Bahrain's senior men's national handball team are set to begin their campaign in the 2022 Asian Men's Handball Championship against their counterparts from Uzbekistan on January 18.

The schedule for the competition's preliminary round has been released by the Asian Handball Federation (AHF), and the nationals are set to play four Group D

Bahrain will be one of 17 teams in the continental competition, which is to be hosted in Dammam and Qatif.
