Azerbaijan accuses France of stoking new regional 'wars'

President Ilham Aliyev yesterday accused France of inciting conflicts in the Caucasus by arming Azerbaijan's longtime rival Armenia, with which it has fought two wars.

Baku and Yerevan have been locked in a decades-long territorial conflict over Azerbaijan's Nagorno-Karabakh region, which Baku reclaimed in September after a lightning offensive against Armenian separatists.

"(France) is pursuing a militaristic policy by arming Armenia, encouraging revanchist forces in Armenia, and laying the groundwork for provoking new wars in our region," Aliyev said in written comments to an international conference in Baku.

Civilian death toll in Ukraine tops 10,000: UN report

The death toll in Ukraine has exceeded 10,000 since Russia's invasion in February 2022, according to the UN Human Rights Office.

Shockingly, about half of the recent deaths occurred far away from the front lines.

The UN human rights mission in Ukraine, with its extensive team of monitors, anticipates that the actual number of casualties is much higher than the official count due to ongoing verification efforts.

US mulls terrorist tag for Houthis

The US said yesterday it was considering designating Yemen's Houthi rebels a terrorist organisation after their seizure of an Israel-linked cargo vessel in the Red Sea.

The capture on Sunday of the Galaxy Leader and its 25 international crew came days after the Iran-backed Houthis threatened to target Israeli shipping over the Israel-Hamas war.

Hope Rises: Gaza hostage deal 'soon'

Optimism soars as Hamas, Qatar and Israel say 'progress' in talks for truce deal

Hamis government says war death toll surpasses 14,000

Hopes mounted yesterday that Hamas could release dozens of hostages from war-torn Gaza after the group's leader and key mediator Qatar said a truce deal was in sight and the Israeli premier pointed to "progress".

The announcements are the most optimistic yet of a potential breakthrough in the conflict, which has raged for more than six weeks and left thousands dead on both sides.

"We are close to reaching a deal on a truce," Hamas leader Ismail Haniyeh said.

In Qatar, foreign ministry spokesman Majed Al-Ansari said "we're very optimistic, very hopeful" and told reporters: "We are at the closest point we ever had been in reaching an agreement."

Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu, who has vowed to destroy Hamas, was more circumspect, telling soldiers at a base only that "we are making progress" on the return of hostages.

"I hope there will be good news soon," he added, with

speculation an announcement could be made later yesterday, after his office announced meetings of his war and security cabinets and government.

US President Joe Biden, who does not support a full ceasefire, said a temporary truce was "now very close".

hostages home very soon," he said. "But I don't want to get into the details of things because nothing is done until it's done."

Release deal

Hopes of a release deal have been mounting since Qatar on Sunday said only "minor" practical issues remained.

Speculation grew further when the International Committee of the Red Cross, which is often involved in prisoner exchanges and hostage releases,

said yesterday its president had met Haniyeh in Qatar.

Despite talk of a temporary truce, fighting raged on in Gaza's bloodiest ever war, sparked by the October 7 attack in which Israel says Hamas fighters killed around 1,200 people, mostly civilians.

In retaliation, Israel launched a relentless bombing campaign and ground offensive in Gaza. According to the Hamas government, the war has killed more than 14,100 people, including nearly 6,000 children and close to 4,000 women.

Sources from Hamas and Islamic Jihad, which also participated in the attacks, told AFP on condition of anonymity that their groups had agreed to the terms of a truce deal.

The tentative agreement would include a five-day truce, comprised of a complete ceasefire on the ground and an end to Israeli air operations over Gaza, except in the north, where they would only halt for six hours daily.

Parliament bill passed

'Government employees to get Commercial Registration'

The Parliament passed a bill in its recent session that allows government employees to obtain a Commercial Registration (CR), with the relevant authorities being granted the power to establish specific regulations for this process.

The bill was passed by the Council after heated debates and discussions that lasted for approximately two hours. During the deliberations, members of Parliament expressed varying perspectives on the bill.

Some MPs raised concerns about the potential for conflicts of interest among certain em-

employees in government agencies. They highlighted the possibility that these employees could misuse their authority in conjunction with the commercial registration, which could contradict existing laws and lead to numerous complications.

These MPs emphasised the necessity of implementing regula-

tions to ensure a well-regulated and smooth process. On the other hand, several MPs expressed their support for the bill, noting that it would allow government employees to diversify their sources of income, thereby improving their livelihoods.

They also argued that the bill would contribute to diversifying

the country's income sources and increasing the number and variety of commercial registrations in the Kingdom of Bahrain. Furthermore, they believed that Bahraini citizens would benefit from these opportunities and that it would strengthen the economy, among other positive outcomes.

109 irregular workers detained, 181 violators deported

The Labour Market Regulatory Authority (LMRA) announced the implementation of 883 inspection campaigns and visits, during the week of 12 to 18 November 2023, which resulted in the detention of 109 violating and irregular workers, while 181 violators were deported.

The inspection campaigns and visits also resulted in the monitoring of a number of violations related to the provisions of a number of regulating laws, especially the Labour Market Regulatory Authority Law and the Residency Law in the Kingdom of Bahrain, noting that legal measures were taken regarding the observed violations.

The inspection campaigns and visits were carried out on various work locations in all governorates that included 10 campaigns in the Capital Governorate; 4 campaigns in Muharraq Governorate; 4 in campaigns in the Northern Governorate and 2 in the Southern Governorate.

The Ministry of Interior is represented by the Nationality, Passports and Residence Affairs in the campaigns.

'Extended support package' for private sector employees

Parliamentary sources revealed to our sister newspaper, Al Ayam, the highlights of the joint parliamentary-government meeting, which gathered leaders in the legislative and executive branches to review and discuss the details of the new programme package launched by Labour Fund, Tamkeen.

In response to queries of MPs and Shura members, the govern-

ment team declared that the new support package, which includes wage increment subsidy support, is not limited to employees but also extends to leadership and supervisory positions in private sector companies.

The government team reported that support could include all Bahrainis who hold leadership and administrative positions whose salaries do not exceed BD1,500, and their wage support could reach BD300.

The sources also reported that wage increment subsidy support for private sector employees reaches 20%, while support for career advancement raises for leadership and executive posi-

tions reaches 50%.

The cost of all new programmes will be entirely covered by Tamkeen through full payment of the wage increments in addition to training support

with higher ceilings and greater support rates, furthermore incentivising institutions that invest in developing their human resources.

Necessity

The Chairman of the Financial and Economic Affairs Committee in the Shura Council, Representative Zainab Abdul Amir, stressed the necessity of including all private sector senior em-

ployees in this initiative, which is the first following many years of a frozen salary scale in the private sector.

The initiative aims to revitalise this vital sector, which includes the vast majority of citizens. Regarding the joint meeting, she stated that the parliamentary team brought up several points, particularly with regards to companies' commitment to disbursing the wage increment at the end of the two-year period.

Court compels woman to pay BD63,500 instead of original BD14,000 for bank loan

The Supreme Commercial Court of Appeal obliged a woman to pay an amount of BD63,500 instead of BD14,000 that was ordered by a lower court towards bank loan dues.

The court has also decided to oblige her to pay the fees and expenses of the lawsuit and attorney's fees.

Details of the lawsuit filed by the bank indicated that in 2010, the woman obtained a loan of BD75,720 with the loan repayment period being over 120 months. The woman requested to postpone the installments twice, which resulted in rescheduling the loan, calculating the fees for postponement. As a result, the loan amounted to BD77,990.

The bank's lawyer pointed out that the woman failed to pay the rest of the installments despite being given a period to postpone the installments, which explicitly violated the loan agreement concluded between the bank and the borrower, which made the total amount of the loan BD63,500.

The lawyer stated that the court of first instance ruled that the borrower was obligated to pay only BD14,000, after she submitted documents to the court showing that the remaining amount in her financial liability was only BD14,000, but the bank appealed the sentence.

Focus on sustainable energy mix, economic diversification

Prominent speakers at 7th EU-GCC Business Forum discuss importance of technological innovation, carbon capture and localised benefits

The 7th EU-GCC Business Forum, held yesterday at the prestigious Ritz Carlton, brought together distinguished speakers, industry leaders, and policymakers to delve into the pressing issues of achieving a sustainable energy mix and promoting economic diversification.

With a focus on redefining economics and building a sustainable and diversified future, the forum sparked insightful discussions on the challenges and strategies necessary for addressing these critical issues.

Mr. Ibrahim Al Zu'bi, Group Chief Sustainability Officer of ADNOC, highlighted the urgent need for economic diversification while acknowledging the world's slow progress in reaching targets. He emphasised the importance of reassessing current approaches and redirecting the focus toward technological innovation.

Mr. Al Zu'bi cited ADNOC's groundbreaking carbon capture project launched in 2016, which successfully reduced CO2 emissions in collaboration with the steel industry. He pointed out that identifying low-car-

bon solutions and investing in their implementation are vital to achieving sustainable energy goals.

The COVID-19 pandemic witnessed a record number of countries and companies committing to NetZero targets. Mr. Al Zu'bi stressed the significance of setting short-term targets, such as a 25 per cent reduction in intensity by 2030, to ensure progress.

He emphasised the need for clear guiding principles, adequate budgets, and well-defined roadmaps to support the transition to a sustainable future.

Addressing the issue of harmful gases, Mr. Al Zu'bi highlighted that methane emissions, which stem from industries and agriculture, constitute 40% of

the total. He emphasised the importance of utilising existing technology, such as satellite monitoring, to tackle this challenge. In this regard, ADNOC launched a knowledge-sharing platform to facilitate the exchange of expertise and promote collaboration among countries.

Mr. Davide Felugo, Managing Director of Ansaldo Energia, praised the region's significant strides in the development of large-scale solar plants. He stressed the need to further invest in infrastructure, particularly in the implementation of storage systems.

Mr. Felugo also highlighted the potential of hydrogen as an energy carrier and storage medium, urging collaboration to

leverage the existing technological advancements in the oil industry, such as carbon capture, to accelerate the transition to sustainable energy sources.

Embracing new technologies

Dr. Abdulaziz Aljodai, Corporate Programs Director of Technology & Innovation at SABIC, stressed the importance of embracing new technologies to reduce carbon emissions while sustaining business operations. He referred to the carbon economy concept, launched during the G20 summit in Saudi Arabia in 2020, which focuses on reducing emissions through renewable energy, energy efficiency, and other means.

Dr. Aljodai said that the significance of holistic approaches, including removing CO2 from the air through natural sources or direct air capture, in achieving NetZero goals and carbon neutrality.

Mr. Cornelius Matthes, CEO of Dii Desert Energy, highlighted the importance of considering local benefits and engaging the younger generation in the energy transition. He pointed out the need to create job opportunities and promote community involvement.

Mr. Matthes acknowledged the growing interest among young students in energy-related topics and called for the empowerment of the youth to drive positive change in the field of energy.

Global markets stumble as traders await Fed minutes

Global stock markets gave up some recent gains yesterday as investors awaited minutes from the US Federal Reserve's most recent meeting for a steer on interest rates in the world's biggest economy.

The Fed will later publish minutes from its November gathering, when policymakers held rates steady, and investors will analyse comments from officials.

Investors are becoming increasingly optimistic that the US central bank is finished hiking rates, with expectations growing that financial conditions will become easier in the new year as inflation comes down.

That has fanned a rush back into risk assets in recent weeks and also pushed the dollar down against most of its peers.

"Traders will scrutinise the minutes closely, hoping to find clues for the timing of the next Fed move, which is now widely assumed to be a cut," said ActivTrades senior analyst Ricardo Evangelista. A drop in yields on US government bonds is a clear indication that the markets believe the Fed is done with rate hikes despite public comments by policymakers that work

remains to be done to reduce inflation, said market analyst Patrick O'Hare at Briefing.com. "It is unmistakable that the fed funds futures market has its mind made up, no matter what anyone says, that the Fed is done raising rates," he said.

Weak results from US retailers Best Buy and Lowe's ahead of the peak-demand Christmas shopping season were an indication that the Fed's efforts to slow the economy and inflation were working. Their shares were lower in late morning trading.

New York's three main indi-

ces were lower a day after the Nasdaq hit a 22-month high thanks to an advance in tech giants including Amazon, Microsoft and Nvidia.

Shares in Nvidia, which reports earnings after the market closes, slid in Tuesday trading after hitting a record of over \$500. Monday's rally was boosted by the successful sale of 20-year US Treasuries that sent yields on other notes lower. Talk is now growing that the Fed could cut borrowing costs as early as March, much earlier than previous bets on the sec-

ond half of 2024.

In Europe, London and Paris both retreated somewhat while Frankfurt ended flat.

Asian markets started strongly Tuesday but ran out of gas as the day progressed.

Hong Kong dipped even after market heavyweight Alibaba jumped more than two% to extend its rebound after diving 10% Friday on news it had cancelled the spinoff of its cloud computing arm.

Argentina's stock market reacted with optimism Tuesday to the resounding election win by libertarian Javier Milei, despite the country being gripped by uncertainty over what changes the self-described "anarcho-capitalist" will bring.

World oil prices slid as traders awaited this Sunday's upcoming output meeting of OPEC+ crude-producing nations.

"The main question the market is asking is whether OPEC will cut production further in response to softening oil prices," noted Economist Intelligence Unit analyst Matt Sherwood.

"These have returned to the levels they were at before the Israel-Hamas war broke out in early October."

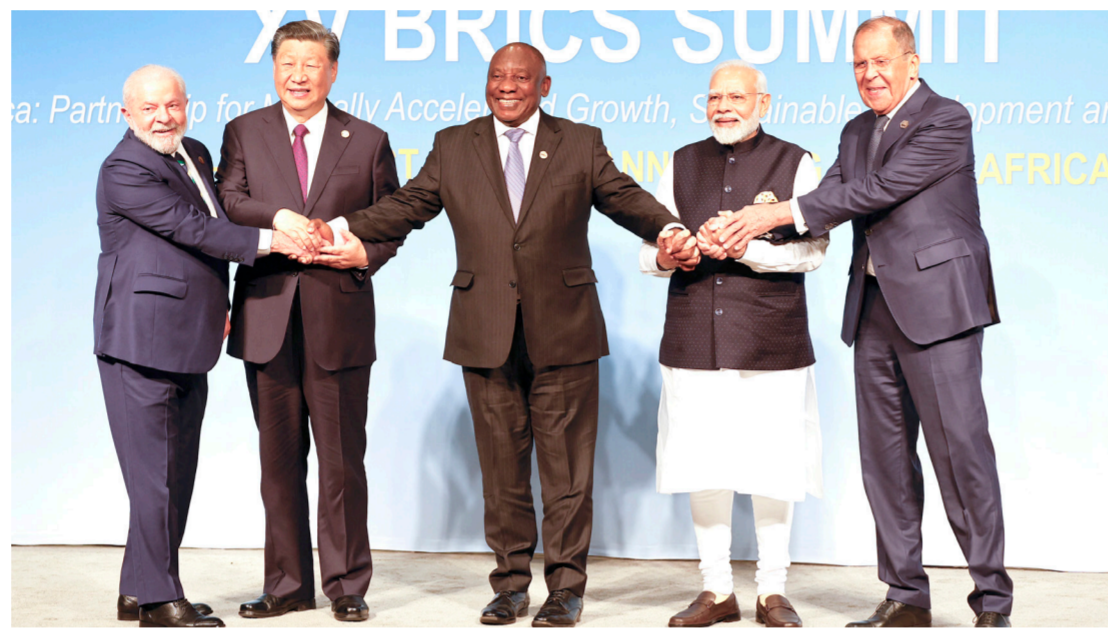

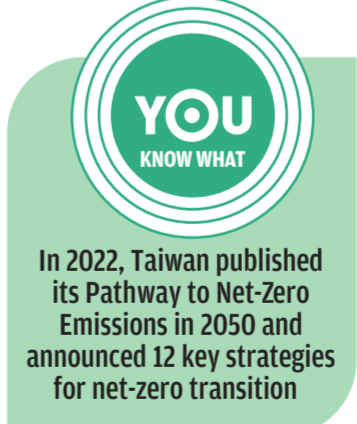

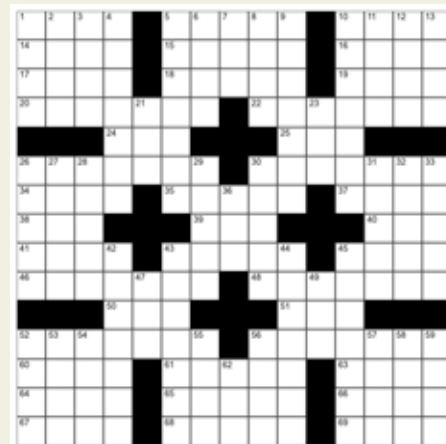

After the re-start, Bahrain tried valiantly to equalise but had few real chances. Hasan headed just inches wide of the target in the 81st minute, and then Marhoon had a free-kick

fly over the crossbar three minutes later.

The UAE finally sealed their triumph on the stroke of regular time when they were awarded a spot kick after Ramadan was taken down in the box by Hardan. Mabkhout stepped forward to take the penalty, and he made no mistake with his attempt, which he sent into the bottom-right of the net.

Group H action resumes in March of next year.
