NASA's James Webb Space Telescope, built to give the world a glimpse of the universe as it existed when the first galaxies formed, was launched by rocket early yesterday from South America's northeastern coast, opening a new era of astronomy.

The revolutionary \$9 billion infrared telescope, described by NASA as the premiere space-science observatory of the next decade, was carried aloft inside the cargo bay of an Ariane 5 rocket that blasted off at about 7:20 a.m. EST (1220 GMT) from the European Space Agency's (ESA) launch base in French Guiana.

"We will release today evidence to prove that Hezbollah is using the airport to target Saudi Arabia," the statement said.

The statement also claimed to have evidence revealing Hezbollah's terrorist involvement in Yemen.

Bahrain vows Saudi full support, condemns Houthi militia attacks

Bahrain yesterday condemned in strongest terms the terrorist Houthi militia's launch of projectiles towards Najran and Jazan in Saudi Arabia.

Bahrain also said it supports all measures Saudi takes to maintain its security, stability and territorial integrity. The attacks resulted in killing two civilians, a Saudi and a Yemeni citizen in Jazan, and

injuring several others.

In the statement, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs expressed condolences to the families and relatives of the victims and governments of Saudi Arabia and Yemen, wishing the injured a speedy recovery.

Bahrain also called on the international community to condemn these heinous attacks, committed deliberately and systematically by the Houthi militia, in flagrant violation of humanitarian law.

they will release new details on the Yemeni crisis today at 4 pm Saudi time.

40 attacks in 24 hours

The spokesman further announced carrying out 40 attacks against Houthi militia targets in Marib and Al-Jawf in the past 24 hours. The attacks resulted in destroying 17 military vehicles and killing 223 members of the Houthi militia.

"We carried out two operations on the western coast to support the coastal forces and protect civilians," the spokesman said.

He also confirmed defeating an attempt to transfer weapons to Sanaa. "The attacks were for neutralising threats," the spokesman said, calling on civilians not to gather or approach Houthi sites in Sanaa.

"Houthis, he said, managed to transfer weapons to Tashrifat camp during a deadline given.

"We managed to destroy nine weapon stores in the camp."

The Coalition on Thursday has said it destroyed seven drone and weapons stores at a military camp in the capital Sanaa in response to an armed drone launched from north Yemen towards Saudi's Red Sea region of Jizan.

The coalition said it carried out the operation in accordance with international humanitarian law.

Pedestrians are the most vulnerable when it comes to road accidents in the Kingdom.

A report published by a division within the Ministry of Works has revealed that the maximum victims of road accidents in the past three years were pedestrians.

According to the Road Safety

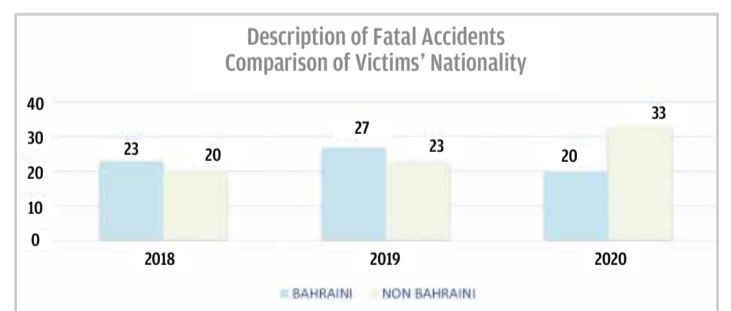
48

48 pedestrians were either injured or killed in accidents, followed by drivers (38), passengers (29), motorcyclists (20) and cyclists (13).

Audit published by the Traffic Safety Group, 48 pedestrians were either injured or killed in accidents, followed by drivers (38), passengers (29), motorcyclists (20) and cyclists (13).

The report has mainly focused

on the previous three years. The Traffic Safety Group has undertaken many initiatives to reduce traffic accidents, in line with the National Safety Strategy. "International standards are followed while carrying out the



audit," the report said, adding that all road projects have been equipped with road safety requirements to enhance traffic safety.

It is learnt that 155 audit reports were issued by the group for the three-year period ranging between 2018 and 2020. "Aware-

ness on road safety audit and its procedures have increased among the engineers. These were reflected in the compliance report for each stage of the audit. The percentage of compliance to the audit had shown a dropdown to 65 per cent."

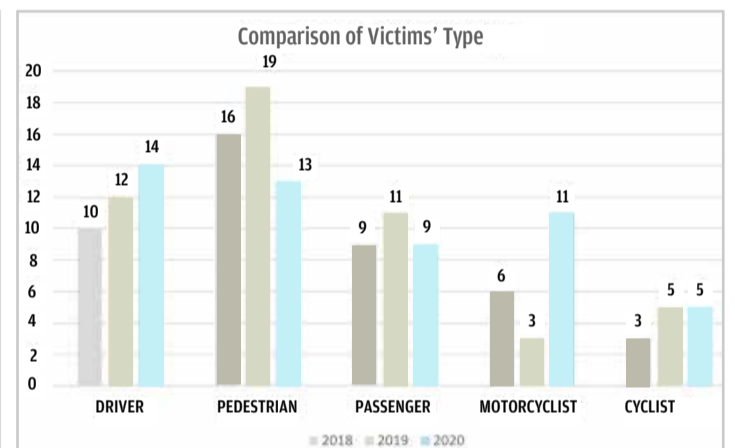
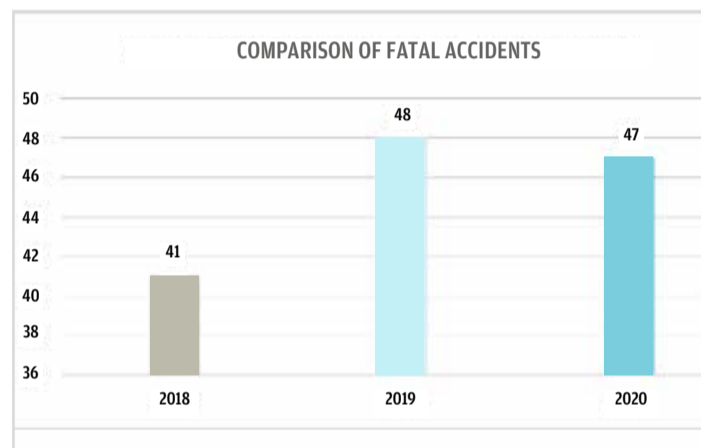

Forty-seven fatal accidents occurred in the year 2020. There were 48 fatal accidents in the year 2019 and 41 in 2018 respectively. According to the General Directorate of Traffic, by implementing adequate measures the Kingdom has been able to reduce the number of fatal accidents by 50%.

"The accident rate is the lowest in the Gulf region and the Middle East. This is because of the increasing steps to monitor wrong traffic practices apart from boosting awareness activities."

A study conducted two years ago revealed that despite the increase in the number of vehicles by 36 per cent in the last five years, the accidents in general reduced by 21.55pc and the fatal accidents by 30pc, while the fatalities dropped by 38pc and injuries-related accidents among drivers by 41pc and passengers by 52pc.

The General Directorate has always been highlighting the important role of the community in reducing traffic accidents by their traffic awareness and culture. He said that the department works within three main points; enhancing traffic safety through studies and reports,

regulation of traffic on the roads and the enhancement of traffic services through e-facilities.

The Director-General of Traffic, Brigadier Shaikh Abdulrahman bin Abdulwahab Al Khalifa, earlier revealed that traffic injuries and fatalities reduced by 60pc after the implementa-

tion of a comprehensive traffic strategy.

Launched in 2015, the strategy reduced such accidents by 25pc from last year until 2021, making Bahrain the top in the region in the drop of traffic accidents rates, he had stated.

He said that such achieve-

ment was a milestone despite an increase in the number of vehicles, heavy traffic and the construction of new cities as part of urban development.

Municipal councils received 175 requests from the part of the public with regard to the traffic safety issue. The subjects of these requests encompassed safety fence, pedestrian crossing facilities, pedestrian fence and speed humps.

The Works Ministry said that, upon receiving requests, site inspections were carried out by engineers along with technicians and municipal council members. "A speed hump committee has been constituted comprising municipal council members, which is looking into 135 requests presented by the citizens or residents," the ministry said.

COVID-19 violations: MoH closes two restaurants, refers 17 others for legal actions

The Ministry of Health yesterday announced closing two restaurants administratively in the capital on Friday for violating COVID-19 restrictions for yellow level.

The actions came during an inspection held in cooperation with the Ministry of Interior, the Ministry of Industry, Commerce and Tourism, and

the Bahrain Tourism and Exhibitions Authority.

The inspectors visited 193 restaurants and cafes, of which 17 were found not adhering to the preventive measures. Legal actions are taken.

The Ministry of Health called on everyone to continue to adhere to COVID-19 measures and report violations to limit the spread of the virus and ensure the health and safety of everyone.

Six in the dock for hacking ePayment website and clearing dues using fake payments

Six people are in the dock for carrying out fictitious payments by hacking an ePayment system to clear their dues with a government agency.

They will face trial before the High Criminal Court starting on the 4th of January 2022.

All of the suspects are now in pretrial detention.

One of the suspects was on the run, and police arrested him from a Gulf Country by issuing an international arrest warrant.

The Gulf country (name not disclosed) handed him over to Bahrain police for facing trial.

Police interrogated him with the rest of the suspects in the Kingdom and charged them with electronic fraud and misrepresentation of information technology system data.

The suspects used a foreign bank abroad for making fake payments after hackin their electronic payment key. How-

ever, all the fictitious payment transactions were detected and stopped.

Case files say the police opened an investigation based on a complaint registered by the government agency through Public Prosecution.

The head of the Capital Governorate Prosecution said the suspects tampered with the digital link of the electronic payment site to carry out fake payments and clear their dues.

Investigators gathered evidence from the specialists of

the government e-Payment website and the financial company responsible for validating the transactions received through the e-Payment website.

The head of the Capital Governorate Prosecution said the Public Prosecution is determined to confront firmly any violation of information technology systems, and called on everyone to maintain the confidentiality of electronic key data and not to disclose it to others.

A season to thrive

It's the season to thrive as Bahrain's short winter and its agricultural abundance fill our Kingdom with greenery and with locally sourced farm produce – herbs, fruits and veg, dairy and poultry products. This year, under the directives of HM King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa and the patronage of HRH Princess Sabeeka bint Ibrahim Al Khalifa, the Wife of HM the King and President of the NIAD Consultative Council, the National Initiative for Agricultural Development (NIAD) has gone beyond the popular Farmers' Markets and started an ambitious greening project which aims to plant over 50,000 plants and saplings across Bahrain. This is a scientifically designed programme and 12 sites have been chosen for their best soil, water and sunlight qualities to nurture the saplings and shrubs, once planted.

Despite poor soil and arid climate, Bahrain will benefit greatly from the planting of trees and green cover. The move by NIAD comes in line with the Kingdom's ambitious plans to nurture a circle economy which will cut waste, upcycle as much trash as possible to deliver energy and reduce carbon emissions by 30% by 2030.

What is commendable is that many private sector organisations have come forward to support the "Forever Green" campaign which is expected to promote the expansion of the green area in Bahrain and to address the effects of climate change within the 2030 Sustainable Development Goals.

Despite poor soil and arid climate, Bahrain will benefit greatly from the planting of trees and green cover. The move by NIAD comes in line with the Kingdom's ambitious plans to nurture a circle economy which will cut waste, upcycle as much trash as possible to deliver energy and reduce carbon emissions by 30% by 2030.

As urbanisation grows apace, the Kingdom's planners are also looking to raise green cover so that we find a proper balance going forward. Each one of us can help in this project – even those without the proverbial green thumb can help by cutting back on plastic use, by encouraging the respect for garden space and wilderness – the mangroves of Arad and Tubli, for example, the brown grass stands that dot our desert areas, they all are part of the wonder of Bahrain's natural green cover and we must safeguard and develop it for the future generations.

Partial eclipses, two lunar eclipses and more for Bahrain in 2022: Al Hajri

Several rare astronomical phenomena are in store for people of Bahrain to enjoy in 2022, said a top Bahraini astronomer and researcher.

Ali Al Hajri said several celestial events are lined up for Bahrain next year and the first will be the alignment of four planets -- Venus, Mercury, Saturn and Jupiter-- after sunset in the first seven days of January.

Celebrating this special gathering from the space will be the Crescent Moon of the month of Jumada Al Akhirah from the 4th to the 6th of January.

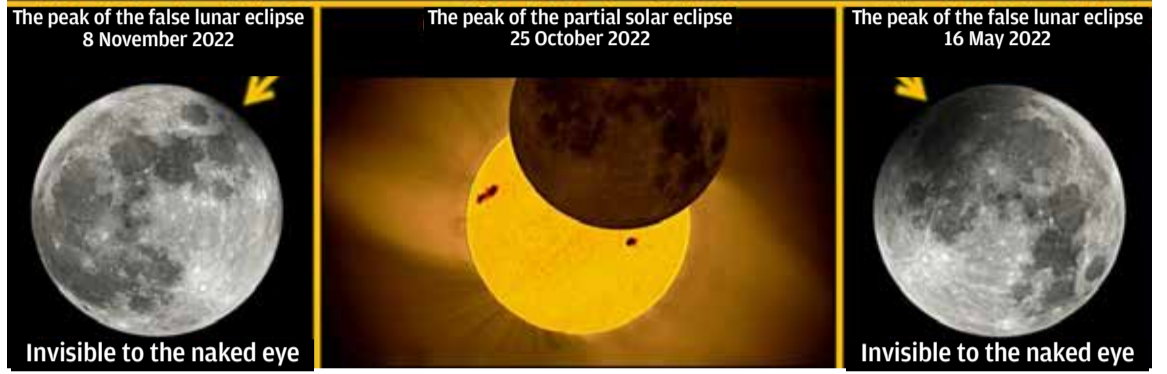
Al Hajri also said that sunset in Bahrain would align with Qibla, the direction towards the Kaaba in the Sacred Mosque in Mecca, from the 8th to 13th January at around 6 pm. It will occur at an angle of 246 degrees from the north side of the horizon.

"This annual phenomenon will be repeated from the 28th of November 2022 to the 3rd of December during fall at 4.45 pm."

Bahrain, he said, will witness a partial solar eclipse (38.77%) for two hours and 18 minutes on the 25th of October 2022.

Another eclipse on the 16th of

May 2022 will happen for about 18 minutes. The percentage of the Moon entering the penumbra of

Earth will be 17.28%.

The last eclipse will be on the 8th of November 2022 and will last for about six minutes at Moonrise. The percentage of the Moon entering the semi-shadow of the Earth will be 0.14%.

In 2022, Ramadan days will start on the 2nd of April 2022 and last for 30 days and Eid Al-Fitr on the 2nd of May 2022.

Al-Hajri added, "A four-way conjunction of the Moon will occur during the month of Sha'ban at dawn with Saturn, Venus and Mars on the 28th of next March towards the east and before sunrise."

Earth will come closer to the Sun "perihelion" for 2022 on the 4th of

January at (09:55) in the morning. Earth will be at the "Aphelion" on the 4th of July at (10:11) in the morning.

Moon will be closest to the Earth "Perihelion" on the 13th of July 2022 at (12:05) noon at a distance of (357278.8 km).

Moon will be farthest from the Earth, or "Aphelion" on the 29th of June at (09:08) am at a distance of (406574.9 km).

"The difference in diameter of the Moon and the Sun at apogee and perihelion can be observed by photographing them with the same equipment and comparing them with computer programmes," he added.

China proposes tighter rules but no ban for offshore listings

China's securities watchdog on Friday proposed tightening rules governing Chinese companies listing abroad, which it said would improve oversight while allowing them to continue to do so, the latest in a spate of regulatory moves by Beijing in 2021.

The draft rules, which had been keenly awaited by investors and were posted by the China Securities Regulatory Commission on its website, extend the CSRC's oversight of offshore listings to Chinese firms with variable interest entity (VIE) structures.

There had been much uncertainty among investors and Chinese firms over how much tighter the new rules would be.

"China is tightening the screws on offshore listings but not turning the valves off com-



Most offshore-listed Chinese tech firms, including Alibaba Group Holdings and JD.com Inc, use the structures, which give them more flexibility to raise capital, while also bypassing the scrutiny and lengthy IPO vetting process that locally-incorporated companies have to go through.

and are "not about policy tightening".

Previously, the regulator would only examine companies incorporated onshore in China that proposed an offshore listing, such as in Hong Kong.

Beijing has unleashed a flurry of regulatory tightening this year under President Xi Jinping, including clamping down on anti-competitive behavior, banning private tuition groups and reining in a debt binge by property developers in a wide-ranging campaign that has rattled domestic and global markets.

Thousands of flights canceled globally

Commercial airlines around the world canceled more than 4,500 flights over the Christmas weekend, as a mounting wave of COVID-19 infections driven by the Omicron variant created greater uncertainty and misery for holiday travellers.

Airline carriers globally scrapped at least 2,401 flights on Friday, which fell on Christmas Eve and is typically a heavy day for air travel, according to a running tally on the flight-tracking website FlightAware.com. Nearly 10,000 more flights were delayed.

The website showed that 1,779 Christmas Day flights were called off worldwide, along with 402 more that had been scheduled for Sunday. Commercial air traffic within the United States and into or out of the country accounted for more than a quarter of all the canceled flights over the weekend, FlightAware data showed.

More than 30 killed, bodies burnt in Myanmar's Kayah state

Reuters | London

More than 30 people, including women and children, were killed and their bodies burnt in Myanmar's conflict-torn Kayah state on Friday, according to a local resident, media reports and a local human rights group.

Karenni Human Rights Group said they found the burnt bodies of internally displaced people, including elders, women and children killed by the military that rules Myanmar, near Mo So village of Hpruso town yesterday.

"We strongly denounce the inhumane and brutal killing which violates human rights," the group said in a Facebook post.

The Myanmar military said it had shot and killed an unspecified number of "terrorists with weapons" from the opposition armed forces in the village, state media said. The people were in seven vehicles and did not stop for the military, it said.

The Myanmar military could not immediately be reached for comment.

Photos shared by the human rights group and local media showed the charred remains of bodies on burnt-out truckbeds.

The Karenni National Defence Force, one of the largest of several civilian militias opposing the junta that led a Feb. 1 coup, said the dead were not their members but civilians seeking refuge from the conflict.

"We were so shocked at seeing that all the dead bodies were different sizes, including children, women and old people," a commander from group told Reuters, asking not to be named.

A villager who asked not to be named for security reasons said he was aware of the fire on

Friday night but could not go to the scene as there was shooting. "I went to see this morning. I saw dead bodies that had been burnt, and also the clothes of children and women spread around," he told Reuters by phone.

Meanwhile fighting in another part of the country, near the Thai border where the Myanmar military continues to clash with a rebel group, resulted in a wayward rocket-propelled

grenade damaging a house on the Thailand side of the border with no deaths or injuries, Thai authorities said yesterday.

The Myanmar military carried out airstrikes a day earlier on an area controlled by the Karen National Union (KNU) near the border in an escalation of fighting that flared up last week and has since sent thousands fleeing into Thailand.

Myanmar has been in turmoil since the military overthrew the elected government of Nobel Prize laureate Aung San Suu Kyi almost 11 months ago, claiming fraud in a November election that her party had won. International observers have said the ballot was fair.

Civilians enraged by the coup and subsequent crackdown on protesters have been taking up arms. Many local resistance forces have sprung up across the country.

The military has outlawed many opponents, labelling them traitors or terrorists, including a self-proclaimed National Unity Government that seeks to lobby the international community and prevent the junta from consolidating power.

At least 30 dead in migrant boat accidents in Greece

Greek coast guards scoured for survivors in the Aegean Sea yesterday after the latest in a series of migrant boat accidents that have killed at least 30 people in just days.

Late Friday, the coastguard found 16 bodies, including those of three women and a baby, and rescued 63 people from a boat that overturned and sank near the island of Paros.

According to those rescued, around 80 people had been on the vessel that was bound for Italy.

Smugglers operating from Cesme and Bodrum on the Turkish coast are packing migrants in yachts to send them to Italy using new, more dangerous routes, according to the ERT television channel.

Three coast guard patrol boats, private vessels, a coast guard plane as well as divers searched for more survivors, officials said.

The latest tragedy -- the third since Wednesday -- came amid high smuggler activity not seen in Greek waters in months.

Hours earlier, 11 bodies were recovered from another boat

grants -- both men suspected of being the smugglers -- were arrested.

Ninety people stranded on the islet were rescued. And on Wednesday, a dinghy carrying migrants capsized off the island of Folegandros, killing at least three people.

Thirteen people were rescued, while dozens remain missing, Greek authorities said.

Survivors gave conflicting accounts: Some said there had been 32 people on board, while others put the number around 50, a coast guard official told AFP.

● The \$9bn observatory seeks out faint light from the first stars and galaxies, providing a glimpse into cosmic creation

NASA's James Webb Space Telescope, built to give the world its first glimpse of the universe as it existed when the earliest galaxies formed, was launched by rocket early yesterday from the northeastern coast of South America, opening a new era of astronomy.

The revolutionary \$9 billion infrared telescope, described by NASA as the premiere space-science observatory of the next decade, was carried aloft inside the cargo bay of an Ariane 5 rocket that blasted off at about 7:20 a.m. EST (12:20 GMT) from the European Space Agency's (ESA) launch base in French Guiana.

The flawless Christmas Day launch, with a countdown conducted in French, was carried live on a joint NASA-ESA webcast. The liftoff capped a project decades in the making, coming to fruition after years of repeated delays and cost over-runs.

"From a tropical rain forest to the edge of time itself, James Webb begins a voyage back to the birth of the universe," a NASA commentator said as the two-stage launch vehicle, fitted with double solid-rocket boosters, roared off its launch pad into

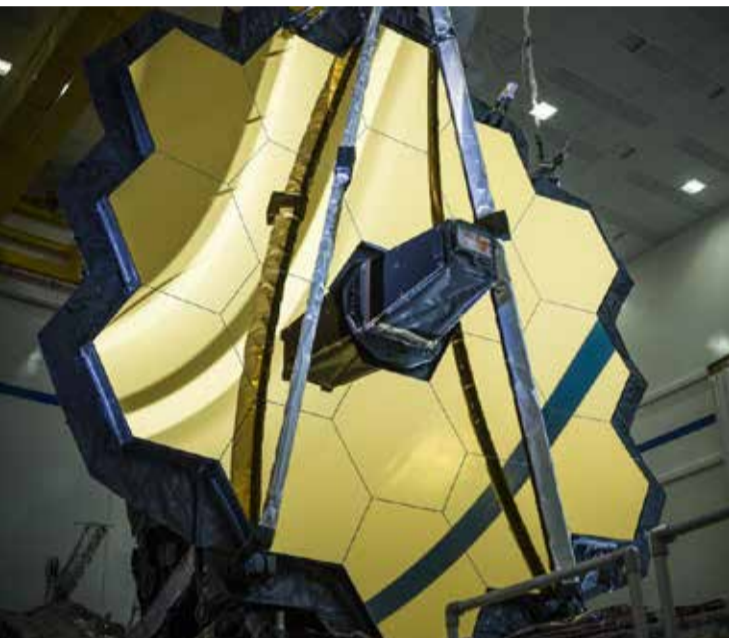

Webb's revolutionary new space telescope blasts into orbit

Telescope lifts off on historic mission from French Guiana



The James Webb Space Telescope Mirror is seen during a media unveiling

cloudy skies. After a 27-minute, hypersonic ride into space, the 14,000-pound instrument was released from the upper stage of the French-built rocket about 865 miles above the Earth, and should gradually unfurl to nearly the size of a tennis court over the next 13 days as it sails onward on its own.

Live video captured by a camera mounted on the rocket's upper stage showed the Webb gliding gently away after it was jettisoned, drawing cheers and applause from jubilant flight engineers in the mission control center.

Flight controllers confirmed moments later, as the Webb's solar-energy array was deployed,

that its power supply was working.

Coasting through space for two more weeks, the Webb telescope will reach its destination in solar orbit 1 million miles from Earth - about four times farther away than the moon. And Webb's special orbital path will keep it in constant alignment with the Earth as the planet and telescope circle the sun in tandem.

By comparison, Webb's 30-year-old predecessor, the Hubble Space Telescope, orbits the Earth from 340 miles away, passing in and out of the planet's shadow every 90 minutes.

Named after the man who oversaw NASA through most of its formative decade of the 1960s,

YOU KNOW WHAT

Webb will attempt to look back in time 13.7 billion years, a mere 100 million years after the universe-forming Big Bang as the original stars were forming

Webb is about 100 times more sensitive than Hubble and is expected to transform scientists' understanding of the universe and our place in it.

NASA Administrator Bill Nelson, striking a spiritual tone as he addressed the launch webcast by video link, quoted the Bible and hailed the new telescope as a "time machine" that will "capture the light from the very beginning of the creation."

Webb mainly will view the cosmos in the infrared spectrum, allowing it to peer through clouds of gas and dust where stars are being born, while Hubble has operated primarily at optical and ultraviolet wavelengths.

The new telescope's primary mirror - consisting of 18 hexagonal segments of gold-coated beryllium metal - also has a much bigger light-collecting area, enabling it to observe objects at greater distances, thus farther

back into time, than Hubble or any other telescope.

That, astronomers say, will bring into view a glimpse of the cosmos never previously seen - dating to just 100 million years after the Big Bang, the theoretical flashpoint that set in motion the expansion of the observable universe an estimated 13.8 billion years ago.

Hubble's view reached back to roughly 400 million years following the Big Bang, a period just after the very first galaxies - sprawling clusters of stars, gases and other interstellar matter - are believed to have taken shape.

While Hubble caught glimmers of "toddler" galaxies, Webb will reveal those objects in greater detail while also capturing even fainter, earlier "infant" galaxies, astrophysicist Eric Smith, NASA's Webb program scientist, told Reuters hours before the launch.

India to give COVID-19 booster shots to healthcare workers from Jan. 10

India will start administering COVID-19 booster shots as a precautionary measure to healthcare and frontline workers from Jan. 10, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said yesterday, as cases of the Omicron coronavirus variant rose across the country.

In a national address, Modi also said those aged 15-18 would start receiving COVID-19 vaccinations from Jan. 3 and those above 60 with comorbidities would be offered booster shots after recommendation from doctors.

"From the point of view of precaution, the government has decided that healthcare and frontline workers should start getting a precaution dose," Modi said in the speech.

India has reported a swift rise in Omicron cases, with the number reaching 415 overall across 17 Indian states.

Modi's government has been accelerating its vaccination campaign, administering at least one dose to 88% of the eligible 944 million population, while 61% have taken both doses.

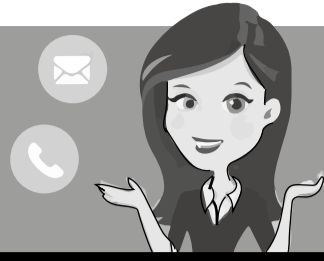

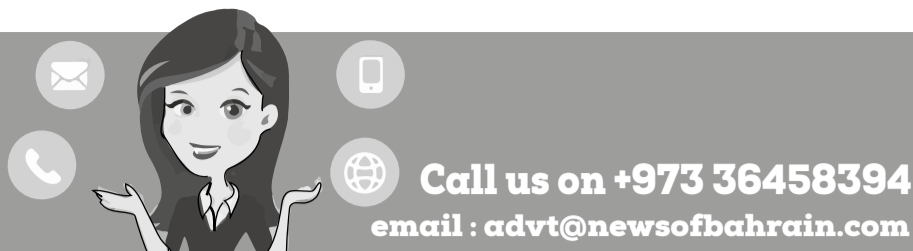

England ring changes for must-win Test as Australia hand Boland a debut

England's Chris Woakes has been dropped for the Boxing Day Test with Mark Wood recalled

Embattled England made four changes yesterday for the crunch Boxing Day Test in a bid to keep the Ashes alive, while Australia handed experienced seamer Scott Boland a surprise debut.

Joe Root's team must win at the Melbourne Cricket Ground in front of an expected 70,000 fans to stay in the hunt after heavy defeats in the first two Tests at Brisbane and Adelaide and with three still to play.

Those losses were characterised by batting collapses compounded by poor bowling and fielding with the visitors looking to stop the rot by shaking up the team.

Zak Crawley was recalled for

the first time since March to replace struggling opener Rory Burns, despite averaging just 28.34 from his 15 Tests.

Veteran Jonny Bairstow, meanwhile, will add to his 78 Tests when he takes over at number six from youngster Ollie Pope, who has failed to adapt to the Australian conditions.

England also mixed up the

bowling unit again with speedster Mark Wood returning after being rested for their 275-run defeat in Adelaide, which followed a nine wicket thrashing in Brisbane.

Off-spinner Jack Leach also gets another chance after being axed for the second Test despite the Adelaide pitch having plenty in it for the slow bowlers.

Jhye Richardson, who took five wickets in England’s second innings at Adelaide, is still sore from his efforts with Boland replacing him to become the third Australian debutant this series

after Neser and Alex Carey.

In doing so, he also becomes the first Indigenous man to play Test cricket for Australia since Jason Gillespie.

“He was pretty sore,” Cummins told reporters of Richardson, adding that he also had a minor leg injury.

“We were umming and ahing -- he had a bowl yesterday but we thought seven days off (before the fourth Test in Sydney) will kind of give him enough rest.”

Boland will play on his home ground, where he has taken 91 wickets at 25.71 in 26 first-class games, often on unresponsive pitches.

Cummins said his record at the Melbourne Cricket Ground factored into their thinking.

“It was a huge part of it. His record speaks for itself here in domestic cricket,” he said.

“Home ground, having someone fresh like him who can perform straightaway were the big factors.”

Djokovic ‘won’t go’ to pre-Australian Open ATP Cup

World number one Novak Djokovic will not travel to Sydney for the men’s season-opening ATP Cup next week, Serbian daily Blic reported yesterday.

Djokovic was named in Serbia’s team for the ATP Cup, although the 34-year-old has yet to commit to the Australian Open following the organisers’ mandate for COVID-19 vaccinations.

Djokovic has declined to disclose whether he is vaccinated, citing privacy.

Serbia are in Group A along with Norway, Chile and Spain at the ATP Cup, which is scheduled for Jan. 1-9 before the Australian Open begins on Jan. 17.

Australian Open chief Craig Tiley said on Wednesday that he is still uncertain whether Djokovic will be playing at the Melbourne Park major.

Tiley has said that all players and staff at the Australian Open would be vaccinated or have a medical exemption granted by an independent

panel of experts.

Canadian Raonic withdraws from Australian Open with heel injury

Canadian Milos Raonic has pulled out of next month’s Australian Open as the former world number three continues his recovery from a heel injury, the organisers said yesterday.

Raonic suffered a thigh injury in March and returned to the tour after a three-month gap. But his 2021 season was cut short due to another heel issue following his first-round loss at the Atlanta Open in July.

“Milos Raonic has withdrawn from the #AusOpen as he continues his recovery from an

Achilles injury,” the organisers of the Grand Slam said on Twitter.

Raonic, who turns 31 on Monday, reached a career-high world ranking of third in 2016 - the year he reached the finals at Wimbledon and made a run to the semi-finals at Melbourne Park.

The Canadian, who has currently slipped to 70th, is the latest to be ruled out of the Australian Open, with Roger Federer, Stan Wawrinka, Jennifer Brady, Karolina Pliskova, Karolina Muchova, Serena Williams and Bianca Andreescu also ruled out with injuries.

Five substitutions will benefit top teams, says Palace boss Vieira

Allowing five substitutions can help clubs manage player workload better given the busy fixture list and surge in Covid-19, but such a move would hand an advantage to the top teams, Crystal Palace boss Patrick Vieira said.

Manchester United manager Ralf Rangnick and his City counterpart Pep Guardiola have both urged the Premier League to increase the number of substitutions from three to five as a way to protect players.

"I think five subs regarding the period that we are in at the moment can be the right answer for us as a manager. But I don't think that would be fair for the top five teams and the rest of us," Vieira told reporters ahead of the Boxing Day clash away to Tottenham Hotspur.

"Any decision you make you always have people who are for and against. But for me, I don't know if we should remain with the three substitutes."

The Frenchman said that he wasn't too concerned about the high number of games during festive period but added that it was tough on players coming back from COVID-19 to play without enough training.

"I'm not worried about the players' welfare regarding the games in this period as it's been like this for years. I am worried regarding COVID," he said.

Vieira confirmed that Palace have reported "a couple of positive cases" in the last few days. Palace's trip to Watford earlier this month was postponed due to a COVID-19 outbreak at the home side.

Kohli's India seek to conquer final frontier in South Africa

Virat Kohli will seek to rebound from being fired as India's One Day captain to lead the Test side to a first ever series win in South Africa

Virat Kohli bruised from being fired as India's one-day captain bids to rebound by leading his country to an historic triumph in South Africa in a three-match Test series which starts at SuperSport Park in Centurion on Sunday.

South Africa is the only regular Test-playing nation where India have yet to win a series.

"We have worked really hard to win series away from India," said vice-captain KL Rahul at India's pre-match press conference on Friday.

"We've won series in England and Australia, which gives us a lot of confidence. We haven't won a series in South Africa, which gives us extra motivation to do our best."

South African captain Dean Elgar said he thought the teams were evenly matched.

"India are number one in the world for a reason but the fact that we are playing in our own back yard gives us an advantage."

Despite losing to New Zealand in last year's world Test championship final, India are the top-ranked Test team, five places ahead of South Africa, who have lost several key players to retirement in recent years.

Kohli leads an experienced side.

Crucially, it has the fast-bowling fire power to match South Africa's in conditions which usually favour pace.

No fewer than ten of India's 18-man squad have toured South Africa before.

Kohli, Cheteshwar Pujara, Ishant Sharma, Ravichandran Ashwin, Umesh Yadav and

reserve wicketkeeper Wridhiman Saha are on their fourth tour of the country.

"We know what to expect and we've had great preparation," said Rahul.

"The pace and bounce is very different to other countries and it was very important that we came here early and had preparation in the middle."

Rahul indicated India were likely to maintain their recent strategy of picking five bowlers, which he acknowledged would lead to a "very difficult discussion" about settling on five specialist batsmen.

Centurion fortress

India have the luxury of choosing between capable players in both batting and bowling, while South Africa's options seem limited, especially since fast bowler Anrich Nortje withdrew from the series because of a hip injury.

Riyad Mahrez to lead Algeria in African Cup of Nations defense
