However, the court rejected his claims after verifying a medical report from a psychiatric clinic, which certified her as mentally sound.

The x-ray examination confirmed their suspicions, revealing foreign objects inside his intestine. Upon questioning, the suspect confessed that the objects were capsules filled with narcotics. Further investigations revealed his involvement in a drug smuggling network that was attempting to smuggle drugs into the Kingdom.

As a result, the Public Prosecution charged him with drug trafficking and drug abuse, leading to his conviction. The Court of Appeals upheld the lower court's verdict, ensuring that
