by Professor Timothy Insoll from the University of Exeter, began in 2019. The significant findings were revealed in 2023.

Excavations began at a mound in the Samaheej cemetery. Beneath the mound, archaeologists discovered the remains of a mosque.

Digging

Further digging led to the discovery of a large building with eight rooms, including a kitchen, dining room, what appears to be a workshop, and three living rooms.

The construction of the mosque is believed to have contributed to the preservation and survival of the building.

The findings suggest that the building may have been the episcopal palace (the main residence) of the bishop of the diocese, which included Samaheej.

Historical sources refer to the area as "Mischmaheej" or "Mashmaheej," which seems to be a variation of "Samaheej."

Historical records also indicate a connection between the area and central church authorities. One bishop was dismissed in 410 AD, and another was condemned for challenging church unity in the mid-7th century.

Town

This discovery is notable for the building's location in the heart of a modern, densely populated town.



Radiocarbon dating conducted by archaeologists at the Samaheej archaeological site in Muharraq confirmed that the building was inhabited from the mid-4th to the mid-8th centuries AD.

Previous discoveries of Christian buildings in the region have been limited to a few churches, monasteries, and dwellings, often located in remote areas along the shores of the Arabian Gulf.

Among the most significant finds are a collection of early Christian symbols indicating the Christian identity of the inhabitants.

These include three crosses made of plaster, two of which adorned the exterior of the building, and one that may have been kept as a personal memento by one of the residents.

Finds

Additional finds include wall paintings carved into the plaster, including a fish symbol and part

of what appears to be the "Chi Rho" symbol (a symbol composed of letters representing the word "Christ").

Dr. Salman Al Mahari stated that the excavation team has reached the final stage of work at the Samaheej archaeological site, emphasizing its importance for Bahrain's history.

The archaeological remains have provided researchers with insights into a significant period in Bahrain's history – the period of Christian presence, he added.

He explained that initial studies at the beginning of the project suggested the site dated back to the 6th to 8th centuries AD.

However, the recent study using radiocarbon dating confirmed that the building is older, dating back to the 4th century AD, making it approximately 1600 years old.

Christian building

"This makes it one of the oldest Christian buildings in the Arabian Gulf," he explained.

He further revealed that a clear example of the Eastern cross was recently found on a plaster slab.

Excavations at the site have also revealed details about the building and the lives of its inhabitants.

It was constructed with well-built stone walls covered with plaster and plaster floors with sockets and holes indicating the locations of doors and benches inside.

The kitchen contained hearths with bases and storage areas. Discoveries inside the building suggest that its inhabitants enjoyed a good standard of living.

They consumed various types of meat, fish, shellfish, and diverse crops, which are still being analyzed.

The discovery of agate gemstones and a large number of broken pieces of pottery of Indian origin suggests that the building's inhabitants were engaged in trade, particularly with India.

The building also contained small glass drinking cups and 12 copper coins, indicating that the inhabitants used currency from the Sassanid Empire.

Religious purposes

Other finds include spinning tools and copper needles, suggesting that fabrics may have been manufactured at the site for religious purposes.

Professor Tim Insoll stressed the importance of the recent archaeological discoveries, stating, "We emphasize the historical and archaeological significance of this site and the urgent need to preserve and protect it."

He added, "It is fascinating to find part of a face drawn on a pearl shell using bitumen, perhaps of a man who lived in the building. This discovery is the first tangible evidence of the Nestorian Church in Bahrain, providing us with valuable insights into how people lived, worked, and worshipped in that era."

Two under investigation for hate speech online

The Public Prosecution has initiated an investigation into two individuals accused of posting tweets that violate Bahraini law, according to a statement released by the Head of the Cybercrime Prosecution.

The investigation stems from reports filed by the Cybercrime Directorate of the General Directorate of Anti-Corruption and Economic & Electronic Security that allege that the two suspects published tweets on their public social media accounts that contained content deemed offensive to individuals held in high esteem by a religious community.

The tweets are also accused of inciting hatred towards a specific group of people, potentially leading to sectarian strife and undermining the fabric of Bahraini society.

Following the arrest of the suspects, the Public Prosecution promptly commenced its investigation.

"The suspects were interrogated and confronted with the incriminating tweets and evidence. Both individuals confessed to posting the tweets on their public social media accounts," the statement stated.

The Public Prosecution ordered the detention of both suspects for seven days pending further investigation.

The Head of the Cybercrime Prosecution urged social media users to adhere to the regulations governing online content and expression.

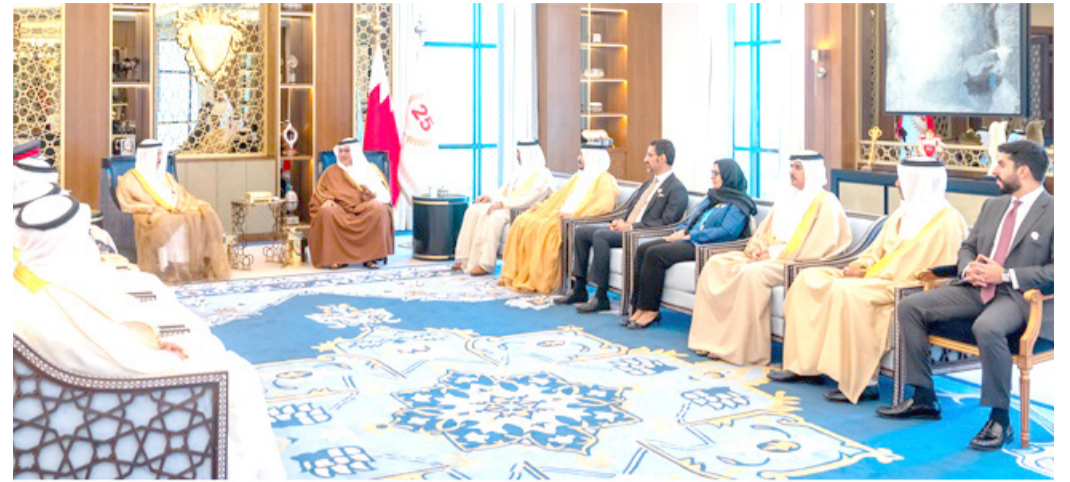
They stressed that online posts should remain within the boundaries set by law, avoiding content that incites sectarian tensions or undermines the security and stability enjoyed by the Bahraini community.

Tenant triumphs

Contractor ordered to pay over BD6,000 for faulty artificial turf installation

The High Civil Court has ruled in favour of a tenant of a football field inside the Istiqlal Walkway in the Sanad area, ordering the contractor to pay over BD6,000 for defects in the installation of artificial turf.

According to lawyer Iman Al Ansari, representing the tenant, her client had contracted with the company to replace the artificial turf at the stadium for BD8,000.

The work was to be completed within a month of the project's commencement.

An additional agreement was made for the company to install drainage for rainwater outside the stadium for BD850.

Defects

Al Ansari stated that the company failed to meet the agreed-upon deadline and that the work was riddled with defects.

The company had also cut the main electrical cable supplying power to the Istiqlal Walkway,

causing a power outage.

The court, after reviewing the expert's report, found that the company had installed substandard artificial turf that was uneven and inconsistent in colour.

Instructions

The company had also left debris and construction materials around the stadium, despite claiming they had acted on the instructions of the caretaker.

The court dismissed this claim, as the caretaker was not a party to the contract.

The court also noted that the company had left a drainage pipe exposed, posing a safety hazard to players.

Furthermore, the company had dug a trench for the drainage pipe without consulting with the municipality or the electricity and water authority, resulting in the severing of the main electrical cable and the stadium's lighting cable.

Power outage

This caused a power outage not only for the stadium but also for the entire walkway.



After reviewing the expert's report, the court found that the company had installed substandard artificial turf that was uneven and inconsistent in colour.

The court found the company liable for the damages caused by the severed cables and ordered them to pay BD1,293,400 for the repair of the main electrical cable, as supported by an invoice from the electricity and water authority.

In total, the court ordered the company to pay approximately BD6,000 to the tenant for the repair of the defects and the severed cable.

GCC population surges by 4 million in two-year span

The total population of the Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) countries has witnessed a significant increase of 7.3% in 2023 compared to 2021, reaching 57.6 million, according to recent statistics released by the GCC Statistical Centre.

Bahrain secured the fifth position among GCC countries in terms of population growth over the past two years.

The statistics revealed a remarkable rise of 3.9 million individuals within this period, with the GCC population standing at 53.6 million in 2021.

Bahrain experienced a 4.8% increase in population, rising from approximately 1.5 million in 2021 to 1.6 million in 2023.

Kuwait witnessed the highest population growth among

GCC countries, with a 16.5% increase, reaching 4.9 million in 2023 from 4.2 million in 2021. Oman followed closely with a 14.1% population surge, reaching 5.2 million in 2023 from 4.5 million in 2021.

Qatar recorded an 11.5% increase in population, reaching 3.1 million in 2023 from 2.7 million in 2021.

The United Arab Emirates experienced an 8.3% population growth, reaching 10.7 million in 2023 from 9.9 million in 2021. Although ranking first in terms of population, Saudi Arabia witnessed a 4.5% increase, reaching 32.2 million in 2022 from 30.8 million in 2021. Data for 2023 is currently unavailable.

The GCC Statistical Center projects the global population to reach 10.2 billion by 2080, with the world population standing at 8.2 billion in 2023.

News in brief -

Israel has started vaccinating its troops in Gaza against polio and supplying vaccines for the Palestinian population after health agencies said the virus has been found in the territory, the military said yesterday. Army authorities have begun "a broad vaccination operation for all ground troops, both regular and reserves," said a military statement. The army did not give a figure for the number of soldiers involved but thousands of regular and reservist troops are reported to be fighting in the war, which has raged since the October 7 Hamas attacks. The statement said the order was given after the army carried out sample tests in Gaza where most of the population is displaced and health and sanitary infrastructure has been decimated by the war. UN agencies said this week that the Global Polio Laboratory Network found type-2 poliovirus in six environmental samples collected on June 23. Israel's health ministry said it had made similar findings. No human cases have been reported.

Malaysia has detained a large oil tanker that collided with another vessel off its coast and fled the scene, the coast guard said yesterday. The Sao Tome and Principe-flagged Ceres 1 tanker had collided with the Singapore-flagged Hafnia Nile two days ago, causing both ships to catch fire, the coast guard said in a statement. The Ceres 1 then illegally left the location of the collision and turned off its tracking system, it added. A maritime air and sea search was immediately activated by Malaysian authorities. "Malaysia has successfully located and detained the Ceres 1 together with two tugboats that were towing it" off the country's eastern coast, Zin Azman Mohamad Yunus, the coast guard's search and rescue commander, said in the statement.

The Philippines and China have agreed on an "arrangement" for resupplying Filipino troops stationed on a South China Sea reef, Manila said Sunday, after a series of escalating confrontations in the disputed waters. "The Philippines and the People's Republic of China have reached an understanding on the provisional arrangement for the resupply of daily necessities and rotation missions to the BRP Sierra Madre in Ayungin Shoal," the Philippine foreign ministry, using the Filipino name for Second Thomas Shoal, said in a statement. A handful of Filipino troops are stationed on a rusty warship that was deliberately grounded on Second Thomas Shoal in 1999 to assert Manila's claims to the area.

'I took a bullet for democracy,' Trump tells first rally since shooting

Donald Trump, holding his first campaign rally Saturday since surviving an assassination attempt, rejected concerns that he is a threat to America's democratic system, triumphantly telling the crowd: "I took a bullet for democracy."

"I'm not an extremist at all," the newly-crowned Republican presidential nominee continued at the rally in swing state Michigan, dismissing his reported links to Project 2025, a shadow manifesto from figures close to him that has been characterized by opponents as an authoritarian, right-wing wish list. And he mocked the rival Democratic Party, roiled by unprecedented pressure for President Joe Biden to abandon his reelection bid amid concerns over his age and fitness to serve, if reelected, until 2029.

"They have no idea who their candidate is... This guy goes and he gets the votes, and now they want to take it away. That's democracy," Trump told the 12,000-strong crowd of passionate supporters.

In the fiery but typically rambling speech, the Republican riffed on his headline immigration views, espoused falsehoods about migrant crime, and repeated his baseless claim that Democrats "rigged" the 2020 election.

He expressed admiration for foreign autocrats including China's "brilliant" Xi Jinping, whom he praised for controlling "1.4 billion people with an iron fist." And he evoked the seconds after a gunman tried to kill him at a rally in Pennsylvania, when, bloodied and surrounded by Secret Service agents, he raised a fist and yelled for his supporters to "fight!"

The crowd in Grand Rapids chanted the word back to him multiple times Saturday, though some appeared to tire of the lengthy address after 90 minutes and began heading to the exits.

The rally represented a moment remarkable by any measure, with Trump back on the campaign trail exactly one week since the assassination attempt.

He wore a new, smaller, flesh-colored bandage over his right ear, grazed in the attack by a 20-year-old gunman who also killed one bystander.

Israeli settlers beat foreign volunteers in West Bank

Israeli settlers yesterday attacked a group of foreign volunteers helping Palestinian farmers in the occupied West Bank, injuring some who needed hospital treatment, the activists and Israeli army said.

Eight mainly American volunteers were working with the farmers in an olive grove near the Palestinian village of Qusra when settlers came after them, said David Hummel, an American-German in the group.

"We were standing there peacefully, not a threat to anyone, when they started coming towards us and pushing us down the path," Hummel told AFP.

"They started attacking and beating us all with sticks and metal pipes and they were throwing rocks as well at us," he said.



Since October 7, at least 579 Palestinians have been killed in violence with settlers or Israeli troops, according to the Palestinian authorities. At least 16 Israelis, including soldiers, have been killed in attacks involving Palestinians, according to official Israeli figures.

"I was attacked on my legs, on my arms and here on my jaw as well and it was ... very violent," added the volunteer, showing bruising to his face.

Attacks on Palestinians in the West Bank have increased since the Gaza war erupted on October 7. Tensions have been further fuelled by an International Court of Justice ruling on Friday that Israel's occupation of Palestinian territories since 1967 was illegal.

The volunteers are from the International Solidarity Movement, a group that says it deploys people to form a "protective presence" for Palestinians at risk of facing violence in the West Bank.

Two women were among four activists treated at Rafidia hospital in the nearby city of Nablus, according to Qusra's mayor Hani

Several ISM volunteers have been injured in the West Bank and Gaza since it started work. Some have also been arrested.

Odeh. An AFP journalist saw at least three being treated in the hospital.

Israeli troops arrived and fired warning shots in the air to chase away the volunteers and farmers, according to the mayor.

The army said in a statement that "a number of masked Israeli civilians assaulted a group of foreign citizens while they were planting trees in the area of Qusra" and that "several" needed treatment.

"Soldiers were dispatched to the scene and fired warning shots into the air, causing the Israeli civilians to flee the area," they added, condemning any "acts of violence".

The volunteers from the ISM, which says it was set up "to resist the Israeli occupation of Palestinian land", have been in Qusra for about a month, according to the mayor.

"The farmers wanted to 'clear the land after settlers burned it some time ago'," said Odeh.

About 10 people from the nearby Esh Kodesh Israeli settlement arrived to confront the farmers and foreign activists, he added.

Hummel said the group of settlers who attacked them included six women.

Shusha Global Media Forum opens in Azerbaijan

150 Media professionals, officials, civil society representatives, representatives of international organizations and media experts from around 50 countries are attending the forum to exchange their views and experiences. Abdul Jaleel Abdulla, the CEO of The Daily Tribune is attending the forum representing media from Kingdom of Bahrain.

During his inaugural interaction with the forum participants, the President of Azerbaijan, Ilham Aliyev said, "Incompetent inaccurate and manipulated reports originate from the West. It becomes our daily life. We were suprised and disappointed, but now wer are

indifferent."

During his speech, President Ilham Aliyev also expressed his opinion on those who do not want COP29 to be held in the country. He emphasized that this event is extremely important for Azerbaijan and added that since the COP is one of the most important events on a global scale, its holding for the first time in the post-Soviet space will enter Azerbaijan into the highest league. In addition, the head of state emphasized that he wants the COP29 to be held in Azerbaijan to be a solidarity event.

The forum will conclude on July 22nd.

Turkey ready to build Cyprus naval base 'if necessary': Erdogan

Turkey's President Recep Tayyip Erdogan said yesterday that his country was ready to build a Cyprus naval base "if necessary", 50 years after Turkish forces invaded the now-divided island.

"If necessary, we can construct a base and naval structures in the north" of the divided island, the official Anadolu news agency reported him as saying.

"We also have the sea," Erdogan said he flew back to Turkey after visiting northern Cyprus on Saturday to mark 50 years since Turkey's invasion.

He also accused rival Greece of wanting to establish a naval base of its own on Cyprus, on whose future both sides remain as divided as ever.

In 1983, Turkey installed what it calls the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus (TRNC), which no other country has recognised four decades after it was proclaimed by Turkish Cypriot leaders.

As Greek Cypriots mourned those killed and still missing since the 1974 convulsion of violence, Cypriot President Nikos Christodoulides said Saturday that reunification was the only option.

Cyprus joined the European Union in 2004 still divided after Greek Cypriots overwhelmingly rejected a UN plan to end their differences with Turkish Cypriots.

Iraq to import electricity from Turkey

Iraq said yesterday a new power line will bring electricity from Turkey to its northern provinces as authorities aim to diversify the country's energy sources to ease chronic power outages.

The 115-kilometre (71-mile) line connects to the Kisik power station west of Mosul and will provide 300 megawatts from Turkey to Iraq's northern provinces of Nineveh, Salah al-Din and Kirkuk, according to a statement by the prime minister's office.

Prime Minister Mohamed Shia al-Sudani said the new line was a "strategic" step to link Iraq with its neighbouring countries.

"The line started operating today," Ahmed Moussa, spokesperson for the electricity ministry, told AFP.

Stalin bust beheaded with sledgehammer in Russian park

Moscow, Russia

An unknown man wielding a sledgehammer has decapitated a statue honouring Soviet dictator Joseph Stalin in a city near Moscow, Russian state media reported.

Video taken in the city of Zvenigorod showed the suspect staggering around the statue before knocking its head off in what appeared to be one swoop and walking away.

"On Saturday, in one of Zvenigorod's parks, a man in an unwell state knocked the head off

the bust of Joseph Stalin with a sledgehammer," a law enforcement source told the state-run RIA news agency.

The man also damaged a bust of Soviet founder Vladimir Lenin before immediately fleeing the scene of the crime, local media reported.

He is now being sought by police, state-run news agencies said.

The statue of Stalin in Zvenigorod was erected by a group of pro-veteran activists in the summer of 2023.

Russia says intercepted US bomber planes over Arctic

Russia said yesterday that it scrambled fighter jets to prevent two US strategic bomber planes from crossing its border over the Barents Sea in the Arctic.

The US military routinely carries out flights over international waters, operations that it says are conducted in neutral airspace and in accordance with international law.

But Moscow has responded more aggressively to the exercises in recent months, warning in June that US drone flights over the Black Sea risked leading to a "direct" military clash.

The Russian defence ministry said it had scrambled fighter jets to intercept an "air target approaching the state border of the Russian Federation".

"The crews of the Russian fighters identified the aerial target as a pair of US Air Force B-52H strategic bombers," it said.

"As the Russian fighters approached, the American strategic bombers corrected their flight course, moving away and then turning away from Russia's state border," it said.

In June, Moscow accused the United States of using its reconnaissance drone flights over neutral waters in the Black Sea to help Ukraine strike the Russian-annexed Crimean peninsula.

It said that the flights increased the risk of a "direct confrontation" between NATO and Russia, and that its army had been instructed to prepare an "operational response".

Outrage after French MP says Israelis 'not welcome' at Olympics

A major French Jewish group yesterday slammed a hard-left MP for saying Israeli athletes were not welcome at the Paris Olympics from next week because of the war in Gaza, calling the comments "irresponsible".

France Unbound (LFI) lawmaker Thomas Portes was "putting a target on the backs of Israeli athletes," said Yonathan Arfi, head of the Representative Council of Jewish Institutions in France, on X.

Portes had said at a rally in support of Palestinians that "the Israeli delegation is not welcome in Paris. Israeli sportspeople are not welcome at the Paris Olympic Games" and called for "mobilisation" around the event.

He later told the Parisien newspaper that "France's diplomats should pressure the International Olympic Committee to bar the Israeli flag and anthem, as is done for Russia".

"It's time to end the double standard," Portes added.

Property can be divided into certain categories including "tangible real property" as in land and anything attached to it, or "tangible personal property" as in any moveable items that can be bought and owned, or "intangible personal property" that cannot be seen but exists by virtue of written documentation as in insurance policies, bank accounts, stocks and bonds. Due to some confusion, it would be better to elaborate in "intangible personal property" particularly stocks, with respect to the noticeable big volume of investment activity.

More over, there are different types of stocks and investment or trading therein is well regulated and established.

Investors purchase a firm common stock, in the hope that that it will increase in value, provides dividends income or both. But how is the value of common stocks determined? Stocks value are expressed in three different ways, as par value, market value and book value. The face value of a share of stock at the time it is originally issued is the "par" value. To receive their corporate license all companies must declare par value for their stocks.

Each company must preserve the par value money in its retained earnings, and it cannot be distributed as dividends. Whereas stocks real value is its "market" value. In other words, the current price of a share as displayed in the stock market. The market value reflects the buyer's willingness to invest in a company at a certain time. The "book" value of a common stock represents the owner equity divided by the number of shares. Book value is used as a comparison indicator because the market value for successful companies is usually greater than its book value. Thus when market falls to near book value, some investors buy stocks on the understanding that it is underpriced and will increase in the near future.

Investors are advised that, common stocks are among the riskiest of all securities. Including, uncertainties about stocks market itself, which can quickly change value. Furthermore, when companies lack profits, they cannot pay dividends. Shareholder income, therefore, and perhaps share price drops. At the same time, on the other hand, common stocks offer high growth potential. Naturally, the prospects for growth in various industries change from time to time and institutional investors are aware. Therefore, particularly small investors, are advised to look for well-established financially sound firms.

Research from RCSI Medical University of Bahrain confirms HbA1c threshold for diabetes-related kidney disease

The Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland (RCSI) Medical University of Bahrain released a research study led by Professor Alexandra Butler, Professor in Pathology, in collaboration with international colleagues, titled 'Using nephropathy as an outcome to determine the HbA1c diagnostic threshold for type 2 diabetes', published in PubMed.

Diabetes is a significant health problem in the Middle East, and diabetic nephropathy (severe kidney disease), is a major cause of poor health and can result in death. The study aimed to determine if a lower HbA1c thresh-

old - the average blood glucose (sugar) and used in diagnosing diabetes- would better predict diabetic nephropathy in a high-risk Middle Eastern population.

After analysing the data from 2,920 participants, the findings indicate that no HbA1c threshold below 7.0% could be found to predict an increased prevalence of nephropathy. Therefore, there is no need to change the existing retinopathy based HbA1c threshold of 6.5% to also accommodate diabetes nephropathy risk. These results are consistent with a similar study conducted in the United States employing the National Health and Nutrition Examination Survey (NHANES) population.

search commented, "The results of the study suggest that there is no need for routine urine screening for diabetic nephropathy at HbA1c levels below 6.5%, even in a high-risk, Middle Eastern population without diabetes. This information is important for the purpose of health screening policies and can help guide resource allocation for diabetes prevention and management efforts in the Middle East."

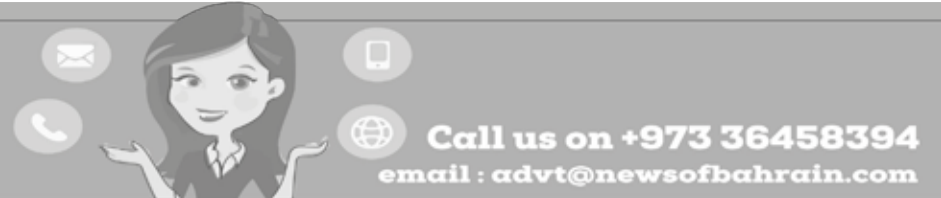

Pogacar clinches third Tour title

Tadej Pogacar dominates Tour de France final time trial, secures overall victory with six stage wins

● **Jonas Vingegaard finishes second overall, Remco Evenepoel third**

● **Pogacar wins six stages, matching his Giro d'Italia performance**

Tadej Pogacar won the 2024 Tour de France yesterday, adding a third overall title to his 2020 and 2021 crowns.

The 25-year-old won the final day's time-trial with defending champion Jonas Vingegaard coming second at 1 minute 03 seconds on the day to seal second overall ahead of a disappointed Remco Evenepoel, third on the day and third overall.

Astonishingly Pogacar won six stages on this edition of the Tour de France, just as he did when winning the 2024 Giro d'Italia.

broadcast across the globe, featured a novelty finale on the French Riviera because of the Olympic Games in Paris.

Instead of the last day romp around the Champs Elysees the race avoided the Olympic Games sites altogether.

With five stage wins already in his saddlebag, Pogacar stormed out of his adopted hometown of Monaco and up the coast to Nice, with its pebble beach and celebrated Promenade des Anglais walkway, where he leapt into the arms of his team-mates.

Pogacar took the overall lead

on a downhill on day four as the race arrived in France from Italy via the Alps.

By the time the race returned to the Alps, Pogacar was 3 minutes clear and Vingegaard was starting to flail, due to his major crash in March.

After the Queen stage on day 19, Pogacar knew he'd won and Vingegaard and his team boss switched their attentions to finishing second.

Vingegaard crashed heavily in March and was praised for even making it to the start line, but ahead of yesterday's race he expressed a desire to win another stage.

Although he started well, as has often been the case in this Tour, he was a distant second best.

He did however beat pre-race favourite Evenepoel, who cried at the finish line.

There are many prizes on offer on the Tour with Pogacar's yellow jersey for overall race leader being the chief amongst

them.

Evenepoel may not have won the final day time-trial but he won the first time-trial in week two.

He also came third in the overall standings and won the white jersey for best young rider.

Other stars emerged along the way, as Eritrean rider Biniam Girmay won three stages, the sprint points green jersey and national hero status in his homeland.

Riding a green bike and decked out from head to toe in

green, Girmay was seen off by a clutch of his countrymen in Monaco.

He narrowly beat the 2023 sprint king Jasper Philipsen, who won three stages but never had the lead in the points race.

Olympic champion Richard Carapaz is being hailed as the most combative rider on the 2024 Tour.

The Ecuadorian EF rider won a stage, took the yellow jersey for a day and came close to other victories. He raced on Saturday in the polka dot best climber's jersey.

Mark Cavendish also grabbed the headlines, claiming a record 35th stage win and was given a special podium presentation for his career achievement.

Greeted by his family in Nice there were no tears from the Manx Missile, who laughed off the idea.

When asked if this was his last race he replied: "Likely so, yeah".

The first inductees from India were joined by British tennis journalist and author Richard Evans in enshrinement ceremonies at the Hall of Fame in Newport, Rhode Island.

Paes recounted his youth playing football and hockey before turning to tennis and eventually following his hockey-captain father as an Olympic medalist.

"It's my greatest honor to be on this stage with not only these legends of the game, people who have inspired me every single day of my life -- not because you've only won Grand Slams, not because you've shaped our sport but every single one of these people have shaped the world we live in," Paes said.

"I would like to thank you so much for giving this Indian boy hope."

Amritraj, 70, played from 1970 until retiring in 1993, winning 15 ATP singles titles and 399 matches and being ranked as high as 18th in the

world and helped India to the Davis Cup finals in 1974 and 1987.

"I am humbled and honored to join this incredible and exclusive group that have brought glory to our sport," Amritraj said.

After his playing days, Amritraj has helped humanitarian causes, backed ATP and WTA events in India and has acted in the James Bond and Star Trek movie series.

"A feeling came over me that I had never experienced," Amritraj said of learning about his election to the Hall. "This was an honor not just for me, for my family, for my parents, but for all of my fellow Indians and my country who live around the world."

Like Amritraj, Evans was inducted in the contributor category for his life impact on the sport.

Paes, 51, was an 18-time Grand Slam champion in doubles and mixed doubles who was selected in the player category after honing his trade in an Amritraj youth academy.

Paes and Amritraj made India the 28th nation represented in the Hall of Fame.

"Playing for 1.4 billion people could either be pressure or it could be wind within your wings," Paes said.

Bashir bowls England to series-clinching win over West Indies

Shoab Bashir took his Test-best figures as England thrashed the West Indies by 241 runs to secure a series-clinching win at Trent Bridge yesterday after the tourists suffered a spectacular collapse.

The 20-year-old off-spinner finished with a superb return of 5-41 as the West Indies, set 385 to win, slumped to 143 all out in the second Test.

The West Indies had actually made a steady start to their stiff chase to be 61-0 only to collapse in stunning style, with all 10 of their second-innings wickets lost in 23 overs.

Victory gave England an unassailable 2-0 lead in a three-match series following their innings and 114-run win at Lord's.

West Indies openers Kraigg Brathwaite and Mikyle Lou-

is came through some testing early overs from an England attack without retired pace greats James Anderson and Stuart Broad for the first time in a home Test since 2012.

But when Chris Woakes (2-

28) had Louis caught behind off the first ball after the drinks break, it was the start of a spectacular top-order slump that saw six wickets lost for just 30 runs.

Bashir then struck with his

Piastrri claims maiden F1 win

McLaren secures 1-2 finish amid team orders controversy as Hamilton achieves 200th podium

Oscar Piastrri claimed his maiden Formula One victory yesterday when he finished ahead of his McLaren team-mate Lando Norris, after a vexed radio argument produced an extraordinary finish to an incident-filled Hungarian Grand Prix.

In a race of fluctuating fortunes and many quarrels on and off the track, the McLaren duo secured a comprehensive one-two after starting from the team's first front row lockout since 2012, Norris finally obeying team orders to hand his team-mate his first career win.

Piastrri, 23, won by 2.141 seconds with seven-time champion Lewis Hamilton finishing third for Mercedes to claim his record 200th podium finish.

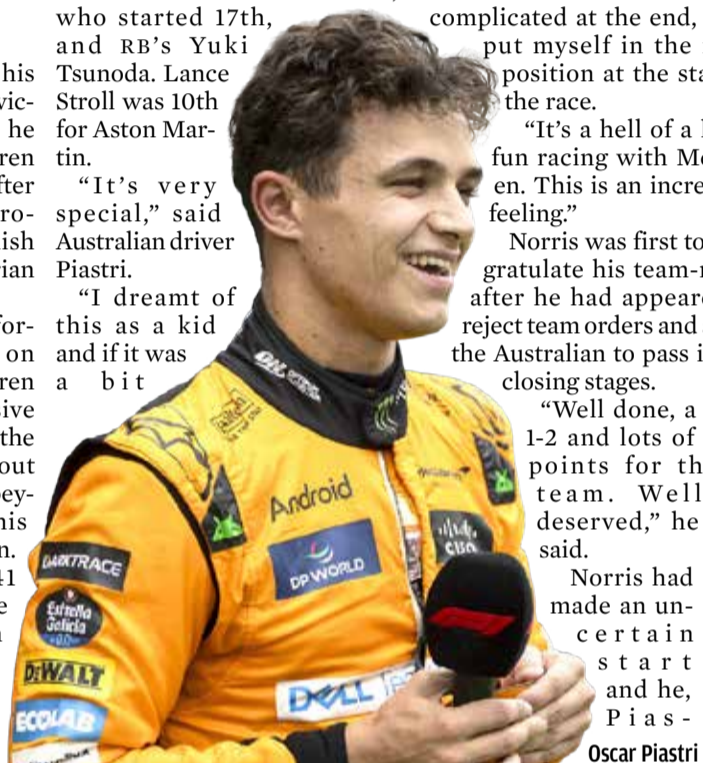
He survived a late collision with Red Bull's three-time champion and series leader Max Verstappen, who flew off, but recovered to finish fifth.

Charles Leclerc came home fourth and Ferrari team-mate Carlos Sainz sixth, sandwiching a grumpy Verstappen who was called to see the stewards to explain his collision with Hamilton.

Sergio Perez finished seventh for Red Bull, having started 16th on the grid, ahead of George Russell in the second Mercedes, who started 17th, and RB's Yuki Tsunoda. Lance Stroll was 10th for Aston Martin.

"It's very special," said Australian driver Piastrri.

"I dreamt of this as a kid and if it was a bit

complicated at the end, I did put myself in the right position at the start of the race.

"It's a hell of a lot of fun racing with McLaren. This is an incredible feeling."

Norris was first to congratulate his team-mate, after he had appeared to reject team orders and allow the Australian to pass in the closing stages.

"Well done, a good 1-2 and lots of good points for the team. Well deserved," he said.

Norris had made an uncertain start and he, Pias-

tri and Verstappen were three abreast into Turn One where Piastrri exited in the lead as the Dutchman ran wide and cut back into second place, gaining a clear advantage and pushing Norris down to third.

This prompted an exchange of messages before race engineer Gianpiero Lambiase told Verstappen to allow Norris to pass, a command that clearly irked him.

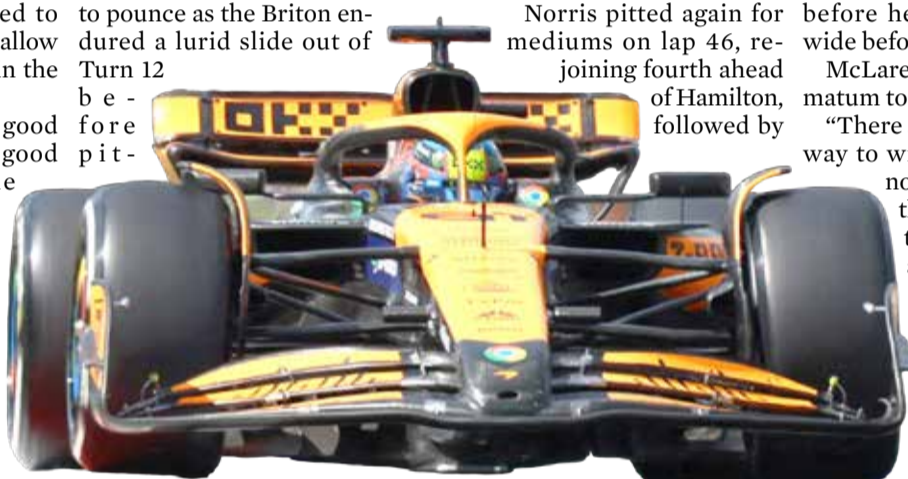
"So, you can just run people off the track?" barked the Dutchman.

'Do the right thing'

By lap 10, Piastrri led Norris by 2.7 seconds with Verstappen third adrift by two seconds ahead of Hamilton and the two Ferraris, led by Leclerc.

Hamilton eventually reeled off a series of fastest laps to rise to third, but Verstappen on younger tyres reeled him in, waiting to pounce as the Briton endured a lurid slide out of Turn 12

ting again on lap 41 after fending off the Dutchman.

At the front, Piastrri was in cruise mode ahead of Norris with Verstappen third, 11.5 seconds adrift. Hamilton rejoined fifth behind Sainz, but with Leclerc, on new mediums, on his tail.

Norris pitted again for mediums on lap 46, rejoining fourth ahead of Hamilton, followed by

Piastrri on 47, handing the lead to Verstappen with Norris up to second, but told to "re-establish the order at your convenience".

Verstappen made his second stop, for mediums, on lap 50, rejoining fifth behind Leclerc, but adrift of the Ferrari by 4.5.

In the lead, Norris was reminded of his team instructions and responsibilities as Piastrri closed in.

"We know you'll do the right thing," said McLaren, but Norris, knowing he could reduce Verstappen's championship lead, stayed silent when told not to stress his tyres.

"Tell him to catch up, please," he said.

As McLaren's tensions boiled over, Verstappen lunged down the inside of Hamilton at Turn One on lap 63, but locked up and clipped the Mercedes. The collision sent him airborne briefly before he bounced clear and wide before rejoining in fifth.

McLaren then issued an ultimatum to Norris.

"There are five laps to go. The way to win a championship is not by yourself. It is with the team. You are going to need Oscar and you are going to need the team."

With three laps remaining, Norris slowed dramatically to gift Piastrri the lead.

Nadal defeated in first tour final in two years

Rafael Nadal lost his first final in two years yesterday as the Spaniard went down 6-3, 6-2 to Portugal's Nuno Borges at the clay-court Bastad Open.

The Spanish tennis great had shown signs of a return to form in Scandinavia as he made an impressive run to the final, just one week before tennis at the Olympic Games gets underway on the clay in Paris.

But Nadal, rather than celebrating his 64th title on the surface and first since Roland Garros 2022, was dominated by seventh seed Borges as he struggled to find fluency with his serve and ground strokes.

"Many congratulations to Nuno," said Nadal.

"You've been playing great during the whole week, so you deserve it more than anyone else here. Congratulations and enjoy your moment, it's always special winning a title."

The 38-year-old showed signs of his old self serving at deuce in the first game of the second set with a booming forehand winner down the line, before he eventually held but that was one of the few highlights for Nadal on the day.

Borges then struck at 2-2 as he broke Nadal's serve for the first time in the second set and fourth time overall to edge ahead.

The 27-year-old followed it up by winning the next three games, sealing a maiden career title in his first-ever match-up against the former world number one with an ace.

Spaniard Marquez, 55, has been coaching league teams in India since 2020 and will take on the role for the national team "effective immediately", the All India Football Federation said in a statement Saturday.

"We are delighted to welcome Mr Marquez to this important role," AIFF President Kalyan Chaubey said, adding the federation was looking forward to working with the new coach "in the years ahead".

Marquez, who has more than two decades of interna-

tional experience in football management, had been the coach of FC Goa since June last year and said he was "grateful" to AIFF for the opportunity as he considers India "my second home."

"I want to do my best to bring success to the millions of fans we have," he said.

Former West Ham and Croatia defender Stimac was sacked in June following India team's poor performance in World Cup qualifiers.

Stimac's five-year tenure ended controversially, with India's federation accusing him of using astrology to pick his teams.

Stimac, who played a World Cup semi-final for Croatia in 1998, became India coach in 2019 and they briefly broke into the top 100 of FIFA's world rankings for only the second time in nearly three decades.
