Bahraini ordered to pay ex-wife BD11,000 in compensation

Bahraini man has been ${\cal A}$ ordered by the Civil Court to pay his ex-wife BD11,000 in compensation for selling two cars that she had borrowed money to purchase.

The court also ordered the husband to pay BD500 to cover the legal fees.

According to the woman's lawyer, his client had loaned her husband BD11,000 several years ago to buy two cars. They had agreed that he could not sell the cars without her consent, but after several years of marital disputes, he sold the cars without her permission. This led to her filing a lawsuit against him.

The court heard testimony from witnesses who confirmed that the ex-wife had loaned the money to her husband to buy the cars, but he had registered them in his name and did not return the money he had borrowed. The court also noted that the ex-wife had provided evidence of the money transfer to her husband.

The court ruled in favour of the ex-wife, ordering the husband to repay her the loan amount of BD11,000, as well as pay legal fees of BD500.

Extra BD50 fees for documentation at Kingdom's embassies abroad

Tustice, Islamic Affairs and **J** Endowments Minister Nawaf Al Maawda has issued a decision to add a BD50 fee for each documentation transaction in the Kingdom's embassies and consulates abroad, in addition to the fees currently imposed for each transaction.

The decision included the addition of Article No. (3) bis to Resolution No. (91) of 2017 regarding documentation fees, which stipulated that "an additional amount of fifty dinars is imposed in the event that any of the transactions referred to in this decision are conducted in the Kingdom of Bahrain's missions abroad."

The fees for documentation procedures are as follows:

1. Two hundred and fifty ditracts of joint-stock companies. mula.
