Indian Embassy hosts Open House, addresses community concerns

The Embassy of India held an Open House yesterday, chaired by Ambassador Vinod Kurian Jacob. The event, attended by over 70 nationals, featured the Embassy's Community Welfare team, Consular team, and legal advisors.

Conducted in English, Hindi, Tamil, and Malayalam, the meeting provided information on the e-Clearance for After-life Remains (eCARE) portal. This online system simplifies the Public Health Clearance

process for transporting mortal remains to India (<https://ecare.mohfw.gov.in/>).

Ambassador Jacob also expressed gratitude for the robust participation of the Indian community at the recent Flag Hoisting Ceremony celebrating the 78th anniversary of India's Independence.

The Ambassador highlighted recent successes, including the repatriation of a TB patient from Salmaniya Hospital to his hometown on August 23, facilitated with the support of the Labour Market Regulatory Authority (LMRA).

Additionally, of the 21 stranded workers who attended the previous Open House, 19 have successfully returned home after receiving their outstanding payments. The remaining two are expected to travel soon.

The Embassy continues to support distressed housemaids by offering boarding and lodging, issuing Emergency Certificates, and arranging tickets through the Indian Community Welfare Fund (ICWF). Legal assistance is also provided on a means-tested basis to Indian nationals in need.
