Spain are making their Olympic women's football debut at the Paris Games but are leading contenders to win the gold medal after their World Cup triumph in Australia and New Zealand last year. They fell behind against Ja-

pan in the western French city of Nantes to Aoba Fujino's early free-kick, but Bonmati soon dentey netted the winner in the 74th minute.
